What's been happening....?

As readers will have realised, this is the programme which was prepared for last week, so the programme is actually for the game being played on Saturday 9th February. So all references to last week, are actually references to two weeks ago!

Opposition is the same this afternoon but there are a couple of updates to note viz.

- Today's referee is Steve Crichton who replaces Raymond Whyte
- Brian Craik had the plaster removed from his arm during the week, so is back in contention for a place.
- Dean Rennie and Peter Flick are still on the injury list
- Frazer Fitzpatrick made a surprise return to training during the week
- In common with the Canniepairt, most grounds were declared unplayable last Saturday. No games survived north of the Tay and only two were played in Fife.

- Scottish Junior Cup winner with Tayport in 1996, Jim Henry, has pulled on his boots again, this time helping out Forfar Albion.
- David Paterson and wife Joan retired as landlord and lady of the Bellrock Tavern earlier this week. We wish them well in retirement and thank them for their continued support to Tayport FC over the last 27 years.

Today's action....

No Super League games survived last week and there is only one other Super League game scheduled for today - Oakley v Kelty Hearts. Kelty will be looking for a 'Port slip up to move up to fourth top. They will, however, be wary of their West Fife neighbours who turned over league leaders Whitburn in their last outing. Like Bonnyrigg, Oakley will be battling for every point to escape the bottom two rungs of the Super League table.

In the Premier League, should leaders Bo'ness take full points from their visit to Perth where they meet 3rd top Kinnoull, then it will be a massive step towards regaining Super League status. At the other end of the table, in the Premier's only other game, a defeat at Dundonald would leave Rosyth in a precarious position.

Holders Linlithgow Rose and Cumnock make a fourth successive attempt to get their outstanding Scottish Cup 4th round tie played at Prestonfield this afternoon.

Investigation Notes

00.00 - 00.45 Back bar

The team arrived and commenced baseline tests in the back bar area: EMF low readings around the room perimeter due to electrics, ambient temperature 20-22.C (cooler towards the rear of the room). The team discussed Tori's drawing which she had done prior to arriving at the location. It showed a spirit man she felt was either visiting or grounded at the pub. She felt that he was quite a joker but had a mean streak. He had a scar by his left eye, dark hair and was in his 30s or 40s. He also had a military connection and the initials J or M. She had also drawn a floorplan of the pub based on our earlier visit. The plan showed the areas that Tori felt were active (the area around the pool table was highlighted as the most promising).

00.30 Tori decided to do pendulum dowsing around the back of the room by the pool table. She stated that the pendulum showed an area of high energy at the very back wall of the room continuing down the side of the pool table towards the toilet door. She had also noted a green trail emitting from the tip of the pendulum which she could not explain, never having seen this before.

Katrina, Natalie and Tori all felt strange sensations like static on their hair and intense pressure/ headache since arriving at the pub.

01.00 Whilst filming around the room, Laura's camcorder turned off suddenly for no apparent reason. There was no beeping as there should have been to indicate it was switching off and the camera worked again after being switched back on.

01.05 Katrina experienced a horrible prickly feeling down her right arm which was quite sore.
01.15 Voice recorder started and left on top of coffee table. Trigger object (pack of playing cards arranged into order and dusted in UV powder) left under locked off camera on coffee table.

01.17 Left the room to go to the lounge bar.

00.18 - 01.42 Lounge bar

Temperature of room 21.C, high EMF reading by door (electrics cupboard) [continued over]

TAYPORT v BONNYRIGG ROSE

When Bonnyrigg last called at The Canniepairt in May of last year they were chasing the championship and the three points they won that day kept them in the hunt. Alas they were to lose out on the title by a point to Linlithgow and so lost the chance of playing in the Scottish Cup. It had, nevertheless, been a pretty good season for Rose who picked up the Fife & Lothians Cup and the Lothians' St Michaels Cup.

Given that success last season, it's all the more surprising that Bonnyrigg are currently sitting second bottom of the Super League table, particularly when nine of the starting XI last May are still at New Dundas Park. Clearly they are in a false position and their performance in their controversial 1-0 Scottish Cup defeat at Auchinleck in their last outing, is further proof that manager Pat Glynn and his assistant, ex Dundee player Graham Harvey, feel it's just a matter of time before everything clicks into place.

Former Tayport favourite John Elliott broke a hand in training and he could miss out again. Gary Maley who kept goal when Tayport stunned Bonnyrigg with a 3-0 win at New Dundas Park in September, gave way to Scott Cantley for the Auchinleck game.

The loss of striker Sean Grady to Forfar Athletic at the start of the season, was a bit of a blow but, as Glynn said at the time, the player had been a good servant and deserved a chance at Senior level. He was replaced with the speedy Sean Paliczka who has tormented a few defences this season. As it turned out, things didn't work out for Sean at Station Park and he's now back in the Juniors with Linlithgow.

Prior to the tie at Auchinleck, Bonnyrigg had been in good cup form during December, winning v Culter, Luncarty and Harthill, scoring 16 times without reply. January was a bad month, however, with only the Auchinleck tie beating the weather.

Tayport's play v Pollok was praised but they will have to cut out the habit of starting from the back foot by losing the first goal if there is to be a move up the table. They will again have Birdie and Dean missing and added to the injury list is keeper Peter Flick, who turned and ankle at training this week. Also missing will be Shaggy Paterson whose loan arrangement from East Fife was terminated at the player's request. Making is league debut will be Darren Scott who came close to opening his goal account several times v Pollok. Maybe today?

Two sides who will have a lot to prove as they attempt to kick start their season following Scottish Cup exits, should be the recipe for an entertaining afternoon's fare. Let's hope so.

Tayport managed to open the scoring at the Canniepairt, when Barry McNaughton forced home Ronnie Kenneth's flick, from Ross Gunnion's throw-in, but, unfortunately, the lead only lasted five minutes.

Alan Waddell stuck out a foot to divert the ball over David Currie, for something of a lucky counter and, during the second half, both teams had chances. These were not taken, with McNaughton and substitute Kevin Kelly having the better of the openings, towards the end of the contest.

So to the Newlandsfield replay and another big crowd for the type of high profile game 'Port have become so used to playing over the years. It did not start well, though, with Paul Hyslop breaking the offside trap before touching home Pollok's opening goal.

Tayport went on to play some really positive football and the travelling fans were confident that their side would get back on level terms, only for Robert Downs to be allowed to double the home team's lead, on 65 minutes.

Chris Webster, set up by Kenneth's header, immediately reduced the deficit and 'Port still had quarter of the match left to salvage the tie. Sadly, it was not to be. Home substitutes Bryan Dingwall and Brian Mackay cashed in late on and the dream of further Scottish Cup success was over for another year.

It would difficult to argue against the Glasgow giants going through to the last-sixteen, but Tayport ran them close. Pollok simply took their chances at the right times.

Let's hope Tayport do something similar this afternoon, to reignite some sort of league challenge.



The two weeks which spanned the Pollok tie provided some excellent coverage the local and national press - an exception being last week's **Sunday Mail**, at least the edition on sale in these parts. For some reason the local edition had missed out on its Junior coverage. Maybe a blessing in disguise!.

The Evening Telegraph (Friday 17 January) carried a cracking archive shot of Barry McNaughton and Tayport fans, taken after scoring the winning goal v Renfrew in the Scottish Cup two years ago. The Canniepairt tie v Pollok attracted six press photographers who provided extensive photo coverage for the Fife Herald, The Sun, Daily Record and Evening Telegraph.

The Sun sent reporter Scott Campbell up for the game and his report carried an interview with debutant Darren Scott who expressed disappointment that he would have to wait to team up with former Harp colleague Birdie Craik who was out of action with a broken arm. Experienced Pollok defender Joe Carruth told Campbell "we knew this was a formidable task but we're pleased to be taking them back to our place".

The Sun, Daily Record and Evening Telegraph all carried pics of Barry McNaughton's goal which put Tayport ahead. The Record's angle on the game was the absence through illness of Pollok manager Rab Sneddon and the fact that he kept an open telephone line to the Canniepairt as he tried to "steer Pollok into the fifth round in the battle of the junior giants".

The Evening Telegraph (25 Jan) featured a lengthy review of Saturday's events on the Canniepairt by Junicus who pointed out that "Tayport had a surprise for their supporters when they named former Lochee Harp striker Darren Scott in their starting line-up after signing him from Arbroath on Friday".

The **Fife Herald** (24 Jan) carried extensive coverage of the Canniepairt tie and a preview of the replay with three large action colour photos. In his interview with the **Herald**'s reporter, Tayport manager Frank Conway was critical of the way his side lost the equaliser, "switching off after conceding a throw and then going to sleep as they attacked".

Monday's Evening Telegraph (28 Jan) understandably headlined with Lochee United's recovery from being two goals behind to win through to the last sixteen over Sauchie. Along with the report of the 'Port tie, there was a photo from Newlandsfield which showed in the background the healthy four figure crowd. Frank Conway interviewed, said "I'm totally shell shocked after that result. We probably played our best football of the season in the first half, yet we found ourselves one down..."

Bonnyrigg had their share of column inches covering their Scottish tie at Auchinleck. And what a controversial match it was, a late disputed penalty, awarded on the call of a linesman - giving Talbot a passage into round 5 by the slimmest of margins. Speaking to **Daily Record** reporter Kevin McGoldrick, manager Pat Glynn said "...we were cheated. Before the match I had said to my players the linesman could be intimidated - and I've been proved right"

The Edinburgh Evening News reporter John Gilmour didn't beat about the bush. According to the reporter, "the Bonnyrigg players went berserk..." when the referee pointed to the spot. The report certainly suggested Bonnyrigg had been hard done by in a game which they certainly didn't deserve to lose. The Daily Record was back at the Canniepairt in midweek for a photo opportunity with Darren Scott at training for an article on 'Port's new striker which appeared in Friday's edition (25 Jan)

FROM THE CLUB'S ARCHIVES **JANUARY 1988**

TWENTY YEARS AGO on SATURDAY 30th JANUARY 1988. Tayport, then an amateur club, played their 12th Midlands Premier League game of the season at home to TIMEX FC in wet and miserable conditions on the Canniepairt.

Although having too many draws to put in a serious championship challenge, Tayport were having a reasonable season and edged a 1 - 0 victory thanks to Neil Shaw's second half goal. Tayport finished the season 6th top of the table.

Not too many familiar faces in the line-up that afternoon:- Paul Hunt; Steve Rollo, Micky McPherson, Colin Downie, Jimmy Falconer, Neil Downie, Stuart Davie, Norrie Farningham, Steve Potts, Neil Shaw and Doug Kempton. Subs were Paul Thackeray and Doug Paterson.

47 players turned out for the 1st XI that season. Jimmy Falconer played in all 40 competitive games including all 26 league fixtures. Eight players played in at least 30 of the games including Colin Downie who would go on to manage Junior clubs Glenrothes and St Andrews United, top scorer Andy Heggie who would have a lengthy career in the Tayside Juniors and is still playing with Dundee Violet and local stalwarts for many seasons, Stuart Davie and Neil Downie. There were even four sub appearances for current committee man Ken Smith.

Across the factory burn on the East Common, the club's second string played an East Fife Amateurs League Two game at home to St Andrews University, winning 3-2. It was to be an unbeaten league title winning campaign. 
The crowd at Pollok last Saturday was amongst the top dozen football attendances in Scotland last Saturday, bettering all the Irn Bru Division three crowds.
