





TAYPORT v GLENROTHES

Glenrothes were to have been our first visitors of 2009 until the weather dictated otherwise. The New Town club arrive at the Canniepairt on the back of a disappointing Scottish Cup defeat at Kirkintilloch last Saturday, but boasting a pretty impressive away record in this season's Super League nevertheless, a solitary single goal defeat at Bathgate in October being their only failure to gather at least a point on the road.

In the programme notes for this game's original date, 3 January, we wrote "Draws four to date- have been Glens undoing and like ourselves, Glens are currently plodding along in mid table. Mid table, the clubs might be, but both are acutely aware that a couple of wins would propel either into the top of the league bracket. Conversely, of course, failure to pick up anything from the next couple of games or so, would see either club slip into the relegation mire. It is, therefore, an important game for both clubs this afternoon." Well, Tayport got their couple of wins - and more - while Glens have had mixed fortunes, losing heavily at home to Kelty and then beating Linlithgow at Prestonfield. Their other games since then have been Scottish Cup ties, a draw v Ballingry, a win v Ballingry and then Saturday's exit at Rob Roy. Essentially nothing's changed, it's still a crucial game for both clubs.

Glens have a compact but very experienced squad which normally gives little away and, as we found to our cost at Warout Stadium earlier this season, they are happy to keep things tight and take full advantage of the chances which will inevitably come their way. Adept at taking such opportunities - and the player with most assists - is the effervescent midfielder Lee Duffy who netted the crucial opening goal against us and who currently leads his club's Super League scoring charts.

The long serving Clive Guppy has made way for Jamie Roberts recently. Up front, Gregg Meikle, although he hasn't managed to add a league goal to his double scored at Whitburn on the opening day of the Super League season, is a lively attacker who will pose problems to the home defence. Absent from the Warout squad will be the influential former Dundee FC midfield player Neil Jablonski who has returned to Australia.

Tayport will likely be without influential players Brian Livie and Reon Juskowiak but Stuart Ferguson who impressed on his debut at Bathgate last week and Adam O'Connor, who capped a sound performance with a goal on his return to action for the first time since the turn of the year, will be hoping to keep their places. Barry McNaughton is available after missing out last week and Darren Scott, suffering from a cold last week, is also now raring to go. Chris Webster is still out following breaking a foot at Carnoustie but Willie Garner has a couple of trialists at his disposal. Defenders Dean Wallace and Andy Sommerville, yes son of the legendary and original, have been training with 'Port for some weeks and were both on the bench at Bathgate last week.

Lochee Utd 1-3 Bo'ness Utd

In their recent game at Easter Road, Killie beat Hibs. Ergo, Bo'ness are better than Hibs. In Hibs' most recent meeting with Celtic, Hibs won, making the BUs better than Celtic. In their latest meeting with Manchester United, Celtic drew. Comparing surgical notes on the touchline at our last home game were Chris Webster and Dean Rennie, one on crutches, one in a stooky. Webby has since had the wire removed from his broken foot and is on the road to recovery but was still on crutches as recently as the Whitburn match. Dean, who suffered a second leg break of his career playing for his Sunday team, has now abandoned the surgical boot and is also well on the road to recovery. Both players who were team mates earlier in the season until Dean was freed by former boss Iain Jenkins, hope to be back in training soon. Dean has been offered training facilities by Willie Garner as he embarks on the road back to fitness.

Bathgate Thistle may be Scottish Cup holders, the town itself may have a population of 15,068, but the attendance at Creamery Park last Saturday was a hugely disappointing 150. Of that total, one third were there to support Tayport, most of whom had made a 130 mile round trip to do so. For a town with a population of 3,847 at the last count, it's a great following.

Tayport players, committee and supporters alike were saddened by the news of the sudden death recently of Roy Gunnion, aged 61, father of former player Ross. Roy and wife Ann were regular attenders of Tayport matches, home and away, during Gunner's seven years with the club.

Tayport FC's committee's time wasn't wasted when the match v Bonnyrigg was postponed five weeks ago. They went shopping for a new mower and were successful in finding a suitable model which should be signed in good time for a debut as the grass emerges from its winter slumber.

Tayport's remarkable turnaround has caused a few raised eyebrows. Less than a week before Christmas, Tayport languished in third bottom spot in the Super League, 14 points behind runaway leaders Linlithgow Rose. Indeed Tayport hadn't even scored a goal away from home, never mind won a point. Nine weeks later, 'Port are third top, one point off the top of the table, and now only one point behind Linlithgow. Not only that, but Ronnie Kenneth is currently the Super League's top scorer.

According to last Friday's Evening Telegraph (20/02) we had played a midweek friendly against Dundee Violet. No, you hadn't missed the result / report. There was no game. Once again, it demonstrates you can't always believe what you read in the papers!

A real kick in the goolies for the Scottish Rugby hierarchy last weekend. A couple of Scottish ties involving minnows St Boswells and Cumbernauld had been delayed by bad weather. So what does the SRU do? They decided the 'big' clubs would win anyway so, to avoid further delay, they binned St Boswells and Cumbernauld, thus allowing their opponents to progress. No doubt there were a few red faces when Saturday's Scottish Cup results came through and 4th Division Howe of Fife knocked out Premiership One hotshots Glasgow Hawks in Cupar.

Let's hear it for Tayport Arms FC. The Sunday Morning League side recorded yet another unlikely Scottish Sunday Cup win to reach the last eight of the National Tournament. Unlikely because they once again trailed their opponents, only to stage a sensational comeback. 0-3 down in the second half against Sports Bar in Harthill, the 'Port lads rallied in superb fashion to win 5-3. The lads are on the road again tomorrow, heading for Livingston and a quarter final tie against Harvester FC. The semi finals beckon and we wish them the best of luck.

Three clubs will leave the Juniors at the end of the season to move into the Seniors. Four North League clubs, Turriff United, Strathspey Thistle, Formartine United and Banks of Dee applied for three vacancies in the Highland League. Following a secret ballot of clubs on Wednesday past, Banks of Dee, who are currently top of the North Super League, missed out, receiving only 5 votes. Turriff (15 votes), Strathspey (14) and Formartine (11) take the step up. Formartine and Strathspey are in Div 1, the standard of which probably struggles to be on a par with the third tier down here. Seems clear that Banks of Dee will have to brush up on their hospitality to visiting clubs!

DUNMORE'S ANGLE

Tayport looking to maintain momentum

Six weeks ago visitors Kelty came to the Canniepairt in buoyant mood, having hit Glenrothes for six, and must have harboured aspirations of recording another win against Tayport, especially after taking an early lead, through a John Martin penalty.

A fine move saw 'Port draw level, with Reon Juskowiak and Murray Urquhart involved on the right flank, setting up Barry McNaughton, who added yet another Super League goal to his tally.

A goalkeeping error played a part in Tayport's next counter, with Stefan Elvin the beneficiary, although he still had to show good imagination in looping his header over a defender and into the net. So, the hosts led at the break and they would soon establish a two-goal cushion. Ronnie Kenneth took advantage of another goalkeeping lapse and, again, his finish, from the edge of the area, was exemplary.

Kenneth was quick to latch onto a poor Tom Courts pass-back, with fifteen minutes remaining and was upended by 'keeper Fleming. The on-form goalscorer took the resultant spot kick, dispatching it emphatically beyond Kelty's makeshift custodian, Fleming having been red-carded. Another dismissal followed, with Stefan Winiarski, a substitute, dismissed shortly after entering the fray. As has been proven on several occasions in the past, playing against nine men does not suit Tayport - Tam McGeorge pulled a goal back for the Central Parkers, making the scoreline 4-2.

Port perhaps suffered a slight break in momentum with the postponement of the game against Bonnyrigg, but when action resumed three weeks ago, there was more good news to report.

The Canniepairt outfit finally buried a Whitburn hoodoo which had stretched back to the 1995 Scottish Junior Cup quarter-final. Stefan Elvin was yet again on the scoresheet, tapping home after the 'keeper had parried Ronnie Kenneth's long-ranger, early in the second half. It was an otherwise tight affair, on a far from ideal surface, but Tayport generally had the better of the game. Brian Livie and Roberto Morris both went close in the first half and, after Elvin's goal, stout defending and one fantastic save from Frazer Fitzpatrick earned another valuable win.

After two weeks without a game, there was finally some action last weekend, when 'Port travelled to Creamery Park. Hosts Bathgate opened the scoring on the stroke of half-time, through former Rangers player, Iain Nicholson.

It did not take the Canniepairt men long to draw level, although they needed a bizarre, yet blatant, handball offence to do so. Ronnie Kenneth tucked away the spot kick, for his seventh Super League goal of the campaign.

A flowing move led to Adam O'Connor arrowing home from the edge of the box, to give Tayport the lead and it looked like Willie Garner's side were going to climb to the top of the table.

A late penalty for 'Gate, however, put paid to those aspirations. The game's second such decision was far more contentious, but there was no stopping ex-Motherwell and Falkirk hitman, Paul McGrillen, as he beat Frazer Fitzpatrick, from twelve yards.

Today we welcome one of my former clubs, Glenrothes to the Canniepairt on Super League business. Amazingly, due to bad weather and subsequent away fixtures at Whitburn and Bathgate, this is our first home game since we defeated Kelty on 17th January, and indeed only our second home game since defeating Lochee on 20th December.

Last week saw contrasting results for ourselves and the Glens. Whilst they were going out of the 'Scottish' at Kirkintilloch Rob Roy, we were on league duty at Bathgate where we drew 2-2. Considering we had not played for three weeks, I was relatively pleased with our performance, although not at all happy at the way we conceded two goals, one from the penalty spot and we had a discussion about these incidents after the game.



As you know, even although we do not have a large squad, I have very much kept the same team through our recent run, but was forced into a couple of changes last week due to work commitments of Brian Livie and Barry McNaughton. The absence of Livie meant that Stuart Ferguson made his debut, and also Adam O' Connor came back into the side, his first game since the Lochee match. I was really happy with both players' performances. Stuart brings with him great senior experience, and on numerous occasions this came to the fore, and all the hard work and effort Adam has put in during his prolonged absence certainly paid off, with his good performance being rewarded in him scoring our second goal.

A measure of how far the players have come in a short space of time, was how disappointed they were that, in their view, we had dropped two points. I felt that the character they showed in the second have, having lost a goal right on half time, was fantastic. Their movement and support play in that second half was great to watch and I felt that with that bit of luck that we always need, we could have scored two or three more goals. In the end we had to settle for a draw.

During the enforced break we have worked really hard on the training field. Jim has been putting the guys through some really intense sessions, with total commitment from the players, as always.

As I have mentioned in previous programme notes, one look at the league table suggests that it will be some time before all the serious outcomes are decided. What we will be doing is continuing to work as hard as we possibly can, and hope that is enough, along with some good fortune, to maintain a position of challenge.

Lastly I would like to thank you for your continued support. It was again good to see many of you at Bathgate and Whitburn. Lets get right behind the team today.



going to toast the lassies," he was told. "Oh no" the chief replied. "I couldn't eat another thing"



Tayport get their place in the (Scottish Amateur FA) history books.....but it's inaccurate.

The Scottish Amateur Football Association recently marked its Centenary Year, 1909 - 2009, with a grand dinner in Dunblane and the piece below appeared in the glossy publication issued by the Association to celebrate the occasion. A researcher had trawled through 100 years of the Association's papers and minutes to provide a record of each decade. Whilst we are pleased that the club should be mentioned in such a prestigious document, it would appear that they got it wrong in the 1970 –1979 A Decade of Dramatic Development feature.

For season 1972/73, there were four hundred and sixty entries for the Scottish Amateur Cup and in an unusual departure from normal business a dispute was settled by Fife Police. Abbotshill (Kirkcaldy & District AFL) played Tayport (Midlands AFA) in the Scottish Cup and the rule at the time meant the home team had to pay travel expenses to the opposition provided the distance travelled exceeded thirty miles. The clubs could not agree, and the SAFA called upon Fife's finest who decided the distance between the grounds was thirty one miles. Thus Tayport were liable for expenses!

- 1 It was a Fife Cup 2nd round tie, not a Scottish Cup-tie
- 2 Abbotshall was the home team and the game was played at Beveridge Park, Kirkcaldy
- The distance confirmed by Fife Police (31 miles) benefited Tayport, as the away team, so we successfully claimed the expenses, not Abbotshall.

The game actually took place over 36 years ago on 23 December 1972 and although they may have

won the expenses wrangle, Tayport lost the tie on the park, going down 3-2.

Tayport's team that cold afternoon was Derek White; Ian Mathers, Abby Oswald; Frank Leslie, Jim Mathers, Lindsay Ancell; Ian Howe, Walter Williamson, Andy Johnstone, Raymond White and Eddie Gilmour. It was the first season in which two substitutes were allowed and Tayport's two subs were Walter Kemp and Stewart Grant. Wattie Williamson and Lindsay Ancell, aka Fancy Dan, were the Tayport scorers.

Never mind not believing all you read in the newspapers, it just shows you can't even believe all you read in the history books either! Suppose we'll have to wait 100 years for a correction to be published.


