

Clydebank groundshare with Yoker but Holm Park has been deemed unsuitable, so the Bankies' home leg will be at Vale of Leven's Millburn Park.



TODAY'S GAME

Redwood Leisure Cup TAYPORT v ROSYTH



After playing ten successive league games since mid December, Tayport return to cup action this afternoon. A failure to make a mark in the Scottish and East of Scotland Cups this season, sees the Redwood Leisure Cup as the last opportunity for regional cup success.

Rosyth caused an upset on their last visit to Canniepairt in May 2007, winning 2-1 in an East of Scotland Cup tie. The south Fife club was going well that season, just missing out on a Super League place and reaching the final of the East of Scotland.

After the dizzy heights of 2006/07, Rosyth went into freefall in 2007/08 and ended up relegated from the Premier Division to the Central Division. The club has staged an impressive turnaround and although they have lost their table top status, are still vying with St Andrews United for the sole promotion spot.

John Lumsden who replaced former Tayport striker Billy Spence, now at Hill of Beath, as Rosyth manager has a big player pool at his disposal and recently boosted his squad by taking three Cowdenbeath FC Under 19s on loan. Striker Callum Young, midfielder Jon Robertson and defender Chris King, who played for Tayport pre-season, will all likely be in the Rosyth squad for this afternoon's tie.

Prior to the date on which today's tie was originally scheduled (7th Feb), Tayport were on a roll, set to name an unchanged line-up for the fourth successive week and looking to extend a run of five league games which had delivered 13 points from a possible 15. Since then, however, there's been no opportunity for consistency of selection and this hasn't helped a situation which has seen only one point taken from five games and no goals scored in the last three of these games.

The enforced weather break didn't do Rosyth any favours either. They emerged from the same two week hibernation as Tayport to beat Luncarty 1-0 only to then lose by 1-2 to each of their Central League title rivals, St Andrews United and Thornton Hibs.

Murray Urquhart missed out for Tayport last week through illness and could again be an absentee as could Adam O'Connor who has been unable to train this week. Brian Livie was back in action at Bonnyrigg after missing five games and Grant Paterson is back in contention after missing out at Bonnyrigg with a rib injury sustained against Hill of Beath.

FROM THE ARCHIVES TAYPORT V ROSYTH 1ST MARCH 2003

Rosyth, then known as Rosyth Recreation, paid their first ever visit to The Canniepairt in Spring just over six years ago to meet Tayport in the Redwood Cup. Rosyth were in the Fife District League and Super League Tayport, having lost only eight goals during the previous six months, were hot favourites to progress. And so it transpired, with the locals winning at a canter by 4-0.

Six years and a fair degree of upheaval down the line, Rosyth have no players in their squad today who wore the red and black back in 2003. The visitors' line up that day was

Ewan Stenhouse; Martin Rennie, Mark Gibson, Gareth Wall, Scott Stenhouse, Bret Haggett, Kieran Grattan, James Watt, Michael Brown, Alan Aitken and Craig Scott. Subs were Ronald Duncan and Callum Douglas

Tayport have four survivors from that game which attracted a crowd of 157, Fitzie, Patty, Roberto and Baz. The line-up was

Within three months, Tayport were to be crowned Scottish Cup and Super League champions.

"Give him a wee text now" he said. "Ask him how his horse got on vesterday" So I sent an SMS, and the reply I got could not possibly by printed on this page. Confused, I turned again to Jimmy. "I gave him a wire, last week" he explained. "It was about 100/1 or something, and had absolutely no chance. But I told him it was a banker, and I think he put a wad on it!!!" Unknown to Jimmy, Lee had also passed the 'banker' onto several of his friends, making him rather unpopular in his peer group!

The Redwood Leisure (Fife / Tayside) Cup

The Redwood Leisure Cup is contested by clubs who formerly played in the Tayside and Fife Junior FAs and was inaugurated in 1995/96 season under the banner of the then sponsor Taycars, the Dundee based car sales firm. Taycars' sponsorship of the competition lasted until 2000. There was then a season without sponsorship before the present sponsors, the Dundee based hotels and pubs chain Redwood Leisure, filled the breach. This season is the eighth season of Redwood's sponsorship.

The thirteen years of the competition have been dominated by three clubs, Hill of Beath Hawthorn, Lochee United and Tayport.

Hill of Beath (Ritchie & Wright) were the inaugural winners, beating Dundonald Bluebell (Cochrane) 2-1 in the final before an estimated crowd of 1,000 at Glenrothes' Warout Stadium in June 1996. Tayport, who had won the Scottish Cup two weeks earlier, were odds on cup favourites that season, having earlier eliminated Newburgh, Kelty Hearts and Lochee United, but went down 3-2 to Dundonald in the semi-final. Rosyth lost 5-0 to Haws in the quarter finals.

Tayport did, however, make their first final the following season but lost out 2-1 to St Josephs (Kopel, McGill - Coventry)

It was 1999 before Tayport got their name on the trophy, beating St Andrews United 5-1 (Reilly 2, Ross 2, Ramsay - Dochard) in the final at Glenesk Park. Twelve months later, Tayport became the first team to retain the trophy, beating Bankfoot on penalties after a 1-1 draw (Cameron - Keddie) at Glenesk.

Although Tayport would appear in another two finals in 2005 and 2006, there was to be no victory parade, Hill of Beath and Lochee United respectively, winning these games 1-0 and 3-1.

Rosyth's best run in the competition was 2004/05 when they reached the semi final, beating Bankfoot, Lochee Harp and Violet on the way, before losing to Tayport on the Canniepairt by the only goal of the game, scored by Ralph Hunter.

It was the second meeting between the sides, the first being in a 2nd round tie in 2003, when 'Port won 4-0 on the Canniepairt (Peters, Ward, Craik and Evans).

Today, then, is the third meeting of Tayport and Rosyth, the previous two also being on the Canniepairt. The visitors are looking for their first win and their first goal whilst Tayport are looking to complete a treble. Rosyth can take heart from Tayport's recent record in the competition, defeats at Oakley two seasons ago and at home to Thornton Hibs last term.

Tayport desperate for a positive outcome today




