



TODAY'S GAME

SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v BO'NESS UNITED

Such is the competitive nature of this season's Super League that every game on the card this afternoon could well be described by each participating club as 'crucial'. This afternoon's event on the Canniepairt is certainly in that category, with both sides haunted by the spectre of relegation, and looking on today's game as the proverbial six pointer. And to think, only six weeks ago, a disputed penalty five minutes from time stood between Tayport and the top of the table position. Since then it's been four league defeats, three by the odd goal.

Like Tayport, Bo'ness enjoyed a successful period around Christmas and the turn of the year, the 4-0 defeat by Tayport in the corresponding game at Newtown Park excepted. The BUs recorded three wins in that period, the third of which was at defending champions Lochee United. Since then it's been three draws and four defeats in seven games.

Without a win in six games, the Bo'ness committee did what committees and boards do in such circumstances, they sacked the manager, or at least they parted company with the manager, and Dundee FC (and Tayport FC) legend Eric Sinclair was on his way following a 3-1 defeat at Kelty Hearts. The club then did what clubs do when they have just parted company with a manager, they put the assistant manager in charge and the team put in a battling performance. Despite being down to ten men, the BUs salvaged a point in a 1-1 draw with a Camelon side which had scored twelve goals and collected full points from their previous two games.


Despite the rumours flying about regarding somebody new wearing the manager's coat, it's pretty likely the club's record goalscorer Paul McKinlay, assistant to Sinclair, will be charged with keeping Bo'ness in the Super League. Substitute Scott Brown saw red for two yellows last week, so is likely to be on the bench again this week. Indeed there's likely to be little change in the visitors' line-up.

Willie Garner gave defender Dean Wallace his first start last week against Rosyth and Darren Scott and Madras College X1's captain Michael Gray livened things up when they came on as substitutes. Derek Wemyss and Adam O'Connor were also on the bench but will be in contention for a starting place today. Grant Paterson, though, injured v Hill of Beath, could have to wait for a return to action.

The Secretary's Report for season 1978-79

The season just finished was fairly successful, one of the club's best ever in fact. Both teams won their respective premier cups, the Bremner and Alliance Cups. An extended run in the Scottish and Fife Cups proved to be most enjoyable both on and off the park. Given a couple of breaks, I feel we could have gone even further. The Scottish Cup run was the furthest that any Tayport team has gone in the national trophy.

We disappointed in the leagues, but I think we suffered more than most with having one of the biggest backlogs of fixtures to play after we had got ourselves free of the outstanding cup fixtures. We dropped two places, from 5th to 3rd, and the Alliance team slipped from 3rd to 4th. A bad patch midway through the season cost them dearly.

Training attendances throughout the season were, in the main, excellent and the ex-manager/coach Bobby Waddell has to be congratulated for his tremendous enthusiasm. The committee and players were all sorry to see Bobby go. He has seen the club rise to its present respected position in his time with us and his experience in the Senior game has rubbed off on both players and committee.

However, the committee feel that with our new manager, former player lan White, things can only continue to improve and I would ask the players and committee alike to give him your full support next season. Ian Dorward, well known in north Fife footballing circles, has been appointed manager of the Alliance team.

Off the field things have developed slowly, particularly the social club. The committee is awaiting details of price of the building planned by our architects.

The new pitch should be ready in August but despite a series of meetings with the club's solicitor and the District Council's legal and parks departments, no lease has been forthcoming.

This week's game at Tayport represents the biggest match of the season so far for Bo'ness United. Both clubs are sitting in the middle of the table with Tayport having played the same amount of games but are a single point behind. However with all the teams below them having games in hand Bo'ness and Tayport are equally desperate to win points to ensure their Super League survival.

The BUs showed up well on Saturday and fully deserved their hard won point against Camelon Juniors. The big plus though was the spirit shown by the players who fought back after going behind to a controversial penalty while seeing Scott Brown sent off for a double dose of dissent. Clearly a difficult match at Tayport will require that same team spirit though the players must keep their discipline as they will need all their resources to have any chance of victory.

Tayport find themselves in a very unusual situation in that they are usually fighting for prizes rather than struggling near the wrong end of the league. Tayport started 2009 with a win at Bo'ness that was followed by two victories at home to Kelty and away at Whitburn. However since then a draw against Bathgate followed by three defeats leave Tayport in the precarious position they are in now. In saying that a penalty kick shootout victory against Rosyth in the Redwood Leisure Cup gave Tayport the taste of success and by all accounts they were unlucky to go down narrowly at Bonnyrigg the week before.

Tayport were worthy victors at Newtown Park earlier in the year and though a visit to the Canniepairt is a daunting prospect Bo'ness have won there in the past and must look to repeat that achievement of five years ago.

After the game on Saturday both teams will only have three matches left to ensure Super League football for next season and therefore the scene is set for an epic survival encounter. It is therefore the time for all Bo'ness United supporters to make the trip to Fife to get behind their team and give them the support to inspire them to victory.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT



Robbie Holden, who moved from the Canniepairt to Kinnoull midway through the season is playing a key role for his new club as they bid to get back into the Super League. In a splendid 3-0 win at Penicuik last Saturday, Robbie scored one and set up the other 'Noull goals. Mind you, the home side's cause wasn't helped by getting two players ordered off in the opening half hour. Another ex-Tayport Robbie, Robbie Henderson, is also starring for his club. After a spell out injured Robbie is back amongst the goals as Cove Rangers head for a second successive Highland League championship.

Tayport fans would not be surprised to note that Glenrothes' Benny Andrews was ordered off v Bathgate on Saturday past for an 'off the ball incident'. On this occasion the match officials spotted the offence unlike on the Canniepairt a few weeks ago when Ronnie Kenneth went off for retaliation following an unprovoked off the ball incident perpetrated by Andrew.

In the days before Senior clubs recruited their players from kindergartens, Junior clubs were rich breeding grounds for the big boys. Bo'ness United, founded in 1945, were no exception. Hibs' John Blackley, Hearts' Donald Ford, Aberdeen's Paddy Buckley were all full Scottish internationalists who cut their teeth at Bo'ness. However, arguably the most famous of the many players who moved on from Newtown Park, was Alex Scott, right winger in the famous 1960s Rangers forward line of Scott, McMillan, Miller, Brand & Wilson.

Missing from the touchline this afternoon is Willie Garner's assistant Jim Moffat. Jim's in France for the next week with Bell Baxter HS's sports teams. Also there is trip veteran, the Herald football reporter Derek Ritchie, who's manager of the school's 1st XI football team. According to Jim, Derek's the guy you don't stray far from, as he's the man with the lingo!

Look for a healthy Bo'ness travelling support this afternoon. The game's been billed locally thus: 'this week's game at Tayport represents the biggest match of the season so far for Bo'ness United'. Given that United have twice this season played Scottish Cup semi-finalists Auchinleck Talbot, it's a measure of how important this game is.

Apart from the fact that local garage owner Tom Willison drives a train at the Bo'ness & Kinneil Railway, there are a couple of other - football - connections between Tayport and Bo'ness. United's Jon Mitchell won a Scottish Cup medal with 'Port when we defeated Linlithgow in the 2003 final. Tayport manager that day was Dave Baikie who was in charge of Bo'ness for a relatively brief spell in 2005/06 in between Senior engagements.

It'll be a fairly quiet April, May and June for Tayport's players. Compared with the other seasons since the Super League was introduced, that is. After today we have a minimum of 5 games to play and, should we reach the final of the Redwood and Currie Cups, a maximum of 13 games. Compare that with the 29 in 2002, 24 in 2005 and 22 in both 2003 and 2007. Fewest we've played during this period was 15 in 2006.




