

Poor stuff at Carmuirs

CAMELON JUNIORS 0 KELTY HEARTS 1 (Mauchlen 2 mins)

Having scored no less than 11 goals in their last two home games it was hoped that Camelon could continue where they left off at Carmuirs Park but sadly that was not to be the case on a day when their big guns fell silent.

With 33 goals apiece so far this season, Camelon and Kelty Hearts are the highest scoring sides in the East Superleague – but you wouldn't have known it on this display.

Camelon were without Blair Batchelor and skipper Stuart Cringean and both were sorely missed – Batchelor for his creativity up front and Cringean for his steady influence in defence.

As it was, though, Camelon were lucky it wasn't all over bar the shouting by half time. With just two minutes on the clock keeper JC Hutchison shouted for Jimmy Mitchell to leave a cross ball. He did, but Hutchison couldn't get to it before Ian Mauchlen and he nipped in between them to nod the ball home. It was not the best of starts for the Mariners who got off the hook another three times before the break.

In the 18th minute hesitation from Steve Kiczynski allowed Tom McGeorge to send in a looping shot that went just over and, one minute later, there was another let-off for Camelon when the same player pulled his effort wide with the goal at his mercy. Shortly after that there was more danger when Graeme Findlay unleashed a shot from the edge of the area that Hutchison did well to save low at his left hand post.

Somehow, however, Camelon managed to go in to the break trailing by just one goal. Early in the second half Hutchison brought off another good save to deny John Martin. For the Mariners, though, their first shot on target was an Andy Dick free-kick in the 65th minute which was easily held by Hearts' keeper Allan Fleming.

Yet it was Dick who was to create Camelon's best chance of the game. With five minutes remaining he combined well with Chris Jeffrey to slice open the Kelty defence before firing in a low shot that bounced back off the post to safety. But the game wasn't helped by the match officials. The linesman on the pavilion side was yards behind play while his counterpart on the other side couldn't see a ball that was out although he was only three yards away.


As for the referee, he booked Camelon's Mark Gillespie, Bryan Bell and Chris Donnelly along with Kelty's Tom Courts.

But he wasn't finished there. With two minutes to go he ordered assistant manager Steve Kerrigan from the technical area and, after the game, summoned Gary Thom to his dressing room to show him a red card.

At least the referee had more to write about the Camelon players than yours truly.

TODAY'S GAME SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT V CAMELON



With stunning 6-0 and 5-2 wins over Glenrothes and Hill of Beath in mid March, Camelon served notice they were putting in a title challenge but a 1-1 draw at Bo'ness followed by a single goal defeat at home by Kelty Hearts last week damaged these hopes somewhat.

However, all is not lost and with every game in this incredible league campaign in the 'must win' category for every team, we can expect today's game to be a tight affair. We've reached mid April and somebody pointed out during the week that, in theory anyway, any team can still win the championship and any team can still be relegated. That will all change this afternoon, though, with four clubs finishing the day with only two league fixtures to play.

An intriguing aspect of today's game is that the East Region's top two Super League goalscorers, Chris Jeffrey and Ronnie Kenneth, will likely be in the opposing No 9 jerseys. Chris drew a blank last week but Ronaldo notched a hat-trick to cap a fine personal performance as Tayport collected a vital three points in a 3-1 win over Bo'ness.

Camelon boss Greg Denham could offer up an excuse for last week's disappointing performance by pointing to the absences of striker Blair Batchelor and influential no nonsense defender and team captain Stuart Cringean. Both are expected to return to action this afternoon but there could be a doubt whether full back Bryan Bell makes it. Denham will be impressing on his troops the need to get back in the groove, with a League Cup final to contest later this month.

Willie Garner reports that everybody trained this week, but an injury picked up at training by Darren Scott saw him finish up on Norrie Marshall's treatment table, so he's bound to be a doubt this afternoon.

It's the third of at least four home games on the bounce for Tayport and their penultimate Super League game on the Canniepairt. The stakes are high again today so let's hope the players can meet the expectation of their supporters.



FROM THE ARCHIVES

Easter time at Tayport FC for many years from 1973 meant the annual trip abroad to play in an international amateur football tournament in Liege, Belgium. It was always a jolly jaunt which spawned literally hundreds of tales which have been re-told on many an occasion, some of them bizarre in the extreme, whether it was hospital visits, hair raising rides in a Congo mercenary's Mercedes, gendarme stations where the plaintive cry "but I'm just a wee farmer frae The Gauldry" cut little ice or arriving at a snow covered local airport direct from the disco at 7 am for the 7.30am return Sabena Airways flight from Liege to Heathrow.

In these early years, the party of players, committee and supporters travelled to Belgium either by coach (no loos or air con in those days), cross channel hovercraft, cross channel ferry or even by air. Arrival in France and disembarking from a hovercraft on the beach was quite an experience for many of the Tayport party for whom a trip to Butlins at Ayr was the closest thing to foreign travel in those days.

Accommodation in Belgium for the trips in the beginning was camp beds in primary school classrooms. Then it was rooms at a college dormitory before graduating eventually to 3* hotels.

Not much English was spoken in the industrial suburbs of Liege where the tournament was staged, so the party usually had an interpreter in tow. In the early years, French teachers Doug Henderson (who also played) or Dave Seth were the interpreters. Messrs Seth and Henderson are still very much to the fore at the Canniepairt as season ticket holders who rarely miss a match, home or away.

No trip was complete without a bagpiper or accordionist in tow and these guys inevitably endeared themselves to the locals

No interpreter was required however in one of the local bars in dust encrusted Ougree. The bar was named 'Le Kilt' and the landlady was a Glasgow girl who had married a local.

After coming close to tournament success on several occasions only to fall at the final hurdle, Tayport finally made the breakthrough, on April 11/12 1982 when wins v DC Cointe and Italians AC Roana put Tayport into the final where the host club AC Ougree were beaten 4-0. Tayport's Philip Smith, later sold to Forfar Athletic for £100, won the Player of the Tournament award and Alan Harte,

later to play with Arbroath FC, won the Young Player of the Tournament award.

Biggest problem thereafter was getting the giant trophy home to Tayport. It might have got there in one piece had it not flown off the baggage carousel at Heathrow!

For the record, the 31 strong party on the successful 1982 trip exactly twenty seven Easters ago, were Charlie Anderson, Jimmy Lindsay, Herx, Ross Macmillan, Abby Oswald, Eddie Stewart (all committee) and team manager Drew Herd. Players were Angus Charity, Rab Downie, Neil Downie, Colin Gray, Gus Malone, Kenny Smith, Alan Hart, Alan Harte, Sandy Hamilton, Kevin Murphy, Bruce Burnett, Jimmy Bissett, Ian Howe, Phil Smith, Frank Feechan, Dean Anderson, Alan Paterson, Barrie Toner and Bobby Wilson.

Also on board were club president William 'Frisco' Payne, vice president Jim 'the Fox' Rae, supporters George Hannah,, Sid Burnett and interpreter Dave Seth.

Cost per head for the five day trip was £110.

Camelon Juniors F.C. "The Mariners"

History of the Club

Camelon Juniors was founded in 1920 and for a team that comes from deep in the central belt of Scotland their nickname, "The Mariners" requires a bit of explanation. It is generally accepted that the nickname goes back to the time when Camelon was a thriving shipping port on the Forth and Clyde Canal at the point where it is linked to the Union Canal.

Over the years the club has produced several big names including; Jerry Dawson who went on to play for Rangers and Falkirk. Frank McAuley who also went on to play for Rangers and later became manager of Norwich City. Not surprisingly several Camelon players made their way to Falkirk including Birkenshaw, Nisbet, Silcock and of course more recently Kevin McAllister. Kevin also went on to play for Chelsea and Hibs before returning to Brockville.

Jack Ross, who had played for Lochee United at Tannadice v Camelon in the 1995 Scottish Junior Cup semi final, moved on to Clyde where he became team captain before going south to Hartlepool and has now returned to his native Falkirk.

Many Camelon players have been capped for Junior Scotland. In the recent past Gary Smith, Sean Bonnar, Scott Hendry, Davie Flynn and Christie McKenzie have had the honour of representing their country at Junior level.

The Mariners have made three appearances in the Scottish Cup Final, the first in 1952 when they were beaten 1-0 by Kilbirnie Ladeside. However it was the mid nineties which was their most successful spell, winning the Cup in 1995 when they beat Whitburn in the final 2-0 and the following year when they again reached the final only to be beaten by Tayport. During this period they also lifted the East of Scotland League; the Skol League Cup and the East of Scotland Cup.

Carmuirs Park

In 1920 when Camelon Juniors paid their 5 shillings to gain membership of the Stirlingshire Junior Association and the additional 4 shillings to enter the Scottish Cup they had no recognised ground of their own. The club found it increasingly difficult with no ground of their own and "home" games were played as far afield as Stirling and Bo'ness. Tired of being the "nomad" club Camelon's committee was forced to take stock of themselves and the future of the club.

A proposed field at Larbert Road did not materialise and the Committee had to look elsewhere. They summoned up their persuasive powers and approached a local farmer, Mr George Strang, who had extensive land on the north side of the Forth and Clyde Canal. When Mr Strang heard that all but two of Camelon's players had been in the Army he offered the club a field which lay on the north bank of the canal. The committee were delighted and it took very little labour to turn the field into a football park. After it was roped out and the goalposts erected it was ready for play. The touch line was four yards from the spectators which gave the players the luxury of not be jostled by the spectators.

The ground took its name from the farm on which it stood. Carmuirs Park was born and the worry and inconvenience of not having a playing field ended. Since that time there have been several improvements. The erection of the pavilion and the enclosure, the levelling of the playing surface and the creation of the terracing has made Carmuirs Park one of the best stadiums and playing surfaces in Scottish Junior Football and even the envy of many senior clubs. The erection of a covered enclosure in front of the pavilion in the 1990s, has added to the attraction of the Stadium.



SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT



"The end is nigh", read one weekend headline. It was referring to the future of Craigmark Burntonians, the south Ayrshire club who play in the West Region's Ayrshire District League. The article continued... "The end is nigh for Craigmark after only two people turned out at a public crisis meeting on Sunday. Now the Dalmellington junior club fear this season will be their last. Tommy Farrell, 72, has been on the committee for 44 years but is shocked at the apathy of the people of Doon Valley. He said: "It will break my heart to pull down the shutters after 44 years but I can see no other option. People are just not interested and we can't continue this way. "If half a dozen people had turned out, we could have survived. But despite handing out hundreds of leaflets, no one wants to know. We have tried everything but nothing is working. "I have been trying to do countless jobs while our manager Lawrie Dinwoodie even lines the park and does far more than other bosses. "Dinwoodie admitted: "I can't see where we can turn. I even had posters up at Saturday's game but there was no response. "Craigmark is my local team and where I want to be but I don't just want to be making up the numbers as I want the team to have a chance."

Craigmark was formed in 1929 and became juniors in 1947. They reached the semi-finals of the Scottish Junior Cup in 1962/63 when a crowd of 12,000 saw them lose 3-0 to Irvine Meadow at Rugby Park.

There was general disappointment for many of those who purchase the Sunday Mail and total disappointment for those who buy it solely for the junior football results and reports when there was neither last week. Apparently Sunday Mail and Daily Record staff were on strike and the freelancers took action in sympathy, hence no junior football, with senior football content supplied by the Press Association.

Derek Wemyss will miss the next two matches, the first Tayport player ever to be suspended as a result of the points totting up process for yellow cards. Most yellow cards attract two points and a suspension kicks in at 18. The totting up procedure only counts for league games, cup cautions are punished by monetary fines.

Tayport keeper Frazer Fitzpatrick was the Lochee United last line of defence when the Dundee side played Camelon in the semi final of the Scottish Junior Cup at Tannadice 14 years ago this month before a crowd of 4,881. Camelon won 2-1 and went on to lift the cup against Whitburn. Of the Lochee team, apart from Fitzy, only Craig Brown (North End), Jack Ross - who afterwards moved to Camelon - (Falkirk) and Ross Graham (Coupar Angus) are still playing at Junior or Senior level. Camelon have no survivors from that Wednesday (yes, Wednesday) evening.

Ronnie Kenneth's hat-trick v Bo'ness last week was Tayport's first Super League treble in over eight years, and the first to be scored on the Canniepairt. Barry McNaughton netted the club's only other treble back in December 2002 in the 5-0 demolition of Hill of Beath at Keir's Park. For the record the players who have hit hat-tricks in cup games in the intervening period are Ralph Hunter, Birdie Craik, Chris Webster, Bryan Duell and Lloyd Young.
