



It's not quite win or bust for Bonnyrigg this afternoon at the Canniepairt. They could fail to win this, their final league match of the season and then wait and see if Camelon win all three of their remaining matches. We're confient however that Bonnyrigg will prefer the easy route. That is win today and they win the title without worrying about anybody else.

For Tayport it's not all over if we lose or draw today although it would mean that we are dependant upon two of Bathgate, Whitburn, Lochee United and Glenrothes virtually losing all of their remaining matches. In this season of strange and unexpected results this is probably possible! A win would make our Super League survival very likely but not totally secure.

It was all change at New Dundas Park at the start of the season. Manager Alan Miller, a former player with Bonnyrigg, moved from Edinburgh United to fill the gap left by the waygoing of manager Pat McGlynn after twelve seasons in charge at New Dundas Park. It was clearly a wrench to leave Edinburgh after over four years in charge and a club with a greatly improved infrastructure but, as Miller said "the opportunity to manage Bonnyrigg Rose doesn't come along very often - it's not been vacant for 12 years and, as an ex-player, if I had turned it down, I would have regretted it. I had to go."

Miller went about re-building his squad, moving out players he didn't fancy and bringing in new blood. The club's progress to date has probably surprised even the manager but his sights are now firmly on the title in particular following three wins in their last three matches with the most recent being a 4 – 0 thumping of current Champions, Lochee United at New Dundas Park a week ago.

One of the more recent newcomers to the Bonnyrigg squad is defender David Dunn, signed from Forfar Athletic earlier in the year after four years and 62 games at Station Park. Dunn actually trained with Tayport a couple of times but plumped to join his home town club. Another ex-Forfar player in the visitors' ranks today is Craig Lumsden who played 21 games for the Sky Blues last season under Willie and Jim.

The Rose have a potent goal threat with Paddy Flannery, Ross Hamilton and Andy Howat all appearing in the Super League top scorers this season with 8, 7 and 6 goals respectively. You have to add Charlie Brigain to that trio after he netted a hat trick against the Bluebells last week.

Tayport progressed to the semi-final of the Redwood Leisure Cup last week with a penalty shoot out win against Dundee Violet. With only eleven fit players the cause was not helped by the dismissal of skipper Roberto Morris just before the break. Under the circumstances it was a satisfactory result and provides us with a home tie against either Ballingry Rovers or Lochee United in the semi final.

Some of last week's absentees will be available today and manager Willie Garner should have a larger squad to make his choice from.



A WORD FROM WILLIE

The league this season has been the most unpredictable ever. Teams have gone on runs of both winning and losing with no one showing much consistency. This is why we are now at a stage where nothing has been decided and we are only a few weeks away from the season end.

I believe that our destiny is in our own hands. We must go into today's game with a belief and a desire that we can retain our league status. We know we are up against a really good side. They have probably shown the most consistency of all the teams and that is why they are in the position they are in. Alan and his backroom team have done a great job in rebuilding the side and deserve great credit.

This game today is of vital importance to the club, and the players realise this fully. I cannot ask the players for more than 100% commitment and I can assure you, as supporters, you will get that.

You support today is vital. Let the players here you throughout the game.

Big games require big players. We will have big players on the park today.

DUNMORE'S ANGLE

"SUPER LEAGUE SURVIVAL ONLY ISSUE"

There is no doubt that it has been a strange few weeks for the club, with Tayport taking a keen interest in a whole host of other fixtures, while playing in only two themselves.

The only priority is Super League survival and 'Port so nearly made great strides at Thomson Park, three weeks ago. Not many gave Tayport a chance against a side who, at that time, still harboured title aspirations. A really positive start to the match, however, saw the visitors open the scoring early. Stuart Ferguson provided the delivery from the left and Reon Juskowiak, playing in a striking role, powered home a magnificent header to stun Lochee United.

After 73 minutes, Blackwood completed the comeback, netting a terrific strike from twenty-five yards out, following Gary Middleton's cushioned knock-down. It was a hammer blow for Willie Garner's men.

It might be that the solitary point gained could prove to have been a point in the right direction, but so much depends on the outcome of today's fixture, when a win would seem imperative.

Winning in the Redwood Leisure Cup, though, has not been vital. Tayport have managed to squeeze through to the semi-finals of the inter-regional competition, with a trio of 1-1 draws. Latest victims were Dundee Violet, at a sodden Glenesk Park, last weekend. Stuart Ferguson diverted a Stefan Elvin shot into the roof of the net, for Tayport's opener, only for Violet to equalise before the break, through Gavin Burns. That goal saw Roberto Morris pick up a double caution for dissent, leaving 'Port with ten men for the entire second half.

From the penalty spot, Stefan Elvin, Darren Scott, Stuart Ferguson, Barry McNaughton, just, and Ronnie Kenneth all scored. Frazer Fitzpatrick this time kept his heroics until the tenth and final kick of the shoot-out, denying Ross Kiddie.

So, the season could well have a silver lining, but that will mean little if a few Super League results don't go our way, starting here, this afternoon.



Quite a character was Willie, another who played for Tayport in Belgium and in so doing spawned a number of amusing anecdotes.

East Fife and Saints were chasing his signature following his exploits for 'Port but Willie plumped for Saints.

Willie did get to Bayview, however, signing for the Methil club after leaving Saints before eventually ending up at St Josephs when the club was under the stewardship of Peter Marr and Davie Young.

From the Archives - 73 years ago

More from the People's Journal November 1936

Further insight into Junior Football from 1911 to 1936 through the eyes of Lochee Harp's President of the era George Walls

"At one time Harp did possess a ground of their own, St Margaret's Park in Loons Road from 1911 to 1914. At one end of the ground was a big tenement and it only needed the ball to be kicked over during a match for a claim to arrive next morning against Harp for every cracked window in the land'. The neighbour wives always made out that it was Harp's ball that had cracked their window. Man, I was often very doubtful about it, but we had to pay and look pleasant."

On to 1936

"I would like to take you behind the scenes in the club. We have good clubrooms in Lochee on which money has been lavished. Come inside. Facing you is the bathroom with a plunge bath which the whole team can use mat once after a match without any overcrowding whatsoever. Sprays are there and a good tiled floor. Next to the bathroom is a very boiler ensuring an adequate supply of very necessary hot water. Two rooms are given over to the players—one as a recreation room, the other as a dressing room in which our trainer has his table for massage and attention to any injuries.

"I have told you before in the course of my articles that Harp players are a contented lot. True we have trouble now and again and I want to say here that to get a summons upstairs is something that is dreaded by Harp players. They know that if they have been guilty of some misdemeanour, they will not be mollycoddled.

"Harp players are not instructed to train. We hold the view that the nature of their employment keeps many of our men in the pink of condition. What we do, however, is to offer a prize of £1:10/- a year to the man who does the most training. Last season [1935] seven players had an equal number of marks for attendance and work. One pound and ten shillings [50p] could not go very far amongst the players so the committee decided to give them 10 shillings each. It was money well spent.

"Our bonus system of payment to players has been a closed book to many people but I am able to tell you here how it works. Suppose we are playing a match at Glenesk Park. Just after half time the Harp committee will hold a little informal meeting a few yards from the clubhouse. There we will be told the amount of the gate and expenses. So much money is then put aside for subsequent expenditure in running the club and a bonus is handed over to the players immediately after the game. For an ordinary league games this ranges from 2/- [10p] upwards. We played a big cup tie at Glenafton Juniors and the bonus was £2 per man.

"Rarely do we have much trouble with our players. Take a chap who might get what I call 'on the sawdust' – in other words, a drinking bout. I don't object to our men having a glass of beer – often it does them good. But I do object, and I think rightly so, to anybody soaking. It doesn't long for some pal to come along and let me know that so and so is spending too much time in public houses. I send for the player to come upstairs to the committee room, and I tell him 'I do not pose as your keeper, but a lot of beer and football just don't go. If you want to stay in football cut it down. Better still, in your case, cut it out for a while'. Invariably that has the desired effect.

"There is one point in Junior football, however, which does give me the greatest concern. That is refereeing. I personally think that refereeing is getting worse. I have never known it to be poorer than in Dundee this year. Ninety per cent of the trouble with spectators at Junior matches is caused by referees. I hope that before long we will see a big improvement. I do not blame the players when things become rough – I blame the man with the whistle. The control of referees has been centralised but while a referee may be a past master in the theory of the game, he is often at sea on the pitch" out for a while'. Invariably that has the desired effect".

Still the same issues as 73 years ago, broken window complaints (in our case caravan windows), duff refereeing. Hot plunge baths and showers pre -war must have had harp well ahead of the game. It was another 40 years before that luxury was enjoyed at Tayport and the multi purpose Belfast sink was done away with.
