TODAY'S GAME TAYPORT v LINLITHGOW SUPER LEAGUE 4/22



The contrast today could hardly be greater. Linlithgow Rose's new manager Brian Fairley brings the league leaders to the Canniepairt looking for a ninth win in ten starts this season while Tayport boss Iain Jenkins has yet to preside over a Tayport victory of any description in ten games since taking over the reins at Tayport.

If ever there was a time to kick start a season, then this would be Tayport's opportunity and in their favour is a fine home record over the Prestonfield club of six wins in eight Canniepairt meetings.

Whilst retaining the experience of long serving players like Danny Smith, Ian Gallacher, Gordon Herd and Stuart McArthur, Rose have brought in a host of new players. International keeper Marc Graham was signed from Hill of Beath, defender Mark Robertson from Bonnyrigg, youngsters Kenny Waugh and Gary Livingston joined up from Hibs and Celtic respectively. Further firepower was added by the acquisition of Chris Geddes from Forfar Athletic and Lee Black from Sauchie. Barry Donald from Albion Rovers and Aaron James from English non-league football completed Fairley's shopping list.

Kenny Waugh opened the scoring for Lithgae in their 2-1 derby win over Bo'ness last Saturday, but the turning point was the introduction on the hour mark of Gordon Herd. Returning after injury, the fresh legs of the substitute caused the BU's defence no end of problems and he won the penalty from which Mark Bradley scored the winner.

Tayport looked the more accomplished side at the Warout last week for an hour but thereafter they seemed to run out of steam and ideas. Glens sensed the chance of taking something from the game and duly did so with two goals in the last five minutes. 'Port will still be without Steve Fallon who has been suffering from tonsillitis and youngster Scott McCrindle has been allowed to go back to Cowdenbeath.

Changes to the starting line-up look certain as manager Jenkins looks for a strategy and the blend which can improve a record of a solitary goal in three Super League outings.

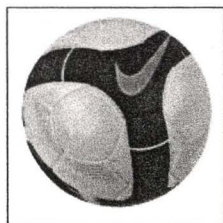

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS **LINLITHGOW ROSE**



After lifting the Scottish Junior Cup and Super League in 2007 to earn a place in the Scottish Senior Cup, it was probably no surprise that Linlithgow suffered something of a hangover last season to finish mid table and indeed briefly flirt with the spectre of relegation.

Understandably, their magnificent exploits in the Scottish Senior Cup took the limelight. Great wins v Newton Stewart, Spartans and Dalbeattie Star in the first three rounds set up a media attractive tie with eventual runners-up and European qualifiers Queen of the South in the 4th round. Despite going down 4-0 to the full timers, Linlithgow put in an impressive performance which was a credit to the Junior game and warranted a standing ovation.

It was a cup run which showed just how much the administrators had got it wrong over the years by excluding Junior clubs. Rose attracted the biggest attendances of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd round ties, their 1,683 v Spartans only being eclipsed by Pollok's 1,873 in their replay v Montrose. The widest smile in the Junior game would certainly have been that of the Rose treasurer.

Yes, last season must have been a great season to be following the Rose. However the pressure told and before the end of the season the shoogly peg on which manager Jim Sinnet's jacket had been hanging gave way and Jim was off to pastures new. Pollok as it turned out.

After a bit of deliberation, Rose appointed former Whitburn, Stenhousemuir, Bo'ness, Dumbarton and Forfar Athletic boss Brian Fairley as Sinnet's successor. Although a core of players with a number of seasons at Prestonfield has been retained, Brian has brought in something like eight new faces, most of whom will be making their Canniepairt debut.

Dunmore's angle Glenrothes - a bitterly disappointing result for the Tayport contingent.

Tayport go into today's tough assignment with only one point to their name, three matches into the new East Super League season. The last home fixture was a fortnight ago, when Whitburn visited the Canniepairt and, yet again, 'Port failed to get the better of the Lothians outfit.

The visitors scored midway through the first half, when Alex Lurinsky followed up to score, after Frazer Fitzpatrick had stopped a Kenny Hannah shot. This was an ominous start, given Tayport's dire record against Whitburn, but the dismissal of Hannah, for a double bout of dissent, provided hope.

'Port went on to dominate possession, but found it hard to break down the resolute visiting defence. As the clock ticked down, Tayport were eventually rewarded for their endeavour, when Barry McNaughton was on hand to head the equaliser, his 21st Super League goal for the club.

That point was viewed as a step in the right direction, but there was a backwards step at Glenrothes, the following weekend. Initially, Tayport created chances, although they failed to convert. Then, towards half-time, the Glens were to the fore, without breaking through.

Goalless midway through the half, it looked as though a draw was on the cards, only for Glenrothes substitute Graham Nicoll to enter the fray and make a telling contribution against his former team. Nicoll pounced on 85 minutes, after a corner kick, to open the scoring, and, in the final minute, his header against the bar enabled Lee Duffy to ram home a second goal for the Warout men. A bitterly disappointing result for the Tayport contingent.

Let's hope for a better outcome this afternoon. No doubt, though, that Tayport will have to perform at their very best, as Linlithgow will arrive at the Canniepairt in confident mood.

Some may consider the romance of the cup was never more evident than when the draw for the 1st Round of the Scottish FA Cup was made a few weeks ago. However, try telling that to Lochee United and Bathgate Thistle. Of all the romantic sounding places in all of the country, they had to be drawn together at the less than romantic surroundings of Thomson Park, Dundee. Fellow Super League side Bathgate, at £8 a head, won't be the attraction that a Highland League or East of Scotland League side might have been. For either side however, it's a great opportunity to make round 2. Of course, win or lose, there's a share of the cup pot.

Mainland Scotland's two furthest apart clubs, Wick Academy and St Cuthbert Wanderers, have been drawn together and meet at Kirkcudbright. To get the distance in perspective, Wick is on the same latitude as Stavanger in Norway, whilst Kirkcudbright is as far south as Newcastle. And it's not as if they are linked by a motorway.

There are other lengthy journeys, eg Newton Stewart v Brora, Dalbeattie v Lossiemouth, Fraserburgh v Hawick, Golspie v Threave, Wigtown v Forres. It was suggested that Rothes would want to avoid a replay and a trip to the central belt until it was pointed out that Buckie Thistle aren't sponsored by a drinks firm but play in the Highland League.

A DAY IN ... SEPTEMBER 1992

Tayport went into this league match on 12th September 1992 on the back of six successive wins and were hotly tipped to maintain their 100% record but it wasn't to be and a goal after 25 minutes from Dave Scott was enough to give newly promoted Albion a famous victory.

The club archives noted that *"Tayport huffed and puffed but it just wasn't their day. Biggest attraction was the appearance of Liz McColgan"* [Liz's brother, Kevin Lynch - now Chief Inspector Lynch - was playing for Tayport]
 It was the only league game Tayport would lose all season, a season in which the club made the first of six Scottish Junior Cup final appearances

Tayport suffered their first reversal of the season when a below par performance allowed newly promoted Albion to grab both points at the Canniepairt.

An early header by Sommerville cannoned off the underside of the crossbar and, shortly before the break, the same player saw another headed effort stopped by impressive Albion keeper, Taylor.

Midway through the half, Scott had fired the visitors ahead from a tight angle after picking up a cross ball from the right which deceived Tayport custodian Mann.

The home support were confident that, with the wind behind them after the break, Tayport would soon level things and, after forcing three corners in succession, Jimmy Hunter then saw his well-struck volley clutched by the acrobatic Taylor.

As the game wore on, and a measure of frustration started to creep in, Tayport introduced Lynch, who gave them a bit more width on the left — something noticeably missing throughout the game due to the absence of the work-committed Lamont.

However, despite a late onslaught on the visitors' goal — including a great effort from Paterson which produced the inevitable fine stop from Taylor — the Port could not produce the necessary finish to salvage a point from a disappointing performance.

Forfar West End, now the two point leaders are the next opposition for Tayport, and a match which was always going to be interesting to say the least, could now turn out to be a cracker. The game, at Strathmore Park, Forfar, has a 3 p.m. kick-off and supporters' transport leaves the football ground at 1 p.m.

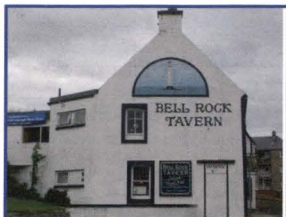
