Some Tayport v Broughty Athletic trivia

- The teams have met on 18 previous occasions, Tayport winning 13 and drawing 3
- Broughty are unbeaten in the last three encounters between the teams.
- The 1-1 draw between the sides earlier this season is the first time Broughty have avoided defeat in eight previous visits to the Canniepairt.
- Grant Paterson, Tayport's left back, has played in all 18 of Tayport's games v Broughty.
- The sides first met in 1990, a 1-1 draw at Whitton Park.
- Biggest attendance in games between the teams was 409 who watched Tayport win 2-1 in the 2001 Findlay Cup Final.
- Grant Paterson, hardly a prolific scorer, has netted two of his 21 goals in 863 matches, v Broughty. The most recent was in an 8-0 win in 1995.
- The biggest winning margin was eight goals on two occasions. There have also been 7-0 & 6-0 scoreline, all in Tayport's favour
- Broughty have managed a clean sheet only once in 18 fixtures.
- Since Tayport joined the Juniors in 1990 there have been 7 seasons when the sides did not play each other.
- As the crow - or seagull - flies, Broughty Athletic are our nearest neighbours.
- There were occasions, as recently as the 1960s, when Tayport FC travelled by boat from Tayport harbour to Broughty Ferry harbour for a Midlands Amateurs game (no road bridge then and maybe the trains were on strike)
- Top Tayport scorer in games v Broughty is Dave Reilly with 11. Hamish Mackay with 4 goals, has scored most in one game. Bryan Duell, Kenny Cameron and Dave Reilly have notched hat-tricks
- Grant Buist, who was signed by Tayport from Broughty in 1995, went on to make two Scottish Cup Final appearances for 'Port

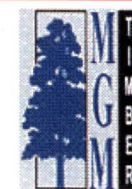

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS BROUGHTY ATHLETIC

We welcome our neighbours from across the Tay to the Canniepairt for the clubs' first ever meeting in the Scottish Junior Cup, one of the world's oldest football competitions which has been contested for some 123 years.

Formed in 1922, Broughty were originally known as Broughty Ex-servicemen. Honours have been fairly thin on the ground over the last eighty six or so years, with a trio of Tayside Division two titles in '70, '80 and '86 the sole league honours and a couple of Courier Cups in 1960 and 1972 being the major of 20 cup wins.

Broughty seem to have short changed themselves by not listing some of their honours in their records. Not recorded are Barrie Consolation Cup (also known as Forfarshire Junior Consolation Cup) wins in 1933 and 1936, two Telegraph Cup wins as Broughty Ex-servicemen in 1937 and 39 and a Laing Cup win in 1949.

Under the stewardship of club chairman Gordon Deuchars of GA Engineering, and manager Kenny Cameron, Broughty have been slowly welded into an effective outfit, but to date their promise has never really been fulfilled. By getting off to a blistering start this season in the East Region's North Division, maybe things are changing.

Broughty's main goal threat comes from the confident strike force of ex Montrose player, No.7 James Russell, as *Fed*, a regular contributor to Tayport FC's website incidentally, who has five goals this season and last season's top scorer with 32 goals, 19 year old No.5 Derek Farrell who has 4 competitive goals this term. Another player to catch the eye is their No 6, former East Craigie, Montrose FC and North End player Robert Smith.

A familiar figure wearing Broughty colours this afternoon is No.3, veteran defender Bobby Brown, whose first competitive game on the then newly laid out Canniepairt was over thirty years ago for Harris FP prior to his move to Brechin City where he stayed for many, many seasons. He has since played here with Forfar West End, Elmwood and Violet for whom the occasional own goal was always heartily welcomed by the Port support.

Amongst other Broughty players who have played here for other Junior clubs are No.9 striker Ross Kenny (Arbroath SC, Lochee Utd and North End), No.18 Lee Bertie (North End, Downfield and Lochee United), No.11 Iain McLeod (Harp, Lochee United, Violet and Carnoustie)

The contrast today could hardly be greater. Broughty arrive at the Canniepairt on the back of a run of six successive victories and in those six games have not conceded a single goal. Indeed the last goal they lost was here at the Canniepairt when Darren Scott's header equalised Marc O'Leary's earlier strike for the Whitton Park club when the teams shared two goals in the League Cup back in August.

Tayport, on the other hand, are currently on their worst ever run, no wins in eight games and only four goals scored in these games. There's not only a contrast in results, however, there's obviously a big contrast in recent opposition with Broughty lining up against third tier opponents in the league whilst Tayport have been facing Super League sides.

Manager Kenny Cameron, the former Tayport striker who was Port's top scorer with 52 goals ten years ago, will have his troops well prepared for today's cup tie. He will have his lads well aware that today will be different and his side will be out to prove they can again match a Super League team.

The contrasts continue when the clubs' respective Scottish Cup records are compared. Broughty's best is a 5th round appearance sixteen years ago whilst Tayport's record of six cup final appearances during the same period tells the story of the competition's most successful side. Kenny will be reminding his charges of this but at the same time telling his team that is history and any team is only as good as its last result.

But Tayport are still to be feared as Linlithgow demonstrated. Although recording two narrow wins on the last two Saturdays, in both matches, the Super League leaders were extremely grateful to hear the final whistle.

Those Tayport fans who missed the match, missed a skilful and gutsy performance by their team and but for hitting the post three times, losing a controversial opening goal and being denied a six yard box free kick for a passback to the keeper in the last minute, might have got a result at Prestonfield.

However, Tayport will settle for points and progress as opposed to praise and hard luck stories. You make your own luck, so let's hope that's the case today against a Broughty side who felt hard done by taking only a point from the League Cup meeting.

DUNMORE'S ANGLE

*Far greater significance today than
when the teams last met*

Today's Scottish Junior Cup tie against Broughty assumes far greater significance than the last meeting of the teams, in the DJ Laing League Cup, six weeks ago. That match was drawn, so Tayport know that the Fed' will pose a threat this afternoon, yet Sean Wilkie's side can go into the fixture in confident mood.

Yes, the double-header against Linlithgow brought two defeats, but the performances were encouraging. When the Rosie Posie came to town a fortnight ago, pre-match chat centred on Tayport's managerial departure. The players, however, acquitted themselves well and were unlucky not to take the lead. Roberto Morris had a header cleared off the line and 'keeper Marc Graham saved well from Robbie Holden.

Stuart McArthur netted what proved to be the winning goal, on the half hour, but, over the piece, Tayport matched their visitors.

They did so again at Prestonfield in last weekend's East of Scotland Cup tie, only to lose by the odd goal in three. Brian Craik, Robbie Holden, Stefan Elvin and Reon Juskowiak all came close for 'Port, before Sean Grady's controversial opener, when Rose maybe should not have contested a bounced ball after Juskowiak's head-knock.

That blow came just before half-time, although there was still time for Juskowiak and Adam O'Connor to link up and create an opening for Barry McNaughton, who missed the target.

Lithgae doubled their lead early in the second half, through Stuart McArthur, but Tayport went on to twice hit the woodwork, through Holden and Craik, and reduce the deficit, courtesy of Chris Webster's in-swinging wide free kick.

Unfortunately, three Tayport men, Juskowiak, Webster and McNaughton, were sent off in an almost farcical conclusion to a game in which there had been no sign of malice. A number of the costly yellow cards had been for dissent. True, the players should have shown more restraint. Also true is that some of the refereeing decisions which prompted the dissent bordered on the ridiculous.

Let's hope that today's game is free of controversy and, from a Tayport standpoint, that the Canniepairt outfit can enjoy a little more good fortune in front of goal. Victory in a Scottish Junior Cup tie may be the spark which can ignite Tayport's season.

From the Dressing Room

Iain Jenkins resigned his managerial post two weeks ago and since then assistant Sean Wilkie has been in charge of playing affairs and continues in that role this afternoon.

Jenks' season only lasted thirty five days into the season and he was still looking to preside over a first win. Nevertheless his resignation came as something of a surprise to the club, but we wish him all the best as he seeks to continue his career in the game.

It's a new chapter and Sean has indicated his willingness to take the club forward.

Sean barely had a fit eleven with which to work last week and had only young Mike Gray on the bench at Linlithgow.

Out of the reckoning today is skipper Roberto Morris who is on holiday, but hopefully Derek Wemyss will be fit to return.

Darren Scott has been having treatment all week but looks like missing out again as will fellow striker Ronnie Kenneth who is about a couple of weeks away from a return to action.

Following a 1-1 league draw with Carnoustie the previous week, Grant Buist returned to the side after a three game absence, replacing Mark Spalding. Birdie Craik was preferred to Graeme Nicoll up front, the same Graeme Nicoll, incidentally, who put us to the sword at Glenrothes the other week.

One of the village's best football crowds for many a day, swelled considerably by Port supporters who had made the journey north, gathered to see a Tayport side cruelly expose the gulf between the teams.

One of three hat-tricksters in the Tayport team was Kenny Cameron, now, of course, Broughty Athletic's manager. Also weighing in with trebles were Mark Corcoran and goal machine Davie Reilly. Ian Greig (2), Steven Stewart and Graeme Nicoll were the other marksmen, bringing the goal tally to thirteen without reply.

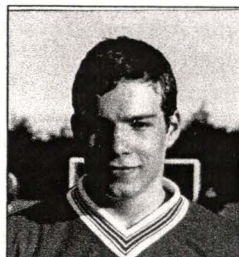

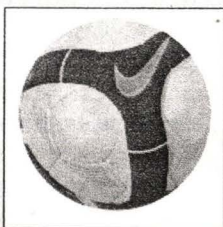

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOOT



Questions were asked on the Scottish Juniors' website following Lochee United's decision to charge £8 and £5 (concession) for admission to last Saturday's Scottish Cup tie v Bathgate. No choice, according to Lochee, but at Pollok, for the tie with a Senior club (Spartans) the charge was £5 and £2. In response, the guy from Pollok said "Total rip off. Lok v Spartans was great value at a fiver. We didn't feel there was justification for raising the price considering the opposition was non-league." A mix-up ... or opportunism?

Big stooshie in the Daily Record on Saturday over the fact that RAF Lossiemouth had been barred from next season's Scottish Junior Cup after scratching from this season's tournament. Says everything about the Record, that this story was a front page headline and the subject of an editorial. Of course the Record swallowed hook, line and sinker, the story that RAF Lossiemouth couldn't get a team because their guys had been posted to Iraq or Afghanistan. "What a way to treat our boys" or words to that effect. Wonder if the withdrawal had anything to do with the fact that they were drawn at home to Steelend Vics and had to find a £240 guarantee. Wonder, also, if they would have called off if they been drawn at home to neighbours Fochabers? It's not the first time RAF Lossiemouth have scratched after the draw's been made. The SJFA was most unfairly castigated for their decision. What's it they say, don't let the truth get in the way of a good story

The club is often asked what referees get paid at Junior level. Normally (league and local cup ties) the referee receives a fixed sum of £40 which includes an element for travelling and each assistant receives £20. For most games, therefore, the home club shells out £80 for match officials. In the Scottish Cup it's a £26 match fee + 20p per mile for expenses. Assistants get £13 and 20p per mile. Is it taxed? We don't know the answer to that one.

Gary Fraser, who was loaned to us from Forfar Athletic last season up until Christmas when he was then loaned out to Downfield, has been freed by the Station Park club.

In the last Port Prog we mentioned Wick Academy's marathon (and ultimately successful) 726 mile round trip to play St Cuthbert Wanderers in last week's Scottish (Senior) Cup 1st round. It turns out the trip wasn't the longest made in the competition. Coldstream, from just on the English border on the east of the country, reckon their trip to play Wick at the same stage of the competition in 1954 was 800 miles. A glance at a roadmap would suggest that shouldn't be the case, but 54 years ago there was no Forth Bridge and the bus couldn't go on the ferry and also had to skirt round three firths en route and this accounted for the extra miles. The team bus, with a maximum speed of 40mph, set off 48 hours before the game. It was worth it though, Coldstream winning 4-2 and they got home on Wednesday!

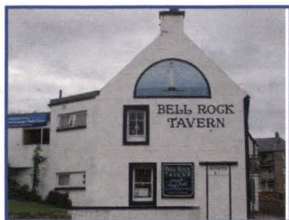
