

Today's Tayport & Forfar West End trivia


- The teams have met on 46 previous occasions, Tayport winning 33, drawing 9 and losing 4.
- The teams have contested four cup finals, all going Tayport's way.
- Kenny Cameron scored four goals in one game v West End back in season 98/99
- Grant Paterson, Tayport's left back, was sent off v Forfar West End whilst making a record breaking 500th appearance for the club
- West End failed to score a goal in the thirteen games between the sides from 1995 to 2001.
- Five opposition players have been ordered off in Forfar West End's last four Super League games.
- In 1991, Forfar WE won 1-0 in a Currie Cup tie on the Canniepairt. Tayport protested over a teamline irregularity. The Association ordered the game to be replayed. Tayport won 2-0 and went on to lift the cup.
- The biggest winning margin between the teams is seven goals, a 7-0 win for Tayport in 2000.
- West End have managed a clean sheet on only three occasions in 46 fixtures.
- Since Tayport joined the Juniors in 1990 there has been only one season - 2002/2003 - when the sides did not play each other.
- Although several players have worn the colours of both clubs, we cannot recall a direct transfer of a player between the clubs.
- Graeme Irons, aka Mel, now assistant to Dave Baikie at East Fife, was manager at Forfar West End before he put on his boots again to play for Tayport in the club's inaugural season in the Juniors.
- Grant Paterson has missed only two of Tayport's 46 games v West End.

TODAY'S GAME TAYPORT V FORFAR WEST END WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE



When Tayport and Forfar West End met for the first time back in 1990/91 season, West End were on the crest of a wave, having just won their only Tayside Championship. This afternoon the Strathmore Park club arrive at the Canniepairt, once more in ebullient mood, having confounded the pundits by soaring to second top spot in the Super League.

After losing their opening two Super League fixtures to Linlithgow and Bo'ness as they took their first, tenuous steps in top tier, West End have embarked on a four game unbeaten run and picked up ten points. Most recent success was a crushing 5-2 home win over Camelon last Saturday.

It's a match of sides with contrasting fortunes this afternoon. Whilst West End can boast of being the Super League's top scoring team and have in their ranks, the League's top marksman in veteran striker Darren Bonella, Tayport have notched only a solitary league goal, Barry McNaughton's late strike v Whitburn six weeks ago.

Manager Jim Finlayson has his team playing a fast and exciting brand of attacking football with 19 year old striker Scott Johnston causing havoc in opposing defences with his searching runs which have brought him four goals and the award of a couple of penalties. Another of Jim Finlayson's youngsters to particularly impress this season has been midfielder Grant Lawson who has already taken his tally of goals to 4.

Defensively, West End are well served by the resolute Graeme Gibb in central defence, the highly regarded full back Craig Logan and keeper Stephen Vanderdeyl whose excellent early in the game paved the way for last week's victory over Camelon.

It's a return to the Canniepairt for former 'Port player Bryan Duell who was signed from Forfar Athletic at the end of August and his jousts with his former teammates should be a feature of this afternoon's game.

Tayport's spirits will have been lifted by a good performance at Broughty last week. The 'Port support was encouraged by a more attack orientated formation and the home fans will be looking for more of the same this afternoon as they look to get their first Super League victory of the season.

LOCHEE UNITED AND BANKS O'DEE CARRY THE JUNIORS' HOPES IN NEXT SATURDAY'S HOMECOMING SCOTTISH CUP 2nd ROUND



SCOTTISH CUP WIN WAS COMPREHENSIVE AND PLEASING AND CAN BE A SPRINGBOARD FOR MORE WINS

Tayport get back to Super League business today, with Forfar West End's first such visit to the Canniepairt. 'Port will go into the match in confident mood, having eventually disposed of Broughty Athletic to reach the second round of the Scottish Junior Cup.

That tie dominated the last two Saturdays, with the initial match finishing all-square, on the Canniepairt. Sean Wilkie's troops did not play well on that afternoon, finding clear-cut chances difficult to come by.

Indeed, once Broughty had taken a first half lead, through Ross Kenny, there was a real danger of Tayport exiting the tournament. Chris Webster flashed home an equaliser, on 57 minutes, but there was another scare to come. Late in the contest, Broughty's Derek Farrell had the ball in the net, after a shot had struck the woodwork and 'Port were only saved by the linesman's flag.

Determined to avoid such narrow margins at Whitton Park, Tayport pressed forward from the outset and the pressure told in the twentieth minute, when Joe Pepper was fouled inside the area and Darren Scott tucked away the stonewall penalty kick.

A similarly bright start to the second half saw Robbie Holden have a goal chalked off before Scott did net Tayport's second. Credit should go to Barry McNaughton, whose perfectly-timed back-heel down the line sent Murray Urquhart racing down the left to cross for Scott, who completed a flowing move.

With five minutes remaining, Chris Webster expertly netted with a twenty-five yard free kick to seal his team's passage into the next round of the national competition. Brian Craik should have added a fourth, but was thwarted by the Fed' 'keeper, which was unfortunate, as young Michael Gray's fine pass was deserving of a better finish.

All told, it was a comprehensive and pleasing win for 'Port. Let's hope that the victory acts as a springboard for more such wins and that the Canniepairt outfit can start climbing the Super League table.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS FORFAR WEST END

warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Forfar West End for the sides' first ever Super League encounter at the Canniepairt.

Forfar West End manager Jim Finlayson will be feeling quite smug when he looks at the Super League table and sees his team looking down on the cream of the East Region. Quite rightly so, as he's confounded any critics who questioned whether Fiddy could take West End to these dizzy heights.

Forfar West End has an excellent set-up at Strathmore Park. It's very well located, has an adjacent social club and pie shop (important priorities, at least for Tayport supporters). It's also a neat ground which has the capacity to be further developed and there are plenty bodies on the committee.

The origins of the club stretch back 116 years to the (very) local Junior Leagues of these days which have metamorphosed into the Super Leagues of today. West End have had their moments during all the eras but the only major achievements have been the Tayside Championship in 1991 and the North/Tayside Cup in 1993 and 2008. 2008 was also the season in which Finlayson took the club to its highest ever level, the East Super League, achieving promotion as runners-up to Bo'ness United.

The immediate aim will be to firmly establish the club in the top bracket of the Junior game and avoid the yoyo scenario. That achieved, the club will have the ambition to go further to win the Super League and Scottish Junior Cup and ultimately test themselves against the best of the non-league and lower Scottish League clubs in the recently re-branded Homecoming Scottish Cup.





Our 4-0 defeat at Durham City during our pre-season tour to the north east of England is being put into perspective. We have never seen anything like it in junior football. It may be true that the Kelty commitee can do nothing to prevent this element travelling to their away games, but they could have warned us of the possibility of them coming to the game. Any club who have to entertain Kelty in the future beware..... Not exactly a Government Health Warning, but...it must have been pretty unsavoury behaviour.

Anybody who doubted whether Tayport would emerge victorious from their replay at Whitton Park last week would have paid little heed to 'Port's ability to win replays after being held at home. Fourteen times, Tayport have been held to a draw at home in Scottish Cup ties and only once have we failed to progress to the next round - last season at Pollok.
