



## TODAY'S GAME

## CITYLINK SCOTTISH CUP ROUND 2 TAYPORT v ARBROATH SC

Tayport, playing their 124th Scottish Junior Cup game this afternoon, meet Arbroath SC for the first time in the competition.

Whilst Tayport were cooling their heels last week after the late postponement of their game at Bo'ness, Arbroath SC were racking up five goals to record their biggest win of the season, 5-2 v Forfar Albion.

ASC supporters have actually been spoiled for goals this season. They've seen an average of four goals per game, with their favourites on the mark in all but one of their dozen games played to date. Not much use on the treble chance, however, as the Seaton Park club have yet to feature in a drawn game.

Manager Mark Bennett and his assistant Danny Powell have put the emphasis on youth and included in their squad are Arbroath FC loan players, keeper Sean Logie and Stuart Richardson. Richardson, however, is likely to miss out today after being injured v Forfar Albion last week. Also missing out today is striker Blair Marshall who was cup-tied for his previous club, East Craigie, v Pollok. With Arbroath operating with a small player pool, there is the possibility that former Tayport favourite Ian Greig could be brought out of retirement for today's game.

Greigy is one of four survivors from the SC team which last played here in 2005, Gary Hamilton, Jamie Martin and Gary McFarlane are the others. Surprisingly only two of the Tayport team which played in the 1-0 home victory that day, are still at the Canniepairt—Grant Paterson and Roberto Morris.

Last Saturday, Tayport had a full squad from which to select for the first time this season and that should be the situation again today when Willie Garner takes charge of the team on a match day for the first time. There was a full squad in for training last Saturday after the Bo'ness game was postponed, giving the new boss the opportunity to get to know his new players.

Today's game is only 90 minutes and in the event of a draw, the replay will be at Seaton Park next Saturday when it will be settled by penalties if level after 90 minutes.


# LOCHEE UNITED DOING THE JUNIORS PROUD IN THE HOMECOMING SCOTTISH CUP


The only disappointment for Lochee United last Saturday when they convincingly beat the Highland League's Buckie Thistle to reach the 3rd round of the Homecoming Scottish Cup was the attendance which was reported as being 202. Lochee officials had been confident of an attendance approaching four figures. One would have thought what was a historic occasion, in that it was the first time a Dundee junior side had met a Senior club in a competitive match, would have been sufficient to pull out a few more local punters.

The prize for Lochee is an eye catching home tie against Irn Bru Division Two promotion chasers Ayr United. Although Thomson Park, with its steep banking and poor access, isn't well suited to a large crowd, it's very unlikely Lochee would want to switch anywhere. And who would blame them? Get rid of Ayr and there is, of course, the possibility of a huge payday in the fourth round. Exciting times down Napier Drive way. The Ayr United tie is on 24th November.

The other surviving Junior side, Banks o' Dee, met their match at Inverurie where former Junior side Inverurie Loco Works beat them 5-1. Elsewhere there were no shocks, with the ties going pretty much as expected with perhaps the home defeats of Berwick and Cowdenbeath by Albion Rovers and Elgin respectively being the exceptions.

# THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS ARBROATH SPORTING CLUB

A warm welcome this afternoon to the players, officials and supporters of Arbroath Sporting Club who make one of their increasingly rare visits to the Canniepairt.

Once a season was the minimum frequency for many years but since being relegated on league reorganisation in 2002, visits have been restricted to cup games, their most recent being in January 2005.

Arbroath SC came into being as an amateur club, then a Juvenile club before joining the Juniors in 1973. At one time based on the Low Common, SC took up residence at Seaton Park, their home now for many seasons.

Throughout the 1990s and into the early part of this century Arbroath SC was probably the most consistent club in the Tayside Juniors. For over twelve years they held down a place in the top division, never falling below ninth place, but never finishing higher than 4th.

During this period, ASC often promised to take a major local honour, but whilst Downfield, Forfar West End, North End, Carnoustie and St Josephs all had their moments before slipping back down the league, the Seaton Park club plotted a steady middle of the league course.

The only honours in the last twenty years have been a Tayside League Cup win in 1981, a Cream of the Barley Trophy win in 1991 and a D.J.Laing Homes Cup win in 2000.

The end to the steady course came in 2002 with relegation to the Tayside District League after finishing the final post-reorganisation season in bottom place. Second place in the Tayside Division 1 gave them a Premier League place. Again SC demonstrated a good level of consistency, finishing in 7th spot for three successive seasons. Unfortunately a seventh place wasn't good enough to keep them in the second tier on further reorganisation and they slipped to their lowest ebb in the club's history, taking their place in the Northern Division in 2006. A second top finish wasn't enough to win promotion and last season they fell away to finish only four places off the bottom of the North Division.



Off the park, the club has moved to appoint Willie Garner as successor to Iain Jenkins and the supporters can now look forward to a new era, which, hopefully, will be both successful and long-lasting.

First test for the manager comes in the shape of Arbroath SC, who have invariably proved to be stubborn opponents in the past. Let's hope that Garner's arrival and the aura that surrounds the Scottish Junior Cup can inspire the increasingly confident 'Port players to another win and a place in the third round of the national competition.


