TAYPORT v KELTY HEARTS

Taking last season's Super League placings into account and the fact that, during the past five years, both Tayport and Kelty Hearts have graced the Scottish Junior Cup Final, this afternoon's game could well be described as a meeting of Fife's top two Junior sides. Both Tayport and Kelty finished mid table last season, with our central Fife opponents trailing us by four points. Current league positions see ourselves trailing our visitors, who presently sit third top of the table, by two points, having played the same number of games.

What makes today's game of further interest are the stunning victories recorded by the respective clubs last Saturday. Kelty's 6-0 win at Glenrothes matched the biggest ever away win in Super League history, a feat achieved by Tayport who won 6 - 0 at North End in 2003/04. Not surprisingly, it was also Glens' biggest ever hammering at home, the previous worst being a 4-0 defeat by Oakley at Warout Stadium in 2002/03. Amazingly, prior to last Saturday, Kelty had only ever won five games away from home in the Super League, a 2-1 win and four 1-0s.

Tayport weren't missing out in the records department last week either. The 4-0 win at Bo'ness equalled the locals' heaviest defeat in the Super League, also inflicted by Tayport, back in 2003/04.

A glance at the Kelty player pool reveals that manager Stevie Leighton has put his faith in experienced pros, most of whom have been over the course at both Junior and Senior level. Craig Morrison signed in the close season from Rosyth, got off to a flyer with his new club, hitting ten goals in three league cup games in as many days. Morrison is also leading marksman for Kelty in the Super League although Tam McGeorge and Conrad Courts don't need to be shown the road to goal either. Graeme Findlay's treble at Glenrothes last week, gave him the distinction of hitting Hearts' first ever Super League hat-trick.

Tayport's Ronnie Kenneth, who came close to grabbing a hat-trick last week at Bo'ness but had to settle for a double, put in a shift that suggests he's reaching a level of fitness he's hitherto been unable to achieve in the last couple of seasons because of injuries. Fellow striker Darren Scott, the current top scorer, should be back in contention after being clobbered at Carnoustie and missing the past three games. Adam O'Connor is available again following a two game suspension but may have to wait in the wings to regain his place in midfield. No return, though for Chris Webster who is still on crutches after having his broken foot wired up following his injury at Carnoustie.

A week ago, a game involving two teams which between them had hit less than an average of goal a game during their league campaigns, would have been unlikely to have stirred the punters' passions, but after ten goals between them last week, who knows.

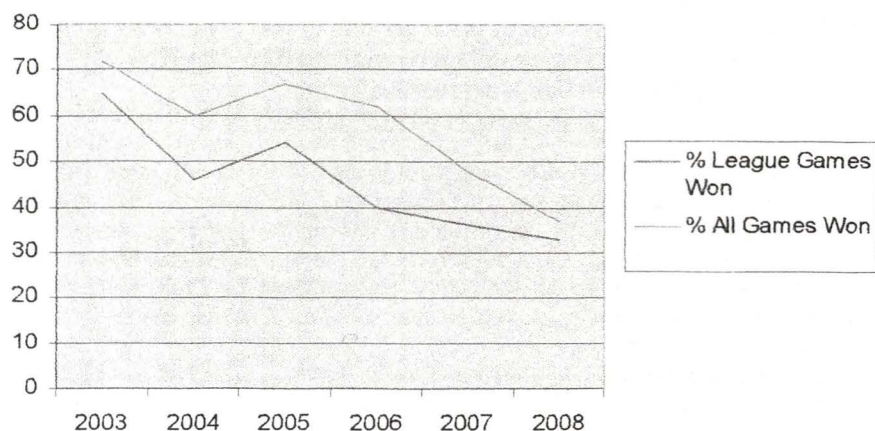

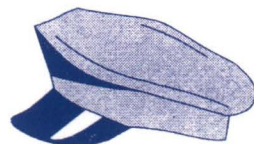

**"Let's hope Tayport can keep
up the good work today"**

Seven points from three East Super League fixtures represents a healthy return. The last home fixture saw Tayport complete a comprehensive three-goal demolition of Lochee United. After a controlled first forty-five minutes, 'Port took the lead early in the second half, courtesy of Ronnie Kenneth. Shortly afterwards, Adam O'Connor thrashed home an indirect free kick, giving his side a healthy cushion.

Red cards for Lochee's Lukas Krobot and the aforementioned O'Connor rendered the game ten-a-side, but Tayport remained in the ascendancy. Kenneth's second goal, following an incisive move, capped a pleasing afternoon on the Canniepairt.

It was disappointing, though, not to collect maximum points from the trip to Forfar West End, in what was the final match of 2008. Robbie Holden, one of two enforced, first half substitutes, put 'Port ahead in the 39th minute, when he reacted quickly to lash Reon Juskowiak's cross into the net, from a few yards out.

Then, before the break, West End's slightly volatile central defender Graeme Gibb collected his customary red card. (Always prominent in matches against Tayport, Gibb has now been dismissed three times, scored an own goal, missed a potentially decisive penalty in a cup tie shoot-out and scored a cup final goal, albeit a consolation in West End's 3-1 Currie Cup reversal.)

Anyway, 'Port had the numerical advantage and a one-goal lead, but could not add to that counter and the Strathmore Parkers got back on level terms through a late Bryan Duell penalty.

So, in many respects, it was a case of two points dropped, but Willie Garner's men bounced back in style last weekend. A wonder-goal from Ronnie Kenneth gave Tayport a half-time advantage and, despite playing against the strong wind and driving rain during the second period, the visitors went on to produce some attractive football. In addition, there was an end-product. 'Port netted three times in the second half, to earn a fine 4-0 victory. Barry McNaughton scored the second of a wild afternoon, then Kenneth was on hand to notch his own second. In injury-time, Tayport remained to the fore and Stefan Elvin slotted away his first goal for the club.

Let's hope that Tayport can keep up the good work today, when Keltie are in town on Super League business.

Back to today, and the business of winning three points. Again, what I will guarantee the supporters, is 100% commitment from the players. We have been doing better at home recently, and with your continued support, we will do our utmost to continue our progress up the league.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOOT



A lot of people maybe don't know this but there's a direct link between the president in waiting of the United States of America, Barack Obama, and Tayport FC. The link is the Chinese city of Shenzhen. Why? Well, Tayport FC's sponsors, Scott & Fyfe, have a factory in Shenzhen and that's where Barack's half brother Mark Ndesandjo stays and teaches orphans the piano and studies calligraphy.

Once again confusion reigns over kick off times. We've been 1.45pm the last couple of weeks despite being 1.30pm the previous two weeks. What never changes is the time it gets dark. Every day of every week of every month the sun sets at the same time every year. Why then can't the SJFA, the ERJFA and any others running Junior football get their heads together and decide once and for all at what times the games should kick off. There's invariably no extra time in cup ties, therefore the times can be set across the country and put in all handbooks. Seems simple. There's little doubt that there have been punters put off attending junior games because they're never sure when the game is likely to start. And junior football can ill afford to lose any punters.

Inconsistency continues to abound in the game. There have been several instances of referees calling off games at the Canniepairt for the reason that the ground is too hard. At Bonnyrigg two weeks ago, their game v Bo'ness went ahead after three pitch inspections, the referee finally making a decision 45 minutes before kick-off. On one of the shortest days of the year, what difference was there in the condition of the ground between inspection 1 and inspection 3? Absolutely zilch, one would imagine. What did the ref say? According to the press report, the referee ruled the game could go ahead 'as it would be the same for both sides'. So that's the criteria. We saw as recently as the cup tie at Carnoustie a referee make a show of dropping the ball to see if it would bounce (at least that's what one would surmise was the reason). The dropped ball fell stone dead in a dub with no bounce. So that must have been a decisive factor because the game went ahead. Yet last time a game was put off here at The Canniepairt through water on the park, a non bouncing ball was the reason given for a postponement. Truth is, pitch inspections are a lottery with absolutely no consistency shown at all by referees.

Of course nobody pretends it's an easy call, but consideration should be given to the ref saying I'll start it and see how it goes, particularly with water. How often do you see a game being abandoned after it had started because of underfoot conditions? And only last Saturday the Edinburgh United v Tranent game went ahead 'in dreadful conditions, only after the referee consulted both managers'. So, games at Bonnyrigg go on regardless, because it's the same for both sides, at Carnoustie games go ahead if the ball doesn't bounce but at Paties Field it's the managers who decide. At Inverurie recently, although the pitch was deemed ok, the game was called off because it was hard where the linesman does his bit. And of course, at Hamilton Accies, they just narrow the park to avoid the hard bits. Maybe we can do that at The Canniepairt to avoid the wet bit down the stand side.

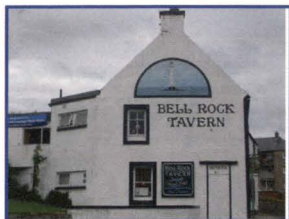
