TODAY'S GAME

East of Scotland Cup 2nd round
TAYPORT v DUNDEE VIOLET

Following the disappointment of being out thought and out fought by Lochee United in the Emirates Scottish Cup quarter final, Tayport could afford no slip up at Armadale last week. It was close but the three points were duly secured to claw back some ground on the premier division leaders. Today it's a different competition again when Violet make the short trip across the Tay for a second round East of Scotland Cup tie. Indeed the Pansies are our closest neighbours so this is can truly be classed as a derby match.

Since Tayside clubs were first allowed entry to the East of Scotland Cup in 2004, neither of today's participants has enjoyed any real success. Violet have the better record, reaching the last sixteen on three occasions to Tayport's twice. Whilst Tayport have twice gone out on penalties after a drawn 90 minutes, both on the Canniepairt (v Hill of Beath in 05/06 and Lochee United in 07/08), Violet progressed via that route on one occasion (v Lochee United in 05/06).

Along with Lochee Harp, Dundee Violet have probably the city's richest junior football pedigree and to date are the only city club to have lifted the Scottish Cup albeit seventy nine years ago. Recent success in any competition has been limited but the management triumvirate of George Shields, Andy Heggie and Grant Clark has been painstakingly putting together a side to aspire to greater things, starting with promotion to the Premier Division.

Since August last year the Pansies have suffered only three defeats, Arbroath SC in the league in September and Auchinleck Talbot in the Scottish and Sunnybank in the GA Trophy. They arrive here having picked up 34 points from a possible 36 in their last dozen league fixtures. Most recent was a 5-0 mauling of Coupar Angus last week when Ross Lunan weighed in with a hat-trick.

The sides have met already this season when Tayport won 7-3 in the League Cup at Glenesk, no doubt a result from which Violet are still smarting. Prior to that Violet were unbeaten in three games against us including a 4-0 win here last season in the League Cup.

Incentive, then, for Tayport who will still not have a full pool from which to select, with Manzie suspended, Nicoll injured, O'Doherty and McNaughton unavailable. O'Connor is back in the pool, however, and Sandy Wood will replace the cup-tied Neal Ferrie as sub keeper.

Referee is Mr Gavin Harris. Better hope it's not windy !

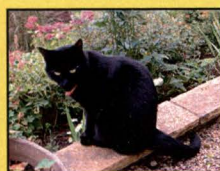

Don't panic Captain Mainwaring...

Despite a horrible winter...and start to British Summer Time, we shouldn't really be getting too concerned over fixture pile-ups. A look at the situation in previous years suggests we'll see the season out quite comfortably, despite having only completed exactly half our league programme.

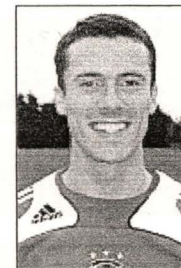

After 8 months of trials and tribulations, squeaky bum time is finally upon us. Shared dreams, whether that be winning the championship, achieving a certain league position or staving off relegation, are about to be realised or broken. To any outsider looking in, this would appear a crazy time to change your manager, and yet the last couple of weeks have seen a number of managers shown the door.

The most high profile casualty has probably been Tony Mowbray at Celtic. Given the enormity of the project which he had undertaken it seems hard to fathom why he would not have been allowed to finish the season. A morale boosting Scottish Cup victory was very much still on the cards and may have laid the foundations for great things to come. Perhaps this was hard to envisage as St Mirren notched their fourth goal, but no more so than a similar scenario with Neil Lennon at the helm.

Perhaps more unexpected was the removal of Jocky Scott from the Dens Park hot seat. Things were certainly not looking promising for the Dees who had thrown away their pole position in the race for the SPL. But two points from the first three games under the new management team have made a dangerous situation critical.

It is interesting to note the contrast with Inverness who are timing their run for promotion to perfection. Terry Butcher couldn't keep the team in the top league and made a stuttering start to the current campaign. But rather than losing faith, the board extended his contract and they now look likely to reap the reward.

Similar contrasts can be found at both ends of the Premiership. At the bottom Hull decided to twist and bring in Iain Dowie for the final crucial games. Most observers would rather see Zola secure survival with the West Ham team which he has led throughout the season. And would it not be better for football if Liverpool somehow managed to achieve the fourth place which Benitez guaranteed and that Manchester City's decision to prematurely remove Mark Hughes was punished accordingly?

What was important is that 'Port bounced back to claim all three East Premier League points, at Volunteer Park. On this occasion, it was Tayport who grabbed the early goals. Strikers Ronnie Kenneth and Grant Manzie were both on target inside the opening quarter of an hour and a comfortable afternoon looked on the cards.

Hosts Armadale, however, created a couple of openings, before reducing the deficit on 62 minutes. Grant Manzie then became the third Tayport player in three matches to be red-carded for retaliation, when he reacted angrily to an off-the-ball assault by the 'Dale centre-half.

Fortunately, the ten men were able to hold on without any undue fuss, to post a crucial win. It's just a pity that the other various promotion challengers will have a chance to put more points on the board today, with Tayport in cup action.

That said, the East of Scotland Cup is a prestigious tournament and Violet will provide a stern test. 'Port, though, will be up for the challenge, looking to build some momentum for what will be a critical phase of the season.

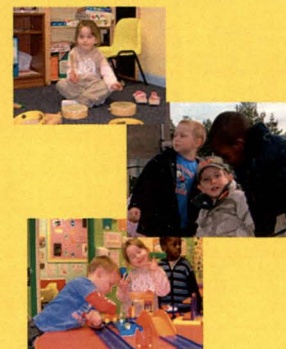

Dods, I continued, is a little slow at the back, with Kenneth clumsy at times when on the back foot.

Therefore the simple way to beat them is balls over the top, miss out their midfield, and don't give them the opportunity to feed the strikers. Dods can't turn, and Kenneth will foul if he is under pressure, running towards his own goal.

Craig nodded concurringly, and continued with his steak pie.

As he was driving up the road back to Lanarkshire on Saturday night, mulling over a 3-0 defeat, he must've been thinking "That Bomber, what a blethering shite!!!"

Among them was Joe Myles, a rookie solicitor when he played in the club's Fife XI. One of Joe's early court successes was taking a civil case for the club and the proceedings in Dundee's Sheriff Court were once again a topic of conversation.

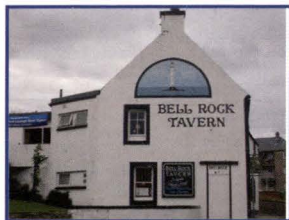
