

TODAY'S GAME

PREMIER DIVISION TAYPORT v PENICUIK ATHLETIC

Penicuik visit the Canniepairt for the first time on league business and they, like their hosts, are very anxious to pick up points. Cuikie are too near the relegation zone for their liking.

After finishing level third in the Premier Division last season, a sticky start to this campaign saw the Penicuik committee come under pressure to make a managerial change and after much speculation a change was made in mid season with Brian Ryrie and Craig Meikle taking over the reins in a move generally welcomed by the Cuikie faithful.

The new management brought in several new faces. Liam McKenna from Bonnyrigg Rose, Ross Harvey, who was a member of the Rangers Under 19s title winning side in 2008, on loan from Dumbarton, and Craig Miller from Edina Hibs were added to the squad. In addition Kevin Milne was persuaded to come out of retirement. At the same time the new management flexed their muscle and shipped out some players, including two who were in the home line up when two goals in time added on gave the locals three valuable points in our corresponding fixture in Midlothian back in October.

Results have improved for Penicuik with a draw v Ballingry and good wins v Montrose and Blairgowrie in their last three league fixtures. A 2-1 defeat last Saturday by South Division high flyers Tranent saw Penicuik eliminated from the Fife & Lothians Cup. It was a defeat which manager Brian Ryrie didn't expect and he's on record as stating that he expects Tayport to suffer the backlash this afternoon. He's no fears on the score of his team's work rate and reckons if they can avoid the slow start they had v Tranent then he can get a result.

Tayport will have to pick themselves up from the disappointment of losing to West End in midweek but they can take heart from the fact that they had the better of the game and but for a few bad breaks, could have collected a comfortable three points.

Changes are likely, however, with one or two of those on the bench in the last couple of weeks in line for a starting berth. Barry Donachie and Graham Nicoll just need match fitness but Joe Pepper might still miss out with and ankle injury.

On Real's influence on this season's Champions League

For the first time in many a year, the Champions' League has recently begun to look and feel more like the European Cup that it once was. OK, so the four semi-finalists might not all be their reigning national champions but at least they are from four different countries. Who do we have to thank for bringing football back to its roots? Why, Real Madrid of course.

How appropriate that this year's final should be taking place at the Bernabéu. It was for this reason that club president Florentino Perez persuaded the banks to loosen their purse strings and loan them the money for the greatest spending spree in sporting history. Winning a legendary tenth European Cup would be achieved on home soil, or so the plan went. Of course things haven't quite worked out that way, but thanks to last summer's unprecedented splurge no one will have done more to influence this year's outcome than Madrid.

First and foremost were the raids on England's last two winners of the trophy. Neither Liverpool nor Manchester United were able to come close to replacing Alonso and Ronaldo within their squads. As a result both came up short in Europe's premier club competition. It is hard to argue that the sale prices made financial sense, but this season has underlined just how integral both players had become to their respective teams.

Lyon also lost their top man to Madrid last summer, with Karim Benzema heading to Spain for around €35 million. However unlike the English clubs, Lyon invested wisely. Lopez, Gomis and Cissokho have all played their part in helping the club reach the last four for the first time in their history.

Of course the arrival of these new *galacticos* meant that Real Madrid would have to get rid of some of their existing talent pool. Wesley Sneijder went to Inter and was to prove instrumental in helping them to overcome Chelsea. And the other big departure was Arjen Robben who has steered new club Bayern Munich to the last four thanks to sensational clinching goals in the last two rounds.

And Barcelona? Well, could there be any greater motivation than winning a second successive European Cup at the home of their bitter rivals? There may well be no madrileños at the final itself, but you can't dispute that they have left their mark.

Inexplicable and inexcusable

Inexplicable and inexcusable are two words which all present at the Canniepairt on Wednesday evening might use to describe the actions of referee Stevenson and his stand side linesman/assistant with regard to two crucial decisions. Others might be less charitable and throw in a few additional adjectives. The opinion of the referee obviously differed but from any other observer's point of view, the decisions were both wrong. Nobody could even remotely suggest that the penalty given to West End was deliberate handball and the penalty which was denied shortly afterwards at the other end, clearly was deliberate hand ball. Unfortunately Mr Stevenson got them mixed up.

That's football, of course, and Willie, Chiel, Patty and the players will be no more incensed than their counterparts have been in the Premiership and SPL who also have to tolerate similar inconsistencies at their level on a regular basis. Ask Owen Coyle!

That said, these incidents should not have had such a significant bearing on the outcome of the match. It was probably the only decent chance West End had to score whilst Tayport had several. The concern of course, is that we let vital points slip away, as we did v Blairgowrie, Penicuik and Kinnoull in successive league games earlier this season. In addition we played Ballingry off the park in the first game of the season, yet lost 1-0.

Eight months on and there's no requirement to be a mix of a mathemetician and a Mourinho to see where our problems lie. 17 goals scored in 13 league games says it all. Where are we going wrong? Despite the refereeing issues the 0-1 scoreline against West End could not have been entirely unexpected. As a player said after the St Andrews game, we can't expect to win all our games by 1-0.

Generally, commitment cannot be faulted, training is good and well attended, team spirit seems good, indeed some of the football played is attractive, but we can't seem to get clear of our opponents with the consequence that we've left ourselves a mountain to climb to return to the Super League. We've got 4 games in hand over Kinnoull and West End, both of whom have only 5 games to go. Two wins and a draw will suffice for West End to win the title, so they are basically out of sight. We've got to win our 4 games in hand, beat Kinnoull and probably win at least two of the other four remaining games. That will give us a fighting chance, so we might as well start against Penicuik today



1-0 has been a common scoreline of late. Two weeks ago, Violet visited the Canniepairt for an East of Scotland Cup tie and 'Port won by a single goal, scored by Ronnie Kenneth. Hardly a classic encounter, but memorable for the appearance of Grant Clark, as the Violet 'keeper. The 49-year old was a stalwart in the Downfield team which rivalled Tayport in the early 1990s and Clark later crossed the water for a brief spell as goalkeeping coach.

The following week, Tayport travelled to St. Andrews, for a first ever league meeting with their north-east Fife neighbours. Again, Ronnie Kenneth netted the only goal of the game, pouncing to drill home a David Black cross, in the 18th minute. Again, there were familiar faces in the opposing line-up, in the shape of Davie Evans and the legendary Allan Ramsay. Gus Malone was also involved, in a coaching capacity. Most important, though, was that 'Port gained three crucial East Premier League points, as the promotion charge gathered momentum.

Table-toppers, Forfar West End, were the visitors to the Canniepairt and they collected the points courtesy of a penalty by former Tayport striker Bryan Duell. Derek Wemyss smashed a clearance into a crowd of players a few yards away. The ball ricocheted back against his arm and the referee pointed immediately to the spot. Should it have been a penalty? Well, nobody seemed to claim for it. There was no intent by Wemyss to handle the ball. The ball would not have gone anywhere near the goal had it not struck Wemyss. The Forfar player had long since surrendered possession of the ball. So, no, probably not.

More frustration followed when, at the other end, a cross into the box bounced up and hit a West End hand. The match official, probably not wishing to be seen to be balancing out his earlier decision, ignored Tayport's appeals.

The hosts did have a couple of near misses during the game. Notably, Darren Scott saw a first half header miss the target, Roberto Morris and Mark Whatley went close after the break and, in the closing stages, an excellent lob from substitute Grant Manzie was spectacularly tipped over the bar by Vanderdevl.

It was not a match that Tayport deserved to lose, but it was not Tayport's evening. Let's hope for better fortune this afternoon, when Penicuik come to town.
