

TODAY'S GAME

EAST of SCOTLAND CUP 3rd round TAYPORT v MUSSELBURGH ATHLETIC

It's a warm welcome to Tayport for Musselburgh whose visit for this East of Scotland 3rd round tie is their first time here for a competitive fixture. The sides have met before, as recently this pre-season when we shared two goals in a pretty uninspiring draw. There's a lot happened since then, of course, with Musselburgh having cut their teeth in the Super League at our expense. After a steady start of two wins and a draw, Musselburgh could only muster one win from their next eight league games but things are back in order with three wins from their last four league games. Mussy should have few problems getting the eight points required from their last six games to guarantee staying in the Super League. Mind you, it didn't happen for Tayport and Forfar WE last season.

Knocked out of the early season League Cup on penalties by Linlithgow in the semi final, Musselburgh went out of the Scottish to Irvine Meadow. Although they are still in the Fife & Lothians Cup, the East of Scotland Cup is the one which Musselburgh will now have very much in their sights.

It's a good squad which manager David McGlynn has assembled. McGlynn has been five years at the helm now and is arguably the most successful manager in the club's history.

Giving today's game an interesting angle is the fact that four Raith Rovers loan players are in opposition, Lee Bryce, who netted a hat-trick on Wednesday night at Blair, and Mark Whatley for us, and striker Tam Graham and midfielder Graeme Beveridge for the 'Burgh.

Experience is certainly not lacking in the visitors' squad. Player coach Iain Ramage and Wes Mitchell have played here before for Whitburn and Arniston respectively and the signings made this season to handle the rigours of the Super League, have provided a strength in depth. Keeper Kieron Renton and Adam Nelson arrived from Stenhousemuir, Calvin Shand from Arniston and Stuart Fraser from Berwick Rangers.

Musselburgh pulled off something of a coup earlier this season when they fixed up local lad Kris Renton (19) who had moved from Norwich City to Brechin City. Kris holds the record for being the youngest player to turn out in a league game for the Canaries when he played in a 2-1 win v Leicester City exactly three years ago.

Tayport have started with the same line-up in the last two games but are likely to make at least two changes today. Keeper Neal Ferrie is cup tied and Grant Manzie took a knock which necessitated his early substitution at Blair on Wednesday. Barry McNaughton is available again and both Joe Pepper and Graham Nicoll are pretty much ready for action, but may have to wait until the Fife/Tayside tie v Thornton here on Monday evening. O'Donnell and O'Doherty are back in Ireland.



THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS MUSSELBURGH ATHLETIC

It's Musselburgh's first visit to Tayport for a competitive match and we bid them a warm welcome to the Canniepairt. With us yet to meet Musselburgh competitively, our first visit to Olive Bank Stadium will be for another season.

What do we know about Musselburgh, the place? It's about 7 miles east of Edinburgh, sits at the mouth of the River Esk across the Firth of Forth from Methil and has a population of around 22,000, the biggest town in East Lothian. It's the home of Loretto School, Queen Margaret University and the famous Brunton Theatre. It is also reputed to be the oldest town in Scotland.

Musselburgh Links is the oldest continuously played golf course in the world. Still on the sporting theme, as well as Musselburgh Athletic there are good going cricket and rugby clubs but Musselburgh is probably best known for its horse racing track, both Flat & National Hunt. Indeed our former match secretary, Chas Anderson's horse Sandwell was set to run there the other week but was a late withdrawal through injury.

From a start in 1898 there have been several Junior sides, Bruntonians, Juniors and Fern which pre-date the current club which was formed in 1934, Of those, the most successful was Bruntonians who lifted the Scottish Junior Cup in 1923, beating Arniston Rangers before a crowd of 20,000 at Tynecastle. Bruntonians also lifted the East of Scotland Cup in 1921 and 1924, the present club's sole success in the competition was in 1937.

Musselburgh have picked up a fair collection of local cup wins since, but championships have been limited to the original East Region's Division 1 in 1971 and Division 2 in 2001. A first success in the restructured East Region came last season when Musselburgh were crowned Premier Division Champions. This season has seen them have an impressive baptism in the Super League.

No shortage of famous footballing sons from the Burgh including Hearts' legend Willie Bauld, Spurs John White, Kenny Miller, Willie Ormond, Jim Jeffries and Raith's current manager John McGlynn. John is a former Musselburgh Athletic player and manager who joined Jeffries at Hearts, initially as youth coach and has gone on to carve a fine reputation in the Scottish senior game. Tayport's Mark Whatley and Lee Bryce, are of course under John's charge at Starks Park.

On a terrible indictment of our national game

To split or not to split; the annual discussion on the novelty ending to the SPL season. The arguments are the same today as they were when the split was first introduced and revolve around a fundamental problem: unless all teams play each other the same number of times the league can never be truly fair.

The rules of all sports are based on ensuring as level a playing field as possible and exist in order to ensure fairness. This had always been the case in football. What better example could there be than the league season in which every team plays the other twice, once at home and once away? The merit of the system is underlined by its universal acceptance both across the world and throughout all the different levels and stages of Scottish football. With the exception, of course, of our four senior divisions.

The history books tell us that there were too many meaningless games, that there was not enough strength in depth to justify the more traditional format. But in reality the decision was a very rare example of Scottish football being ahead of the times, with a decision being taken for financial rather than sporting reasons.

The top clubs realised that they could double the number of money-spinning fixtures with the Old Firm. And yet as a result even Third Division clubs must now face the boredom of playing the same opposition on at least four occasions every season. Is it any wonder that nobody bothers going to the games?

The advent of the SPL split was simply the logical next step; with the top six ensuring that they would get a bigger slice of the pie than their closest adversaries. The bottom six in turn are placated by there being only one relegation spot, in itself an outrageous state of affairs and one which is surely unique in world professional football.

The most recent developments have seen Neil Doncaster, head of the SPL, alluding to a series of mysterious criteria used to decide the order of the post-split fixtures. What are these criteria and why are they not public knowledge? The lack of transparency inevitably leads people to conclude that the system simply is not fair.

What a terrible indictment of our national game.

A WORD FROM WILLIE

After the disappointment of the result against Forfar West End, not the performance but in the manner we were beaten, I asked the players to respond. I also demanded that we started turning our possession into goals. I had a chat with Chiel and Pattie about changing our system, basically getting more of our strikers on the park at the same time. I made the changes and we were rewarded with nine goals in two games. This is down to the players having a belief that they can score goals. I am friendly with their manager Dave McGlynn and his philosophy is to play football. His team are new to the Super League this year and after a great start, lost their way a bit around the bad weather time, but they are back winning and playing well. I look forward to the contest.

We have seven league games to play. These are our priority. Cup runs are great, especially one as big as this one, but I will change my side today. We have picked up some knocks and with another game on Monday night against Thornton that will be six games in seventeen days. This type of schedule takes it toll and I need to ensure the team is fresh and fit for next Saturday up at Montrose. It was great to see so many supporters at Blair mid week. I can assure you again that your support is appreciated. On a final note, I would like to personally thank John 'Bomber' Brown for all his help and support in my time at the club, and I wish him well in his new venture at Dundee FC

FROM THE ARCHIVES 1990/1991
