TAYPORT v KINNOULL

Had Penicuik not carried out a smash and grab with two goals in time added on last Saturday, Tayport would be sitting in a pretty good league position going into this afternoon's game. However, in truth, few could argue that zero points was no more than we deserved, losing the two goals from needlessly conceded and poorly defended set pieces. As it is, we're 2 points ahead of our opponents who picked up an excellent point v Forfar West End with goals from Jamie McKenzie and Chris Anton so the incentive of a decent lift up the table is there for both teams this afternoon. Indeed a win for today's visitors would see them go above ourselves with a game in hand

There will be a few familiar faces on show for Kinnoull today, with no fewer than four former Port players in their squad. Ross Gunnion, Robbie Holden, Duncan Bruce and Steve McAllister, all to varying degrees, made their mark here at the Canniepairt. None more so, of course than Gunner who played 264 games from 2001 to 2008 including lifting two Scottish Cup medals and two East Region Super League championship medals, after signing from Bankfoot.

Injury has restricted Gunner's activities in recent weeks but not so Robbie Holden. The wee striker is one of only two Kinnoull players to feature in all the club's games this season and is top scorer with 5 goals to show for his efforts. Jon Kelly, the former Carnoustie marksman, always poses a threat and with Chris Anton and Stevie McManus weighing in with a fair share of goals from midfield, there is a significant attacking threat in this Kinnoull team

Keeper Duncan Bruce has been in consistently good form since he moved up river and will no doubt be anxious to thwart his former teammates this afternoon. After a very lengthy spell out injured, Kinnoull recently welcomed back Mark Morrison, who, along with the rugged Sandy Ross, provides a resolute defensive unit.

Tayport will be well aware of Kinnoull being a side with the potential to get back into the Super League and this will be as tough a league fixture as we can expect this season. The disappointment experienced by all associated with the club at Penicuik is still raw and a more positive performance will be demanded by the manager and his coaches. A more effective return from set pieces and the elimination of basic errors is bound to have been on this week's training agenda.

Mick O'Donnell is back and there will possibly be a return to action for Graham Nicoll and Derek Wemyss. David Black is an injury doubt after falling at home while Grant Manzie, who took a blow when he collided with a barrier in the first half at Penicuik, should be ok. Definitely out are Roberto Morris (holiday) and the injured duo of Stefan Elvin and Darren Scott.

The Pub Bore

...on keeping
the house in
order

Referees are being subjected to an increasingly unacceptable level of abuse. Such is the view of Hugh Dallas, Scotland's refereeing supremo, and last week he headed down to a junior football match with the BBC in tow in order to prove his point. Irrespective of one's views on Mr Dallas, it is to the shame of the Junior game that it didn't fail to deliver. Of course it isn't just the fault of Bellshill and Lanark. This is a situation that is countrywide, with the last match on the Canniepairt a case in point.

That particular game couldn't possibly be called dirty; indeed the only violence on show was that shown to the corner flag by Barry McNaughton. Yet three opposition players saw red, each for two yellow cards. And all six cautions were for abusive language towards the official. Any initial sympathy for the first Armadale players to be booked quickly dried up as the team as a whole showed a remarkable lack of discipline.

As the SFA's new campaign will shortly remind us, football would not be possible without an official. Yes, they do get paid, but it would be very hard to argue that the remuneration on offer for taking charge of a game is worth 90 minutes of personal abuse. Running the gauntlet of a Junior game is a price worth paying for young officials who are hoping to make the journey to the riches and glamour of grade 1. But consider the same proposition when promotion is no longer an option and it is simply a way of spending your Saturday afternoon.

In a previous column the Bore has bemoaned the attitude of referees and it would certainly help if they considered the way in which they speak to players. A less confrontational and less condescending attitude might help to erode the idea among players, coaches and fans that they want to take centre stage. But if we are to demand this of referees then teams must also show a willingness to demand that players show respect to the men in black. It is hard enough for Junior football to get a fair hearing from the Scottish media, but in this regard there are worrying signs that they may have a point.

Tayport host Kinnoull today, looking to get last weekend's bitter disappointment out of their system. The performance at Penicuik was not good, but it did look as though the early own goal from home defender Lynch would be enough to see 'Port scrape a win and three vital points.

During the second half, Penicuik pressure began to build, but, having survived until past the 91st minute, nobody could have foreseen the late calamity which would then unfold.

'Port lost two injury-time goals, both headers following Ryan Gay set-pieces, and the Canniepairt men had snatched the proverbial defeat from the jaws of victory. Never before have Tayport succumbed to defeat in such a manner and it was a stunned set of players who trooped off the park on the final whistle.

The previous week, Tayport did at least put three points on the board, when Armadale Thistle came to town. Ronnie Kenneth was the match-winner, nodding home in the 65th minute, shortly after 'Dale had been reduced to ten men. The visitors then lost their discipline completely, with two more players receiving red cards in the closing stages.

As if it were at all required, the evidence thus far demonstrates just how difficult it will be to achieve the club's goal of promotion back into the Super League.

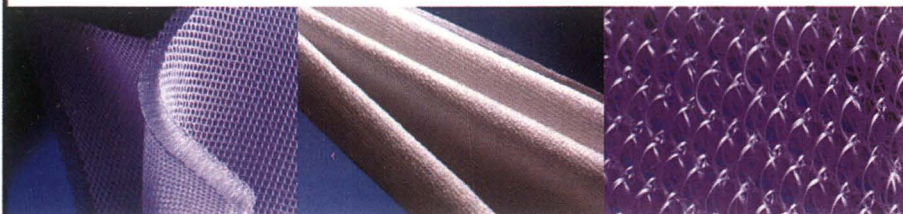

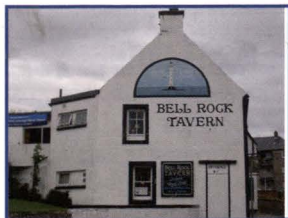
