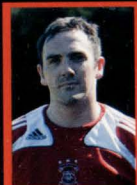

THIS AFTERNOON AT THE CANNIEPAIRT ACA Sports SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v LINLITHGOW ROSE

What better opposition for our return to the Super League than Scottish Cup holders Linlithgow Rose. What better attraction than the return to the Can-niepairt, for the first time in opposition, of the former Port triumvirate of Dave Baikie, Mel Irons and Derek Carr plus the iconic figure of John Ward. Baiker and Wardie live in Tayport and this is the nearest they've got to a home game since leaving Port. All four enjoyed great success at the Canniepairt and still retain an affection for the club with which they experienced so many memorable times. Not that these feeling will cut any ice today. Indeed the situation will likely give Rose that wee bit extra edge.

Not only are they Scottish Cup holders, but Linlithgow, are very much the form team in the East Region, with a string of league victories to end last season and then starting this season with qualification for the semi finals of the South District's League Cup. A bit like Tayport really, although our league run to end the season was at a level below.

In the modern era the ultimate goal for every Junior club is to qualify for the Scottish Cup proper by winning the Emirates Junior Cup or a Super League Championship. Although Rose made this season's competition by winning the Scottish Cup, most managers will see the league route as being the better bet. Every point, then, is a prisoner and the Linlithgow boss will today set out his stall accordingly, a stall with which we are all fairly familiar and one which has brought plenty success over the last twenty years.

One decision both managers will have to make is who they select to play in goal. Respective goalkeeping veterans Frazer Fitzpatrick and Ronnie McPherson have shared the role this season to date with Neal Ferrie and Steven Pinkowski. The close season signing of Whitburn's Colin Strickland has boosted the Rose striking power and the season-long loan of centre half Dario Quinn from SPL's Motherwell has stiffened an already resolute defence. Carnoustie Panmure striker Andy Reilly has already played as a trialist and may feature if he's shown enough to win a contract. Definitely out of the Rose line-up are Keith Hogg (injured) and Keith Donnelly (unavailable), the man whose goal in the brought last season's Emirates Cup to Prestonfield.

Rose hit five goals in midweek as they cantered past Armadale in the League Cup while Tayport had to come from behind yet again to salvage a draw at home to Dundee Violet. The point proved to be sufficient, however, to take us through to the semi finals. Five players were out injured in midweek and three were on holiday. Chris Anton and Stefan Elvin should be back from holiday in time to be involved today but not Barry McNaughton. Definitely still out injured is David Black but the others could return to action.

DUNMORE REPORTS...

Super League action returns to the Canniepairt this afternoon, thanks to the incredible conclusion to last season. The goal of promotion was achieved in the most dramatic of circumstances. The 2-1 win at contenders Kinnoull was crucial, but the real drama came on the Canniepairt, in midweek. One down to St. Andrews as the game entered its final minute, Lee Bryce's equaliser provided some hope. When Roberto Morris scored the winner, deep into injury-time, the noise from the 'Port support in the enclosure reflected just how important that goal had been.

In what had become a title decider at Strathmore Park, hosts Forfar West End, who just required a draw, opened the scoring. Again, Willie Garner's men came from behind. They equalised through Stefan Elvin, and Ronnie Kenneth's second half strike sealed the championship.

Since then, the focus has been preparing a squad which can once more compete in the top flight. Thus far, the signs have been encouraging. After a decent set of results in the pre-season friendlies, Tayport began their DJ Laing League Cup campaign with a 5-1 win at Lochee Harp. Debutants James Russell, Ross Lunan and Stevie McManus, with two goals, were all on the mark. Robbie Henderson also netted the first official goal of his second stint at the club.

North End then shocked Tayport by taking a two-nil lead, in the next match. Goals from Russell, a penalty, and McManus, late on, rescued a point.

More impressive was the 2-1 victory against fellow Super Leaguers, Lochee United, last weekend. After falling behind to a Paul Blackwood strike, 'Port equalised, courtesy of a James Russell free kick. Ronnie Kenneth then stabbed home what proved to be the winning counter, before half-time.

Tayport could have added to their tally towards the end of the match, once the Bluebells were down to ten men, but what was important was the collection of three points. That victory put 'Port in the driving seat, as far as the section was concerned, but progress to the semi-finals was not altogether straightforward.

Violet visited on Wednesday evening and, like North End, they went two goals up. Stevie McManus rescued Tayport, with his fourth and fifth goals for the club, one in each half.

With Lochee winning against the Dokens, the point was enough to see Willie Garner's men top the section, but conceding the first goal in three successive matches is something of a concern. Let's hope that flaw is now out of the system, as the Super League campaign gets underway.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS LINLITHGOW ROSE

This will be Linlithgow's tenth visit to the Canniepairt since the sides first met here just short of 14 years ago. Tayport were 3-0 winners that day in a Scottish Cup round 3 tie and were 2-0 victors in a 5th round tie just over a year later. The first league encounter was a 2-1 win for 'Port in November 2002. In the six games since then there have been three wins for Tayport, two for Rose and five years ago, the only goalless draw between the sides.

Expectations were high when Rose appointed Dave Baikie as manager after the former Tayport boss had resigned his post following a successful spell at East Fife. Baikie hasn't disappointed. The football may not have been too attractive at times, if you believe online forums and the like, but the Emirates Cup sits in the cabinet at Prestonfield and the draw for the Scottish Senior Cup is awaited with keen anticipation.

Most of the players who lifted the cup will be here today, supplemented by some astute acquisitions. Striker Colin Strickland arrived from relegated Whitburn to revive his career and Adam Nelson was signed from Musselburgh. Adam won't like to be reminded of his last visit to Tayport. He was ordered off but did have the satisfaction of being on the winning side.

Baikie had used his contacts in the Senior game to bring new faces to Rose last season and these contacts proved to be telling again this year when he was tipped off that Motherwell centre half Dario Quinn was just too old to play for the Under 19s at Fir Park but, there being no reserve sides as such in the SPL, Quinn needed regular football and would be keen to go out on loan.

The arrival of Spaniard Jordi Virgili was signed in similar fashion. In Scotland to complete a degree at Aberdeen University, the full back was with Arbroath FC but wasn't getting a regular game at Gayfield. The then Arbroath manager John McGlashan got on the phone to Baiker. The fact that Jordi's got a Scottish Cup winners medal demonstrates the value of that contact.

Incidentally the Spaniard will probably be the first former Barcelona player to play on the Canniepairt. He apparently previously played for the Barca third string.

Rose had planned to do a pre-season tour to north of England but, like ourselves, the cost ruled this out. Mind you, we didn't win the Scottish Cup!

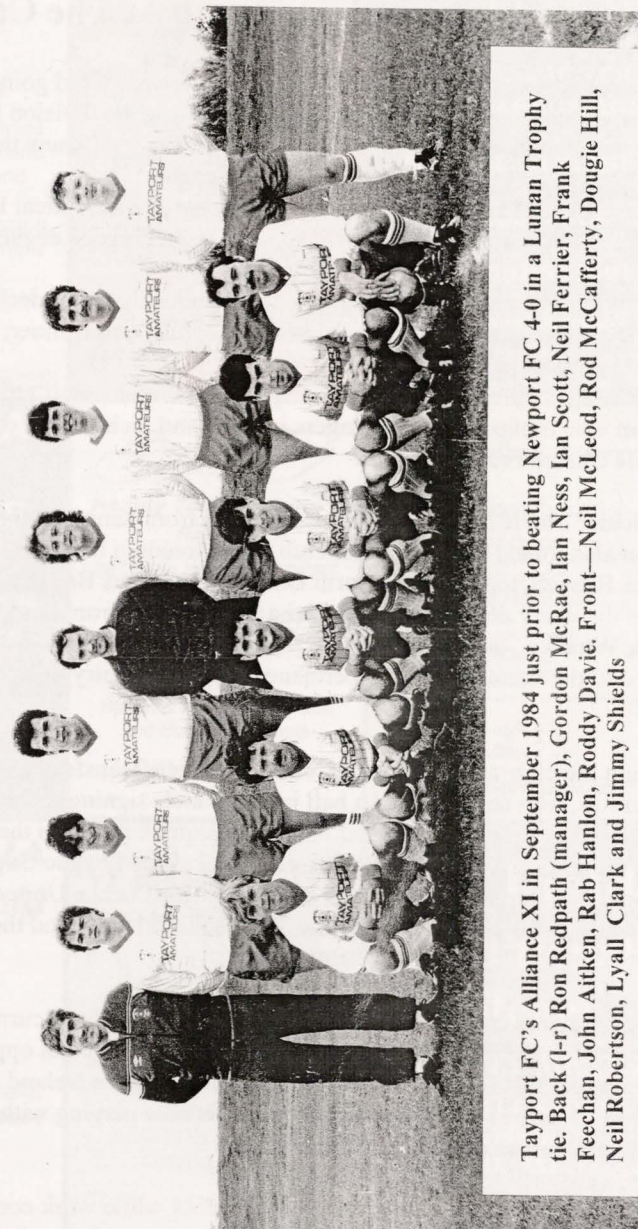

"The facilities are excellent. I have played at St Mirren and Hamilton in the SPL and they don't have any training facilities.

"A lot of teams in the SPL would love these facilities.

"I hope to bring something to the team otherwise I would

not have come up here - I want to help the team progress."

Corcoran, who began his career in the junior ranks with Tayport and Linlithgow Rose, is pleased to remain in the full-time ranks.

He said: "I only turned full-time when I was 24, I worked in an office for Scottish Widows in Edinburgh for two years.

"It wasn't a great job, it was a boring, mind numbing administration job.

"Full-time training can be difficult sometimes but I love what I am doing and I would not swap it. I was thankful to sign a two-year deal, it does give you a bit of security considering the financial state football is in."

County target Chris Innes, meanwhile, is training with Kilmarnock with the aim of securing a deal with new manager Mikko Paatelainen at Rugby Park.

From the Archives

Dave Baikie must miss doing his programme spot since he moved to Linlithgow. The *Baiker's Bit* became a fixture in the Port Prog and was an opportunity for Baikie to get his message over to fans, committee and others, often in a subtle fashion. Sometimes of course it wasn't so subtle and the club found itself in front of the beaks. Lithgae don't do a match programme, so that opportunity has been denied him. Here we've reproduced an extract *The Baiker's Bit* from December 2002, from the programme the week after Tayport and Rose met at Tayport in the Super League for the first time. Tayport won 2-1 that day with big Wardie getting one of the 'Port goals.

THE BAIKER'S BIT

I said to our players prior to last week's encounter that defeating Super League favourites Linlithgow Rose would almost certainly end their chances of title glory this term, given that they would have to win their remaining ten games to amass forty seven points, a figure that I feel will be surpassed by at least one, if not more teams.



I also said, by defeating Linlithgow, they would inadvertently become our ally, due to the fact that we've now played them twice and every other side in the division has yet to face them. I've no doubts that they will take points from our main rivals. Let's hope so anyway.

It goes without saying that I'm pleased to have gained the three points from last Saturday's fixture. I felt that, over the piece, we deserved our victory. I've spoken to quite a few neutrals who attended the game. They all said the same, that they thoroughly enjoyed the match and reckoned it was worth every penny.

Our workrate was excellent and it really had to be against a side of Linlithgow's quality. We restricted their scoring opportunities to probably only three genuine chances from which Fitzzy made two tremendous stops at vital times in the game to give us a platform to go on and create five or six decent chances of our own and deservedly win the game.

I read a quote by Linlithgow manager Jim Sinnett in one of the national newspapers. Speaking about the Super league, he felt that winning the inaugural division would be a greater achievement than last season's Scottish Cup win. I would probably agree that you most definitely play more difficult games, 22 to be precise, but I find myself every bit as excited about this great competition [the Scottish Cup] as I did the first time I entered it as a manager

In a tense match Saints played out of their skin and took the lead with eight minutes left. All looked lost. Indeed some supporters had given up the ghost and left the ground. The game was at the end of its natural life when Lee Bryce grabbed an equaliser. Then deep into time added on, Captain Marvel headed a dramatic winner to spark off scenes of great joy. Promotion was all but assured thanks to a third successive win by the odd goal.

A trip to Forfar for the Premier League's very last game three days later. West End's champagne had been waiting for weeks to be uncorked but it would remain on ice. Stefan Elvin's fantastic goal had us level 1-1 at the break but it was all 'Port in the second period with Ronnie's goal enough to settle the match and put Tayport at the top of the table.

Amazingly it was the first time we had topped the table all season. Spare a thought for Forfar, top of the league since September and needing only a point to stay there. Aye, football's a funny game.
