

Today's Game

ACA SPORTS PREMIER DIVISION TAYPORT v PENICUIK ATHLETIC

It's a crucial match for both clubs this afternoon (mind, you all matches seem to be so described) with the promotion aspirations of both sides receiving a reality check. Tayport have slipped back to third in the table and Penicuik, a point behind with a game in hand over Tayport, have the incentive today of pushing Tayport further down the table. A defeat for Tayport or a draw would not only be a great boost to our visitors, but also to another five or six clubs with realistic sights on a promotion spot. Neither side has any cup-ties to which they can look forward so thoughts are 100% on the league campaign

Of course, it's only half way through the campaign for most of the clubs and there's a long way to go. In Tayport's last Premier campaign, after 11 games, we were sitting sixth from top place with 20 points, 14 points behind the leaders, yet still finished as champions. Although not all clubs have played the same number of games, only six points separate nine clubs, so there is little margin for error.

Following Tayport's 1-0 at Penicuik earlier in the season, the Midlothian club suffered another two league losses but since the turn of the year there have been three league wins on the bounce. Most recent was last week when two goals in the last few minutes edged out Armadale by 2-1. Netting the winner was recent signing striker Craig O'Reilly who has yet to start for the visitors but he could well do so today. O'Reilly (25) is not unknown in these parts having played two seasons with Dundee and indeed won a SFL Young Player of the Month awards whilst at Dens. He also played at Raith Rovers, Montrose and East Fife where he is best remembered for scoring the goal which eliminated Premier Division St Mirren from the League Cup in 2007

Major interest for the home fans will be the likely debuts of 19 year old striker Simon Murray, signed from Montrose FC four weeks ago but still to make his debut after successive match post-ponements and being ineligible for last week's cup-tie. Simon is familiar with the Premier Division, having been on loan to Downfield this season and actually played against his new team on the Canniepairt earlier this season. Another new face who could debut today is left sided defender Gary Robertson (25) signed on Thursday from Dundee Violet.

Missing today will be Mark Whatley who has broken a foot, Robert Smith and Andy McDonald, both suspended, and there are injury doubts over Jamie Mackie and James Russell. Tayport may be looking for a first win in eight games but on the positive side, our unbeaten league run stretches back seven games to September.

Today's Visitors PENICUIK ATHLETIC

The origins of organised football in Penicuik can be traced back to 1882, when several clubs operated in the area. Penicuik Athletic were formed in 1888 at a meeting in the Royal Hotel in Penicuik and established a pitch at Hays Park. A supermarket, the main road and Penicuik Health Centre now stand on the site.

In 1893 the East of Scotland League was formed at a time when Penicuik Athletic was a senior club but in 1904 the club adopted junior status and the club name was changed to Penicuik Juniors. A high point came in 1910 when the Juniors reached the semi-final of the Scotlish Junior Cup only to lose narrowly to Kilwinning Rangers. The 1930s saw the club revert to the Senior East of Scotland League and Scotlish Cup ties were played in Penicuik against Heart of Midlothian and St. Mirren before Penicuik Athletic rejoined the Juniors.

In 1966 Athletic reached the semi-final of the Scottish Junior Cup only to lose by the narrowest of margins to local rivals Bonnyrigg Rose. Inspired by their progress Athletic went one better in 1969, this time reaching the final at Hampden Park Yet again the Athletic were to lose by the narrowest of margins, this time in a replay against Blantyre Victoria.

The 1970s saw probably the most successful period in the club's history when a social club was built at the ground. Many local trophies were won and the team was considered as one of the leading teams in the east of Scotland. However the biggest prize of all, the Scottish Junior Cup still eluded Athletic.

The club's fortunes fell into decline both on and off the park in the 1980s and the Social Club was forced to close in 1986 with mounting debts. The park had been used as security for various loans and the creditors put the park up for sale to clear the debts. The team continued to play despite the off-field problems and were showing signs of revival when a near fatal blow was delivered when the ground was sold on to be developed into a supermarket.

Throughout the 1990s several initiatives were embarked upon to secure a new ground but for a variety of reasons, were unsuccessful. Eventually a new ground was acquired and. Penicuik Athletic were accepted back into the re-organised East Region and took their place in the second division in 2002-3. Promotion to the 1st Division was secured in season 2004 - 5 when Penicuik won the second division title.

In season 2005 - 6 Penicuik finished as runners up to Camelon in the 1st Division, narrowly missing out on promotion to the East Super League. Second place, however, gave Penicuik entry into the new Premier League of the East Region. Season 2006 - 7 Athletic found the going tough in the new Premier League and narrowly escaped one of the three relegation slots back to the District League. Relegation was avoided by beating Scottish Junior Cup finalists Kelty Hearts in the last league match of the season in front of over 500 fans. Season 2007/08 saw Penicuik improve their position in the Premier League by finishing in sixth place. Season 2008/09 brought further improvement in the league position with Penicuik finishing in fourth place. Season 2009/10 Penicuik had a poor start to the new season. A run of only one win in seven league matches before an enforced break for bad weather saw Penicuik drop into second bottom spot in the Premier League. Team manager, Snowy McKean stepped down and was replaced by Brian Ryrie and Craig Meikle, chosen from a strong list of applicants. Despite losing their first match in charge, sufficient points were gained from the remaining league fixtures to claim seventh spot in the league, finishing clear of the three relegation spots. Season 2010-11 Penicuik finished a respectable 5th in the Premier Division, ten points off a promotion place but a comfortable nine points off a relegation spot. A measure of Athletic's steady progress was their appearance in the semi finals of both East of Scotland and Fife & Lothians Cups

Has there ever been such a dearth of goals at The Canniepairt?

Ronnie Kenneth with 2 goals was Tayport's top league scorer on the Canniepairt in 2011. Joint runners-up were Messrs Elvin, Livie, Wemyss and Russell with a single goal each during the same period, the only Tayport players to have found their opponents' net in that twelve month period of league football. Yes, 7 goals is all the Canniepairt faithful had to cheer in 1,000 minutes of league football—and one of the seven goals was scored by an opponent!

Not that visiting fans had a lot to shout about, either. A mere 17 goals for them in eleven games.



A dearth of goals isn't a new phenomenon though. Even in 2005/06, our most recent Super League title winning season, the home fans had little to get excited about in terms of goals. 11 goals for and 7 conceded, a total of 18 goals in 12 games. Pop away for an ill-timed pee too often at Tayport and you could well not see a goal for a couple of years!

Indeed, since the advent of the Super League ten years ago, in only one season have Tayport broken the 20 goals barrier in their 12 league games at home — that was when we scored 21 in our most recent Scottish Cup winning season of 2004/05. It's not that the opposition have been scoring many either, we conceded only 5 in 2009/10 for example. Even in our two relegation seasons we only conceded 13 and 17 goals respectively at home.

This season's statistics of 3 goals scored in 5 homes games is disappointing but can be balanced out somewhat by having only conceded 4 goals in these games. That's an entertainment average, if you like, of 1.4 goals per games. When you compare that with the 2005/06 title winning season referred to above, of an average of 1.5 goals per game, it's maybe not too bad.

One thing's for sure though, if we're going to maintain a league challenge this year, things will have to improve on the goal scoring front.

It's accepted the way the game's played and the way the teams are set up tactically has changed and that it's unlikely we'll ever see the likes again of the days when Dave Reilly and Ronnie Kenneth would net 20 and 17 league goals respectively in a home league season as they did in 1995/96 and 2000/01 respectively. Goals, though, are the lifeblood of football. It's what fans want to see. Let's give it a go and get started today.

THE MANAGER WRITES

Looking ahead to today's East Premier League fixture, I'd like to begin by extending a warm welcome to all those associated with Penicuik. Our last match against them was a tight affair, with Penicuik having the upper hand during the first 45 minutes and the second half being more even. We managed to snatch the win, but I saw enough to know that Penicuik are one of the best sides we've played this season. Another tough match is in prospect today.



I was pleased that we were able to get a friendly against a young East Fife side on Tuesday, scoring seven without reply. It was an ideal game at an ideal time, as it helped us get last week's bad result out of our system. It

was pleasing that we had lots of different scorers as well, as we have been finding goals difficult to come by

We then had a good training session on Thursday and, at the end, I spoke to the players and emphasised that we had eleven league fixtures to play and they would all be like cup finals. There is little or no room for error. The players realise it's a case of now or never. I don't want them to have any regrets at the end of the season.

Although we are in the midst of an unbeaten league run that stretches back to September, we have drawn a few too many of these fixtures. I still believe that we have some terrific players at Tayport and few teams can match us when we play to our potential, but if we don't, other teams will catch us out.

There is no hiding place for Tayport players. It's not just a case of turning up and playing a game. This is a professional set-up, where expectations are high. If you play for Tayport, you have to stand up and be counted. You have to be able to take criticism. That is part and parcel of football. People have a right to express their opinion, but, having said that, I don't want negativity from certain quarters to detract from the togetherness of the club. There are lots of positives for us to focus on. We have a young team, with a certain freshness. OK, young players will make mistakes, but we can make real progress with the players we have in this squad.

We've made a few changes to the squad since our last home fixture. We brought in Simon Murray, a striker, from Montrose. He had been on loan at Downfield and was a regular scorer for them. The one positive of the recent postponements is that Simon has been able to settle in and train with the rest of the squad. Simon will add something to the team and he brings with him a great deal of enthusiasm. We'd like to wish him the very best, as he begins his Tayport career.

Just this week, we also signed Gary Robertson from Violet. He is an experienced, left-sided players and he will bolster us on that side of the park. I want to welcome Gary to the club.

Going in the opposite direction is Grant Manzie. He hasn't been a regular for us in recent months and I feel the move to Violet will allow him to continue to develop. I do want to thank Grant for his contribution to the club over the last few years and wish him the very best of luck for the future.

I also want to give a warm welcome back to Barry Donachie. He had been away on a trip around the world with his wife and we're pleased he's now back with us. He is a born winner and it won't take him long to get back up to speed. He got 90 minutes in our friendly against East Fife, so he's coming along well. Barry actually came home a couple of weeks early. He was involved in a game of beach football out in Thailand, but he made one robust challenge too many against a team of Thai waiters and was chased out of the country. Their loss is our gain.

Tayport were enjoying the experience of their first season in the top Tayside division and were handily placed in second spot, a point behind leaders Downfield with a game in hand. It is perhaps interesting to note that it may only have been January but the Tayside Championship was already drawing to a close with East Craigie, for example, having played 23 league games and only three left to complete their season.

This weekend in January 1992 Tayport were taking a break from league action with a Zamoyski Cup second round tie versus Lochee United on The Canniepairt. Tayport were in the midst of a run of thirteen successive wins which would stretch from 30 November to 29 February.

There was an estimated attendance of 250 as the following Tayport players ran out to face their local rivals - Fraser Mann; Paul Reilly, Grant Paterson, Mark Spalding, Andy Sommerville, Frankie Dolan, Billy Coventry, Grant Cushnie, Dave Reilly, Jackie Devine, Gary Lamont. The two substitutes were Jimmy Hunter and Ronnie Robb.

FLOOD FEARS THREATEN CANNIEPAIRT

A press report last week (well, it was last Fears over coastline being week before we were hit by postponements) reclaimed by rising waters reporting on Fife Council's latest Fife Shoreline Management Plan highlighted the risk to The Canniepairt over the next 20 years.

> In the plan, Fife Council's Head of Transportation, Dr Bob McLellan, stated that more than 1.200 properties in Fife are at risk of being flooded in the next 20 years as sea levels rise and as many as 2,822 properties could be under water by 2110.

The report continued by saying that, if action was not taken, Tayport would be worst affected in Fife with 284 properties at risk, "Tayport is quite large and heavily built up with a number of residential properties backing straight on to the coastline. "Sea level rise and coastal flooding heavily affects the town of Tayport, which is currently already defended by seawalls and rock revetment"

Although those living in the Harbour Road, Links Road and Shanwell Road South areas will be understandably concerned about their properties and the difficulty insuring same, we at the football club cannot be complacent. Anybody who has witnessed the erosion and change to the Tentsmuir shoreline in the last few years will be only too aware of the power of the sea.

The Council claims that building coastal defences will cost hundreds of millions of pounds.

DUNMORE REPORTS

Today sees Tayport play their first competitive fixture on the Canniepairt since the Emirates Scottish Junior Cup exit to Lochee United, on the first Saturday in December. The 3-0 scoreline slightly flattered the Bluebells, but they were undoubtedly worthy winners.

During the first half, Lochee had all the pressure, but Tayport kept their visitors at bay. Ironically, 'Port improved after the break, yet conceded three goals. Jon Voigt was the architect of the first, setting up Grant Lawson, midway through the half. In the final minute, Voigt added his own name to the scoresheet, to ensure victory. Then, deep in stoppage time, the misery was compounded when Iain Ross was sent off and Graham Hay completed the scoring, from the spot. That four players were also ordered off added to the bewilderment. Roberto Morris was first to be red-carded, for the last-man foul which led to the first missed spot kick. (The infringement looked to have taken place outside the box, but the referee was convinced otherwise) Andy McDonald was dismissed after the break, for an altercation with home midfielder, Baird, who had floored the Tayport man. Fraser Milligan saw red late on, for a second bookable offence. It was not Tayport's day. Let's hope for better this afternoon.

How the mighty have fallen. Rangers brought to their knees by their bank. The entire first team squad up for sale. The rise and fall of Govan's finest is wholly representative of what could prove to be the most disastrous quarter century in the once proud history of Scottish football.

1986 and the arrival of Graeme Souness saw Rangers start to exercise their financial muscle as they attracted England internationals north of the border with bumper wage packets and the offer of European football. By season 1992/93, with their Glasgow rivals also beginning to realise some of their massive financial potential, Scotland's domestic league looked to be in rude health. The Scottish champions achieved home and away victories against English champions Leeds United and only one goal deprived them of a place in the European Cup final. But this was a height that neither Rangers, nor any other Scottish team, was to get close to ever again.

It is no coincidence that 1992/93 was also the inaugural season of the Premiership. No longer would money be fairly distributed throughout the 92 league teams; now the English elite were free to reap the riches of satellite television. In the years that followed Rangers, desperate to establish themselves at Europe's top table, spent money that the income streams generated by Scottish football could never match. David Murray must still have nightmares about the £12 million spent on Tore André Flo.

Saddled with a crippling debt of over £70 million, Murray turned to the club's loyal supporters around the world. A share issue would allow them to take some ownership of their beloved club and help alleviate their financial woes. The fact that the call was almost wholly ignored should act as a warning to those who believe that the supporters are ready to ride to the club's rescue. Murray was forced to cover the issue with £50 million of his own money.

But now David Murray is skint and as a result the banks are no longer prepared to keep extending the credit offered to Rangers. Quite simply Scottish football is no longer profitable, if indeed it ever was. Gone are the players that could be sold for huge profits. Gone are the bumper TV deals. Gone are the millionaire investors. Income seems in terminal decline. The current market value cannot be much more than £7-8 million for the entire Rangers squad. Who can blame Lloyds for getting what they can while the playing staff are still under contract? Before long Rangers will have to sell lbrox. A proud history might soon be all that remains.
