We welcome Ballingry Rovers to the Canniepairt this afternoon and especially our former management triumvirate of Baikie, Irons and Carr with whom the club enjoyed so much success in the past.

Points are vital to this afternoon's contestants, both of whom are coming off the back of somewhat unexpected defeats.

It's only 16 months since the we met here in the league but both clubs have since experienced a major overhaul in personnel. Only Adam Moffat and Mark Morrison survive from the Rovers line-up that afternoon and it's no different for Tayport who have only Iain Ross and Stefan Elvin in today's squad from the side that won 1-0 here last season.

With a substantial injection of finance last year Ballingry have quickly built a side with the express intention of getting into the Super League and there's no doubt this is where they are heading. Tayport's aim was also to get up this season, not necessarily as champions, although that would have been nice, but as one of the teams finishing in the top four places. That's still a possibility but with every dropping of points recently, the task becomes that bit more difficult.

Tayport do have a decent home record, however, and this will be severely tested today against a Ballingry side boasting a 100% away record, so, with Tayport unbeaten at home in the league, something's got to give.

This is a hugely experienced Ballingry team which, on paper, is probably the most experienced Junior team Tayport have ever faced. Rovers are packed out with players who were Senior last season plus, in Craig Smart, Adam Moffat and John Martin, they have three guys who know the Junior game inside out.

Ballingry's 'Route One' tactics were the subject of some comment from Newtongrange boss Alan Miller who said in the press this week "Our feeling all season is that we have been the team that has tried to play against Ballingry, who just kick the ball up the park. I was pretty diplomatic about it before the game [Ballingry v Nitten last week] but that's what they do"

Well, it's certainly working for them most games and with Tayport adopting a more studied approach, it should make for an interesting game.

Tayport will be without top scorer Simon Murray who was red carded after the game last week and has to serve a one game suspension today. Greater responsibility will now fall on the shoulders of young strikers Nik Mann and most recent signing, 19 year old Robert Boyd, Robert has been with both Stranraer and Arbroath and both him and Nik are in the frame to be given a starting jersey.

It's certainly win or bust for Tayport while Ballingry can ill afford to lose two in a row if the title is to be secured. An interesting match is in prospect.

THE MANAGER WRITES





I'd like to give a warm welcome to our friends from Ballingry. Their management team needs no introduction to our supporters, as they are Tayport legends. They are personal friends of mine and it'll be good to see them this afternoon, at the Canniepairt.

I want to express how disappointed we all were after last weekend's result, at Broughty. There are a limited number of games left and a win would obviously have given us a better chance of promotion. I reckon 37 points would be enough to ensure a top-four place and that reversal has dented our hopes of reaching that total.

However, it's not beyond us and there won't be any defeatist talk from our camp. This set of players has what it takes to bounce back from a bad result. I have 100% belief in this squad and I've been in the game long enough to know that we have something positive happening at the club.

We had to have an overhaul of the playing staff this season. Through various circumstances, we have lost players like Roberto Morris, Derek Wemyss, Ronnie Kenneth and Brian Livie, Scottish Cup and Super League winners. Then, during this season, Paul Tosh, Fraser Milligan and Colin McNaught have left. We have replaced these players on a shoestring budget, maybe a tenth of what they'd have been worth in the transfer market. All things considered, I think the team has done fantastically well. With a predominantly youthful pool, it isn't totally unexpected that we would have an up and down season, but we have to live within our means.

As we enter a crucial phase of the campaign, I would urge the supporters to continue to get behind us, as the majority always do. The players

give their maximum every single week and they certainly respond to positive praise and encouragement.

I hope everyone enjoys this afternoon's match.



FROM THE ARCHIVES 10 YEARS AGO

MARCH 2003

The best Tayport team ever? That, of course, is debatable but TEN YEARS ago this week Tayport were on target for a Scottish Cup and Super League Championship double.

Visitors to the Canniepairt on Saturday 1 March 2003 were Rosyth Recreation in the third round of the Redwood Leisure Fife/Tayside Cup. Tayport had hit a purple patch since Christmas, winning five games on the bounce, scoring thirty goals for the loss of only one. Rosyth were duly seen off by 4-0 in front of a relatively disappointing attendance of 157.

The line-ups were as follows Tayport - Frazer Fitzpatrick, Scott Peters, Grant Paterson, John Ward, Roberto Morris, Jon Mitchell, Gareth Dailly, Allan Ramsay, Brian Craik, Barry McNaughton, Davie Evans. Mark Craib, Steven Stewart and Doug Scott came on as substitutes. Mark who? Mark Craib, it's probably fair to say, wasn't Baiker's most inspired signing, playing only 5 games + 2 sub. This game was to be his final appearance in Tayport colours. Goals came from Scooter, Wardy, Birdie & Davie Evans

For the record, the Rosyth line-up was Ewan Stenhouse, Martin Rennie, Mark Gibson, Gareth Hall, Scott Stenhouse, Bret Haggett, Kieran Grattan, James Watt, Michael Brown, Alan Aitken, Craig Scott. Subs were Ronnie Duncan & Callum Douglas.

In a 47 game season Tayport suffered only two defeats, losing 2-1 to Broughty after extra time in the first round of the Findlay & Co Cup and going down by the only goal of the game to Oakley United in the final league game of the season on The Canniepairt on 12 June. The title was clinched on 7 June with a 2-1 win at Bonnyrigg with goals from Ward & Peters.

To reach the final of the Scottish Junior Cup at Firhill, Tayport had to account for Coupar Angus, Johnstone Burgh, Wishaw, Irvine Meadow and Cumnock before eliminating Glenrothes in the semi final at Starks Park with a goal from Birdie Craik. Birdie (pictured) again hit the only goal of the game when Linlithgow Rose were defeated in the final to cement his legendary status at the club.

In the final of the North End Centenary Cup (Tayside / North), Tayport defeated Violet by 2-1 after extra time at North End Park, the winning goal coming from substitute Robbie Holden, now a leading marksman with Jeanfield Swifts.

There were two ever-presents that season, John Ward and Frazer Fitzpatrick who played in every one of the club's 47 matches.

Fly Emirates

The fifth round went very much to form although Bo'ness had looked down and out when they trailed Kirkintilloch by two goals with only twenty minutes left to play. Getting back in the game with their 70th minute goal, a comeback still looked beyond them but they levelled with two mins left and grabbed the winner deep into injury time when the Rob Roy's keeper's clearance went straight to the BU's McAvoy who coolly netted a golden goal.

At Rutherglen, Pumpherston's dream was also ended with a last minute winner from a Glencairn substitute

After dominating the competition during the early part of the century, former Tayside clubs have fared poorly in the past few seasons. It's now four seasons since a former Tayside club graced the quarter finals.



TODAY'S VISITORS BALLINGRY ROVERS



Ballingry Rovers have been described as the Man City of the East Region Juniors thanks to an investment last close season which allowed them to sign around eight players from the Irn Bru Scottish Football Leagues for this season's bid for the Premier League title and an assault on the Emirates Scottish Junior Cup. The Cup bid came unstuck at Sauchie early on but the Championship is firmly in their grasp.

Ballingry joined the Juniors in 2004 and had two mid table finishes in the Fife Regional Division before restructuring of the leagues brought them into the newly titled Central Division which was an amalgamation of Fife and Perthshire clubs. Rovers finished third that season thus missing out on promotion to the Premier Division.

Promotion came along in 2007/8, however, and as champions, the club moved up a tier. From then to the present day it's been four successive mid table finishes.



In eight seasons, cup success has been limited to two final appearances, both unsuccessful in 2007.

In early 2012 Ballingry prompted a few raised eyebrows when they appointed Tayport's legendary former boss Dave Baikie (above right) as manager. Baiker set about reshaping the team, one of his first signings being Stevie Nicholas (pictured left), who had once moved from Stirling Albion to Motherwell for £100,000 as a 19 year old. Next on board was Jayson Alexander from Lochee United, a one time trialist here at Canniepairt.

It was a case of out with the old guard and in with the new as a succession of new faces arrived during the summer.

Goalkeeper Kyle Allison (Linlithgow), Chris Hegarty (Forfar Athletic), Dougie Cameron (Montrose), Jonathan Smart (Montrose), Alan Rattray (Peterhead, although the former Violet youngster had been on Ioan at St Andrews United), Kevin Byers (Forfar Athletic), David Mowat (Forfar Athletic), Graeme Gibson (Forfar Athletic).

However, the most notable signing was probably tricky forward Bobby Linn from East Fife (pictured right)

There were early season signings, too, from the Juniors, the experienced Craig Smart (Hill of Beath) and John Martin (Glenrothes) and more recently Sean Anderson from Dundee Violet and Steven Kiczynski from Broxburn Athletic.

DUNMORE REPORTS

The last two McBookie.com East Premier League fixtures have brought contrasting results for Tayport. A fortnight ago, Penicuik Athletic visited the Canniepairt and Simon Murray put the visitors to the sword, with a hat-trick.

Murray opened the scoring early on, squeezing home his shot, after retaining possession inside the box. Although 'Port had a few more opportunities, Penicuik became the more dangerous looking side. They eventually equalised on the hour, when the ball was bundled home, after Neal Ferrie had kept out a powerful header, from a corner kick.

A draw looked to be on the cards, until late in the match. Simon Murray found Steven McPhee, who cut inside and fired in a shot which ricocheted into Murray's path. The striker swept home to give his side the lead. A few minutes later, Murray latched onto a Stephen Tront pass and was felled by the Penicuik 'keeper. The referee pointed to the spot and Murray netted the penalty to make it 3-1 and three points for Tayport.

It was hoped that John McGlashan's men could build on that excellent result when they travelled to Whitton Park the following week, to meet struggling Broughty Athletic. There was a bright start to the game and all was looking well when Stephen Tront netted the opener, with an impressively-executed, left-footed free kick.

Out of the blue, the Fed' equalised before half-time and worse followed a minute into the second half, when Broughty were gifted a second goal.

Although stunned by this turn of events, 'Port did quickly find an equaliser. This time, Steven McPhee showed great technique to score with a free kick and restore parity.

Unfortunately, the afternoon would end in major disappointment, as Broughty were awarded a contentious penalty, from which one-time Tayport forward Gary Fraser scored, giving the Fed' their first win of the league campaign.

Let's hope that result doesn't signal the end of Tayport's promotion bid. A win today would certainly provide a boost, but the opposition could hardly be tougher. An intriguing fixture awaits.


