FROM THE ARCHIVES

110 YEARS AGO

The Evening Telegraph reported on Thursday 25 February 1904 under the heading 'Argument on Common'

Yesterday some excitement was aroused in Tayport when it became known that two young men, Mr John Thomson and Mr Gordon, both bakers, were to run a mile on the Common to decide an argument arising over the bringing home of a football cup. At four o'clock they toed the line, the mile being six times round the football pitch. Mr A.L. Black was the starter and referee. Both kept pretty close together for four or five laps, and then Thomson put on a spurt, followed by Gordon but he failed to overhaul him and Thomson came in rather an easy winner.
[Well suppose it's better than pistols at dawn!]

106 YEARS AGO

The Evening Telegraph reported on 13 June 1908

Tayport - The East Common yesterday was kept lively by a large contingent of Dundee poor children who were enjoying a day's outing under the auspices of Pearson's Fresh Air Fund. The children crossed to Newport by the ferry boat and proceeded to Tayport by rail. Favourable weather conditions prevailed making the outing a great success. [100 odd years on and Dundonians continue to find Tayport a healthy and peaceful haven!]

69 YEARS AGO

October 1945

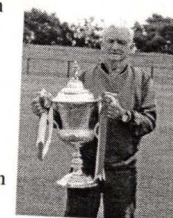
Following the end of hostilities Tayport Violet FC was the only team in the town and they played in the Midlands Amateur FA. One of the first post-war line ups was the following which played Builders United FC on the East Common.

George Cockburn; Robertson, Larry Adam; Joe Weir, Stanford, Newman; Patrick, Farquhar, Trewern, Davie Hughes and Jock Howe.

Some of the names will be familiar. For example goalie George Cockburn was later to be mine host at the Freemason's Arms, hence it's current name Cobbies Inn. Left winger Jock Howe is the father of Tayport FC striker of the 70s and 80s, Ian Howe. Jock stays in Monifieth but is still a regular here at The Canniepairt.

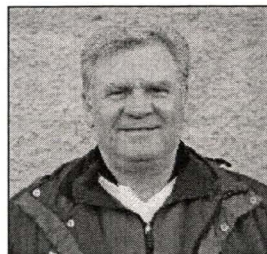
Inside left Davie Hughes (pictured) was posthumously awarded 'legendary status' at the most recent Legends Dinner.

THE BAIKER'S BIT



Good afternoon to the Port Support and may I welcome the players and officials of Hill of Beath, our Scottish Cup 4th Round opponents.

It's not exactly been a fantastic three weeks or so since the last Port Prog as we only picked up one point from a possible nine.

A home reverse to Lochee United was a particularly sore one to take. Had we gone in at the interval ahead in the game they couldn't have grumbled. Instead it was Lochee who led through an extremely dubious penalty. That coupled to losing a slack goal immediately after the break was enough to lose out on the day.

That was followed by another decent first half performance at Newtongrange but once again we let our concentration lapse not long after the break and were punished accordingly. It's vital for us if we are to make inroads into gaining success in games that every player who starts produces a level of consistency in their concentration throughout the game. One player switching off will lead to our demise in games.

Last week's game at Linlithgow was more encouraging for me. The 2-2 draw not only halted a run of five reversals, but, like the first half at Newtongrange and for 90 minutes last week we performed like a Super League side. There was a game plan. We kept a good shape. We defended better and caused our opposition problems on numerous occasions. No individual player dropped their work rate and if the officials had done their task as well, I would be talking about our victory at Linlithgow.

We know our opposition today well. They are undoubtedly a strong, well organised, streetwise side with a number of quality players. My challenge to our players this afternoon: This is not a league game. It's a win or bust. Produce a performance on the day, then you take the applause and move into the 5th round of a famous trophy. Make it happen!

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 4th Rnd TAYPORT

HILL OF BEATH HAWTHORN

We welcome Hill of Beath to The Canniepairt for this Scottish Cup tie, their first visit since April 2011 when they won 3-1 to drive another nail into Tayport's relegation coffin. That may have been less than three years ago but such has been the turnover of players at Tayport that only Barry Donachie survives from the home line-up that afternoon.

By contrast, more than half the Haws' squad that Spring evening, Hall, Callum Adamson, Smart, Wright, Barry Smith, Aaron Hay, Dair and Paterson are in line for a jersey this afternoon.

That contrast perhaps tells its own story with Haws' comfortable league position down to the consistency and experience that Tayport lack. Longevity of service at the club was always a Tayport strength but not so in recent years and experience, too, is in short supply. That said, Tayport have turned in some excellent performances this season without getting too many rewards for their efforts, last week's couple of points dropped at Linlithgow being the most recent example.

It's not only consistency on the park that stands Haws in good stead but off the park too with legendary manager Jock Finlayson having been at the helm for, well...forever. The 63 year old Keir's Park boss got his hands on the Scottish Cup 24 years ago and would dearly like to repeat that feat, as he would the Super League title after twice being runners-up.

Haws' form this season has been steady if not spectacular, scoring in every game since a blank on the first day of the season yet conceding at least a goal in all but three of their nineteen games to date. They demonstrated last week v St Andrews United their tenacity and desire to win. 0-2 behind to a Saints side who looked well set to chalk up a vital victory and three points, Hill of Beath clawed themselves back into the game to win by 4-3.

Hill of Beath striker Lyall Shaw is likely to miss out through injury as is Tayport's experienced on-loan midfielder Keith Gibson.

A Scottish Junior Cup tie is always a keenly anticipated fixture and hopefully the supporters will not be disappointed.

Referee is Mr Gavin Ross from Edinburgh.

DUNMORE REPORTS.....



It's been a few weeks since Tayport's last home match and, while it's been a tough period, the Canniepairt men can count themselves unlucky, as the breaks have certainly not gone their way.

When Lochee United came to town on the last Saturday of December, Danny Cavanagh gave them a seventeenth minute lead, but Kris Rollo equalised and it looked as though the sides would go in level at the break. However, a dubious hand-ball decision, on the stroke of half-time, gave Scott Gates the chance to edge the Bluebells back in front from the penalty spot.

Cavanagh scored again early in the second half and there was no way back for Tayport, who ended the year on a losing note, with 2014 scheduled to begin with tough trips to Newtongrange and Linlithgow.

At New Victoria Park, 'Port performed well for the first half, more than matching their hosts. Goalless at the interval, hopes were high that the second half would go Tayport's way. Five disastrous minutes put paid to such hopes. The Nitten opener should not have stood, as Mike Deland handled the ball before thumping it past Sam Morris. Things very quickly went from bad to worse though, as the hosts added two more counters, to lead 3-0.

Grant Lawson pulled one back, but there was no real prospect of a comeback. Lawson was on the scoresheet again last week, at Prestonfield, where Tayport were highly unfortunate not to claim all three points.

Lawson latched onto a Ryan Suttie header to race away and slot home the opener. Linlithgow soon equalised, through Callum Smith, but there was a hand-ball in the build-up. (So, one way or another, hand-ball decisions have gone against 'Port in three consecutive matches.)

Despite that equaliser, Dave Baikie's team was playing well, again more than matching their hosts. Indeed, on 44 minutes, Lithgae were stunned when 'Port notched a second. Again, Grant Lawson was the scorer, intercepting on the halfway-line, darting towards the box and delicately chipping over the advancing 'keeper, for a goal of real quality.

Now, what were we saying about Tayport not getting the breaks? In the second half, Lawson came mighty close to a hat-trick, only to be denied by the post. Then, a terrible pass-back by a Linlithgow defender by-passed his goalkeeper, with the ball travelling rapidly towards goal. 'Keeper Christie gave chase and cleared, but only after the ball had apparently crossed the line. With the assistant referee not in a position to judge, play was waved on and 'Port had to endure yet another decision going against them.

To compound matters, Colin Strickland plundered a 90th minute leveller, to make it two-apiece. Gaining a point at Prestonfield is definitely a positive result and a step in the right direction, but the performance deserved so much more.

It doesn't seem right to hope for our turn to gain from dubious decisions, but it would be nice if dubious decisions at least stopped costing us so dearly.



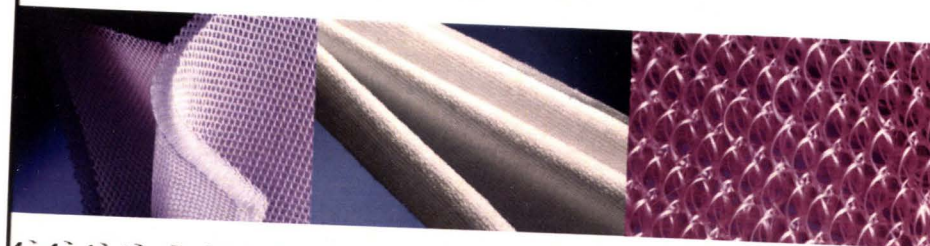

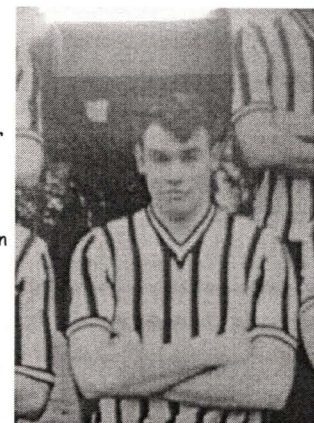

Newburgh, who had been semi finalists the previous season were looking to go one better and had accounted for Loanhead Mayflower, Hall Russell's, Whitletts Vics and Sauchie before their defeat by Bonnyrigg.

George had a very successful Under 21 Juvenile career with Bonnyrigg 'A', winning 12 cups in two seasons before stepping up to the Junior grade with Bonnyrigg Rose. The 1960s was a great period for George and the Rose, winning numerous cups as well as the Edinburgh and District Junior League for four successive seasons.

The photo shows George with the East of Scotland Cup, the Brown Cup and the Evening News Cup, all won in the same season.

Dick Smith, who had kicked off his Junior career with Kinnoull, signed for East Fife later in 1963. The highlight of his Bayview career was drawing a League Cup tie 1-1 at home to a strong Rangers side before narrowly losing the relay before 30,000 at Ibrox. By this time Dick had been converted to a hard tackling full back. After a short spell in Highland League Dick moved to Australia for a number of years where he won the Australian Cup with Hakoah and also turned out for Auburn and Revesby Rovers



Non-league 'Sir Alex' retires after 40 years

A LONG-SERVING manager who started his footballing days in Angus and has just retired 40 years later has published his memoirs.

The Sir Alex of English non-league football, Chris Symes, has retired from the game after 19 years at Cornard United.

The 62-year-old started at all in Arbroath, where he stepped off a Royal Navy vessel and into the football as a coach aged just 27.

He began his second career as a

Gayfield when Albert Henderson, without any professional playing experience.

Written by Neal Manning, *The Life and Times of Symes* is about his time in the navy, his beginnings in Scottish football and a long career in the south of England.

"I was 17 and I was in the navy, then from the players playing for me," said Mr Symes.

"At one time you would have to turn the lights out on the players at training to get them to bed it's not like that anymore."

"You ask them to hang the sheets up before a game or risk the corner flag in and you get 'no' but in the end so polite."

Newsletters, the players send a club booklet with their initials on it by the time they are 18 or they are dismissed."

Mr Symes, who runs the website *Barbours* which he has stationed at Arbroath, will visit Gayfield Park to see the West Lothian next season, along with the 100-year-old of the Arbroath FC Supporters' Club.

They make two trips to Scotland each season to watch the team.

The club was founded by the hugely enthusiastic Chris Symes who was the manager of the then recently opened Sports Centre at Newport's Waterstone Crook.

Chris worked very hard to get the club established and amongst his efforts was the construction of a wooden rail around Waterstone Crook's top pitch to satisfy the SJFA's entry requirements. Unfortunately things didn't go so well on the field, the club finishing foot of the table in both seasons before folding.

Regrettably Waterstone Crook never hosted a Scottish Junior Cup tie as in both seasons North Fife FC were drawn away from home. In 1977/78 they lost 4-2 at East Kilbride Thistle and the following season it was Dundonald 2 North Fife FC 1.

Chris moved down south after leaving Waterstone Crook and according to the article it would appear his enthusiasm for the game has never dimmed.

After 40 years of coaching and managing teams, Chris has published his memoirs, *The Life and Times of Symes*, which has been penned by former East Anglia's Green'Un sports writer Neal Manning.

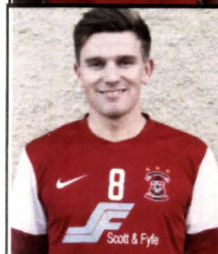
