

TODAY'S GAME SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP TAYPORT v RENFREW



Both teams today take a break from the crucial business of picking up much needed points in their respective Leagues. Tayport are striving to get clear of the bottom three places while Renfrew, currently in the West Region Super League's second tier, are anxious to avoid the trapdoor which would see them plummeting into the District Leagues.

Renfrew's co-managers Martin Ferry and Colin Clark didn't get their season off to the best of starts and drafted in highly rated youngsters Kyle Doherty and Sean Armstrong on loan from Stenhousemuir to strengthen their pool. The early season problems were then compounded somewhat by the necessity of selling top scorer Alain Kinney to Glenafton Athletic last month. Frew turned down an initial offer but accepted an increased bid for the player who had netted over half his side's goals in their opening nine games.

The income from Kinney' transfer was made available to the co-bosses to strengthen their side but suitable transfer targets have not been easy to find. In addition to the absence recently of left sided defender Andy Stobo through injury, striker Graham Barbour went down with shingles.

Following a run of six games without a win, Renfrew got things together with a 4-3 win in a crunch match away to Lesmahagow, although they almost let things slip after racing into a 3-0 half time lead. A point v Greenock next time out built on the 'Gow win but two weeks ago promotion challengers Cumbernauld United provided a setback by winning 4-1, a result which by all accounts flattered the New Town club.

Tayport fans are likely to see a home debut for defender Dale Robertson, signed two weeks ago from Fauldhouse United. Robert Boyd and Ruaridh Donaldson would have missed last week but are available again. Paul Thomson and Kenny McCulley were on Norrie's treatment table this week so there may be a late decisions on their fitness.

Both Tayport and Renfrew were without a game last week through their respective games suffering postponements so should be raring to go today.

As can be seen from the above extract from Stewart Davidson's Scottish Non-League review of 2005/06, this afternoon's two contestants dominated the Scottish Junior Cup during the first five years of the 21st Century. Indeed one could argue Tayport and Renfrew were the top sides in the country during that five year spell.

The years since haven't been nearly as successful, however, with both clubs having experienced lean times. Before their respective demises, however, Tayport and Renfrew had a successful 2005/06, Tayport finishing as East Super League Champions for a second time and Renfrew only missing out on the West Super League title on goal difference. In the Scottish Cup, the sides were paired in the 4th round. Tayport emerged victorious and went on to reach the semi final. That defeat by Tayport seemed to coincide with Renfrew hitting a slump from which they've never really recovered.

They were relegated the following season, 2006/07, and exited the Scottish Cup in round 4. The slump continued and in 2007/08 'Frew just avoided a second successive relegation and went out of the Scottish in round 2. An appearance in the final of the Central League Cup that season brought some respite during an otherwise fairly disappointing season.

Season 2008/09 was a fairly mundane affair, with another 2nd round Scottish exit and a mid table First Division finish. The next season, 2009/10, brought another 4th round meeting with Tayport and the end of Renfrew's run in the Scottish Cup but there was more promise shown in the league when they finished fourth, just missing out on a play-off place.

Although Renfrew negotiated a run to the 5th round of the Scottish in 2011, league form wasn't good and relegation was only avoided by 2 points.

The 2nd round was the extent of the Scottish Cup progress in 2012 but league form perked up and a place back at the top table beckoned when Renfrew reached the play-off, only to lose 5-1 on aggregate to Pollok.

Another dip last season, finishing mid table but only avoiding relegation by 3 points and again going out of the Scottish in round 2.

DUNMORE REPORTS



When last on the Canniepairt, three weeks ago, Tayport made very comfortable progress in the inter-regional GA Engineeering Cup, at the expense of visiting Coupar Angus. Dave Baikie took the opportunity to start several players who had not featured regularly of late and everyone showed up well in a 4-0 win.

Jake Mair set the ball rolling as early as the second minute and Nik Mann doubled the lead in the eleventh, heading home a Steven McPhee corner. There was one more counter before half-time, with Connaire Connelly heading in his first competitive goal for the club.

More chances followed after the break, but only one more goal came Tayport's way. Substitute Matty Adam was the scorer, netting after the Coupar Angus 'keeper had blocked Nik Mann's shot.

The following weekend, it was back to Super League business, when 'Port visited Ore Park to take on Ballingry. Both meetings last season resulted in 3-2 wins for the Canniepairt outfit and something similar seemed to be on the cards this time around. Matty Adam continued his goalscoring form with an early brace to give Tayport a deserved two-goal lead. Grant Lawson helped to create the first, while a blocked Ryan Suttie header led to the second.

The game's third goal, however, went to Ballingry. Former Tayport forward Lee Bryce was the man on target, giving Rovers a crucial lifeline. Adam Moffat then cleared a Suttie header off the line to ensure that only one goal would separate the sides at the interval.

The hosts equalised on 79 minutes, when Paul Thomson was unfortunate to net an own goal. Undaunted, Tayport continued to press in the closing stages and came mighty close to notching a winner, only for the home 'keeper to spectacularly tip away Grant Lawson's goal bound strike.

Both Culter and Auchinleck Talbot, the Juniors' sole survivors in the Wm Hill Scottish Cup, drew Scottish Senior League opponents in the draw for the 3rd Round...but probably not the opponents they would have chosen. A tie at Ibrox v Rangers (Airdrie's tie) or maybe at home to Dunfermline Athletic (Elgin City's tie) would probably have been preferable. Still, they'll not be complaining with ties at home v Berwick Rangers(for Culter) and away v Stranraer (for Auchinleck). Both ties are eminently winnable with Stranraer languishing in the nether regions of League 1 and Berwick not exactly setting the heather on fire in League 2.

Two weeks ago Linlithgow Rose disappointed their supporters, going down 3-1 to Deveronvale in their 2nd round replay at Prestonfield. Given that they had drawn 2-2 in Banff after surrendering a 2-0 lead, a home win had looked on the cards.

As seems to increasingly be the case, being held at home is not exactly a disaster. Four of the five replayed 2nd round ties saw the visitors win through after being held at home.

An amazing three weeks for Lowland League team Preston Athletic from Prestonpans. Three weeks ago they held Queen's Park to a draw at Hampden, two weeks ago they narrowly lost the replay at home by the odd goal in three. After the highs of two Scottish Cup ties, they returned to the bread and butter of league football last week but were cuffed 9-2 at home by Whitehill Welfare who are actually below them in the League.

Rules for some...

Last Saturday was a wonderful afternoon for football - soft going, mild temperature, no bright sun and no wind. Unfortunately we didn't get a game as the match referee decided the Canniepairt pitch was unplayable. The rain came on just after 1pm and was battering down causing a few shallow pools to form on the playing surface. Players of both teams appeared quite unperturbed and the referee was advised that the water would drain away quickly as soon as the intensity of the rain lessened or went off. The clubs requested we 'wait and see'. To no avail, as the referee declared pitch unplayable about an hour before kick off.

How galling, then, to watch players on TV playing in far worse conditions that evening and in farcical conditions in a Champions League match during the week. So, if the laws of the game are the same world wide, why off at Tayport but not in Lisbon? Do referees not receive the same guidance? A cynic might suggest it's because at Junior matches there is no inconvenience to UEFA and no millions of £s involved.

FROM THE ARCHIVES 100 Years Ago & 79 Years Ago

EVENING TELEGRAPH OCTOBER 1913

Junicus...yes, Junicus, who was writing in the Evening Telegraph last night, is still going strong exactly 100 years later and still contributing Junior football notes to the Tele twice a week. He reported in his column on 30 October 1913 that "Tayport FC reached Fairmuir [Dundee] about 3 o' clock prepared to play Renton. They found no ground marked off or nets up. By the time matters were rectified it was almost 4 o' clock, so that a league game was out of the question. Tayport have claimed the points ".

The Evening Telegraph also reported in October 1913 that the 2nd round of the Scottish Junior Cup had been drawn. The competition was drawn on a regional basis. Tayport were in the Fifeshire section and received a bye. The Fife ties were Crossgates Thistle v Boarhills Thistle; Hearts of Beath v Crail United; Newburgh West End v Denbeath Star; Windygates Rovers v Kelty Rangers.

There was no Bo'ness United in the East of Scotland and Borders section of the draw but Kinneil Ramblers were drawn away to Penicuik Athletic. [no joy in the competition that year for Tayport. The local populace had to wait another 82 years to see the Scottish Cup paraded through the their town]

Elsewhere the newspaper reported that Andrew Doctor, farmer. Garspit [sic], Tayport, pleaded guilty at Cupar Sheriff Court to a contravention of the National Insurance Act by failing to stamp the cards of his employees. The Fiscal said Mr Doctor had objected to licking stamps. He received a nominal fine of 10 shillings [50p] from Sheriff Armour Hannay.

79 YEARS AGO 23 OCTOBER 1934


A dastardly crime in Tayport was the subject of an Evening Telegraph report under the headline

Tayport Betting Offender. £5 fine imposed.

The newspaper reported "William Gray, labourer, 32 Henderson's Lane, Tayport admitted before Sheriff Dudley Stewart at Cupar Sheriff Court that on 17 October 1934 on Golf Road, Tayport, at the Caddie Shed owned by Scotscraig Golf Club he frequented and loitered for the purpose of receiving or settling bets. He pleaded guilty. His Lordship said 'is there room for this industry in Tayport?' (laughter).

"Mr R.S.Henderson, the Fiscal said quite a large amount of business was being transacted on that particular day. There was found in the accused's possession, 38 betting slips, a tick-tack clock containing money, 55 football points pools cards, labels addressed to his employer and a quantity of betting literature, notebooks and pencils. His Lordship imposed a fine of £5 and ordered forfeiture of the papers."

Not just the Junior Cup which has its spectator behavioural problems. The William Hill Scottish Cup replay between Preston Athletic and Queen's Park at Prestonpans was held up for a spell and the players taken off the park as the police dealt with flares being set off and also a pitch invasion. The Bobbies were certainly being kept busy that Saturday.

Goalkeeper Iain Ross was last week transferred to Broughty Athletic. It's understood there was serious interest from another couple of clubs, but ambitious Broughty came up with the goods. Our statistics guru tells us the big keeper, who signed on the start of season 2011/12, played 54 competitive games for Tayport and kept 19 clean sheets, an average of some 28%.
