TODAY'S GAME SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v **BONNYRIGG ROSE**

It may only have been 32 months since Tayport and Bonnyrigg last met here at The Canniepairt but it's perhaps an indication of the rapid turnaround of players at clubs these days when one realises there are so few survivors in each camp from that meeting in April 2011. Only Sean Grady and Chris Gray are now regular starters for Bonnyrigg whilst Tayport have only Barry Donachie and Barry didn't last the full 90 after two yellows = one red as Tayport went down by the only goal of the game.

Max Christie replaced Alan Miller, now boss at Newtongrange Star, as manager shortly after that win at Tayport and has completely revamped the squad he inherited and along the way has won the Super League title, the East of Scotland Cup and reached the semi final of the Scottish Junior Cup and taken his side to the 3rd round of the Scottish Senior Cup.

Although Christie and the Bonnyrigg fans will be very disappointed at going out of this season's Scottish Cup in the first round, beaten by Bo'ness United after a replay, they can now concentrate on collecting a third Championship. They arrive at the Canniepairt having won six games on the bounce but came mighty close to having that run ended last Saturday at home to St Andrews United after twice being behind and grabbing a late winner to take the points in a seven goal thriller.

It's a very experienced side that Christie has put together with only two players under 25 in his squad, several of who will be familiar faces to the Tayport backroom staff following their period working in south of the Forth with Bo'ness and Linlithgow. They were one or two players short last week and had to call on a trialist, Paul Harvey, and he netted one of the goals v Saints after coming off the bench in the second half.

Tayport disappointed at Broxburn, but although playing second fiddle for much of the match, remained in contention throughout and might have stolen a point. Keith Gibson was a late call off through illness but should be back for a home debut this afternoon and his experience will be welcomed. Nik Mann and Connaire Connelly are both unavailable.

Since our last home game Ally Smith, who hadn't featured this signing in the close season, has been transferred to Forfar West End and Robert Boyd has been transferred to Dundee



THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS BONNYRIGG ROSE ATHLETIC



Bonnyrigg Rose is one of the oldest and most respected clubs in the Junior game. Rose can trace their roots back to 1881 and as well as having recorded many a famous cup

and league success, the club was a prolific breeding ground for Senior football talent, particularly in the middle of the 20th century. The legendary John White (Spurs and Scotland), Pat Stanton (Hibs and Scotland) and Hearts' Tom White are amongst the famous names who graced the Dundas Park turf. Not the most famous of course. That would undoubtedly have been Jamesh Bond aka Sean Connery who was a player with Bonnyrigg in the 1950s when he was still a milkman, prior to becoming a cinema legend as 007.

Bonnyrigg have twice won the Scottish Junior Cup in 1966 (v Whitburn) and 1978 (v Stonehouse Violet) and were beaten finalists in 1972 (v Cambuslang Rangers).

Like Tayport, Bonnyrigg can lay claim to two Super League titles, the Rose successes coming in 2009 and 2012.

Tayport's three Scottish Cups and two Super League titles came a few years early to enable the club to get automatic entry to the Scottish Senior Cup but Bonnyrigg's two league title successes were more recent and gave them that opportunity.

In 2010 Rose drew 1-1 with Highland League Fraserburgh but lost out 1-2 in the replay at Bonnyrigg. In last season's competition they progressed to the third round, beating Girvan and Stirling University before going out to Brechin City.

Hopes were high after the home side had only just salvaged a 2-2 draw at Glebe Park but the only compensation after a heavy defeat at home in the replay was the share of the gate receipts!

The introduction of Steven McPhee and Matty Adam turned the match back in Tayport's favour, with both scoring in what became a 3-1 victory.

McPhee was the undoubted star of Tayport's stunning Scottish Junior Cup third round triumph, when he scored a memorable hat-trick against high-flying Newtongrange Star. The home side opened the scoring at New Victoria Park, but McPhee soon thundered in the equaliser. His second scorching strike gave 'Port an interval lead.

The advantage was precarious and Nitten must have believed that they could turn the tide in the second half. They could not. Matty Adam was on hand to slot home Tayport's third, after Grant Lawson saw a shot pushed away by the home 'keeper. Lawson himself added number four, following a surging run by Ryan Suttie. Star were now a spent force and Steven McPhee fittingly completed the rout late on, to seal his treble.

That incredible 5-1 win came the week after another mightily impressive victory. Visiting Bo'ness United were toppled in a Super League encounter in mid-November. Matty Adam headed the opener, from a Steven McPhee cross, but the BUs levelled on 34 minutes, courtesy of Andy Scott.

The Canniepairt outfit went close with a couple of efforts towards half-time. The winner was soon to come, albeit in fortuitous fashion. On 51 minutes, McPhee shot for goal, after a twisting run, and must have been surprised to see the ball squirm under goalkeeper Peat and into the net. 'Port deserved the three points though and a similar performance would be most welcome this afternoon, as Dave Baikie's side strive for another Super League win.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

20 YEARS AGO 11 DECEMBER 1993

December 1993 saw a first glitch in Tayport's steady progress since joining the Scottish Junior FA in 1990... shock...horror - four games and two months without a win.

Tayport had lost only once in 15 games since the start of the season before they drew 3-3 at Camelon in the 2nd round of the Scottish Junior Cup in mid November. The replay at Tayport was twice postponed before a 0-0 draw and an penalty shootout took Tayport through to meet Armadale Thistle in the thirds round on The Can-

niepairt the very next week, December 11th 1993.



It was a bit of a shock for Tayport, the previous season's beaten finalists, to lose 2-1 before their own fans in a 505 crowd on The Canniepairt. It wasn't a particularly cheery festive period for 'Port who had suffered something of a hangover from their Armadale defeat, failing to win for a fourth successive game when going down 2-0 to Downfield in a Perthshire Advertiser Cup tie the following week.

Tayport quickly recovered, however, and got their new year off to a good start with a win at Broughty Athletic and rarely looked back thereafter in a run which saw them taste defeat on only four occasions in the next 126 games.

You've seen the books in Waterstone's. You know idea. The type of thing you buy your old uncle at Christmas, knowing full well they're never likely to visit one, never mind 100 or 1,000. A Thousand Places to Visit Before You Die or A Hundred Charity Shops to Rake Through Before You Die. That sort of thing. Well here's a football related one that might well be of interest and one to which you can contribute. Read on.

100 BRITISH FOOTBALL GROUNDS TO VISIT BEFORE YOU DIE

A project is underway to find the nation's favourite football grounds - and your nominations are needed. Recently, I read an article about Nantwich Town of the Northern Premier League. A photo of their neat main stand drew me in, to the point where I found myself thinking, "I wouldn't mind going there to watch a match". In itself, this is a fairly unspectacular anecdote, were it not for the epiphany it inadvertently gave me.

Even if I were a dedicated traveller, there would never be enough time to visit the several thousand grounds that constitute our football landscape. As such, one sometimes has to be more selective. And here is where the epiphany kicked in. What if there were a bucket list, a holy grail if you like, of the top 100 British grounds to visit before you die? Who would be on it? Why would they be on it? And then it occurred to me: why not find out and write a book about it?

The problem is, where do you start with something so vast? It would be pointless for me to draw solely on my own experiences as I have only visited around 90 grounds, some of which have been positively awful. Besides, writing something so subjective on the basis of one person's opinion is riddled with folly. No, the correct thing, indeed the only thing, is to throw the matter open to a public vote. During my years following football. I have had the privilege to meet a diverse spectrum of fans and aficionados, from season ticket holders in the Premier League through to non-League groundhoppers.

It is this eclectic mix of venues that makes our football heritage so rich and rewarding, something the book will ultimately aim to capture in all its glory. So this is very much where I hand over to you, the person reading this article. In an attempt to try and bring this altogether, I am asking fans to nominate up to five of their favourite British grounds visited. They do not need to be submitted in order of preference, as each ground submitted will receive one vote. However, each vote should be accompanied by a brief explanation. Not only does this give the nomination credibility, but it allows the book to reference those who have actually visited the grounds.

You can nominate any existing ground at any level of the football pyramid in England, Wales or Scotland. In terms of individual selection criteria, this is fairly open. It could be anything from architecture, location, atmosphere, historical significance, the warmth of welcome or quality of food. Selections that are too partisan should probably be avoided. For example, 'because they're my club' or 'because we won the league there' don't really constitute solid enough justification for entry.

Votes can be submitted by emailing 100groundsproject@gmail.com. Closing date for entries will be January 31st 2014 (though this may be pushed back depending on work commitments nearer the time).

If you poll two different sample pools at two different points in time you are likely to get two different outcomes. But then this isn't a referendum on the laws of the game or a thesis on financial governance. First and foremost, this is supposed to be a bit of fun. And if it introduces fans to grounds or clubs they were hitherto unaware of, it can only be a good thing.
