We welcome Dalkeith to the Canniepairt for only the second occasion...and they won't want to be reminded of the first occasion in September two years ago, when they crashed to an 8-1 Premier League defeat. By the end of the season they were sick of the sight of Tayport, having lost the return game at King's Park by 5-0. It would be fair to say they were somewhat fluke results, given that most of the players who featured in these games are still with Dalkeith and were there last season when the club just missed out on a promotion place, finishing third behind Penicuik and Fauldhouse.

Manager Willie Pearson, therefore, has a very settled squad with no fewer than twelve of the side who featured in that most recent meeting still wearing Thistle colours. It was a disappointing pre-season, however, certainly in terms of results and this carried on into the opening two Premier League fixtures with a 4-1 defeat at Arniston then a 2-1 home defeat by Jeanfield Swifts. No panic, though, and all changed with a superb 2-1 win at Strathmore Park v Forfar West End which was followed up by a win by the same margin at home to Oakley United last Saturday. So, it's a form team we will see visiting us this afternoon.

Matty Adam will still miss out after the injury sustained v Edinburgh while there are also fitness doubts over John Tonner and Kevin Milne. Dean Rennie is on holiday but Kris Rollo should be back. Yet to appear this season because of suspension and holidays, Ryan Suttie is likely to miss again today because of a wedding. Goalkeeper Gavin Wilson, signed from Cupar Hearts will continue between the sticks.

In stark contrast to Dalkeith, only three of Tayport's squad from the most recent meeting of the sides in March 2013, Stefan Elvin, Kris Rollo and Connaire Connelly, will renew acquaintances with the opposition today, evidence of the rebuilding job currently underway at Tayport.

A TRAVELLER'S TALE No. 1

It's always interesting to get a neutral's view and here we reproduce a posting, courtesy of Tony Kempster's website forum, of a Groundhopper's visit to Cardenden for the recent Dundonald v Tayport league match.

East Juniors Premier Division (level 2)

Dundonald Bluebell v Tayport 3-2 (2-1) @Moorside Park Admission £5, raffle £1, no programme, lentil soup (x2) and pie £3.20, att. 155 (h/c).

Moorside Park is yet another small gem of a ground in Fife, the Fifers take pride in their football and football grounds. The ground is at the outskirts of Dundonald, a small gathering of houses forming part of Cardenden, and within easy walking distance of Cardenden Rail Station. You enter the ground, neat and tidy and resplendent with white and blue paint, near the corner flag. Along this side are the social club and a decent-sized enclosure with the dressing rooms in a building behind. Catering is served through a hatch at the side of the dressing room block and the lentil soup, abundant with tatties and carrots, was delicious. Moving further along the near side, there's a grass bank and a second enclosure, not as rickety as it looks, with four steps nestled into the bank. The ground is enclosed with wooden fences at the ends and a line of trees on the far side with fields behind. There's a third enclosure at the far side, slightly larger than the dugouts.

The game was even and well contested. Tayport took an early lead, Bluebell equalised with a goal that looked offside to me and took the lead on the stroke of half time as a rebound off the post was put through goal. Tayport had missed a similar chance minutes earlier hitting a rebound wide of an open goal. The visitors had a goal disallowed for offside midway through the 2nd half which led to an early bath for one of their players as he wasn't entirely in agreement with the referee. Bluebell had the chances to close the game after that but Tayport snatched an equaliser with a few minutes to go only for Bluebell to hit back and score on the stroke of 90 minutes, leading to an elderly Bluebell committee man running along the enclosure waving his walking stick in unbridled joy. A proper ding-dong battle, great entertainment and football at its best.

108 PEARS AGO

The Evening Telegraph on 25 May 1906

reported on Tayport FC taking the huff

Much Disputed Final ran the headline

St Andrews Burghs Association, after much hesitation, has sent the final of the Martin White Cup to Bayview Park, Methil. How the burgh clubs come to have the use of the field is a story by itself. Mr McKinlay of Montrave Association had it booked for the Wemyss Violet v Tayport final but the Tayport lads flatly declined to cross the County and no Gilmour Cup Final is to be fought this year.

It took Tayport another 84 years to get the opportunity to play at East Fife FC's Bayview Park, the original Bayview Park that is.

Tapport FC returned to Bayview Park, Methil

on Monday 29th OCTOBER 1990 to see the club's Fife XI lift the Skol

Cup with a 1-0 win over Savoy Hearts, thanks to an Alan Gray goal after only 4 minutes play. It was a damp evening in Methil but a crowd of 300 rolled up to see the following team lift the silverware for 'Port.

Miller Lang, Alan Gray, Andy McRobbie, Andy McDougall, Alan Hart, Davie Blair, Richard Rennie, Fergus Mann, Colin Gray, Bert Valentine, Allan Harte. Subs were Gary Kirk and Eddie Ramsay.

There are a couple of connections with Tayport's current squad. Richard is Dean's father while Fergus is goalie coach Fraser Mann's brother.

110 PCARS AGO on 26th APRIL 1904

The Dunbee Ebening Dost reported under 'Tapport Dews' that "At last week's County Licensing Court, it was decreed that all licensed houses in Tayport be closed on the dates of Dundee holidays. This will prevent a recurrence of the disgraceful scenes witnessed on the Spring Holiday".

The other item of news that day was "Winnipeg, Canada, appears to be the El Dorado of Tayportians in quest of fortune and next week Mr & Mrs Beath and family set off to try their luck in the great western city".

Former Tayport players have been banging in the goals in early season matches. Jake Mair, Robert Boyd, Keir Reilly and Bryan Duell have been on the mark for Violet. Nicky Mann was on the score sheet for Downfield. Ross Gunnion grabbed the winner for Jeanfield the other week, James Russell counted for Broughty Athletic and Robbie Holden snatched the only goal of the game for St Andrews at Montrose Roselea last week. In addition, ex'Port favourites Simon Murray and Mark Whatley have done their bit to help Arbroath FC in their climb to the top of the table in the SPFL's Division 2. There was also a somewhat tenuous goal scoring connection with, if not Tayport FC, then the Tayport Arms. Pub regular Ally Harris' nephew Steven Harris hit a second half hat-trick to give Newburgh a super 4-3 win over Downfield in Dundee last weekend.

It's almost exactly 20 years since Tayport's first and to date only game v Port Glasgow...and the way things are going, it might also be the last. During last season it became apparent that Port Glasgow owed Inverclyde Council, their landlords, something in the region of £8,000 for various outstanding charges. Despite meetings held over the last few months in an attempt to resolve the situation, it seems matters have reached something of an impasse and Port Glasgow have now been banned from using Council owned facilities. All games scheduled at home this season have so far been played away from home.

The 26 man Scottish International squad selected for the Germany Euro Qualifier next month contains only three home based players which must be the lowest ever percentage of home Scots in a squad. A sad indictment of football in Scotland..

A football match where all 22 players, referee, linesmen and reserves shared the same name of Bungay has taken place in the town of Bungay in Suffolk. Bungay is one of Britain's rarest names with only 455 people called Bungay in the country - just 12 people per million.

The Bungays came from Britain, Australia and America and they turned up for the match which is believed to be the first in the world using all players of the same name. The mixed sex teams were able to tell each other apart as they had different red and blue shirts - but all had Bungay printed on the back. The mascot for the match was an eight-year-old Carla Bungay and the doctor on hand to treat any injuries was Dr Elizabeth Bungay.

The idea for the match came about after Shaun Cole who is on the Bungay Town FC management committee decided to investigate ways of promoting the Anglian Combination League club. He saw a mention of the London advertising and public relations company Beattie McGuinness Bungay on Twitter and contacted the firm to see if anyone called Bungay worked there.

Mr Cole, 51, ended up speaking to the firm's director Bill Bungay who suggested they find as many Bungays as possible to play in a football match. He then searched the BT directory inquiries website to find addresses for 68 families with the name. Mr Cole wrote to all the Bungays he could find and contacted others internationally on Facebook and Twitter. Retired lorry driver Chris "Tiiffer" Bungay, 57, of Queensland, Australia, agreed to play in the match while combining it with a holiday to visit his relatives in Britain.


Mr Cole found qualified referee John Bungay, 61, from Eastleigh, Hampshire, England, who agreed to officiate. His two sons Andrew, 37, and Graeme, 34, also attended. All profits from the match; which was drawn 6-6, went to The Jack and Ada Beattie Foundation, which supports vulnerable people.
