

Today's Game Premier Division Tayport v Bathgate Thistle



A happy new year to everyone in both camps today as Tayport FC welcome Bathgate Thistle as first footers to the Canniepairt, their first visit since the final game of 2014/15 season. Such has been the change in personnel here, that only Alan Tulleth and Connaire Connelly are still at Tayport.

Bathgate Thistle

A Bathgate club played in the Senior Central League pre-World War 1 along with the likes of Alloa Athletic, Dunfermline Athletic, St Johnstone and Stenhousemuir. At the end of the war the Central League clubs were more or less invited en bloc to form the second division of the Scottish League. Bathaate survived for eight seasons playing at Mill Park before resigning from the league. The club carried on until 1932 before folding and the ground was sold for council housing. The main stand was sold to Stenhousemuir.

Bathaate Thistle was formed in 1936 and joined

the Midlothian Junior League for season 1938/9, playing home games at Creamery Park, their present ground. In season 1947/48 Thistle reached the Scottish Junior Cup semi final, losing narrowly to Irvine Meadow after 3 games (two of them at lbrox) watched by almost 93,000 people in total.

In the mid 1950s nine players went to the Seniors December 17th. During the most notably goalkeeper Billy Ritchie who went to Rangers. With the loss of so drawing 3-3 against many players in a short space of time the team went into decline and nearly folding several times in the early seventies. In 1987 the Hydraload company of Willie Hill, a former player and later manager, invested in the club. Things started to improve both on and off the park and Thistle won East Region Division 2 in 1986/7 and 90/91, East of Scotland Cup in 2006/7, Fife and Lothians Cup in 2009/10 and after being beaten semi finalists in 2006. Bathgate achieved their ultimate goal by winning the Scottish Junior Cup in

2008. Now part of a Community Club, **Bathgate Thistle have** slipped a bit from these halcyon days [haven't we all! I and were relegated from the Super League in 2012.

Today manager Andrew

Colley will be hoping to continue winning ways after beating Dalkeith Thistle 3-1 in their last legaue game on festive break, Bathgate played two friendlies, Lothian Thistle H.V. and beating Stoneyburn 8-2. Players to watch out for are ex Dundee United

striker Robbie Feeney [pictured] (14 goals), Darren

Dalrymple (5 goals) and Hassan Nyang (4 goals). Tayport boss John Ovenstone doesn't have a full sauad available but nevertheless will be hoping to pick up three points to close the gap on the teams





Manager's Memo



Good afternoon and a happy new year to all our supporters, staff and today's visitors Bathgate.

2017 is a fresh year and we want it to be a successful one. With our relegation, 2016 wasn't the best of years for us but we are starting to rebuild and starting to see results. It's going to take time to get Tayport anywhere near the team we want them to be but as far as I'm concerned we're on the right track. The final saw us up against Kelty and they are probably the best junior side I've ever played against. The talent they have and they way they played was a great experience for our young lads. Although we were beaten 4-0, I thought we competed well and if it wasn't for magnificent finishing from them, on another day we could maybe have caused a wee upset. However that's the difference in levels between the sides but that's where we should be striving to be a few years down the line.

Today will be a difficult one as is every game in this league, Bathgate were tipped at the start of the season to be around the leaders come May and will be a dangerous outfit in the second part of the sea-

We need to maintain our home form and start the year well with 3 points. We aren't far away from full strength which is a relief because we have been missing a few vital players. Alan Tulleth is now fit while Sergio Alvarez and Keiron Conway are looking to be back fit for Downfield next week. Daniel Sanchez is missing today as he is away home to visit his family over the festive period. He will be missed as he has been up there with the best performers this season but it gives others a chance to grab the jersey. Other than that, I've got a full squad from which to choose. I hope you enjoy your afternoon and 2017 is a successful year for everyone connected with Tayport.

DUNMORE REPORTS...



It's been almost a month since Tayport last played on the Canniepairt and that East Premier League fixture against Haddington turned out to be a thriller. The visiting Hi-Hi dominated the first half and opened the scoring early on. Midway through the first half, Dale Reid guided in the equaliser, but the visitors were ahead again, by the interval, and only the crossbar prevented Haddington from going in with a two-goal cushion.

'Port were not performing and it did not take long for the Hi-Hi to add a third goal and leave Tayport well and truly up against it. Gradually, however, 'Port began to take the initiative, helped by a Struan Christie thunderbolt which crashed against the woodwork. Still, Tayport needed a goal to get back into contention and it came on 85 minutes. Stuart Walton's free kick hit the bar and Latvian Pavel Ostrovskis netted on his first appearance.

Three minutes later, Liam Ross was fouled by the goalkeeper and Marc Ogg lashed home the leveller, from the spot. In injury-time, the Canniepairt outfit completed a memorable comeback, with Stuart Walton getting the plaudits for a late, late winner, from the far side of the eighteen-yard box.

The following week, it was on to

Whitburn, where two points were dropped. Tayport had a few openings before eventually going in front on 37 minutes, when Jamie Mackie sent a screaming strike into the back of the net from distance.

At the start of the second half, Pavel Ostrovskis was sent off for a second caution and this would prove costly. Tayport did score a second, when Dale Reid dived to head home Grant Mowatt's effort, but Whitburn kept plugging away and pulled one goal back ten minutes later, before netting an 86th minute equaliser, to earn a share of the points.

That game at Whitburn was Tayport's last competitive outing, but John Ovenstone's side ended 2016 by playing in Kelty's festive tournament. Last Tuesday, 'Port took on Kennoway Star Hearts and came back from 4-2 down to win 5-4, in an exciting tournament opener. Fraser Anderson and Grant Mowatt notched one goal apiece, while Alan Tulleth stole the show with a hat-trick.

In Thursday's final, against Kelty, the hosts were too strong, running out comfortable 4-0 winners. At least Tayport managed to get a couple of matches under their belts, which will stand them in good stead for today's league match, as Bathgate Thistle first-foot the Canniepairt.

PLAYERS REFUSE TO TRAIN.

TO-MORROW'S GREAT TIE.

The chances of the local team against
Violet in the Scottish Cup tie to-morrow are
considered very good, and there is no doubt
that with a strong team opposed to them
Violet will require to go the whole ninety

The 'troubles' (see left) must have been resolved as the 'Great Tie' went ahead as planned on Saturday 28th November 1903.

The match report said "Tayport proved they were the superior lot and deserved credit for their fine first half display." Tayport trailed Violet by 2-0 at half time but in the second half

"the rain was now pouring hard...and towards the close the ball could hardly be followed owing to darkness...the game was then stopped 12 minutes before time"

The following Wednesday the Scottish Junior FA ordered a replay for three days later, on Saturday 5th December.

The **Evening Post**, in the vernacular of the time reported..."The postponement only seemed to whet the enthusiasm of the Fifers and notwithstanding an early start, there was a large crowd present....as the game progressed it was seen that the ground was really in a dangerous state and in some parts of the pitch it was impossible for the players to gain their footing. Tayport were a goal behind at half time and when they had a goal disallowed "Referee Sturrock had to bear the inflictions of some choice epithets from the Tayport supporters" [113 years on, and no change there, then!]

Tayport then went 2 goals behind but fought back when "the sphere was passed to Wilkie who headed through. Tayport went at it with a will and A.Oswald passed the ball to his brother who shot straight and hard. The teams now being on level terms, considerable excitement prevailed. Messer looked offside when he captured the ball and sent it into the top corner of the net, but the point was allowed and the players for the next few minutes went wild with excitement. They now had all the play and in the concluding ten minutes, the visitors could do little against such tactics. One of the hardest matches ever played on Tayport Common thus ended Tayport 3 Dundee Violet 2"

No joy for Tayport in the 4th round as they went out of the competition, beaten 2-0 by Edinburgh's Morningside FC.

Chairman's Chat

Club chairman and legendary former manager David Baikie pens a regular column for the match programme.

I hope everyone had an enjoyable time over the past couple of weeks and may I take this opportunity to wish all our supporters a happy and prosperous 2017. Looking back over the year just past at the club, there's been quite an upheaval with myself, Mel, Gus and Fraser deciding to call it a day, albeit just a couple of months prior to the beginning of 2016 and then announced retirement of Abby, Herx and Kenny from the committee close to the end of the season.

On the playing front, relegation from the Super League was a big disappointment but not unexpected as it's been a cycle that's unfortunately continued over this past decade. I've spoken previously regarding my thoughts on the reasons for this situation. The league reconstruction some twelve years ago definitely created a divide in fortunes whereby the clubs with the most financial clout have, in the main, succeeded and the rest have found a level. The midweek tournament at Kelty only confirmed my thoughts on the subject as the gulf between Kelty Hearts and Tayport was there for all to see. The difference was not only the quality on the pitch but off it as well. Unfortunately the days of pulling together a group who were willing to play for virtually buttons, but who had the massive advantage of having character and a desire to succeed, are all but a thing of the past.

This season our fortunes are most definitely still in our hands. Yes, the stats don't lie, but our league position is a reflection of where we are, as I know only too well just how difficult it has been for John to attract players who could strengthen our team. I recently looked at a photo of the side that won the Premier League and the GA Cup which was only 18 months or so ago and we now only have a couple of these players at the club. I lost 5 or 6 of those players going into the Super League and hard as I tried, I could not replace them with the same standard of player, so we were in a position, going into a division higher with a much weakened side. John has had to deal with the same scenario as he's had to con-

tend with the loss of, or almost of, the remainder of that group.

So what does 2017 hold for Tayport FC? Well, to state the

obvious, it's another year. We have a committee, that is almost new and double in size and is willing to put in the effort. I, like them, am ambitious for the club to prosper. We have a young manager who has a backroom staff with vast experience and together we must all strive to make Tayport once again a force. Someone once said 'the only place where success comes before work is in a dictionary' so if we are all serious about wanting this club to be a force again, we must all pull together both on and off the field and put in the work.

At this time sponsorship is without doubt one of the main differences between our club and those clubs who sit at the top of the Super League. Tayport has always been a team of fundraisers. We've had a committee of hard workers who've dedicated their time and effort to raise funds for the club and team they love and support but in reality what was enough in the past is not enough now. We need to generate more income and find a substantial sponsor or sponsors to help Tayport move on from being a yo-yo club to becoming a major player again. Of course we must continue the fantastic work the past committee did but we must also double our efforts to seek strong financial backing.

Finally, I'd like to thank everyone on or off our committee for their efforts behind the scenes. Believe me, it was an eye opener for me who as a manager demanded this and demanded that. It's supposed to be an unpaid hobby but it can at times be an unpaid full time job, so all of us should recognise and thank all of these guys. We're all singing from the same hymn sheet and we all want our team to be the best.

So, as each point won gives some hope, each point dropped increases the doubt.

Despite possessing one of only 5 unbeaten home records in the 60 club East Region, our form up to the turn of the year suggests we will have to show improvement to finish better than sixth top.

Tayport do have a track record, though, of trashing form statistics in this division so who knows? Wins in our three league games in January would go a long way to improving the picture.

Sauchie look certs for the title whilst at the other end Violet, at the moment, look destined for the drop but it's going to be tight and a run of bad results, such as St Andrews United are experiencing at present, could see one of half a dozen other clubs staring into the abyss come May.

Forthcoming Fixtures

Next Saturday Tayport make the relatively short journey across the Tay to Kirkton to meet **Downfield** in a Premier Division match. Tayport's emergence as a force in the Junior ranks twenty seven years ago also marked the beginning of the end of Downfield's reign as the top side on Tayside under the Grier brothers' management.

The clubs met regularly, as often a six times a season, from 1990 until the advent of the Super League re-structure in 2002. From 42 games vs. each other in our first 6 seasons to only 6 games vs. each other in 14 post-restructure seasons illustrates the extent of the Spiders' demise. There are clear signs, however, that they are on the rise again and recording a first win against us in 24 meetings stretching back 21 years provides our opponents next Saturday with the perfect incentive.

On Saturday 21st January we host Jeanfield Swifts in the East of Scotland Cup then on 28th January we're at home v Armadale in the league and on 4th February it's a trip to Aberdeen to meet Sunnybank in the GA Cup. Weather permitting, a vital month for the club which will make or break the season.
