Tayport v Cumbernauld United



We welcome Cumbernauld United, who play in the McBookie.com Super League First Division, the second tier of the West Region Juniors, back to the Canniepairt for a repeat of the one and only previous meeting of the clubs back in 1992. Tayport shocked their visitors that day with a 7-1 win but we're unlikely to see a scoreline like that this afternoon.

Neither side has set the heather on fire so far this season and the respective managers will be looking for a morale boosting win and a passage into the next round of one of the world's oldest football tournaments, now in its 131st year.

It was a Scottish Cup defeat by Luncarty last season which saw Cumbernauld part company with George Shaw, their manager of only 5 months. Said club chairman George Watson, at the time "results have been poor to say the least and losing to Luncarty was the final straw"



Cumbernauld moved quickly to fill the vacancy by appointing Thorniewood United manager Andy Frame (pictured above) as the new No.1 at Guy's

Meadow. Frame succeeded with his initial challenge of steering the club clear from the threat relegation.

The close season gave Frame the opportunity to re-shape his squad and during the close season there were a host of comings and goings as the management team faced the challenge of winning a place in next season's re-structured top tier. In came keeper Jordan Brown (Rob Roy), defender Paul Murphy (Petershill), Mark Batchelor (Cumbernauld Colts), Willie Wells (Irvine Meadow), Martin Shiels (St Rochs), veteran striker Robbie Winters and most recently another striker, Fraser Team from Rutherglen Glencairn.

Recent results have not been great but three of the four defeats in their five games have been inflicted by teams currently sharing the top of the league. Their win, 5-4 at Darvel, is the Ayrshire side's only defeat to date.

Tayport repeated their Houdini act of last season versus Haddington on Saturday past when they again came from behind with only a few minutes remaining to collect full points. The profligacy in front of goal, however, and the errors which almost gift wrapped the points for the visitors will be of concern to Charlie King but he'll have been heartened by the spirit shown by his players. To finish on top. Hopefully an entertaining game is in prospect.

Cumbernauld United, founded in 1964, are based at Guys Meadow Stadium in Cumbernauld, the ninth biggest locality in Scotland with a population of around 52,000. It was the third of Scotland's designated 'New Towns' created in the mid 1950s after East Kilbride and Glenrothes.

Since being promoted as champions from the third tier Central Division 1 in 2010 Cumbernauld have held their own in the West Region McBookie.com Super First Division, peaking with a 4th top spot in 2015.

Cup success has pretty much eluded Cumbernauld over the years with an Evening Times Cup Winners Cup win in 1978 a rare cause for celebration.

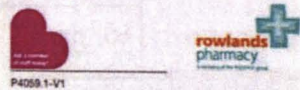

When Cumbernauld was last at Canniepairt 25 years ago, striker Robbie Winters, 43 in a couple of months, had just signed for Jim McLean at Dundee United, his first professional club. A Scottish Internationalist (v Germany in 1999), Robbie has had an amazing and incredibly lengthy career. After United he moved to Aberdeen then Luton Town, Brann in Norway for 6 years, then seven Scottish League clubs, a spell in Iceland and now **Cumbernauld United** which is his 5th Junior club. He's still knocking in the goals, having netted two in Cumbernauld's last three games.



Robbie was SPFA young player of the year in 1997, Norway's Premier League's POY in 2004. In addition he has amassed numerous winners and runners-up medals with his array of Senior clubs. He also has a runners-up medal from his time with Pollok. He came on as sub for Pollok v Beith in the 2016 Scottish Junior Cup final and scored with his first touch. It finished 1-1 and although Robbie netted his penalty, Beith won the shoot-out.

Hats off then to Robbie for his longevity in the game. Yes, he actually has had more clubs than Jack Nicklaus. Jack's only allowed 14. Robbie's had 17!

Tayport advance in OVD Cup

Tayport go forward to the second round of the OVD Scottish Cup after crushing Central League Cumbernauld last Saturday. The early minutes of the match belonged to Cumbernauld, a McAvoys cross stretching Mann, followed by a Murphy effort which slipped past the wrong side of the post. The visitors were making effective use of the offside trap, but once Tayport had breached this in the 18th minute, to allow MacKay to stab the opener past Connelly, there was never any doubt as to the outcome of the match.

MacKay slammed home his second after being set up by a neat touch from Dave Reilly.

It was Reilly who then took over the limelight. Connelly had to be quick off his line to thwart the rushing forward. Next, a tremendous curling shot over the defence came off the underside of the bar. Finally, seven minutes before the interval, Reilly found himself clear of the defence to notch the third.

Yet again, it was the visitors who started strongly, Doogan firing past the upright. However, the inevitable fourth was only parry a Paul Reilly shot and MacKay pounced for his third.

Two minutes later, D. Reilly got on to the end of a low ball into the box from Devine and neatly clipped the ball over Connelly.

The visitors grabbed their only crumb of comfort moments later when Valentine beat Mann from close range.

With 15 minutes remaining, another quick-fire double from Tayport finished the scoring. MacKay made good ground down the right and his ball into the middle was met by Devine, who beat Connelly, low at his right-hand post.

The best was definitely kept until last when Lamont scored a real beauty which, had it been scored in a televised senior match, would have had the commentators in raptures. MacKay was involved yet again sending over a high ball which was met perfectly on the volley by the wee winger and Connelly never even saw the ball as it screamed past him into the net.

Last Saturday's cup-tie was kindly sponsored by Mr Keith Sinclair of the Taybridge Bar, Dundee.

Owing to a Scottish Cup replay at Glenesk Park, tomorrow, a league match against Violet has been switched to Tayport with a 2.30 kick-off.

United went tumbling out of the OVD Scottish Cup to a team who outplayed, outthought, and totally overran them, once they got their nose in front.
