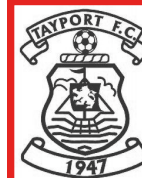

DUNMORE'S Match reports

The 2018/19 season is now well underway and Tayport have made a mixed start to the campaign, with one win and one defeat to date. The victory came on opening day, against **Kennoway Star Hearts**, with 'Port coming from a goal down at the break to record an impressive 3-1 win.

After a bright opening spell from the hosts, Dylan Muir gave the visitors the lead when he escaped the defence to calmly slot past Gavin Sorley in the Tayport goal. Early in the second half, Dayle Robertson, a regular marksman for 'Port, fired in the equaliser and, from that point, the Canniepairt men took over.

Substitute Steven Harris then won a header from a Jamie Gill corner and defender Kieran Conway reacted quickest to prod his team into the lead. KSH were then reduced to ten men, with Nathan Doig receiving his marching orders and 'Port soon put the game to bed. Stewart McConnachie sprayed a crossfield pass to Jamie Gill and he finished well to make it 3-1, before the visitors had Jason Watson ordered off, to finish the game with nine men.

Unfortunately, Charlie King's men could not build on that victory and they slipped up at Westview Park last weekend, losing to **Kirrie Thistle**, who had finished at the foot of the Premier League table last season. Following a goalless first half, two former Tayport strikers were involved in Kirrie's opening goal. Dale Reid, who left 'Port in the summer, went down under a Connor Gray challenge, to earn a spot kick. That penalty was dispatched by Darren Scott, whose Canniepairt spell came a decade ago.

Kirrie doubled their advantage with five minutes to go, when Reid set up Fairweather to finish and effectively end Tayport's hopes of claiming a point. Conor Ireland did pull one back in stoppage time, but it was a case of too little, too late and Tayport will have to regroup and attempt to get back to winning ways this afternoon, when old foes Downfield come to town.

From the ARCHIVES 2 May 1992



Picture shows the first ever League encounter at Tayport between 'Port and the Spiders

Tayport were playing what would be the first of ten matches that month. Pre-match, Downfield led the league by two points but this was their final game and Tayport had two games in hand so 'Port's 2-1 win gave them the Tayside Championship.

A Canniepairt crowd estimated at 500 saw the Spiders take the lead in 52 minutes through Derek Mitchell but big Hamish Mackay equalised in 72 minutes and Dave Reilly netted the winner with four minutes to go.

Tayport fielded Fraser Mann, Paul Reilly, Grant Paterson, Mark Spalding, Andy Sommerville, Hamish Mackay, Jackie Devine, Grant Cushnie, Kevin Thoms (Graeme Irons), Dave Reilly and Jimmy Hunter (George Malone).

It was a great day...and night for the club as the Alliance XI won the Alliance title with a 4-0 win over Birkhead across on the East Common the same afternoon.

The club's Alliance XI thus completed their league season with a 6th successive league victory without conceding a goal. The 4 goals were shared by Stevie Black, Bryan Fitchet, Alan McDade and Roddy Davie. The line-up was Alan Speirs, Grant Clark, Mike Smith, Jimmy Brunton, Bryan Fitchet, Neil Clark, Lindsay Crichton, Roddy Davie, Alan McDade (Roger Welsh), Paul Barnett (Stevie Moyes) and Stevie Black.

A CHAT WITH CHARLIE



Rangers new boss Steven Gerrard was quoted this week as saying that he had "spoken [to his players] about discipline and composure...we are picking up too many red and yellow cards for my liking", said Gerrard. Given that three of Tayport's regulars last season missed the start of this season through suspension and there have been something like 10 players cautioned in our first two games, , will you be speaking to your players in similar fashion?

Yes, absolutely. It's something we must keep in mind although last season's discipline, if I remember correctly, was relatively good. With Ryan, a lot of his points were picked up at his previous club and he's a huge loss at the minute.

There have only been two clean sheets in the league at home in over a year. This is bound to have caused you some frustration.

Do you think we can address this situation with the players we've already got or are there any defenders on your radar whom you think might lead to an improvement in this respect?

Yes, it is very disappointing. However, as with last year, we struggled to have the same defence week in week out due to work commitments. We did speak to a number of defenders over the summer but they chose the East of Scotland League which is fair enough.

Although it's obviously early days yet and most Super League clubs, including ourselves, will be looking to mount a challenge, the bookies' three pre-season title favourites, Lochee, Broughty and Carnoustie have each made very solid starts to the campaign with 2 wins out of 2.

Do you agree with the bookies form assessment?

The favourites I would go along with, but we hope to cause an upset. I believe we have as good a squad of players as any. However we lack consistency because of youth and lack of commitment at times due to work but again, there's not much we can do about that. I'm a winner and I have been fortunate over the years to have been so and I want that installed in our players.

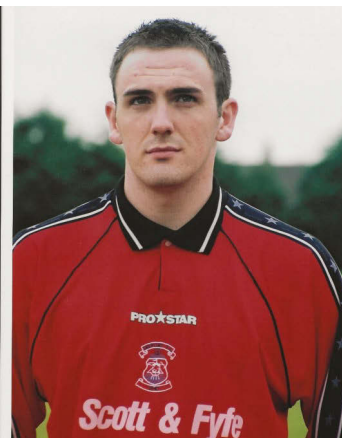
