Macron Scottish Junior Cup 3rd Round

Tayport v Rossvale FC



A warm welcome on their first visit to the Canniepairt to Rossvale FC's committee, players and supporters for this Macron Scottish Junior Cup tie.

Rossvale are a fairly new addition to the Junior game having joined the SJFA as recently as 2011.

Steady Progress

They took a wee while to find their feet, remaining in the bottom tier, the Central League Division 2, until emerging as Champions in 2015. They spent three seasons in Division 1 before stepping up to the Championship, the West Region's second tier, as last season's Division 1 champions.

Ambitious

Rossvale are an ambitious club with their sights on the Premiership, the West Region's top tier, and they have made an excellent start to life in the Championship, with only one defeat in their nine matches to date.

Following a spell of ground sharing with Petershill,

Rossvale moved to their present home, the Huntershill Community Sports Hub in Bishopbriggs where they play on an artificial grass surface.

Rossvale from Bishopbriggs on the northern outskirts of Glasgow have their roots in youth football but made the decision to introduce a Junior side to their club and in 2011/12 joined the West Region's Central League Division 2.

Rossvale's Scottish Cup history began in inauspicious fashion almost exactly 7 years ago to this day when they crashed out, beaten 8-2 at Clydebank in their first ever match in the competition

Valuable match practice

Prior to Saturday's 1-1 league draw with 3rd top Cumbernauld United, Rossvale had been without a fixture for two weeks. They did however get some match practice after fixing up a midweek friendly, winning 3-1 against Premiership side Kilbirnie Ladeside.

Goal threat

Spotting Rossvale's main goal threat won't be easy for the Tayport management as Vale's goalscoring threat comes from all over the place! Their nine goals in their past four games have been shared by eight different players.

Injury doubt

Although they are all likely to be in line for a start today there's bound to be a doubt over Gary Griffin who was carried off in the home draw with Cumbernauld last Saturday.

Key players absent

Unlike their opponents, Tayport's goalscoring in their last four games has been somewhat monopolised by one player, Dayle Robertson, with 5 goals, and unfortunately he is unavailable today. Tayport will also be without goalie Gavin Sorley another player who has caught the eye for us this season.

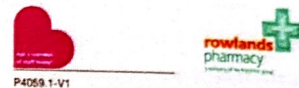

WHAT'S HAPPENED?

What's gone wrong with Scottish football? Here we are on the eve of the World Cup in Africa, potentially the greatest sporting event the world has ever witnessed. 32 countries represented, the cream of the world's football talent. Sadly, however, Scotland's involvement will be restricted to the reading of World Cup mags, watching HD TV and taking advantage of beer bonanzas at the local supermarket.

For the Scottish international team, qualifying for a World Cup was a fairly routine affair in the 70s and 80s. And we probably could have done a lot better in the 50s and 60s if SFA had put in an administration, ambition and foresight which matched the undoubted on-the-field talent which existed in Scotland at that time.

Where are we now? Also rans. No better than some of the remote former Soviet states, not as good as most African countries. Virtual no hopers and, given the lack of talent about, probably glad we didn't squeeze into the last 32, thus avoiding the embarrassment of sending out teams to keep the score down.

All our top SPL teams are packed out with foreign players, pretty ordinary ones, too. At one time in England it appeared that the mainstays of all the top teams were Scottish. Going through the team lists of clubs in all four English divisions forty years ago would reveal a plethora of Scots.

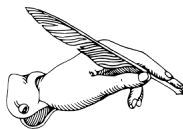
So what's happened? The population of Scotland's the same, indeed it's rising. There must be the same number of wee laddies out there. Why are they now being born without football talent? Is there something in the water here? Or is the talent lying untapped. There's no shortage of money, it would appear, to buy fancy gear, quality equipment and, although we may lag behind some countries, there's plenty pitches to play on, indoor and out. No need now to put down a couple of jackets and play on blaes pitches. Just roll out the portable goals on an artificial surface.

The SFA has ploughed £millions into football at grass roots level which again proves that money doesn't necessarily buy success.

What are the answers? If we can find them, then there are six European Championships and five World Cups in the next twenty years to perhaps show that the last twenty years has just been a glitch and we'll rise again...

This article appeared in a Tayport FC match programme over eight years ago. Has anything much changed? Sadly, replace 'Africa' with 'Russia' and it could have been written 6 months ago! The recent matches v Albania, Israel and Portugal would suggest little has changed. Jings, even Gibraltar have just won 2 internationals on the trot. Food for thought

DUNMORE'S Match Reports



It's been a more positive couple of weeks for 'Port. A fortnight ago, the Canniepairt men made progress in the inter-regional Signature Signs Cup, by virtue of a solid three-nil win against Kirrie Thistle. On a rain-soaked surface, Tayport opened the scoring in the sev-

enth minutes, when a well-worked corner from the right was headed back across goal to **Dayle Robertson** who looped his header over Diamond in the Kirrie goal.

Chances to extend the lead were missed, while Gavin Sorley made a couple of saves at the other end, so the game was still in the balance heading into the final quarter of an hour. It was 'Port who notched the game's crucial second goal though. **Jamie Gill**, wide on the right, fired the ball low and hard into goalmouth where it eluded defenders and attackers alike, and went into the net, off the post.

Two goals to the good, 'Port were well on course for victory and sealed the deal in the final couple of minutes. The home side attacked down the left through substitute Stephen Duffy and he pulled the ball back from the bye-line to Grant Paterson, whose cross was met by **Dayle Robertson** and he netted with a majestic header.

Kirrie's McKenna was then ordered off, for a second caution, and Tayport had gained a modicum of revenge for the league defeat at Kirrie earlier in the season.

Next up was a trip to Laing Park and a meeting with Carnoustie Panmure. 'Port had also lost to Carnoustie earlier in the season, on cup business, but, on this occasion, a Super League point was secured. Remarkably, it was the first time that Tayport had avoided defeat away from home during this campaign, so from that point of view, it was a positive result. The Gowfers opened the scoring, courtesy of Ryan Dignan, early in the second half, and another defeat was looming. Fortunately, on 72 minutes, Jamie Gill's free kick was met perfectly by **Dayle Robertson**, who planted a powerful header high into the net, for Tayport's equaliser. Conor Ireland had a late chance to win the match, but blazed over and Charlie King's men had to settle for a point.

Today, of course, is Scottish Junior Cup day and we welcome Rossvale to the Canniepairt. Let's hope for another home victory.
