

I write to inform you that at the PGB meeting held earlier this week there was approval of the revised tier 6 structure as noted below.

There is a sub group meeting organised for 14th November to tier with a view to commencing for the 2019/20 season.

Statement is below for info which the Scottish FA will publish in due course.

The senior football pyramid was established in Scotland in 2013 with the introduction of the Lowland League sitting alongside the Highland League as a new "Tier 5" allowing promotion to and relegation from League 2 of the Scotlish Professional Football League. The East of Scotland League and the South of Scotland League feed, in similar manner, into the Lowland League, forming "Tier 6" of the Pyramid.

Since then, discussions have taken place within Scottish football about increasing the geographical spread at tier 6.

The Scottish FA re-convened a Pyramid Working Group chaired by the President, Alan McRae, at the start of the year to progress these discussions, taking cognisance of the number of clubs which had recently joined the East of Scotland League to gain access to the Pyramid and the most recent Scottish Junior FA AGM when junior clubs voted to embrace the Pyramid.

The Scattish FA is pleased to confirm that at its most recent Pyramid Working Group meeting consensus formed around admitting the existing Scottish Junior FA West Region and East Region leagues. The Scottish Junior FA will continue to administer both leagues with the top division in each region forming part of an expanded Tier 6 with connectivity to the Lowland League.

Work will continue within the Pyramid Working Group to standardise player disciplinary rules, registrations and fixture scheduling across the East of Scotland League, the South of Scotland League, the West Region and the East Region of the Scotlish Junior FA and the Lowland League to ensure the smooth delivery of promotion and relegation between Tier 5 and Tier 6 of the Pyramid.

This is an important development within Scottish football, allowing ambitious clubs progression from grass roots to the highest echelons of our professional game and improving standards.

Discussions will also begin between the Highland League and the Scottish Junior FA North Region to explore appropriate access to the Pyramid in the north of the country.

It is anticipated that the new structure, including a new play-off format, could be in place for the start of the 2019-20 season.

DUNMORE'S Match Report

Tayport went into last week's East Region Cup sectional tie at home to Downfield with Grant Paterson snr and Jamie Mackie overseeing the team from the dugout, as the previous weekend's calamitous Scottish Junior Cup exit had signalled the end of Charlie King's relatively brief tenure in

the hot seat. While Downfield won the match with a

late goal, Paterson and Mackie had done well to galvanise almost all of

the players and the performance against the Spiders could be considered to have been a mostly positive one.

'Port struck first, on 18 minutes, when Dayle Robertson latched onto Ryan Suttie's fabulous ball over the top, then twisted and turned, before shooting low past 'keeper Clarkson. Within a short space of time, Jamie Gill, Steven Harris and Robertson all found themselves in good positions, with players in support, but could not find the end-product.

From that last opening, Downfield broke upfield and earned a penalty kick. Veteran striker Paul Blackwood was the player who threatened Tayport's rearguard and he was taken down by Craig Sturrock, Tayport's last man. Sturrock was ordered off and Bryan Duell netted from the spot, with 38 minutes on the clock. Another one-time Tayport player, albeit briefly and sporadically, Connor MacLeod, then glided through to tuck away a fine finish and give the Spiders a half-time lead.

However, after the break, the Canniepairt outfit took the game to Downfield and the ten men equalised in the 55th minute, when Dayle Robertson smashed home his second of the afternoon, from a tight angle.

Robertson had a hat-trick chance midway through the half, but took too many touches inside the box and the opportunity was lost. When Robertson looked set to break clear again, he was clipped by central defender Garden and it was Downfield's turn to have a man sent off. The resultant free kick came to nothing though, and it would be the opposition who would have the better of the closing stages.

Slack play by Gavin Sorley almost gifted MacLeod a goal, but he missed the target from close range. Then, things began to unravel. Nathan Scott burst down the right for the Spiders and he found MacLeod, who netted what proved to be the winner. In the aftermath of that counter, the management was tested by the goalkeeper, whose behaviour left much to be desired, and he was promptly substituted, in what was a highly disappointing conclusion to the match.

Let's hope for a cohesive performance today, as we get back to Super League business with a match against Thornton Hibs.

How are the defectors doing?

The end of last season saw the greatest upheaval in Scottish Football in modern times when 24 East Region JFA clubs and 1 West Region JFA club abandoned the Junior game to join the East of Scotland League and thus gain access to the Scottish Senior Football Pyramid.

The clubs who left all had their reasons, whether it be a reduction in travel costs, time away from home for matches, more derby games, maybe the anticipation of untold riches flowing into their coffers, a genuine desire to reach a higher grade of football or maybe they just went with the flow. For other clubs their geographical position made a move to the Seniors a non-starter. Next season we'll all be together again in tier 6 of the pyramid (see page 12), although they will still be Seniors and we'll still be Juniors.

How have things gone?

Well, some clubs have had to spend a bit of time and cash on making improvements to their facilities and match day arrangements (Juniors to follow suit on admission to the pyramid??)

Some will have seen a reduction in travel costs and some will have seen an increase in gate receipts and associated spend. We always knew that Senior or not, the onfield standard of the EoSL wasn't particularly high and this would appear to be borne out by the current league placings in the 3 Conferences.

Only when we come to the end of a full season will the clubs who moved be able to assess the full picture.

114 years ago - FROM THE ARCHIVES Sept/Oct 1904

When Tayport and Thornton Rovers were drawn together in the East of Scotland Cup 1n 1904, it turned out to be quite a tie. Played at Tayport, the tie was well reported with articles in no fewer than seven newspapers. Tayport's ground was both described as East Common and Burnside Park, no doubt one and the same, the burn being that which separates the Canniepairt from the East Common today. Tayport won the first game 2-1 on 10th September. The Dunder Curing Post reported "Fouls were the order of the day, Tayport if anything being the worst offenders". E. Oswald (2) and McLaren for Thornton were the scorers, the winner coming in the last minute. Thornton however protested that the crowd had encroached the field of play owing to there being no barrier in place, a breach of Rule 28. A subsequent meeting of the East of Scotland Junior FA in Edinburgh upheld the appeal and the game was re-scheduled for 1st October, again at Tayport, no doubt following the erection of an appropriate barrier.

Tayport fielded Coss, A. Oswald, Gowans, N. Oswald, Cowie, Caird, E. Oswald, Rae, Hill, Campbell, Wilkie. **Thornton** team was from Sinclair, Mercer, Brown, Wallace, Wilson, Carmichael, Somerville, Roughhead, Simpson, Thomson, Adamson, McLaren. Referee was Mr Dryburgh (Lassodie). Kick off was 4pm

Under the headline "Rousing Game at Tayport" the Dunder Evening Telegraph reported the replay thus

"The roughest game ever seen at Tayport" was the opinion of all who witnessed the match between Thornton Rovers and Tayport on Saturday. It was apparent from the very beginning that the game was to be a fast one and before many minutes play the referee was issuing warnings, one of the backs being the chief offender. Subsequently the game was several times interrupted by the very questionable tactics of the visitors, and free fights were engaged in, the referee being powerless. It is to the credit of one or two of the visitors that they did their utmost to soothe the offenders and the game was resumed: but the homesters were putting plenty of vim into their play especially the two Oswalds, and a third point was added by Campbell, catching a beautiful pass from Wilkie and banging it into the net. [Ed's note: point means goal in 1900s reporting style]

The unruly scenes still continued, and it was a relief when the whistle sounded, finishing up the roughest game ever seen in Tayport with the score standing Tayport 3; Thornton Rovers, 1. "Free Fights Amongst Players" ran the Curning Post headline.

Reviewing the match during the following week the Curing Telegraph reported - "Shortly after the interval one of the most rowdy affairs ever seen at a football match in Tayport took place. Most of the players took part in a general 'melee' and the referee would have been quite within his power if he had put a few of them off the field.

This is what gives the game a bad name, and it is to be hoped that after this the players will learn how conduct themselves on the field of play"

Hopefully we will witness a more genteel affair this afternoon
