A WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of Yes, you're reading that our visitors Forfar West End.

Last weekend at the Canniepairt we had the Premier League's Blairgowrie for the second successive week and what a difference a week makes! From an 8-2 demolition to an extremely disappointing 1-1 draw. For me it's all about attitude. I heard the Blair manager instructing his players in no uncertain manner what he expected of them and reminding them of their performance the previous week. To a man, their focus and mentality was in the correct place. I'm afraid that couldn't be said about us and on the day we got exactly what we deserved. Unfortunately it wasn't much better the previous midweek at West End. To score four goals and only come away with a point was criminal. At 3-1 up with maybe ten minutes remaining we should be seeing the game out but from that point I can only describe our defending as comical.

I know I'm painting a disappointing picture but if players don't learn from their errors then they won't improve as players and we won't improve as a side. Despite this we've still an opportunity today to advance to the quarter finals but only a victory will do. In essence, today's game is a last sixteen game, an opportunity for us to approach it with the correct mentality and commitment.

The last two weeks has seen us sadly lose two giants of Tayport Football Club. 'Hercs' Oswald and Chas Anderson both served the club for many decades. They will be missed but never forgotten!

I'd like to take this opportunity to update you on the club's position with regard to our lease with Fife Council which expires in two weeks. Approximately one year ago we received proposals from the Council for a new lease. I won't go into figures but the proposal

equates to a 1,200% rise. correctly! As you can imagine this stunned us and quite frankly would jeopardise the very existence of the club as we know it.



So, over the past year we've had a catalogue of emails and meetings with representatives of Fife Council's Estates group. The most recent discussions we've had is with a view to purchasing the ground and we've had the ground surveyed by the District Valuers, so we now have a figure.

Both ourselves and Fife Council are keen for this to end with a positive conclusion but unfortunately there are a number of stages and hurdles we have to overcome to achieve this, not least that the ground is classed as Common Good Land which means that, although all parties agree, it must go before a Sheriff. An important aspect in supporting our cause will be to show strong evidence that we have the support of the wider Tayport community. In the coming weeks and months, therefore, we will be pushing to obtain that support through numerous avenues.

Earlier this week myself and Dave Aitken had a very positive meeting with the Tayport Community Council who have unanimously agreed to give their support so, watch this space. We need to secure this great football club's future and any support from yourselves will be welcome.

This afternoon we've an opportunity to secure a quarter final place and keep our season going. There is no doubt in my mind that we're well capable of success today if we want it enough...





TROM THE ARCHIVES 1969

50 years ago this weekend, 10 May 1969, Tayport beat Tay Valley FC 5-0 in the Midlands AFA's Carne Trophy round 1. Team was Derek White, Walter Kemp, Jim Scott, Ronnie Laing, Jim Mathers, Richard Redpath, Abby Oswald, Andy Johnstone, Ian White (3), George Ritchie(1) and Doug Henderson (1). Raymond White was sub. The same afternoon Tayport's Alliance XI won 4-1 at Timex in the Alliance League. Team was Andy Horan, Ian Mathers, Jim Foulis, Fred Janssen (1), Iain Bell, George Bryson, Dennis Auld, Davie Ure (2), Eddie Stewart, Maurice Flynn, Stan Cowe (1). Ian Mackie was sub.

Dayle is Best for 17 Years

Dayle Robertson, with 33 goals in 31 games to date, is Tayport's highest scorer in a season since 2001/02 and needs two goals to surpass Davie Evans' total of 34 goals that season. Top scorer since then was Simon Murray with 28 in 2012/13. In 2000/01 the prolific Ronnie Kenneth hit 54 in a season.

No Pyramid Access for the Juniors Next Season

Despite a decision at last year's AGM and further assurance earlier this season from SFA Chief Executive Ian Maxwell that Junior clubs would be part of the SFA's pyramid for next season, it won't happen. Mr. Maxwell advises that the Pyramid Working Group has not been unable "find consensus across all parties". As changes in the Scottish Football structure continue, Tayside clubs look increasingly isolated, with the opportunities to progress, should they wish, becoming increasingly difficult. The SJFA should be concerned. Next season's East Super League North is going to look pretty much like the Tayside Premier Div of 20 years ago.

East of Scotland League (EoSL) champions Bonnyrigg Rose have been left stunned after their application to join the Lowland League was rejected this week by the SFA as floodlights have not yet been erected at New Dundas Park.

Glenrothes Juniors' application to join the EoSL has been accepted. Next season's EoSL top division will virtually comprise former Junior clubs and one would be forgiven for thinking it was an East Super League from a couple of seasons ago.

DUNMORE'S Match Report

It's been several weeks since the last edition of the programme, the game being a resounding win against Carnoustie Pan-

mure, at the end of March. An own goal saw 'Port draw first blood, but the Gowfers equalised, courtesy of a Winter free kick. Dayle Robertson soon had his team back in front, though, and, on the stroke of half-time, Jamie Gill made it 3-1. Substitute Lewis Payne added Tayport's fourth, in the second half, to seal three valuable Super League points.

Next up was a high scoring affair against Kennoway Star Hearts, at Treaton Park. Jamie Mackie's stunning free kick provided an early opener and Dayle **Robertson** doubled the lead. 'Port were looking good, but it was all square by halftime, with KSH benefiting from a penalty kick and a deflection. On the hour, Craig Sturrock hooked the visitors back in front, but centre-half Doig netted another leveller for the hosts. With the game delicately poised, the introduction of Lewis Payne turned the match in Tayport's favour. He instigated the next goal, snapped up by Davle Robertson and, just to make sure of the points, Payne himself lashed a cracker beyond

to make it 5-3 and another three points.

The match at Downfield the following

weekend was less eventful. Towards half-time, Jamie Gill and Ryan Suttie combined to fashion a chance for the on-form Dayle Robertson and he made no mistake, to give Mackie opened the scoring for the Canniepairt men the lead. In the second half, another trademark **Jamie Mackie** free kick made it 2-0 and Stevie Kay's men had won again.

A midweek trip to Lochee United's Thomson Park was always going to be a real test and it was there that Tayport's fine run of wins came to a halt, but the players competed well throughout the encounter, in which the Bluebells scored three without reply.

That fixture represented the end of the Super League programme and 'Port had to settle for a solid, if unspectacular fifth place finish. Recent form, however, had been excellent and the team should be proud of its progress over the last couple of months.

There is still the Consolation Cup to play for and the Canniepairt outfit began their campaign with a resounding 8-2 win at Blairgowrie. Unsurprisingly, Dayle Robertson led the way, with four goals, all in the first half. Luke O'Brien and Jamie Mackie also weighed in, with former 'Port player Matty Adam

the goalkeeper, netting one for the hosts. Not as many goals in the second half, but Jamie Gill and Lewis Payne took Tayport's tally to eight, while Blairgowrie's McManus doubled the home side's total.

> Last midweek, 'Port journeyed to Forfar, for a fifth successive away game and shared eight goals with the Strathmore Parkers. In the first half, Jamie 'Port and Jack Shaw saved a Batchelor penalty, but it was in the second half that the goals flew in. FWE equalised early on, but **Davle Robertson**, from the spot, and Jamie Gill had Tayport 3-1 up. Back came the hosts, to tie the score, then it looked like Jamie Gill had won it for Stevie Kay's men, only for Cameron McMahon to grab a late, late leveller and make it four apiece.

Not so much excitement last weekend, when Blairgowrie visited for their return leg. A scrappier affair ensued and Blair' eventually took a shock lead and it was only late in the day that Dayle Robertson rescued Tayport with an equaliser.

The Consolation Cup is back on the agenda again today, with Forfar West End the visitors. The 'Port support will be hoping that last Saturday was an aberration and that their side will return to goal-scoring form this afternoon. Support the 'Port!

They Played Their Part In The Club's Success

There are many factors which contribute to a football club's success. In Tayport's case the club, already on a good foundation, took massive strides to build on that strength during the last two decades of the 20th century. Clearly, players and management have a role to play in any club's success but such success cannot be achieved without the backing of strong committee all singing from the same sheet. Alastair Oswald and Charles Anderson were two such committee members, both of whom demonstrated commitment and foresight during this era and played key roles in taking the club to new heights. Sadly both passed away within four days of each other at the end of last month.

Alastair Oswald, better known as Hercs, who passed away on 23 April age 66, joined the committee in 1974 and was chairman from 2009 until retiring in 2016. Hercs, who had family connections which he could trace back to the family which actually farmed the Canniepairt almost 150 years ago, played a major role in the development of the football ground and buildings we have today. The many expressions of sympathy from former players was perhaps testimony to his popularity with those who played with the club throughout his committee years.

Charles Anderson or Chas or big Chic, who passed away on 27 April, age 69, was another lifetime Tayport resident who gave the club sterling service. Chas was social adviser in 1983 before joining the committee in 1984, becoming vice chairman in 1985 and then becoming the inaugural Juniors' match secretary from 1990 until retiring in 1992. Chas was a mainspring behind the club's hugely successful Summer Galas in the 1980s and introduced many innovative fundraising events during this era. He will always be remembered for arranging for the legendary Scotland footballer Jim Baxter to be the club's weekend Gala guest. He was also a main player in the acquisition of both the club's 30 seater team bus and the members' half time lounge formerly the bus garage. For several years Chas looked after the club's Scorepool lottery, the forerunner of the Super Six lottery. Chas's Funeral is on Monday 13 May at Dundee Crematorium 2.30pm.

Big Hercs and Big Chic were the best of buddies and it was tragic that they should pass away suddenly within a few days of each other. However, they leave behind them host of memories. We offer both families our sincere condolences.
