A WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of our visitors Dundee North End.

Our start to the season has been hard to swallow with three defeats and a draw. I certainly wasn't expecting that but we are where we are and must focus on gaining a victory as soon as we can. This afternoon would be the ideal game to achieve that.

Once again we have been extremely unfortunate to lose our manager at a most vital time. When Stevie Kay was forced to stand down due to work commitments we made the decision to pass the mantle on to Stevie's assistant Willie Campbell. So this afternoon we have the opportunity to record our first victory of the season. Our visitors Dundee North End won the Premier Division last season and are a very capable side but not unbeatable. If our attitude and commitment is of the highest standard there is no doubt we can produce that win we badly need to get our season started

Tayport v Dundee North End



We welcome North End to the Canniepairt for our first Saturday home league game of the season, their first visit here on league business for five years.

We've not had a good start to the new North Super League or should that be the new Super League North not to be confused with the North Super League which is in the Aberdeen based North Region. We are in the North Super League following the new East Region restructure. Regardless of what it's called we are in a league which pretty much resembles the Tayside League which we left in 2002.

It's a major change this season. There are only ten clubs in the League and we'll play each other 3 times.

It's our worst start since the Super League - that's the original East Super League - of 2012/13 when it took us ten games and three months to record our maiden victory.

North End who lost only one game on their march to the North Premier League

North End won the Dundee Junior Championship (pre-Tayside days) exactly 60 years ago and a top tier title might have escaped the Dokens until now but for a tragedy for a player which ultimately led to good fortune for the club. Tayport, hot favourites for the 1998 Tayside title, looked set to collect full points, leading 2-1 v North End on Canniepairt before an April midweek crowd of 427 when the game was abandoned with a few minutes left after the visitors' Scott Kemlo sustained a broken leg. When the game was re-played, North End won 2-0 and lifted the championship by 2 points, their last top tier title

title last season have made a reasonable start to life in the top tier, picking up a point at Kirrie Thistle and

defeating Forfar West End before most recently suffering 1-2 defeats vs Broughty Athletic and Scone Thistle.

North End manager Ross Lunan played the first 9 games of the 2010/11 season for Tayport under Willie Garner, his last appearance a red card affair v St Andrews Utd.

Other TFC connections in the North End camp are keeper Neal Ferrie (56 games - only 16 times on losing side), striker Gary Sutherland (109 games, 42 goals) and winger Owen McCabe (5 games, all as substitute).

Tayport will again be without Jamie Gill but Dayle Robertson and Kris Rollo return to action. Striker Ross Bell, on a short term loan from Forfar Albion, should make his home debut but there is an injury doubt over Tom Whyte.

At the time of going to press Tayport were negotiating the international clearance of a Cypriot midfielder.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

30 years ago ~ 1989

1989/90 was something of a watershed season for the club, but in the club's Newsletter in August 1989 there was no hint of the decision that would be made later that season to join the SJFA the following season.

As the extract from the Newsletter below reports, Jim McLean brought Dundee United over to Tayport for a pre-season friendly. United played in Europe that season and would finish 4th top of Premier Division, above Celtic but behind Hearts, Aberdeen and Rangers. Another McLean footballing legend, Grant, albeit at a local level, was Tayport's Social Convener. Andy Heggie, who scored Tayport's goal that evening, was back at the Canniepairt the other week as manager of Dundee Violet.



Tayport got as far as the 5th round of the Scottish Amateur Cup, making their exit in Ayrshire, beaten 2-1 by Irvine's Girdle Toll AFC. Bert Valentine scored the goal but the records tell us Tayport were "beaten by a very average team". A disappointing exit after having eliminated the favoured Star Hearts by the same scoreline in the previous round.

Tayport's Fife XI, playing in the East Fife AFA, was in high scoring form that season hitting 7 v St Andrews University, 9 v Leven Rovers, 12 v Wormit, 14 v Buck'n'Hind and an amazing 18 v Springfield Amateurs, 12 of which were scored by Gary McCabe.

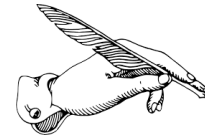

A CHAT WITH CHRIS

Port Prog put some questions to new manager Chris McPherson and here are his responses

You were appointed manager late in the day and have had to start from the back foot. Can you describe briefly the difficulties this situation has given you?

Yes, it certainly was late in the day when the job came my way but it was an opportunity that I was never going to turn down. It's been a whirlwind couple of months since taking over and I would be lying if I didn't admit it has somewhat taken over my life. I would use the word challenges as opposed to difficulties and the main one is player recruitment. Many of the players I would be targeting were already tied down on deals at other clubs and with the pre-contract arrangement a lot of others teams transfer business was conducted at the end of last season, something that we'll be looking to take advantage of next season. So it will take time, but as the market begins to move, I'm sure there will be more announcements on players to come in the near future.

You've brought your own backroom staff. Grant Miller is no stranger to home fans but can you give us a brief introduction to your management team, highlighting the particular strengths you've identified in them.

Well prior to being interviewed for the job I approached my back room staff to ask if they'd be interested in the Tayport project as I was acutely aware I needed individuals with experience of the local junior game and more importantly people that I could trust. I count myself very fortunate that I was able to persuade Alan, Grant, Bobby and Fraser to the club and they offer me experience and enthusiasm in abundance. **Alan McSkimming** was my gaffer at Carnoustie Panmure where he managed them in the Super League with great success for several seasons. He is a hugely respected coach, has fantastic contacts and his knowledge of the Junior game I feel is unrivalled. I have a huge amount of admiration for what he did for Carnoustie Panmure on and off the field, both the football and business side of game, and I'm sure he can recreate that here.

Bobby Brown is a bit of a footballing legend to me and epitomises everything I want our club to be. He has a fantastic attitude, has lots of contacts and has a very similar view to me on the way players should conduct themselves both on and off the park. He played senior then junior football himself to the age of 53, so what an example he is to our players. Everyone likes Bobby, he's an all-round fantastic guy and I'm delighted to have him at the club.

Grant 'Hobee' Millar as you say needs no introduction having won the Scottish cup whilst playing at Tayport. What I like about Grant is he complements the rest of us. He is quite effective speaking to players on a one to one basis, he takes time to work with and improve players, passing on his knowledge and experience.

Finally, **Fraser Buttar** is my goalkeeping coach and has been great to have about the place. Fraser has good experience of the juniors and most recently operated in a similar role at Kinross FC. He is a great help to me and his work with our young goalies is already paying off as evidenced in some excellent displays in our first few games.

SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP DRAW 2019/20



Tayport received a bye in the 1st round and will travel to South Ayrshire in the 2nd round, having been drawn away to **Girvan FC** who play in the third tier of the West Region. Tie is on **Saturday 28th September**

Consensus is that the Scottish Junior Cup has been devalued somewhat and lost a bit of its sparkle following the mass defection to the East of Scotland League. In the five years after the turn of the century, the East Region supplied seven of the ten finalists, six of which were from Tayside. Since Tayport won in 2005, of the 28 finalists, all bar two have been from West Region or are clubs now in the East of Scotland League. In the past 4 years all finalists have been from the West. Odds are that the pattern will continue. However, we'd be delighted to be proved wrong.

Collectively, I'd like to think we've got as good a coaching team as there is in the East Region JFA and I would encourage players, if they want to improve their game and develop, to work hard in training with the coaches and they'll reap the rewards.

You've had a tough baptism and will have been disappointed with the results since the Super League campaign got underway. What are your thoughts on the way things have gone to date and are you comfortable with the players you've got or are you looking to strengthen?

Yes it's been tough, but being realistic, it was always going to be this way. Myself and the management team came into the club late on. We've asked the players to adjust the way they play. Last season I think Stevie Kay did superbly well with the team, playing direct football, using the pace of the forwards, turning teams and hitting them on the counter attack. This season, we've coached the players to take the ball from the back, play a bit more football, before playing through the midfield and wide areas on to the forwards. These changes take time but the players have bought into it. The feedback so far is that the boys are looking fit and playing good football. But of course the results haven't quite followed. I genuinely think we aren't too far away. Against Downfield in the first game we hit the bar and had one cleared off the line, against Carnoustie we dominated large parts of the game despite having a numerical disadvantage with the three ordered off players, and against Broughty we had chances to equalise when we were one nil down. Managers talk about fine margins and I think at some point in the near future we will get a small break, a bit rub of the green, then we'll be off and running. Player recruitment is and always will be, work in progress. As I said, by the time we came in players were already signed for their clubs and so we are playing catch up. I've had players say they would have been interested had they known earlier we were taking over at Tayport, but had already signed elsewhere. This is something that we will have to be ahead of the game with for next season, but as things stand, yes, there will be more new signings.

You brought in young Ross Bell on loan from Forfar Albion. What was your thinking behind that?

Ross Bell is a player that I know very well from my time at Broughty Athletic and will be a fine addition to our squad. Ross is a tricky and skilful player and held his own in a team full of talented players whilst at Broughty last season. He is still very young and has a lot to learn but I want to identify players like him who have raw natural ability but are willing to listen to our coaches in order to improve and develop their games. I contacted Ross when I took the Tayport job but like many players he had already committed to another club. I wished him all the best and that I'd keep tabs on him to see if he wished to sign the following season. In a twist of fate I spoke with ex-Tayport player and current Albion manager Steven Stewart about a player swap and he said that Ross has been outstanding in several games for his team but wasn't always fitting into the system that he was currently using. I jumped at the opportunity to take Ross on loan with view to a permanent signing and for anyone who was at the Broughty game at the weekend, you could see what he brings to the team. He showed flashes of great skill and worked very hard for his new team and I am delighted to have him.
