A lot of people seem to think that Walking Football is played by elderly folk, some using a walking stick! They couldn't be more wrong!

Walking Football was first introduced into Scotland in 2012, initially starting up in Midlothian, with games also played in Tranent via the "Hibs Fit Fans In Training" programme, and in less than 4 years it had become one of the fastest growing sports in the country. In just over 4 years there were over 95 teams, covering most regions, with an age range from early 40s through to some in their 90s.

Membership numbers vary, some groups have 10 or so, whilst the bigger clubs have over 100, with new players joining all the time. Most groups contain both men and women players.

Many of the groups welcome participants with disabilities, dementia and those recovering from major illnesses, thus offering an opportunity to greatly increase fitness levels and improve social integration.

For more active participants there is also the opportunity for competitive play, with many areas organising friendly tournaments and festivals. In June 2015, the first Walking Football tournament took place in Edinburgh, attracting 14 teams. The following year the entry was 24 sides, and in 2019 the event had grown to include tournaments for age groups of 50+ and 65 and over, attracting 74 teams and over 700 players, the largest Walking Football event in the world to date. Raith Rovers beat Hearts in the over 50s tournament, and in the 65 and over category, Kirkcaldy made it a Fife double, winning a penalty shootout against East Kilbride.

There are more than 10 groups in Fife registered with Walking Football Scotland, including ourselves, and 5/6 in Dundee. In April 2019, nine clubs in our area formed the East Region (Scotland) Walking Football League, playing matches once a month at the GA Arena, Dundee. For obvious reasons the league was suspended in 2020, but we are due to resume again in September this year, and Tayport will be in it, along with other teams such as Montrose, Arbroath, Carnoustie, Dundee Social and six or so more.

I initially started up the group when I moved here from Monifieth in 2019. I used to play for Dundee East, at the Douglas Sports Centre, but found no club in the Tayport or Newport area. I contacted the Tayport chairman, Davie Baikie, and told him I was starting a Walking Football group at Waterstone Crook Sports Centre in Newport, and could I make it part of Tayport FC. He was absolutely 100% behind the idea, and in August 2019 we held our first session, with 9 participants. When Waterstone Crook shut, due to the pandemic, we too had to stop training, but once we got the green light to resume outdoors, Davie allowed us to train at Canniepairt on a Friday morning from 10:15 through to 12:00.

Our age group is 50 years and over, and we have 30 registered players and average 16/18 per session. Some are ex Tayport players, including Frank Feechan, John Anderson, Abby Oswald and Alan Gray, plus we have Mark Craib who played for Dundee and Montrose, and hopefully Davie Baikie will join in once he has recovered from a foot injury. We also have former Tayport goalkeeper Fraser Mann's brother, Fergus, playing for us. Other players in the group have also had experience in the Amateur game, so we have a good spread of experience, along with those who just enjoy playing football and the social interaction created during and after each session.

Sniffin' Around...



Times they are a-changing. In 2015, the Midlands Amateur FA, established 95 years ago, had a membership of 36 clubs. Of these 36 clubs, 19 were based in Dundee. Now, six years on, the picture has changed dramatically. Kicking off this season are 14 clubs, only 3 of which are located within the city. Social change in its many forms has probably contributed to this fall in membership, as has the establishment of a Saturday Morning Amateur League. Hopefully, with the Association's centenary year on the horizon, the drain on the MAFA's membership can be reversed.

Three former Tayport players started this season in management roles with East of Scotland League clubs. Ross Gunnion is the man behind the ambitious Jeanfield Swifts resurgence, Robbie Holden has Luncarty on fire and Charlie King was at St Andrews United until parting company with Saints last weekend.

A few familiar faces in the Carnoustie line-up at the Canniepairt last week. No fewer than five Gowfers previously wore Tayport colours - Ryan Suttie, Dale Reid, Keiran Conway, and Stephen McPhee started while Robert Smith was on the bench.

Former 'Port players were also to the fore amongst the Midlands League scorers last weekend with no fewer than five - Ryan Suttie, Robert Smith, Gary Sutherland, Gregor Anderson and Bryan Duell - on the mark for their respective clubs.

Youngster Gary Breen, with Tayport in 2019/21, hit a hat-trick in Violet's recent 3-0 win over Blairgowrie last midweek. Gary, it will be recalled, netted both our goals in the 2-1 Scottish Cup 4th round win at Kirrie in November 2019.

Barry Wilson, who netted Violet's first goal against us at last Saturday is the son of Bobby Wilson, the former Tayport player who played 107 games for the club from 1979-82 before his transfer to Brechin City for whom he made 60 appearances (see also Archive page)

Looking in whilst passing the Canniepairt during the close season was a former player, Bob Brannan (pictured), who was with Tayport in the 1974-75 season, the club's last season playing on East Common. Bob moved up in the football world, later becoming chairman at Dundee FC and Chief Executive at Glasgow Rangers.



Tayport started the season confidently after a successful run of pre -season friendlies, however their first few matches have been eveopeners. Even Chris Macpherson has noted his disappointment with his side after they failed to gain as many early points as he had hoped. Despite too many soft goals being conceded, the team have played skilfully, and undoubt- the next few edly do deserve more points than they have gained so far.

The team had a positive start to the season, beating Dundee North End 2-0 in a fast paced and, at times, aggressive match. This highlighted their potential and solidified their place as a team to beat in the league.

Since then, their performance remained average, with four games without a win before Wednesday, following their initial triumph. That is not to say that the team have played badly, their effort level is always high and there has been

clear improvement match to match.

Despite losing against Carnoustie Panmure last week, the boys proved their worth and put up a good fight.

Afterwards Macpherson named Louis Joyce man of the match for the second

time this season, as well as naming others as close runners up.

This team is undeniably one to watch. Hopefully in weeks we will get another couple of wins under our belt and boost mo-



TAYPORT v LOCHEE UNITED

We welcome Lochee United to Canniepairt for our biggest test of the season to date, a game which will perhaps give us a measure of how the season is to pan out. Lochee, along with Broughty and Carnoustie, are the bookies' favourites to lift the inaugural Midlands title.

Certainly, the odds are stacked in the visitors favour today. We've got to look way back to Christmas 2008 for our last win over Lochee, a 3-0 Canniepairt success under Willie Garner's management. Five successive managers since that December afternoon have tried and failed. A sixth, John Ovenstone, avoided defeat and that was probably because we never played Lochee under his stewardship!

Lochee have had an unbeaten and goal laden start to the season with a draw v North End last Saturday the only blemish to date on their record. Grant Lawson, the former Tayport player, is a key component in the Lochee midfield and adds his penalties to the visitors goal threat which comes from all areas of the park with ten different scorers already this season. Top marksman is former 'Port striker Kevin Milne whose hat-trick in the 5-1 win at Forfar

United on Wednesday brought his season's tally to six already.

Plenty experience in the Lochee player pool which includes experienced former Seniors Grant Adam in goal, ex'dee Bryan Deasley, and ex-Utd Gary Kenneth. Catching the eye at the other end of the age spectrum is 16 year old Dundee FC loanee Ewan Murray

Although the midweek win v Scone was an exception, the failure to kill off their opposition when the opportunities have presented themselves has contributed to Tayport's relatively disappointing start to the season.

Manager Chris McPherson has yet to have a full pool from which to select. Greg Whyte, Jim Malone and Sam Sanchez are injured and Craig Sturrock is self isolating after returning from abroad.

Kris Rollo who missed last week at Violet was back in action in the 6-1 win v Scone on Wednesday, a win which would have pleased the manager, particularly in the manner of the creation and execution of some of the goalscoring opportunities.

A CHAT WITH CHRIS McPHERSON



There have been a number of changes in personnel - some out, some in - at the Canniepairt since November when our season ground to a halt. You've now got 22 players on the books. Does that suggest you're happy with your pool or do you envisage some movement?

There will certainly be movement. I think it's important to constantly try to progress. Yes, we want a settled squad and team and we do have a strong nucleus of a squad that are on long term deals but there are areas we want to improve and it's important we are on our toes should players that will im-

prove us become available. They have to be the correct type, strong character and willing to learn and work hard. We want to, and need to, improve.

The new Midlands League brings together all the former Tayside teams into one division, the clubs regularly challenging at the top of the league and those clubs which were rarely out of the lower echelons of the bottom division. From a manager's perspective, can you give us your thoughts on playing in such a league? It's very challenging as our results so far have shown. We had a good start with three points against an excellent North End side, despite being without several players. Then we have found it hard to break down other teams that maybe on paper we should be beating. I think teams have improved, Lochee Harp have signed players from a very strong amateur team and Forfar United have done the same so there are no easy games. It's important that we approach each game properly and judge each team in their own merits. I say to the lads it's down to what we do fundamentally, and if we're honest, we've not been quite at our best so far. Although there are certain mitigating factors for everyone to see, 4 or 5 players being unavailable for each game, we still have to do better.

After today, 20pc of the league will be complete, so based on what you've seen so far, realistically where do you see Tayport finishing?

There's a loaded question if ever I've seen one! Tayport should be as close to the top of the league as possible. I was brought up watching the chairmen's team regularly win leagues and cups and I still believe this club with its facilities and proud history should be up there. I didn't come to the club as manager for mediocrity. We're certainly building towards that and I think it's fair to say there have been improvements both on and off the park, despite our indifferent start this season. As you've seen, the big three teams, are as strong as ever (Broughty, Lochee, Carnoustie) but I believe we are getting closer. After that there are also a lot of other strong teams eg North End & East Craigie, teams that have had a settled squad for several seasons. They will undoubtedly take points off any team on their day. We've got to be aiming to be in about the top teams, but time will tell.

It's been the best part of 18 months since we were officially playing, so we're going to take the opportunity of updating you with a list of the players currently signed with the club and from where they were signed. FROM THE ARCHIVES 1980

41 YEARS AGO Tayport FC travelled to Liege, Belgium to participate in the Jacques Vandebosch International Amateur Football Tournament.

The club had been having a good season and would later reach the final of the Fife Amateur Cup, only to lose 1-2 to Windygates FC at Central Park, Cowdenbeath. Understandably, hopes of lifting some European silverware were high.

The date of Tayport's Fife Cup quarter final tie had clashed with the weekend on which Tayport were scheduled to be in Belgium but opponents Ballingry Rovers graciously agreed to bring the tie forward to Thursday evening, thus allowing the Tayport players

the opportunity to set off for Belgium early the following morning.

Ballingry may well have regretted their graciousness when Tayport ended the cup favourites' unbeaten run for the season, winning 3-2 with goals from Raymond White, Alex Reid and Gordon Hughes.

Sunday morning in Liege saw Tayport beat French side FC Barantin by 4-0 to reach the afternoon's semi final where a 3-0 win over local side Angleur FC put Tayport in the final.

Opponents in the Monday afternoon final were Yugoslavian [now Croatian] side RKN Split, very physical and disciplined opponents. A goal from the late Gordon Hughes had Tayport level at the break but as the Scots tired in the second half, the Balkan side found the net again for a 2-1 win.

Tayport weren't to be denied, however, and two years later, finally won the Jacques Vandebosch Cup.
