






Sniffin' Around...

Perth's St Johns AFC are the latest victims of the pandemic. After 60 years in the Perthshire AFA, the prominent North Inch club has gone into abeyance, citing difficulty in fielding a team.

Tayportian and former 'Port midfielder, Fraser 'Scholsy' Anderson (pictured), now

with St Andrews United netted his first goal of the season on Saturday past at home to Tweedmouth Rangers. Fraser's penalty looked to have given Saints a point but the English side scored with literally the last kick of the game to win 2-1. Saints, managerless since Charlie King stood down, have appointed a new manager. New man in the hot seat is Barry Cockburn. Barry left the manager's post at at Rosyth in January 2018 to take charge of Lochgelly Albert but in October the same year moved to Glenrothes. 12 months later Cockburn guit Glens, citing work commit-



ments, ironically, just after the Warout club had lost 8-1... to St Andrews United!

All change in Scottish Cup

When the Scottish Junior Cup got underway in 1887, drawn ties went to replays, 2nd replays, even 3rd replays. That's changed over the years. Last occasion on which there was a second replay was 1993 when Downfield and Tayport couldn't settle their quarter final tie [Tayport won the 2nd replay]. Since then penalties have been used if teams are level after one replay. That all changed this season with penalties being used to separate sides if all square after one game. Look for some shocks, as underdogs will surely benefit and 'parking the bus' and time wasting tactics could become the order of the day. There were eight first round ties settled by spot kicks on Saturday past, five of which involved Midlands teams. Letham and North End were successful, Broughty, Kirrie (21 penalties were successfully scored here before Petershill went through) and Violet were not. Penalty kick practise will feature high on pre-cup tie training methinks!

Good to see Matty Allan a key player in the Montrose FC side which has started the season well. Tayport fans will recall Matty playing 12 games for 'Port on loan from Dundee FC as an 18 year old in 2014. Matty has played 127 games for the Links Park side since signing from the Dark Blues. Anather example of a player getting a good grounding in the Juniors.



Tayport have had a good run this month with five wins under their belt. Despite a couple of disappointing matches, the team have clearly upped their game and have been easily securing wins and allimportant league points.

Back at the start of the month Tayport brought in a 6-1 win over Scone Thistle, elevating moods for the season and really showing what they are capable of. However, it wasn't until their match against Broughty Athletic that they really turned up the heat. This proved a hard-fought win for Tayport, with some early chances missed. Though they managed to keep Broughty Athletic away from the goal, allowing them few chances to sneak the ball through. It wasn't until the 80th minute here that the deadlock was broken

and Tayport brought the score to 1-0. This win seemed to push on the team, who have won their games since.

In their tenth match of the season Tavport took on Coupar Angus JFC. The team set the pace of the match quickly and came away with a 6-0 win.

This was followed up by the first cup tie of the season, where Tayport took the gruelling journey to Forres to face Forres Thistle on Saturday the 21st. The team looked to make the trip worthwhile, and certainly managed it, walking away with another 6-0 win. After just four minutes Tayport were already on the scoreboard thanks to Lyall Shaw. This was followed up with some easy goals, with Forres putting up a weaker defence. The last goal came in the 88th minute from new signing, Ross Cameron after he was brought on late in the game. This is hopefully a good sign of much more to come from the player.

A CHAT WITH CHRIS McPHERSON...

A good win and a polished performance at Forres on Saturday. What pleased you most about Saturday's Cup success?



I think the most important thing is we are in the next round of the cup, but in terms of the performance I believe we are now starting to hit a bit of form. There was a real balance about us particularly in the second half. I was really pleased that we were able to make three substitutions and all three contributed to the final result. The score sounded like it was a comfortable match but Forres made it difficult for us. I'm pleased the lads worked hard for the result to continue the winning run.

You sent goalkeeper, Jamie Lockhart, out on loan to East Craigie but you have around 22 players in your squad. Making allowances for injuries etc, that's a big pool. How do you keep them all happy?

I think it's easier to keep a big pool of players happy when you are winning, less so when we have been struggling. Ultimately, we have had so many injuries that I have never had to tell anyone that they aren't in the squad. In fact, on several occasions, I've not been able to list a full complement of substitutes. I think that tells a story in itself. We have 22 signed players but, in reality we've only had perhaps 17 available at any one time. Moving forward I expect us to trim the squad now that the midweek games are drawing to a close. I believe this will allow the group to focus and hopefully steer clear of injuries.

Zak Wilson played in the first eight games of the season, yet was quickly transferred to Violet. What were the circumstances there?

Zak is a great lad and good player and we thank him for his efforts whilst at the club. Essentially Craig Sturrock is our first choice left back at present but he decided to go on a near 2 months holiday and isolation period, much to my frustration! Zak, who is more of a forward left sided player, filled in for Stuzz over this period. We received excellent offers from two clubs for Zak and we felt it was best for us and him that he went and played regularly elsewhere. This also clears the way for promising young Ross Cameron to come in and provide competition for Stuzz. It was a tough decision to lose Zak, he was great to have around the place and I'm sure he'll do well at Dundee Violet.

Creating an atmosphere

Last season there was plenty of football available to watch on the TV, but I found it really hard to get into. I struggled watching matches with no fans; there was no atmosphere and many of the matches felt flat. In the last month it has been fantastic seeing stadiums back at full capacity once more. Even from just watching at home you can see and hear the impact that the fans have on the game and how the players respond to it. It's the same at our level and at Tayport, the handful of matches that we played in the abandoned 2020/21 season felt flat and empty. The team played well on the pitch but there was no buzz or energy at the matches. As Jock Stein famously said, "football without fans is nothing" and I think over the past 18 months that has been extremely clear. Whatever level you are playing at, every team needs their fans. 

It's been well documented that one of the world's greatest footballers once played for Arbroath Vics. Yes, in August 1982 the legend that is George Best turned out for Vics against Arbroath FC at Gayfield as part of Vics' Centenary celebrations, the Best inspired Vics beating their Senior neighbours by 3-2.

Tayport FC v Arbroath Vics - no league meetings this century

Since Tayport joined Arbroath Vics as members of the Scottish Junior FA 31 years ago, matches between the clubs have been few and far between. Indeed, there have only been 10, and we have to go back to Ogilvy Park, Arbroath in **February 1994** for the last league encounter between the teams, a 6-0 win for Tayport.

Since then there have been five cup-ties between the clubs, all ending in wins for 'Port, the most recent in **November 2013.** Appearing for Tayport in two of these ties was **Mark Whatley** who would go on to play 217 games for Vics' Senior neighbours Arbroath FC, captaining them to the Scottish League Division One title.

One of those Tayport v Vics ties was the Scottish Cup meeting in **2011** when **Paul Tosh**, another former Red Lichtie, netted two of Tayport's goals in their 5-0 win. In Tayport's final game of that season Whatley, Tosh and **Simon Murray**, another who would move to Gayfield, all scored in Tayport's final game of the season v Arniston Rangers. Tosh had earlier in his career, secured a record transfer fee of £120,000 for Arbroath on moving to Dundee FC and following Simon's move to Arbroath, the Gayfield club later collected a transfer fee £50,000 from Dundee United.

Of the 24 different teams Tayport FC played in their first Junior season, **1990/91**, Tayport only failed to taste victory against one club...**Arbroath Vics**, losing 2-1 at the Canniepairt and drawing 2-2 at Ogilvy Park. But for a last minute goal from player/manager, manager and now chairman, Davie Baikie, it would have been an even more memorable double for Vics

Tayport v. Arbroath Vics

Tayport went close in the 10th minute when Riley shot over from 6 yards. Vics took the lead when KUBICKI rounded keeper Tosney and slotted the ball home.

Tayport equalised in the 33rd minute when a Christie cross was turned into his own goal by FARMER.

Half-time—Tayport 1, Arbroath Vics 1.

Arbroath took an early lead in the

2nd half when STRUTH headed home with the Tayport defence flat footed.

A hectic goal mouth scramble almost lead to an equaliser but the ball was clear of field. Thoms came close with a 30 yard thunderbolt which Duncan touched round the post.

Final-Tayport 1, Arbroath Vics 2.

Arbroath Vics v. Tayport

In nine minutes a cross by Reid was controlled by STRUTH who volleyed the ball past Toshney.

In 32 minutes a through ball by Dolan was slotted home by THOMS.

Half-time—Arbroath Vics 1, Tayport 1.

In 59 minutes STRUTH ran on to a pass from Hickie to score again.

Three minutes from time a cross by Cushnie was headed home by BAIKIE.
