



A CHAT WITH CHRIS McPHERSON...

Last Saturday's win made it five wins in a row, a run sparked off with the excellent win at Broughty. Previous to that, the two performances, against Lochee United (2nd half) and Downfield, were disappointing so what did you put this improved form down to?



There's no mystery to the results. We simply managed to field a stronger, more settled line up against Broughty and the momentum has carried us through the succeeding games. I don't like to make excuses, but the fact of the matter is, that against Downfield, we had three of our back four missing. We also had Gordon Norrie and Ewan White injured prior to that game. It's ok missing one or two, but when you're missing so many, it completely upsets the shape and the rhythm of the team.

We've since built a bit of momentum but Saturday past we only had two outfield players on the bench having some seven players unavailable. I believe we can have a really strong season and am praying we can

ride out the injury storm we are currently suffering.

There were a few changes to last Saturday's line-up. Dayle was missing, Darren was making his debut between the sticks and Keiran Sturrock, a new signing, made his debut. Can you give us a bit of background?

Dayle was one of several players missing on Saturday. He was suffering from illness as opposed to injury and we hope to have him back for the weekend. Darren Brown made his debut as we looked to use the fixture to rotate the squad. In reality the other changes were again down to players being unavailable through injury. Darren is an experienced goalkeeper and has been patient since signing. I was pleased with his performance.

Kieran Sturrock is a winger-cum-striker who I've admired for a long time. He adds quality to the squad. He hasn't played for a couple of months so I was pleased with his contribution. His levels of fitness will improve and he is desperate to do well for the club. There is plenty more to come from him.

With another new player in, it's believed several players will be moving on, whether temporarily on loan, or permanently. Can you perhaps give the fans an update on this situation?

We are always on our toes with player recruitment. I think it's important to constantly look to improve. In recent weeks we have sold Zak Wilson to Dundee violet, loaned Gordon Norrie to Blairgowrie and Logan Irvine to Downfield. Gordon has struggled for fitness this season due to having an op. then a groin injury, Logan had slipped down the pecking order and we felt it was important they went and got some game time elsewhere. I am told that Gordon and Logan have started to feature for their loan clubs and we'll be closer to deciding on their long term future in the next few weeks.

1996...MEMORIES OF A TRULY MEMORABLE YEAR FOR THE CLUB...AND TOWN

As we look forward to another Scottish Cup tie next week, we look back 25 years to 1996 when Tayport FC lifted the Cup for the first time

The road to Motherwell's threadbare Fir Park was a lengthy one with nine ties and replays having to be overcome before the team bus finally pulled up at the Motherwell stadium on Sunday 12th May 1996.

Tayport would run out to play Camelon, the cup holders, that afternoon before thousands of Port supporters who had travelled through to North Lanarkshire for Tayport's second cup final appearance. The line-up and scorers are a fixture on the inside front cover of this programme but here we provide more detail of the road which led to a day which will forever be etched into memories of the players, committee and supporters and, indeed, the history of the town.

Manager Davie Baikie, the present club chairman, used only 16 players from the first round on October 14th to lifting the cup seven months later.





club originated, Gartlea and Cairnhill.

Gartcairn was part of the exodus of West Region Junior clubs which left the SJFA to

join the Scottish Football Pyramid via the incipient West of Scotland Football League (WOSFL) a couple of seasons ago. Although no longer playing league football in the Junior Association, like others, they retained membership of the SJFA to allow participation in the Scottish Junior Cup. Gartcairn currently play in Conference B. of the WOSFL and are just

tucked in behind the league leaders. In round 1 of the Scottish Cup they had a comfortable 4-1 over the North Super League's Aberdeen East End.

Gartcairn's best run in the cup was reaching the guarter finals in 2017 but any dreams of a last four place were shattered by Linlithgow Rose who won 7-0. The Airdrie based club has previously only met one club from Tayside, losing 2-0 at home in round 3 to Lochee United in 2018/19. Those of you with a long association with Tayport FC will know that in the past 48 years the club has run different

weekly lotteries in order to generate income. The club's first lottery, **Golden Goals**, was launched in 1973 and was followed by **Scorepool**, which was then replaced by **Super Six** which was launched in 1994. Super Six ran till March 2020. In its 26 years Tayport's Super Six paid out over £300,000. It was a great income generator for the club and really helped develop us over the years. As the Super Six involved buying a physical ticket, it was suspended in March 2020 when the country went into lockdown.

time on Super Six and launch a new weekly lottery, one that took place online. At the start of the year we teamed up with *Our Club Lotto* to launch **Port Lotto** and in April the first draw took place.

The jackpot for Port Lotto started at £1000 with this money being carried over from the Super Six. Port Lotto takes place every Wednesday evening, costs £1 to enter and each participant can enter up to 10 times each week. Each line costs £1 meaning the more lines you place the better chance you have of winning. At the time of writing the Port Lotto jackpot stands at £2,150. If the jackpot is not won £50 is added to the prize pot for the next week. The jackpot is won if you match all four numbers. If you match three of four numbers in any order you will win a share of the second prize, £50.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

A minute's silence for the late Bobby Waddell was observed at last Saturday's match on the Canniepairt - and at Dens Park v Livingston. At Bobby's funeral in the morning there was a good turn out of Tayport players from the mid 1970s, the era during which Deedle managed the team. It was clear, from the comments of these guys, the respect which they had for Bobby as their coach and manager.

Bobby Waddell loved football, anywhere, anytime, anyplace. He played 25 games for Tayport, age 41, in season 1980/81, following reinstatement to Amateur status, helping the club's Fife XI win the East Fife Div 2 championship. Such was the modesty of the man, that his Tayport teammates that season, such as Richard Callander, Ronnie Stewart, Doug Henderson, Frank Feechan, Jim Downie, Kenny Smith, Rich Rennie, Bruce Burnett, Alan Paterson, Brian Davidson, Lindsay Clark, Jimmy Robb playing in games against the likes of Ernie Bryson's Pittenweem Rovers were never aware that one of their teammates had also been teammates with, or played against, some of the most famous names in English football during the 1960s when a player with Blackpool.

scored one of the Blackpool goals in a 5-1 demolition of a United side which was on course for the League Championship. Seven of that United side would be on the field when Matt Busby's side became the first English club to lift the European Cup in 1968. During his time down south, Bobby played with or against seventeen of the 22-man squad which helped England win the 1966 World Cup, including nine of the eleven who played in the final.
