This has been a quiet month for Tayport, with only three matches since the last programme due to a week off in the middle of the month.

Following their 3-1 win against Dundee St. James, Tayport played Blairgowrie, securing another win, by 4-0. This match was once again proof that we are now well into winter, with rain and mist making play difficult throughout. Tayport once again pushed through this, however, to gain further points in the league. The team didn't waste any time scoring here, with their first goal coming from Kieran Sturrock on the 10-minute mark.

A new League set-up and a spanking new ground with a 3G playing surface at Beechwood heralds a new dawn for Lochee Harp, one of Dundee's oldest and

best respected clubs. But it's Harp's away form which has caught the eye this season. Only one defeat on the road...at Arbroath Vics...and six wins, scoring an average of four goals per game. A win today would give Harp five successive league wins away from home and see them leapfrog Tayport in the league table.

Last Saturday a Sean Tucker (pictured) goal was sufficient to earn Harp a Quest

Cup win over St James and earn a 2nd round tie against Broughty Athletic.

Tucker has been amongst the goals this season as has the vastly experienced Ryan McCord signed from Broughty Athletic, one of many new faces this season as Harp look to build a side, which will



provide a consistent challenge to the teams setting the pace at the top of the league.

Tayport's defeat at Arbroath Vics last Saturday proved to be one surprise defeat too many for manager Chris McPherson, who along with his assistant Alan McSkimming, handed in

their notice. Although Eddie Wolecki Black has been appointed manager, coaches Grant Miller and Bobby Brown are expected to be in charge today

Tayport FC and the Scottish Football Pyramid

2021 was a seismic year for Scottish football when the modification of the archaic structure of the game completed. The ceiling debarred a club from the pinnacle of the Scottish game had been removed, finally with the opportunity to climb the Scottish Football Pyramid.

There had been upheaval in the Scottish Non-League game during the previous couple years when a host of East Region Junior clubs, including local sides Newburgh and St Andrews United, had joined the Pyramid by defecting to the East of Scotland Football League (EoSFL). West coast and central based Junior clubs similarly abandoned the West Region Junior FA to form the nascent West of Scotland Football League.

With no clubs south of the Tay now remaining in the Junior FA, apart from Tayport, Tayside's Junior clubs, in order to join the Pyramid, were left marooned between the Aberdeen based North Region Junior FA and the EoSFL. The River Tay was the long-established geographical boundary line between north and south, hence Brechin City's Hobson's choice of the Highland League following their relegation from the Scottish Professional Football League (SPFL). This boundary meant that Tayside clubs, with the exception of Tayport, were barred from any opportunity to join the EoSFL.

Earlier this year the final piece of the Pyramid jigsaw fell into place when the 19 Tayside clubs, including Tayport, formed the East Region FA Midlands League which was slotted into tier 6 of the Pyramid. The others in the Pyramid at tier 6 are the North Region Junior FA's Superleague, the North Caledonian League, the EoSFL's Premier Division, the West of Scotland Premier League and the South of Scotland Football League.

For progress up the Pyramid, clubs require to have a ground and facilities which would satisfy Scottish FA Licensing criteria. Then, in theory, they could reach the SPFL. For Tayport to progress, they would initially have to win the Midlands League, then win a 3 way play-off between themselves, the winners of the North Region JFA Superleague and the North Caledonian League, respectively.

The winners of this play-off would then have a further play off against the bottom club in the Highland League. Next step would be to win the Highland League then win a play-off against the winners of the Lowland League thus earning a further play-off versus the team finishing bottom of the SPFL's League Two (at present, Cowdenbeath FC).

Manager Chris McPherson and Tayport FC part company

Tayport FC announced on Monday evening of this week that manager Chris McPherson and assistant manager Alan McSkimming had left the club with immediate effect. No specific reason was given but the departure was described in a club statement as being 'by mutual consent'.

Chris took over the reins in August 2019 and in that season and the current season he has been in charge for 44 games and in those games has fielded 42 different players and had a winning percentage of 39%. Defeats at Downfield, Gartcairn and Arbroath plus a failure to keep in touch with the league leaders has disappointed the club's support this season.

Chris's successor is Eddie Wolecki Black who becomes Tayport's 13th manager since the club joined the Junior FA 31 years ago,

St Andrews United and Newburgh are in tier 7 of the Pyramid, a tier below Tayport. These two clubs compete in the EoSFL First Division's Conference Leagues A & B respectively and would have a longer journey to reach the SPFL. Saints and Newburgh would initially require to win their respective Conferences to reach tier 6. They would then have to win the East of Scotland Premier Division and be part of a 3 way play-off between the respective champions of the South of Scotland League and West of Scotland League to be promoted to the Lowland League, the champions of which play off against the Highland League champions

So, in theory, it is possible, that Tayport could meet St Andrews United in the Scottish Premiership and taking imagination a few steps further, could meet each other in the final of the Champions League!!

Clearly fantasy, but when Tayport were twice winning matches at Kelty Hearts only five years ago, few would have thought, in light of their present positions in the Pyramid, that next season Kelty could be taking East Fife's place in SPFL League One and playing league games against their near neighbours and fallen giants, Dunfermline Athletic.

Kris Rollo chalks up his 200th game for Tayport today (if he plays) and he's quickly catching up on his old man, Steve (right), who wore Tayport colours for seven seasons from 1985 to 1992. During this time Steve played the bulk of his games in Tayport's Midlands and Fife teams with a couple in the Alliance XI, amassing the fine total of 211 games.

Kris made his debut in 2012, moved to Lochee United for the 2016/17 and half the 2017/18 season before returning to Canniepairt.

LOCHEE HARP'S FIRST EVER MATCH

As the Harp badge tells us, today's opponents were formed in 1904 so there is no-body around with that recall. We do know, however, the detail of that first match on **Saturday 6th August 1904 at St Margaret's Park in Lochee** against North End in the opening fixture of the Dundee Junior League season. What we also know is who played for Harp on what would be an historic occasion.

LOCHEE HARP V. NORTH END.

These teams met on St Margaret's Park before a splendid turnout of spectators. The teams lined up as follows:—

Harp—Orr; Dorward and M'Gee; Robertson, Hogan, and Kidd; Connor, Garthy, Burns, M'Laren, and Dolan.

North End—Kennedy; Bell and Marshall; Marnie, Pearson, and Marshall; Smith, P. Docharty, Campbell, James Docharty, and P. Kennedy.

Final result:—

LOCHEE HARP,	3
NORTH END,	1

I am requested by the directors of the Harp to state that it is not Lochee Harp, but simply Harp.

This is for the benefit of all it may concern, but particularly the contemporary who criticises others styling Harp as Lochee Harp, and yet on their own poster in bold type—"Lochee Harp's Grand Victory."

Dear Oh Dear! Vics and Pollok Thrown Out



North End, Dyce and Lochee United or Banks o' Dee. What do these clubs have in common? They are the only clubs actually playing Junior league football who will feature at the last 16 stage, ie round 4 of the Scottish Junior Cup. The other 13 clubs are playing Senior football!! East Craigie and Carnoustie tumbled out last week and either Lochee United or Banks o' Dee will suffer the same fate this Saturday when they face each other in their delayed tie at Thomson Park.

Rossvale FC weren't playing last week either. They had a free passage into the last 16 when the opponents they were drawn against, either Pollok or Irvine Vics, were thrown out of the competition and each club fined £500.

The 3rd round tie at Irvine ended in chaos after each side had a man sent off in the final two minutes with Pollok leading 2-1. Words such as '*crude challenges, brawl, ugly scenes mar Scots football match, carnage, shameful scenes*' peppered media reports of the tie. With spectators, coaching staff and players all embroiled in the mayhem, the poor referee had little option but to abandon the game.

It has been suggested that, had refereeing assistants been appointed to the game, the '*unsavoury melee*' which had been sparked off by a couple of bad tackles, might have been nipped in the bud but, allegedly, the home side's parsimony had ruled out the appointment of said officials.

What is disturbing is that none of this information, nor the fact that an appeal was lodged against the fines and expulsion from the competition, has ever been mentioned on the official SJFA Scottish Junior Cup website's news page.

Tayport won 4-0 that afternoon with goals from a fondly remembered quartet of Birdie Craik, Steven Stewart, Dave Reilly and Kenny Cameron. Attendance was 149. Tayport would go on to win the Tayside Championship... and the next three, before reconstruction which would see 'Port win the inaugural East Region Superleague title in 2002/03. In those days all the players had squad numbers which they retained for the duration of their stay at the Canniepairt. For most of these players, that would be for many seasons, their number being synonymous with their name.

A few familiar names, too, in the Harp team that afternoon, including present chairman Mike Kelly (pictured). Mike who took over the reins from his father, the late Jim, a football legend of four decades, not only with Harp but Junior football generally. Mike helped his club to successfully negotiate Harp's new development through the City Council's planning stage, telling the committee among other things "...the average age of those who come to Junior Football games is over 70" !
