





After four league matches in January we take a break from league duty today as we host Fraserburgh United in the 3rd Round of the Quest Precision Engineering Cup. Our four league matches in January couldn't have gone much better, played four and won four.

Before the first game of the year the manager made it clear to the players and supporters that he wanted four league wins in January and to be sitting on 50 points going into the month of February and he has got what he wanted. Great credit has to go to the players and management for getting these four wins. Three of the four teams that we beat this month were teams that we dropped points to earlier in the season and I think this is an indication that our team is improving.

We know how January has gone for Tayport but let's have a look at what else has been happening in the Midlands Football League. Like every January there are always question marks over whether matches will beat the cold weather and for the first week of fixtures in 2022 the weather and the ongoing Covid situation meant that only two games in the Midlands Football League were played, one being our match against Violet and the other being Carnoustie's against Scone, which the Gowfers won 4-0 to close the gap on league leaders East Craigie.

The milder weather the following weekend meant that all nine Midlands League matches went ahead with the game of the day being at Whitton Park where Broughty Athletic hosted North End. Going into this match it was 4th against 6th and it was the Dokens in 6th place that took home all three points. Goals from Frankie Devine, John Farquharson and Gary Sutherland gave North End a 3-1 victory.

Last weekend there was just one match that didn't survive the weather and that was Forfar

United's home game against Broughty Athletic which was off due to a frozen pitch. The big game of the day was at Laing Park as second place Carnoustie Panmure hosted third place Lochee United. A goal just before half time from Steven McPhee gave the home side the lead. Lochee equalised with 15 minutes to go through Calvin Colquhoun but they were only level for 10 minutes before Dale Reid scored the winning goal for the Gowfers in the 85th minute. The win for Carnoustie saw them go nine points ahead of Lochee but Lochee have two matches in hand.

League leaders East Craigie have continued to go about their business effectively and professionally, first beating Violet 5-1 and then beating St James 7-1. On the subject of the league leaders, they too are in Quest Cup action this afternoon and their match against Banks o'Dee is being called the game of the day as top of the Midlands League take on top of the North Super League. It will be a tough match for the Shipbuilders against Banks who last week put in a strong performance against Raith Rovers in the 4th round of the Scottish Cup. It took Raith until the 67th minute to break the deadlock and it wasn't till injury time that the win was secured for the Fife side with two more goals coming in added on time.

Although today is about the Quest Cup, for those clubs in the Midlands League who have already exited the competition, there are league fixtures this afternoon, the big league match being the Lochee derby as United host Harp.

Harp travel to Thomson Park after parting company with co-managers Jay Smart and Del Mitchell following last Saturday's 2-1 defeat by Arbroath Victoria. Both Lochee United and Carnoustie will be wanting to take advantage of . being in league action and hoping to close the points gap on East Craigie.




FROM THE ARCHIVES



We've met Fraserburgh United on two previous occasions in this competition. Both these matches, in March 1993 and February 2005, were in Fraserburgh, both ended in wins for Tayport, 3-0 and 3-1, and both matches were in seasons which would end in Scottish Cup Final appearances for Tayport. There, the comparisons ended. We lost 1-0 to Glenafton in the 1993 Final but triumphed 2-0 against Lochee United at Tannadice in 2005.

In 1993 Manager Davie Baikie fielded Fraser Mann; Billy Coventry, Grant Paterson, Mark Spalding (Paul Reilly), Andy Sommerville, Sean Wilkie, Jimmy Hunter, Grant Cushnie, Hamish Mackay, (Kevin Thoms), Dave Reilly and Jackie Devine. Hunter, Devine and the club's record all-time goalscorer Dave Reilly were the Tayport marksmen in the 3-0 win. It was game number 24 in an unbeaten run of 33 games which would stretch from September to May.

The records note that "2 goals early on killed off the Broch. Windy conditions didn't help make it a classic. Tayport were never troubled. Thoms made his comeback. Three busloads of punters made the trip"



Twelve years later we were

back up the same road, returning with a 3-1 win.

Team that day, which included three of the team that had also played in 1993, was Duncan Bruce [pictured above right]; Ross Gunnion, Grant Paterson,

Injury wise, only Jim Malone misses out today and we welcome back Louis Joyce from suspension.

During this time of the season every manager is looking to strengthen his squad and I am no different. It's fair to say we have had a lot of interest in our players. So far, we have declined offers for most but we have agreed to let our goalkeeper Jamie Lockhart go out on loan to Lochee Harp. This is of mutual benefit as Harp get a good 'keeper for the rest of the season and we get another player playing regularly.

Today's opponents have not had the best of seasons and lie 6th in an 8 team league. We have had them watched twice now and our players have been shown some footage. As always, we will respect our opponents and work hard to get into the last 8 of what is the second biggest cup competition available to us.
