Last week the club received their fixtures for April. There are still a few fixtures to be arranged but we now have a much clearer idea of what the last few months of the season are going to look like. So, let's take a look at what March and April look like for the Port and what fixtures we have left to play.

Today we host **Arbroath Victoria** in the league, the fixture which didn't go ahead in August due to Covid issues. We have already played Vics twice this season. We won 2-1 in the Quest Engineering Cup before they beat us by the same score in the league at Ogilvy Park in October, a game which turned out to be Chris Macpherson's last match in charge. Next Saturday we are at home to **Kirriemuir Thistle**, who we last played in November and won 3-1. This match against Kirrie will be our last home game for several weeks with us on the road for the rest of March and potentially all of April.

We start the first of six scheduled away games on 19th March against **Letham** in the league when we visit Seven Acres Park in Perth. We took on Letham at home back in September and won 3-2. We then turn our attention to the **Quest Cup quarter final v Forfar United** and the manager and players will be desperate for our name to be in the draw for the semi-finals. We've played Forfar United twice already this season, drawing 1-1 at Guthrie Park in the second league game of the season before beating them 4-1 under the Canniepairt lights in January.

Our first April fixture is in the league when we play title chasing **Carnoustie Panmure** at Laing Park. The original fixture should have taken place in December but the pitch was unplayable that day due to frost. Then on 9th April we take on **Lochee Harp**. There has been much change at Harp in the last month with their manager leaving the club and moving to Coupar Angus. Since then a large number of the Harp team have also made the move to Coupar Angus, so it will be a very different Harp team to the one we faced back in October. Harp now have Tayport's former Assistant Manager Alan McSkimming in charge along with former Port manager Chris McPherson.

The following week, 16th April, we take part in the **Thorntons Property Cup** for the first time this season, entering in round two when we are away to **North End**. We have played North End twice in the league this season, 2-0 on the opening day then 2-2 at North End Park in November. On 23rd April we visit the transformed Davie Park to take on **Blairgowrie**. It's all changed at Davie Park since we last visited there in the league in 2020 with them now having an Astroturf park. Blair visited the Canniepairt in October on league business when we ran out 4-0 winners

We know if we defeat Forfar United in the Quest Cup, the semi-final will be on Saturday 30th April. We have also been informed by the league that there will be mid-week fixtures taking place on Wednesday 20th April and Wednesday 27th April and these fixtures will be released in due course. We have three league games left which have still to be arranged, away games at East Craigie and Coupar Angus, one of which was abandoned and the other postponed, leaving a home match against Brechin Victoria. After today's match we will only have two home league matches to play.

There are still a lot of points to play for in the league and silverware up for grabs in the cups, so let's hope it will be a strong finish to the season for the Port.

THE SCOTTISH FOOTBALL PYRAMID

The next page shows how the pyramid looks today as we move into the last ten weeks of the season. It shows the teams currently topping each tier of the pyramid and also shows where a selection of our neighbouring sides in other leagues are positioned in the pyramid..

Scottish football took a long time to adopt a pyramid system and so remove the 'closed doors' approach which prevented ambitious clubs from progressing. Now, any club can, subject to licensing conditions, move up the pyramid.

The pyramid structure is still settling down but it's like this...

At the end of this season the Highland League winners, presently Fraserburgh, play off against the winners of the Lowland League, presently Bonnyrigg Rose. The winners

then play off against the bottom Cowdenbeath. The winners are

would take their place in next season's Highland League, the losers dropping down to take a place in a Tier 6 league. In theory, that would be Tayport's route to the Premiership and ultimately the Champions League and the World Club Championship!

That's one leg of the Pyramid, the other being the Lowland League leg, which is our neighbouring Fife and Perth former Junior clubs' route to the SPFL and Europe!

Jeanfield are in Tier 6 and would have a similar route as ourselves (and other Midlands clubs).

It's a longer journey for the others, Kinnoull, Luncarty, Newburgh and St Andrews United, who are each in Tier 7. The top placed teams in the East of Scotland (EoS) Conference (league) A and the top placed team in Conference (league) B, each get promotion to the EoS Premier Division in Tier 6. Thereafter it's the same route to the top as for a Midlands club

We were all in agreement that Adam has some work to do physically but we could all see his physique and nice touch as being strong assets for the club. I wish Adam the best of luck and hope he doesn't have long to wait for his first goal.

Today's visitors are a team that intrigue me. I think they are better than their league position dictates and are a dangerous side, especially from set plays, but we have identified one or two areas in which we think we can capitalise.

Our key words today are attitude and application. If we manage them correctly, we could be victorious again. Injury wise, Jamie Hume is a concern and may require a fitness test but Ewan White will return to the squad as will Kris Rollo following his suspension


