



Linesmen/Lineswomen/Linespersons, or to give them their proper title, Assistant Referees, are a feature of Midlands League football matches on The Canniepairt, as those attending home games would attest. However this is not the case at all Midlands League games. Clubs have to request Assistants and many clubs within our league choose not to. Why? Because they have to pay for them. So, what do we see? Well, sometimes nobody on one line (usually Tayport's), sometimes somebody on both lines with a flag usually looking totally disinterested. And for what purpose? Certainly not for offside and corner calls but perhaps only for the very odd occasion when the referee isn't sure who touched the ball last. Of course, who gets the throw in such situations, matters not a toss.

So really, what Referee Assistants are there for is to do exactly that. Assist. They are wired up to the referee and can greatly assist in offside, corners, off the ball incidents. Issues that really matter in a game

We are talking about a Tier 6 football league with semi-professional teams but taking a less than professional approach. Is it not time for a professional league to take a professional approach and make Assistants mandatory in all Midlands games? Supporters paying at the gate should expect their cash to contribute to the cost of Assistants.

## 50 years ago FROM THE ARCHIVES 25 years ago

On 22nd September 1973 Tayport drew 1-1 with Grove AFC in a Midlands Division 1 on the East Common. Team that day was: Phil Callander; Ian Mathers, Graeme 'Spider' McLaren, Ron Fleming, Ian Rae; Jim Scott, Lindsay Ancell; Albert Oswald, Andy Johnstone, Eddie Gilmour, Gordon Hughes; Subs: Ian Howe, George Caldow. Of that line-up 50 years ago, sadly Gordon Hughes and Lindsay Ancell are no longer with us. Tayport would finish 4th bottom of the table that season avoiding relegation by 3 points.

On 19th September 1998, Tayport defeated Broughty Athletic 5-2 on Canniepairt in a Tayside/North Regional Cup tie. Tayport's line-up was Fraser Mann; Grant Buist, Keith Nicolson, Sean Wilkie, Ian Greig (Alan Ramsay); John Young, Billy Coventry (Brian Craik), Steven Stewart; Stevie Ross (Mark Corcoran), Dave Reilly, Kenny Cameron. What a star studded line-up that was! Manager was Andy Somerville. It was Tayport's 8th successive win since the start of the season, scoring 25 goals and conceding only 3 goals, 2 of which were in this game. Mark Corcoran played 99 games for Tayport before going on to play 278 Senior games for Hamilton Accies,

Before joining the Highland League, Formartine United, Turriff United, Banks o' Dee and Inverurie Locos all played here in Scottish Junio and Regional FA Cup ties. Only Banks o' Dee were successful.

### **Scottish Gas Scottish Cup 1st round**

We welcome the players, officials and supporters of Highland League Buckie Thistle to The Canniepairt this afternoon for what is something of a historic occasion, a first ever (Senior) Scottish Cup tie in Tayport.

Buckie Thistle will be hoping this visit to the area will be more successful than this season's earlier visit to Tayside. That was

against Dundee FC Under 21s or Dundee 'B' as they were sometimes billed, in the Scottish Challenge Cup. Not at Dens Park but at Station Park, Forfar in August. Dundee ran out 4-0 winners.

Buckie have been flying high at the top end of the Highland League in recent

times and have been runners up in both the last two seasons, to Fraserburgh and Brechin City respectively. When Buckie were pipped for the Highland League title on the final day of last season, they missed out on a play off against Spartans and the opportunity to take a place in the SPFL.

Thistle started this season impressively but last Saturday's 2-0 defeat at Banks o' Dee saw them fall four places from the top of the table. It was a second successive disappointing Saturday for the Jags who were knocked out of the League Cup by Keith on penalties, after a 0-0 draw, the previous week.

In the close season they brought in four additions to their squad, experienced 'keeper Stuart Knight (17 seasons at Forres Mechanics), defender Dale Wood (Forres Mechanics), Josh MacIver (Formartine United) and central

defender Darryl McHardy (12 years and 300+ games for Elgin City).

Leaving Victoria Park were Kyle Macleod (transferred to Brora) and Sam Morrison (on loan to Clach).

Manager Graeme Stewart, in charge at Victoria Park for eight seasons, has pretty much relied upon a settled starting eleven since the start of the season but, following these two successive defeats, is likely to make changes for today. Top scorer Andy MacAskill received two yellow cards for dissent and saw red in last week's defeat at Spain Park but will be available today.

Tayport's results and performances of late have seen them slip down the table, dropping points when being punished for a defensive error, at Scone and Kirrie for example, and a

failure to execute opportunities at the other end, for example at Scone and Blairgowrie.

Tayport haven't been in the best of form and will be playing competitively against a team from tier 5 for

the first time so will be rank outsiders today, perhaps a unique situation for a Tayport team.

The Cup is different though and who knows, there will be no lack of effort and if Tayport can play to their capabilities, another cup shock can be added to the SFA's archives!

**Ethan Samson** - "It's a massive game for everyone associated with the club and to be part of it is a privilege I don't take lightly. Coming off a good result at the weekend fills the whole squad with confidence going into this game.

I think that most people would agree that Buckie are the favourites going into the match but this just fills the squad with more freedom to play and enjoy the occasion. We must try not to get ahead of ourselves and focus on the game at hand, although to progress to the next round would be a dream for everyone associated with the club"



Club Captain **Jamie Hume** - "Today marks a fantastic milestone in the club's history. Tayport has enjoyed success in the Junior Scottish Cup in the past, having won it three times, so it's an amazing opportunity for the club to finally be involved



in the Senior Scottish Cup and is something everyone involved is relishing. There's been a major push from the committee and club members over the past few years to get us here and it's great that all their hard work has got its reward. This is something that we, the players, appreciate and hope to repay with our performance on the pitch.

Obviously, today's opposition are in a very good place right now and we know this will be the toughest fixture on this season's calendar, but this is the calibre of game in which the club wants to be involved, so hopefully we can lay down a

performance to mark the occasion and thank the fans for their terrific support throughout the season"

#### PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB REPORTS...

Tayport's Walking Football section has continued to flourish in the last 6 months, new players have joined, bringing the number of members to just over 30. If the weather is favourable we continue to train and socialise on a Friday morning at The Canniepairt , or over the bridge, indoors, at the Regional Performance Centre (RPS) in Caird Park if it is wet. The RPS is a state-of-the-art training facility, with full size 4G indoor and outdoor pitches. Tayport FC train there in the winter where the



door and outdoor pitches. Tayport FC train there in the winter where the facilities include changing rooms, showers and gymnasium. We only book half a pitch, and find ourselves occasionally sharing the pitch with Dundee FC's under 21 squad. Quite an age spectrum!

I have tried different methods to recruit new players, banners have been put up and flyers distributed, but the majority of new players have come from word of mouth. And not just from the immediate area, one comes from Cumbernauld, another from Kirkcaldy and one from Markinch. I think the most positive result is that once someone new comes along, they enjoy the whole experience, not just playing, but the fun atmosphere and social interaction afterwards.

This year, Walking Football Scotland, to which we are affiliated, announced that in the East Region the league competition would involve 2 divisions for the first time, a Premier league and a Championship league. The Premiership would be the top 8 teams from last year and the Championship would include the bottom 5 sides plus new teams from Dundee FC, Luncarty and Highland Utd.

We had several players interested in taking part, so I took the huge step of entering a second team in the Championship! I didn't want an A and B team or first and reserve team, but wanted both our teams to be separate 'squads', each with their own identity, so the Premiership squad became **Tayport Reds**, basically last year's team, and the Championship squad became **Tayport Yellows**, predominantly new players. When you look at clubs the size of Hearts, Dundee Utd., Linlithgow Rose, Raith Rovers etc., only entering one team, it's very positive that Tayport FC is the only club entering two (but it's not been easy)!

At the moment the **Reds** are 6th in their division, down on last year, but injuries haven't helped. The **Yellows**, predictably, are bottom of their division but are up against very experienced teams such as Raith Rovers, who last time out beat us 2-0, and top of the table Dundee Utd., who beat us 4-2.

It takes time for new sides to gain experience of playing together, and the Yellows results are similar to how the **Reds** fared in their first season. All in all, the club is going forward and hopefully next year we will again enter two teams, and attract more players to our club.

I would like to thank the parent club Tayport FC for its continued support of the Over 50s Walking Football section, and for the use of the club's facilities.

# Buckie Thistle & the Scottish Cup



Being a tier 5 club and thus exempt from the competition's two preliminary rounds, this is Buckie's first appearance in this season's competition.

Over recent years Buckie have had their moments but can count only Albion Rovers and East Stirlingshire as 'giants' killed. The last named weren't really killed, more euthanised after they were found to have played an ineligible player in their 1-0 win over the Jags in the 2011/12 competition.

The default result put Buckie in the last 16, their best run ever. They could have drawn Aberdeen, Dundee United, Rangers or Celtic in the 5th round but they had to settle for Brechin City at Victoria Park and that was the end of their dream.

Buckie's last and only visit to Fife was to New Central Park, Kelty in 2021 where they lost out to a Hearts team which would end its inaugural season in the SPFL as Division 2 champions.

Not Fife, but a lot closer, eight miles or so to be exact, was their visit to Thomson Park Lochee in 2008 where Lochee United, eligible for entry to the Scottish Cup by virtue of being East Super League champions, knocked out Buckie by 3-0 in a 2nd round tie.

### The Highland League's Scottish Cup Shocks

There haven't been too many Scottish Cup upsets caused by Highland League clubs which would come into the mega shock category. Two, however, which certainly do come into that category, occurred in 1959 and 2021.



In **January 1959** Dundee FC travelled north to meet Fraserburgh at Bellslea Park in a 1st Round tie. The Broch were mid table in the Highland League. Dundee were third top of the Scottish League and four years later would be playing in the semi-final of the European Cup [Champions League]. Without doubt, an away banker. But Fraserburgh pulled off a shock 1-0 win which still reverberates round the fishing town to this day, thanks to Johnny Strachan's goal just before half time.

The other, more recently, was the 2-1 win for Brora Rangers v Heart of Midlothian at Dudgeon Park in **March 2021**. Hearts, beaten Scottish Cup finalists in the two previous seasons, had come into the tie unbeaten in 9 games whilst Brora had won only 3 games all season. A reminder for Tayport today that shocks can happen ....

### The Season Up To Now by Jay Aitch

The return of Montrose Roselea, moving from the North Region to the Midlands fold, gave each Midlands club another couple of league games to fit into their schedule. The season got off to a July start with five midweek games and consequently, with eight months to go, one third of the league season will have been completed by next Saturday.

For our opening games against the returning Montrose side, it was a much changed 'Port line-up. Only two players remained from the side which opened the season a year ago and only four of those starting the closing fixture at Violet lined up vs Montrose. The aim was to improve the final league placing of 8th and offer a challenge to those teams fighting it out at the top.

A sound 2-0 win over Montrose was followed by a run of ten games, seven of which were against teams which finished beneath us last season. Unfortunately profligacy in front of goal cost us dearly with two points dropped at both Blairgowrie and Scone where the points could have been banked early doors. There was a goalless draw at home to East Craigie in the first of three games vs. sides which had finished above Tayport last season. Disappointingly, the other two games, at Downfield and at home to Lochee United, saw us comprehensively beaten.

After surviving some early sticky moments, the 1-0 win at Hill of Beath was perhaps the best team performance of the season albeit against a Haws side which had started poorly in the East of Scotland League Premier Division. If the Cup win at Keir's Park was one of the best displays of the season, that at Kirrie the following week, losing 1-0, was at the opposite end of the spectrum. A failure to create much in the way of goal scoring opportunities, slack defensive play and a lack of discipline, which saw Tayport finish the game with nine men, provided an afternoon to forget.

Four goals in sixteen first half minutes put Tayport in easy street at Coupar Angus last week but we failed to build on that lead and the bottom of the league side netted the only goal of the second period.

On field discipline and subsequent suspensions was a problem last season and it's a pattern which is being replicated this season. It's only September and already referees have dished out four red cards and 29 yellows to Tayport players, resulting in suspensions for five players. At present another two players are a yellow card away from a suspension.
