

#### **EDITORIAL**

Unlike pre-Pyramid days, there is now no longer a ceiling for what would previously be described as 'non-league clubs'. The closed-shop days when a club seemingly perennially destined to finish bottom of the Scottish League and survive, are gone. Some of those clubs which have since finished bottom following the advent of the Pyramid, are gone too, at least for the present time, eg Albion Rovers, Berwick Rangers, Cowdenbeath, East Stirlingshire, who are all now playing in the Lowland League. It's refreshing to see clubs which replaced them, and which were once regular visitors to The Canniepairt, now playing with the 'big boys' eg Kelty Hearts and Bonnyrigg Rose.

More than twenty years ago Tayport pushed for changes, arguing that the Scottish Cup should be open to all and we were pooh-poohed when suggesting that, if it was, then maybe one day Rangers or Celtic could be our opponents on The Canniepairt.

Well, after beating us here, Buckie Thistle eliminated Forres Mechanics and then Broxburn Athletic to hit the jackpot and be financially secure for many years, by drawing Celtic in Glasgow in round 4. Despite losing 5-0, Buckie were far from disgraced and their fans had a great weekend out.



The late Councillor Annie Beaton is to thank for The Canniepairt being a football ground today instead of a housing scheme. At a Tayport Town Council's meeting in June 1968, Councillor John Rae's proposal, seconded by Police Judge Bill Crone, to build a scheme of 96 houses, was defeated 5 votes to 3 by Councillor Beaton's amendment, seconded by Dean of Guild Jim Heggie, to instead build new houses on gap sites in the town and not on The Canniepairt. Town Clerk Harry Wilson was instructed to "close all correspondence with Bett Brothers, the contractors"





In 2010/11, Tayport's home Scottish Cup tie v Petershill was postponed on 8 successive weeks from November. No Saturday afternoon was wasted, though, and Manager Willie Garner had his troops training on the snow-covered Shanwell Common (pictured are David Black, Chris Anton and Derek Wemyss) and on the adjacent beach. The tie was finally played on 5th February (0v0). The replay in Glasgow was also 0-0, Tayport losing on penalties.

#### **TODAY'S GAME**

## TAYPORT v SCONE THISTLE MIDLANDS CHAMPIONSHIP



This afternoon we welcome Scone Thistle to the Canniepairt for only a tenth competitive visit here since their first, back in 1991 and, with ten defeats since then, it's never been a happy hunting ground for the Jags. Scone, though, have generally been in good form this season and their defeat at Lochee United last Saturday was their first on the road since September.

Farquharson Park boss, former Tayport manager Charlie King, has revitalised Scone this season, and they maintained their record of scoring in all bar one of their league games away from home, when they gave Lochee a fright to lead 1-0 at half-time before four goals in the last half hour gave the Bluebells full points.

The visitors' top scorer this season, 21 year old Sean Hastie (pictured), signed for Highland League leaders Brechin City just before Christmas and his presence - and goals - will be missed. The experienced former 'Port No.1, Gavin Sorley has been a standout between the sticks for Scone this season and he will be determined to thwart, what has been this season, a relatively shot shy Tayport attack.

Just as Scone had done prior to the Christmas break, Tayport returned from East Craigie with full points and having won at home to Blairgowrie in our previous home game, will be looking to cheer the home support by making it three in a row.

It's been something of a revolving door at the Canniepairt this season, with no fewer than 23 player movements, either in or out or in several cases both, as the manager tries to find a formula which can take the club forward.

Latest to get a dressing room peg are young striker Alex Balfour and Kieran Crighton. Kieran moved from Lochee United where he had only started two games this season, with Aiden McDougall heading in the opposite direction. Kieran came on as sub at East Craigie last week and quickly made his mark by collecting a yellow card within five minutes of his debut!

#### PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB REPORTS...

Tomorrow, February 4th, will see the start of the Walking Football Scotland Over 50s league programme.

We will again have 2 teams in the East Division. One in the Premiership, **Tayport Reds**, and one in the Championship, **Tayport**Whites. We now have a team manager and a selection committee, and have balanced out the 2 squads so we will see how it goes!



The **Premiership** clubs include Raith Rovers, Linlithgow Rose, Hearts, Arbroath and St. James plus another 3 teams making 9 in all. We will play Raith Rovers, Luncarty, Hearts and Arbroath on February 4th, so it doesn't come tougher than that!

In the **Championship** Division, the teams include Hibernian, Dundee FC, Forfar and Montrose plus another 7 making 12 in total. Our games tomorrow are against St. Duthus, Arbroath second team, and Carnoustie Panmure. All games last 15 minutes and will be refereed by SFA qualified referees, trained to know all the walking football rules etc.

Fortunately we have one of our members who has decided not play, but instead to referee our training games on a Friday morning. He has learnt the rules from A to Z and makes sure the players are punished for breaking any of the rules! The biggest infringement is not walking! The rule clearly states that if you're not walking then you're running and that's an indirect free kick. Tackling is also not allowed, and if any team gives away 3 free kicks, the third one becomes a penalty, so it's imperative our players have it drilled into them that they must think about their play and not give away unnecessary fouls.

If anyone wishes to come along and support the teams, get the dates in your diary, the games are being played at the Regional Sports Centre (RPC), Caird Park, Dundee. The Premiership games start at 1:30, followed by the Championship games at 3:15.

We are continuing to train indoors at the RPC on a Friday morning, starting at 10:30, and will do so until the weather improves, and then we will return to training at the Canniepairt.

#### Midweek results keep Lochee and Broughty to the fore

Lochee United and Broughty Athletic are taking advantage of their own and other clubs' floodlights to gather in the points as they challenge for the title. Both were in action a week past Wednesday, Broughty winning 5-1 at Blairgowrie and Lochee beating Forfar West End 5-0 at Thomson Park. On Wednesday 14 February, Lochee face Carnoustie at Thomson Park while a week later, 21 February, the Bluebells are at Links Park to meet Montrose Roselea. Lochee have re-signed ex-Tayport Ryan Paterson from Forfar Athletic. Ryan moved to Forfar last summer and in his 6 months at Station Park made 26 appearances and scored 3 goals.

#### **SCONE THISTLE TRIVIA**

DAVE Reilly, Tayport's all-time top goalscorer, was a thorn in the side of many clubs and none more so than Scone Thistle. Between 1991 and 1996, DR, as he was always known, scored 21 goals against Scone, finding the net in each of the 10 games between the two clubs during this period.

SCONE Thistle's manager Charlie King was a popular manager at Tayport FC from July 2017 to January 2019. Charlie was in charge for 56 games and had a 45% win percentage during his time at Canniepairt.

Taking a look at the comparison between the top of league table on **14th January this year** and the table a year ago, on **14th January 2023**, the point when most clubs were roughly halfway through their league programme. The comparison suggests that the strong are getting stronger in terms of points won and goals scored. Carnoustie have fallen away and **Tayport**, with fewer goals scored and fewer points, are treading water.

The league title looks destined for either Whitton Park or Thomson Park with North End keeping in touch to take advantage of any slip-ups. With an improvement in all fields, **Scone Thistle** are clearly on an upward trajectory

#### Elsewhere Locally... A Mid Season League Report

Jeanfield Swifts, boasting the EOS L Premier Division's best defence, and with games in hand, are very much in the title race and a play-off place to join the Lowland League.

Glenrothes, Kinnoull & Luncarty, three of last season's four clubs promoted to the EoSL Premier Division, are currently in the bottom three places and a quick return to Division One looks likely. St Andrews United have lost a bit of ground recently in their bid for promotion from Division 1, losing 0-1 at home to Leith and then 0-3 at Dunipace. Newburgh, with only 2 league wins from 15 games, are deep in a relegation battle to avoid a drop into Division 3. It's only halfway through the season, though, so things could well change.

#### **Lochee United the sole Scottish Junior Cup survivors**

Originally Scheduled for 2nd December, **Downfield** waited two months to play their much postponed last sixteen tie at WoSL Division 1's **Johnstone Burgh** but alas, the wait was in vain, the Spiders going out on penalty kicks after the 90 minutes had ended in a 2-2 draw. **Johnstone Burgh**, having won 8 games on the bounce at home prior to the Downfield tie, had already eliminated East Craigie and North End and thus completed a Midlands League hat-trick. The overseas investments by Jack Henderson and by local businessman Scott Graham have revolutionised the Keanie Park club and a Scottish Cup win is an early target on the road to greater things.

The Spiders had been aiming to join **Lochee United** in the quarter finals but Lochee are now the only Junior League club still with an interest in the competition. In the only tie to beat the weather, way back on Saturday 2nd December, **Lochee United** had a successful trip to Ayrshire to reach the quarter finals, beating **Largs Thistle** 3-0 on penalties after a 2-2 draw.

The quarter final draw is - Auchinleck Talbot v Hurlford United; Bellshill Athletic v Arthurlie; Darvel v Lochee United; Johnstone Burgh v St Cadoc's. Ties are scheduled for next Saturday.

### Scottish Gas Scottish Cup

The 4th round draw gave a picture of what might have been, certainly for Tayport, when Buckie Thistle were drawn away to Celtic, a match shown live on TV last weekend. Buckie, whose 1st round win at The Canniepairt earlier this season, set them on the road to Celtic Park are estimated to have made between £200,000 and £250,000 from the tie and that doesn't include merchandise sales. Two one-time Junior clubs not so long ago, were also in 4th round action. Bonnyrigg Rose provided the shock of the round, knocking out League One leaders Falkirk but Kelty Hearts went out at Ayr United.
