## THE CHAIRMAN...


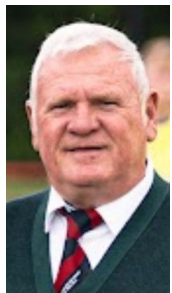
Good afternoon to our supporters and a warm welcome to today's opposition Carnoustie Panmure.

### **TODAY'S GAME**

## **TAYPORT v FORFAR UNITED**

### **MIDLANDS CHAMPIONSHIP**



Defending League Champions Carnoustie Panmure are our visitors this afternoon. Following a series of uncharacteristic defeats in August which saw them slip down the table, the Gowfers got their act together, and how! Winning six games on the bounce, scoring 28 goals and a rapid climb up the table. Their form since then has been mixed, three wins and three losses. Most recent win, though, was a crushing 6-1 home win over a hapless Blairgowrie side last week.

Carnoustie have played only three games at home during the last 5 months whilst this will be their 10th game on the road during the same period. Home or away, the Gowfers have invariably found the road to goal, finding their opponents' net on all but two occasions, once at home and once away. Their main goal threat is top scorer former 'Port striker Dale Reid who bagged another couple last week v Blairgowrie.

To say that Tayport have been struggling in that area would be an understatement. In their past dozen fixtures, only Scone (0.83) and Brechin Vics (1.00) have a worse scoring record than Tayport's 1.25 goals per game. Carnoustie have been rattling them in at a rate of 3.42.

Carnoustie's hopes of retaining their title have gone, so the Quest Cup tie at high flying Hermes in Aberdeen next week is, like Tayport's, who visit Dyce, the last chance of a major piece of silverware this season.

The Gowfers have lost a few players from last season's corresponding league game here - which the visitors won 3-0 - but around half of that pool will likely be listed today. Tayport's squad is almost unrecognisable from that which featured back in March, with only around four who played that day likely to feature this afternoon.

Today is a test for Tayport and an opportunity to gauge the progress of the re-build, against a side who a year ago this time were on a march to the title. The two yellow cards Kieran Crichton picked up in his initial two outings for Tayport has seen him pass the suspension threshold, so he'll be an absentee today. Jamie Hume is still unavailable but Ian Plenderleith, Darryl Burns and Ryan Smith all return. 16 years old full back, Thomas McConnachie, who came on as sub. Last week could be on the bench again. Matty Adams has been transferred to Dundee Violet

When Tayport saw off Carnoustie by 4-1 at The Canniepairt in March 2018, few would have anticipated the miserable run we have experienced in our games against our visitors since then. Seven played, seven lost, five goals scored, twenty three conceded. It's probably time that run was halted!

## PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB REPORTS...

Last Sunday saw the start of our league season. We are again in the Walking Football Scotland over 50s East Division.

When we first joined the league in 2021 there were 10 teams in one division. This season there are 21 teams over 2 divisions, the Premiership and the Championship. Last season Tayport was the first club to enter 2 teams, Tayport Reds and Tayport Whites. The Reds were in the Premiership and the Whites in the Championship. Both teams are still in their respective divisions.



The popularity of Walking Football can be measured by the clubs who have entered teams. Not even mentioning the other regional leagues, the East Division sees teams from Hibernian, Hearts, Raith Rovers, Forfar and Montrose plus local sides Arbroath, Dundee and Carnoustie Panmure.

Only Arbroath, like ourselves, have 2 teams this year, and it says a lot about the Tayport Walking Football Club that despite us being a small club in terms of the number of players, we do have a very enthusiastic squad of guys who make sure Tayport always fulfil their fixtures unlike a few other clubs who have just one team.

This year we have decided to take some of the workload off of my shoulders, and appoint a Team Manager and selection committee.

Tom Malone has kindly stepped up to take charge of the squads, assisted by Alan Gray, Bruce Peebles and Frank Feechan.

Both squads register their individual players and you cannot swap them from squad to squad, although any player in the league can be transferred to another club/team, but only once.

Tom has decided that this year we need to balance both squads with equal calibre defenders, midfield and forwards. This has meant a couple of players moving from one squad to the other, pre- registration!

We also have the luxury of having, for the first time, 3 excellent keepers, so the choice will be dependent on availability and rotation.

Each league game is 6 aside with substitution allowed and each game lasting 15 minutes. Both our teams had squads of 7.

Last Sunday the Premiership side's first game was against Raith Rovers. Few chances were created and the game finished 0-0. Next up were Luncarty, and despite having more shots on target than them, we finished up losing by a penalty! 0-1.

We then faced previous league champions Hearts. We matched them in all departments except scoring goals and after going 0-1 down, going all out for an equaliser, we paid the price by conceding a late goal. 0-2.

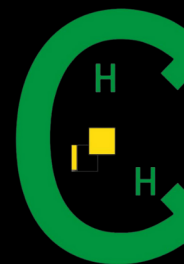
Our final game was against last year's champions, Arbroath, and despite going a goal down, we managed to equalise and get a very valuable point. 1-1.

Overall, on paper it looks a disappointing set of results but although we only scored 1 goal, we only conceded 4, so we've got the defence correct, we just need to sort out our attack.

The Championship side, missing 4 regulars, only had 3 games.

First game was against St Duthus from Inverness. We took an early lead, then

## Trivia

On a very hot afternoon in a pre-season friendly at Gretna's Raydale Park in August 1998, two Tayport players, Fraser Mann and Sean Wilkie, needed treatment, not for your run of the mill football injuries, however, but for wasp stings sustained during the pre-match warm up. Tayport won 2-1 (Steven Stewart and Dave Reilly). Only eight years later Gretna would be in the Scottish Cup Final losing to Heart of Midlothian on penalty kicks after a 1-1 draw.

When Tayport play in the Quest Cup next Saturday opponents Dyce will be the 23rd different North Region club which Tayport FC has played competitively. Of those 23 clubs four are now in the Highland League, four are defunct, one has changed its name and two have amalgamated.

We found ourselves at 2-2, and the same error in going for the winner cost us the game. 2-3.

Next it was the second squad from Arbroath, and a very well-balanced game saw us get a very creditable draw. 1-1.

Finally, we played Carnoustie Panmure, a long-established club, and despite having chances to score, lost 0-2.

Similar situation to the Reds, played well in all games, just didn't get the goals!

We now have until April to put right what was missing last Sunday and I'm sure Tom will get all the support he needs to achieve it. It would be different if we played badly, but we didn't and I'm sure a little tweaking will get the goals going in.

A Tayport FC (Fife XI) pic from **44 years ago, 1980**, to be precise, which features three of today's Tayport Walking Footballer squad, Frank Feechan, Alan Gray and Jimmy Shields. Frank won the Alliance Cup with TFC in 1976 and Alan won the Carstairs Shield in 1981 and the Skol Cup in 1990, scoring the only goal in the 1-0 win in the final at the old Bayview Stadium, Methil. Tayport had a first half lead in the Scottish Amateur Cup semi final v Barr & Stroud at Dens Park in 1986 but Alan was taken off injured at half time and Tayport went down 3-1.

The line-up above is Brian (Bruno) Burnett (coach), Frank Feechan, Ronnie Stewart, Doug Henderson, George Hayter, Alan Paterson, Alan Gray, Jimmy Robb, Ross Macmillan (manager). Front - Jimmy Shields, Willie Gardiner, Ken Smith, Roy Lessels, Bruce Burnett and Bobby Waddell. Bobby of course was a member of the Dundee FC squad which won the Scottish League in 1961-62

## Lochee United are bidding to reach the Scottish Cup semi finals at Darvel today



Lochee United are in Ayrshire this afternoon bidding to reach the last 4 of the Scottish Junior Cup at the expense of hosts Darvel. Darvel's recent five game unbeaten run came to an end last week with a 2-0 defeat at Hurlford, the venue at which our somewhat forlorn cup hopes were ended. Manager Tony McNally, did not seem too downhearted, being quoted with the time-honoured cliché "We reset and regroup, ready to go again next week". Darvel are currently 5th top of the West of Scotland Premier League but have only a 50% win record in home games this season. ## Tayport break new ground in Quest Regional Cup

Tayport travel north next Saturday to meet **Dyce FC** at Ian Mair Park bidding for a quarter final place in the Quest Cup. This will be the first time the clubs have ever met. Kick-off is at 2.30pm.

A glance at Dyce's current 8th placing in the North Region's Premier League table gives a false picture. Had they not suffered a 6 point penalty for playing a suspended player they would be 3rd top, which was their final position last season, and poised to make a title challenge.

There's little doubt Tayport will have their work cut out against a team which is unbeaten at home this season and has suffered only three defeats in the entire campaign.
