We welcome Brechin Vics to Can-niepairt for a match which, in com-mon with all Midlands League match-es not involving Dundee North End, there is only pride at stake.

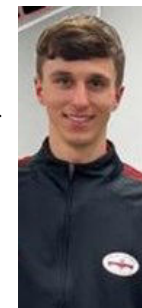
We met each other exactly a year ago in the corresponding league fix-ture. Tayport won that one by 1-0 but such has been the turnover of players during the last twelve months, only one player who fea-tured in that game - Callum Petrie - lined up against Dundee Violet last weekend.

Brechin Vics finished last season sec-ond bottom of the league table but have made progress during the cur-rent campaign and are now in 16th place.

Last season Vics gained an aver-aged .5 of a point per game but at present are averaging .8 of a point per game. Their goals for is fraction-ally down on last season's goal-a-game but defensively things have been tightened up, losing 2 goals per game at the moment compared with 2.6 last season.

Postponements have cost Brechin a couple of games over the past five weeks, but the results in the most recent games have illustrated the defensive improvement. A 90th mi-

nute penalty from for-mer Tayport player Dominic Naglik (right) gave Vics a 1-0 win over Arbroath Vics last week and Dom also got the winner in 1-0 win over St James, while, in be-tween on 13 April, Co-rey Hill (below) equal-ised at Carnoustie Panmure but they couldn't hold on and went down 2-1.



Tayport finished on top when the sides met earlier this season at

Montrose's Links Park, goals from Callum Petrie and Mackenzie Williamson giving us a 2-0 win.

After an energetic first half and a two goal interval lead, Tayport disap-pointed their support last Saturday, losing a late goal and being held to a draw by Violet.

Jamie Hume, injured at work, missed Wednesday's disappointing affair at North End. Mackenzie Williamson is available for today's match then misses the Harp and Carnoustie games through suspension.

1966 FROM THE ARCHIVES 1980 & 1981

Because Bobby Waddell wasn't one to talk much about his football achievements, his teammates in Tayport's Fife XI in 1980 and Tayport FC's Alliance XI in 1981 would be unaware they were sharing a dressing room with a player who had played against West Ham United's Martin Peters and Bobby Moore for Blackpool along with Alan Ball another World Cup winner, a mere three months before England lifted the World Cup. Then later that same year Bobby was in a Blackpool side which trounced a Manchester United side which included George Best and Nobby Stiles by 5-1

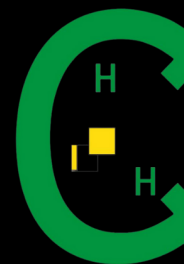

When Jaden Ferguson gave Tayport a 2 goal first half lead within five minutes midway through the half, Tayport looked on course for three points.

However, Tayport youngster Kyle McMulkin, who moved to Glenesk from The Canniepairt earlier in the season, brought the visitors back into contention just after half time and on 67 minutes James Simpson brought them level.

With ten minutes left, substitute Nicholas Fletcher regained Tayport's lead but, as has happened so often this season, we let two points slip in the game's closing minutes when second half substitute James Simpson brought Violet level for a second time to secure a point.

Back in 1980 Tayport had a team in the Midlands AFA, a team in the East Fife AFA and effectively what was a third XI which played in the Midlands Alliance League. Despite a long standing knee injury, Bobby played with the Fife XI in 1980 and the Alliance XI in 1981

43 years on, a lot of familiar names in the Fife and Alliance XIs. The Fife XI (see opposite page) played in the East Fife AFA and Bobby's teammates in side which defeated St Andrews University 5-1 were Richard Callander, Jimmy Anderson, Alan Gray, Willie Gardiner, Doug Henderson, Alan Paterson, Jim Downie, Kenny Smith, Brian Davidson, Sandy Hamilton, Ian Dobie and Brian Simpson.

A number of these guys are still knocking about locally. Doug Henderson is a regular attendee at our matches today, Alan Gray is with the Tayport Walking Football Club, Alan Paterson can be seen selling ice cream from his van in Broughty Ferry, Jim Downie is just outside Kirriemuir. Kenny Smith is resident in Ayrshire and takes in the WOS League games down there as well as Tayport games when visiting these parts.

In the Alliance XI that afternoon at Harrison Road were Jimmy Shields, John Falconer, Frank Feechan, Dick Tracey, , Rab Burns (now Hanlon), Colin Doherty, Frankie Dew-

ar, Grant Howitt, Roddy McCafferty, Steve Cassells, Ian Ness and Stephen Whyte. Shields and Feechan currently play with the Walking Footballers as does Doherty's brother Neil, Nessie is on the TFC committee, Dick Tracey was a GP locum at the local doctors' surgery. McCaff and Frankie Dewar are still knocking about in Tayport as are the others in Newport. Cassells came from Glenrothes or thereabouts and married a Tayport lass.

My fourth game in charge saw us take on a Dundee Violet team that are only a few places behind us in the league so it was important that we tried to open up the gap between the teams. East Craigie meet Bridge of Don Thistle in the other semi-final at Craigie Park. Bridge of Don ended North End's hopes of retaining the Cup in the quarter final, eliminating the Dokens on penalty kicks after a goalless ninety minutes.

SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP FINAL

Darvel and Arthurlie will contest the Scottish Junior Cup Final on **Sunday 2nd June** at Broadwood Stadium, Cumbernauld with a 4.05pm kick-off. Both clubs are members of the West of Scotland Football League

Darvel, who led Auchinleck Talbot by 2-0 after the 1st leg, fell 1-0 behind to a goal after 20 mins in the second leg but held on to make their second final. Their first was a 0-3 loss to Bo'ness United in the 1976. Attendance: 1st leg 604; 2nd leg 1200. Arthurlie and Johnstone Burgh were level at 2-2 after the 1st leg but again home was no advantage and the Barrhead club, level 1-1 at half time, got an early 2nd half winner to win 4-3 on aggregate.
