

Match Report 4th May 2024 Lochee Harp 0-7 Tayport

Well, what a contrast! After an insipid display against Brechin Vics the week before, Tayport recorded their biggest away win in a league match since 2002 with a range of well constructed and executed moves in a 30 minute spell before and after half time.

Scott McComiskie - what a signing he's been - started the demolition of a young Harp side with a perfectly struck free kick in 44 minutes after Max Reid had been flattened and still had time to add a second before the break with a penalty awarded for handball.

The goals flowed freely in the second period with the energetic Marc Van Der Kuhl getting two inside 5 minutes before Scott competed his hat trick on the hour. His fourth came from a penalty a couple of minutes later after Marc had been felled in the box.

The scoring was complete in the 70th minute with a well worked seventh goal. Ewan White and Van Der Kuhl cut open the Harp defence and Ryan Smith was on the spot to head home the latter's first time cross. A trio of substitutions thereafter seemed to disrupt the flow of goals.

Tayport supporters could be seen shaking their heads as they left the ground, wondering, where did that come from? Mind you, Harp, in their last game of the season, were far from at their best.

THEIR PLACE IN HISTORY!

Tayport and Downfield have a significant place in Scottish Junior Cup history. Their quarter final meeting in 1993 was the last ever tie to be played over three games. 0-0 at Canniepairt, 1-1 at Downfield before moving on to a third game at North End Park, which was settled in Tayport's favour by a goal from our all time record goalscorer Dave Reilly. The attendance for the three games was 6,829.

TODAY'S GAME TAYPORT v DOWNFIELD MIDLANDS CHAMPIONSHIP



A warm welcome to Downfield for our last home game of what, for us, has been a very disappointing season. A good finish to the season, starting today and winning what is effectively a six pointer at St James next Wednesday, could see us finish 7th, one place better than last season. However, a poor run and we'd probably end up 10th.

Downfield will finish the league season in 4th place and this is probably less than was expected at the start of the campaign. Nevertheless it's been a good season for the Spiders. Also in the visitors' ranks today is keeper Gary Thain who had 22 games between the sticks for Tayport in the post covid 21/22 season.

Mission Complete!

Joe has visited every League ground in England and Scotland

It's maybe quite appropriate that Joe Kimmet lives a mere hefty goal kick away from the Canniepairt because football grounds have played a big part of Joe's footballing life.

Joe (right) has just completed his mission to visit all 92 English League grounds. To achieve this, he's actually had to visit 118 grounds and that's not including the grounds of 14 clubs he's had to visit twice because of their relocation to new stadiums during this time. In addition, he's visited all 42 Scottish League Grounds plus umpteen Junior and other non-league grounds.



The mission was complete two weeks ago, April 27th, when he took in Forest Green Rovers v Notts County at the New Lawn Stadium in Nailsworth, Gloucestershire, Rovers last game before relegation to the National League kicked in [by the way, he reports that the vegan burgers were very tasty!]

It was in the late 1960s at Doncaster Rovers' Bellevue Park that Joe went through his first turnstile, taken there by his dad who was in the RAF, stationed near Doncaster. Sadly, Bellevue Park and two others Joe visited with his dad around that time, Highbury and White Hart Lane have been replaced by modern stadia, all since ticked off, of course.

Joe began his mission seriously, about ten years ago, initially by car but in more recent times by rail, bus and even plane. On some occasions Joe's visits to some of the many grounds were with a party of Groundhoppers. The Groundhoppers would often attend games at as many as four different grounds in a day, usually non-league grounds, but Joe has managed to take in matches at two league grounds in a single day during these hops.

As can be imagined, Joe's experiences have been many and varied, such as his visit to Rushden & Diamonds, based in Irthlingborough, between Cambridge and Northampton, and at the time the smallest town to have a team in the English League. Unfortunately, Joe had chosen a bank holiday and arrived in neighbouring

Match Report 27th April 2024 Tayport 1-1 Brechin Vics

Midlands Championship

Ten minutes played, a goal up a sitter missed and Vics having not been within 50 yards of the Tayport goal, a comfortable home win seemed assured. Yes, we've heard this before and once again we'd find ourselves hanging on to collect a point.

Scott McComiskie netted inside two minutes, collecting Max Reid's long ball from the right and crashing a wonderful shot into the postage stamp corner. Mac Williamson should have doubled his side's tally two minutes later after being sent clear by Ross Paterson's woeful passback but he failed to finish. As the half progressed a relieved Brechin worked their way back into the game and in 36 minutes Jacob Smith cashed in on some error strewn defending to find the net with a low shot from the edge of the box to level the scores.

McComiskie had looked like Tayport's only scoring threat but on the hour mark Ryan Smith netted following some good build up play only to be denied by a linesman's flag. Despite the bright start, it just wasn't to be Tayport's day and the visitors returned back over the Tay having become the first Brechin team to have avoided defeat on The Canniepairt.

Wellingborough to discover there was no public transport to Irthlingborough. No choice, then, but to take an expensive taxi ride to make the kick off.

On another jaunt down south, Joe had planned to take in a MK Dons v Wimbledon FC game, but MKD wouldn't sell him a ticket because he didn't have a Milton Keynes postcode. Not to be outdone and still in London, he nipped along to Wimbledon, where as well as getting a courtesy tour of the Wimbledon FC ground, he got a ticket for the away end at MKD.

On another occasion he had planned to cross the channel to see Lille v Amiens but this was called off, so he turned to Arsenal v Stoke. He didn't have a ticket and touts were looking for around £100. No way was he paying that but wandering about outside the ground he got on the chat with an Arsenal fan who said he could get him a ticket. He did and for only £30. They had a beer at half time then met up with his other Arsenal mates in a pub near the ground where you needed to be a season ticket holder to get in. His new mates wouldn't let Joe buy a drink, he had a great time and of course ended up the worse for wear!

Not so pleasant in the east end however at a Millwall v Birmingham City match. The presence of Riot Police hinted at what was in store. Joe was in the Millwall end and when Birmingham scored in the 90th minutes, all hell broke loose so he made an early exit. Just as well, too, as it made the national news – there was fighting, police cars set on fire, pubs getting wrecked etc. Joe says he wouldn't go back to MK Dons because of the way he was treated - nor Millwall for obvious reason.

In Scotland Joe has attended games at all 42 SPFL grounds. First ever Scottish ground was New Year's Day 1969 at Tynecastle, Hearts 0-0 Hibs, when he went to the match with his dad and brother. Joe's mum's family were from Edinburgh, so they were regular visitors to the capital. They chose Hibs to support because apparently they preferred the colour of their shirts and Joe's been a Hibee ever since.

By the 1980s he realised he had seen Hibs play at all original 38 league club grounds except Stranraer and Albion Rovers, so they were ticked off and this season Spartans v Dundee United finally completed his treks round Scotland.

Of the 42 Scottish League grounds, Peterhead by public transport proved the most difficult to reach and he says he wouldn't be back at Ibrox in a hurry as he found the atmosphere hostile.

Best Scottish experience was ticking off Hampden Park with the family on 21 May 2016 when the Sun Shone on Leith!

Tayport Cup heroes at New Beechwood last Saturday

Attending Lochee Harp v Tayport last Saturday were two of Tayport's Scottish Cup heroes, Hamish Mackay and Brian Craik. Unique? Probably as it was the meeting of two players who had scored goals in 3 different Scottish Cup semi-finals for the one club. That club of course is Tayport.

Hamish's name is etched in history after scoring a hat trick for Tayport in Tayport's 3-0 semi-final win over Auchinleck Talbot in 1993. It was a result which announced Tayport's arrival on the Junior Football stage. Seven more Scottish Junior Cup semi-finals would follow during the next 12 years.

If Hamish was first to signal that Tayport would make its mark on the Scottish Junior Cup, Brian Craik aka Birdie made sure that mark was indelible. Birdie scored the only goal of the game in the 2003 semi final v Maryhill then went on to notch the only goal to win the final v Linlithgow Rose. The following season, the 2004 semi-final, the big man netted the only goal of the game v Glenrothes.

Hamish was a Harp player before a transfer to Montrose FC, prior to joining Tayport, and was at Beechwood for a gathering of former Harp players to celebrate Harp's two Tayside Championship wins of 40 years ago, 1984/85 and 1985/86. Hamish was telling us that the Tayport Heritage Trail is one of Hamish's favourite walks with his dog these days.

Brian and wife Clare were at Beechwood to see their 16 years old son Marcus in action for Harp. Birdie, 51 this year, was playing amateur football regularly for Midlands Amateurs kingpins, Broughty United until announcing his retirement in February past.

THE CHAIRMAN...

The result made up for the dismal home encounter against Lochee Harp earlier in the season.

I missed our home encounter with Brechin Vics the week prior and by all accounts the game should have been done and dusted within the first 15 minutes, going 1-0 up within the first minute and passing up a number of opportunities to increase our lead but then allowed the momentum to fizzle out, going in at the interval all square. By all accounts, although dominating possession, we failed to convert numerous scoring opportunities, two points dropped.

After today's game we have a further two away fixtures to fulfil, at Dundee St James & Letham which will see an end to another pretty average season.

As a former manager of this great club, it hurts that as the Chairman, albeit we've seen great advancements in the infrastructure at the ground, we have



struggled to take the playing side of the club forward. There is no doubt that there are clubs in our division whose player budget is much larger than ours and in the main throughout every level of football, the clubs with the bigger budgets will be the most successful but, make no mistake about It, having the right manager can go a long way to closing the gap. Over my time away from the dugout we have strived to find that manager and give him as much support as we possibly can without putting the club into financial difficulty. That won't change under my charge, as it's vital this club will be here long after I'm not. It goes without saying we will give our new manager George Shields every support to fulfil his and our ambitions for Tayport FC to succeed.
