EDITORIAL

The Scottish FA has just produced its "Report on the 'Transition Phase'" which tells us that not enough 16 -21 year old players are getting game time in the Scottish Premiership.

In the calendar year April '23-'24, in Scottish Premiership football only 6.7% of game time was played by players under 21. This was lower than any other comparable Leagues in Europe The report goes on to suggest that SPFL managers/head coaches should play more youngsters.

[Interestingly, Barcelona, cited as an example in the Report, fielded 3 x17 year olds and 2 x20 year olds in their opening league game this season]

A couple of thoughts... are our academies actually producing enough quality players to merit a 1st XI place? and where are all these under 21 players who are being denied a game in the 1st XI?

The Juniors and the like aren't exactly flooded with them.

THE CHAIRMAN...

Good afternoon to our fans and a warm welcome to our visitors Dundee North End for this Scottish Cup preliminary round tie.

Of course last weekend North End unfortunately inflicted on us our first defeat of this season. In my opinion a well deserved win for them. Personally its the first time I've seen last season's league champions play for over a year or so and I must say I was quite impressed. They put us under a lot of pressure both with their pressing and their quality of movement and passing. How-



ever all isn't lost for us but we have a lot of work ahead to get to their stage. George and his coaches are not long through the door and I can see a marked improvement with our attitude and commitment. Last Saturday we showed character that just wasn't there last term.

Unfortunately I have been posted missing for four of our five opening games due to holidays and maybe I should have prolonged my break as we won all five games, albeit against sides which, on paper anyway, we should be beating. The important thing is we did win all five.

Believe or not as luck would have it, we not only face today's opponents on consecutive Saturdays, but have drawn them in the first round of the Quest Cup as well. "Familiarity breeds contempt", they say, but for me it's a fantastic opportunity to learn and improve. We now know from last Saturday where we failed, where we can improve, what we need to stop and what we need to exploit. I remember when I managed Cowdenbeath, they'd finished 2nd bottom of the league the previous season and one of my first games was at home to Gretna who were full-time and of course were a Premiership side in the making. We lost 8-0 we were 6-0 down at half time. I'm told that Sky TV's Jeff Stelling, when reading out our score, said I'd love to be a fly on the wall in Dave Baikie's dressing room. We improved! We only lost 2-0 in the 2nd half, but did they take the foot off the gas? Our next meeting at Gretna we lost 4-0 and I'd say that's an improvement. Our 3rd encounter at Central Park it ended in a 2-0 loss, we're definitely learning. In our final meeting of the season at Gretna we drew 1-1, result or what? We were only one of a very few who took a point off them, finishing 3rd in the table. The moral of the story is that it's all about learning, improving, doing your homework and above it's all about instilling an attitude and a mentality within the squad.

So, can we make inroads, show improvements this afternoon and be harder to beat? Only our players hold the answers to that. The prize is a place in the first round of the Scottish Cup.

SEASON JROM THE ARCHIVES 2012-2013

A dozen seasons ago Tayport were playing in the East Region's Premier Division with the target of a promotion place to the following season's revamped East Super League. A finish in the top four would guarantee that fourth place and, somewhat like North End's charge to the Midlands title last season, Tayport would have to win each of their remaining 7 games to get that fourth place. Wins v Ballingry Rovers (then managed by none other than our own Dave Baikie), Dalkeith Thistle, Jeanfield Swifts, Glenrothes, Dundee Violet and Ballingry again, had Tayport needing to win their final game at Penicuik Athletic. It was a nerve wracking finale but goals from Simon Murray and Kris Rollo gave Tayport their 2-1 win and a place back in the Super League.

The players who pulled it off that May afternoon in Penicuik were Ian Ross; Kenny McCulley, Blair Mudie, Paul Thomson, Gary Robertson, Robert Boyd, Connor Gray, Stefan Elvin, Stephen McPhee, Simon Murray and Kris Rollo. Jake Mair came on as a substitute.

Simon and Kris had the goals which sparked off the celebrations. Managing the team during that era was the late John McGlashan, whose son, young John, is playing for Lochee Harp this season. The evergreen Gary Robertson is a member of today's Tayport squad. Simon, who was signed from Montrose FC for £1,000 in February 2012 netted 36 goals in his 41 games at Canniepairt and is still doing his stuff at Dens Park.

Preliminary Round 2

Back in the days of the former Tayside and Dundee Junior Leagues with the closed shop mentality of the SFA of the time, few could ever have imagined two local Junior clubs playing each other in the 'big' Scottish Cup. Yet, that's what we have here today. So, we welcome you all to this unique occasion and also our near neighbours Dundee North End, to the Canniepairt.

The Dokens are competing in the competition this season by virtue of being Midlands JFA Champions, their first title success since pipping Tayport



for the Tayside title back in 1998.

As we know, the clubs met only last week when North End took the points from a 3-1 win at North End Park in what was a first big test of the season for a Tayport side who had started the new campaign with a string of victories. However, there would be no complaints from Tayport over the outcome, with the home side controlling the tempo in the middle of the park, an area where Tayport were frequently guilty of shipping possession.

North End's attacking threat is evidenced by their 22 goals in their opening four league fixtures. Tayport, although struggling at times to contain this threat, had their moments at the other end, and this afternoon will be looking to be more incisive in their attacking third.

With quality players in both teams and the management duos in both camps having an abundance of experience in the Senior game, we can expect an interesting game.

Should the teams be level after 90 minutes and still al square after 30 minutes extra time, the tie will be decided on penalty kicks.

PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB REPORTS...

Despite players being unavailable due to holidays and injury, we have managed to have an average of 18 players attend our Friday morning training sessions. We've trained at both the Canniepairt and the Regional Performance Centre over the last few weeks.

As previously mentioned, we haven't missed a single training session, as my piece of seaweed gives very accurate weather forecasts!

We have attracted a few new players recently, and the feedback we get is "should have tried it earlier"!

When you mention Walking Football to people, especially men, they visualise older men playing football at a snail's pace and immediately laugh it off. They couldn't be more wrong. Walking Football obviously means no running but the skill involved in playing this adaptation of normal football is amazing.

The ball mustn't go above head height or the height of the crossbar, only 3 touches, no tackling and no running whether you have the ball or not. Those are the main rules and there are many more, which all create a need for concentration and skill.

The goals are similar to 5 aside goals, with a goal area in which only the keeper is allowed. The size of pitch we adapt to the number of players taking part, allowing space for players to pass accurately and to avoid unnecessary contact.

Walking Football is the fastest growing sport in Europe, especially in the UK. Most clubs allow players from 50 years old to play, and there is no upper age limit. Our oldest player, Jimmy McIlravey, who plays in goal, is 75 years old and is still an amazing keeper. Jimmy plays in our league games, and admits he never thought he'd still be playing and enjoying it.

Walking Football Scotland, the governing body, has leagues for over 50s, over 60s, over 65s and over 70s, and can include women.

They also have women's leagues for over 40s and over 50s.

There are 16 teams in our over 50s league, so if you perhaps think Walking Football is worth trying, contact me on **0783-53555**, and I can give you more information about the sport and our club.

South of Scotland League has 6, the Midlands League 3, North Caledonian League 2 and the North Region JFA and the Amateur Cup winners each with 1 entry.

Locally, look for an upset at Glenrothes' Warout Stadium where **Cupar Hearts** take on a Wigtown & Bladnoch side which is anchored at the foot of the South of Scotland League, having lost all their seven games to date, scoring a measly 1 goal in the process.

Clydebank are riding high at the top of the WoSFL Premier Division with 6 wins out of 6, so it looks like a fruitless journey west for **St Andrews United**. Hawick Royal Albert are in tier 9 of the Pyramid so are unlikely to be a match for **Lochee United** at Thomson Park. Similarly, in Perth, although the visitors have won their last three games, there should be no slip up when **Jeanfield Swifts** get a visit from SoSL's Newton Stewart.

One of the games of the day will surely be at Penicuik where the home side face Musselburgh Athletic. Both clubs are neck and neck at the top of the EoSFL's Premier Division.

Only clubs with an SFA licence can enter this competition. Exceptions are the holders of the Scottish Amateur Cup (Cupar Hearts) or the champions of the North Caledonian League (Invergordon FC), Midlands JFA (Dundee North End) and North Region JFA (Culter FC) who are invited to enter.

There were only two ties and two byes in Preliminary round 1, so the road to Hampden next May starts in earnest today.

We have a real contrast in the distances the clubs have had to travel this afternoon. Compare, for example Carluke's round trip of 460 miles to Golspie and Wigtown & Bladnoch's 320 miles round trip to Cupar (although it's a wee bit less now, with the tie being played in Glenrothes), with the 3 miles round trip of Newtongrange Star to play Easthouses Lily and North End"s hop across the bridge to Canniepairt.

The East of Scotland League dominates today's cup card with an entry of 25 clubs followed by the West of Scotland Football League with 14 entries.


