

TAYPORT v ARBROATH VICTORIA

A warm welcome to The Canniepairt to Arbroath Vics who were last here at the beginning of March. Tayport won 3-1 that afternoon.

Only six home games since for Tayport, but it's likely only seven or maybe eight of Tayport's match squad that day will pull on a red jersey today. Vics, too, will show many changes with only seven or so of their pool likely to feature today. One who will likely feature, but in Tayport colours, is Luke o' Brien who moved back to Canniepairt from Ogilvy Park this season.

Today's two teams' start to the season have been in stark contrast. Vics were unbeaten in their opening four games, which included recording credible draws at both Lochee United and North End, whilst Tayport managed a solitary goal in losing their three opening fixtures.

Since then, Vics went down 1-2 at Scone Thistle, then lost successive games at home to Letham and Coupar Angus, failing to score in both before turning over Harp in Arbroath on Wednesday evening. Injuries and unavailabilities haven't helped manager Eddie Gray with his team selection but that midweek win will boost his team's confidence for today

As noted above, draws at North End and Lochee United suggest that, although Vics have yet to taste victory away from home so far this season, they are a threat on the road.

Daryl McKenzie's team may not have been firing on all cylinders, but they have arrested that early season disappointment to pick up five wins on the bounce to cheer up the Canniepairt faithful.

It may only have been a 1-0 win in Perth on Wednesday but the narrow scoreline flattered Letham and Ryan Paterson's fine goal capped a good team performance to give the locals their first home defeat of the season.

Tayport are missing the injured Jamie Gill but hopefully he will be back to full fitness soon.

THE TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALLERS UPDATE

The Over 50s Walking Football section has been continuing its Friday morning training sessions during the summer and has recruited some new players along the way. We get around 12-16 attendees at training, a good number considering several work on a Friday. For that reason we are trying to hold an evening session once or twice a month to allow those players to join in and also, hopefully attract new members. That depends on ground availability, as obviously the Juniors have midweek games.

Our Sunday League programme has continued during the summer. On May 1st we had 4 games, beating Raith Rovers 3-0, Saints in the Community 2-0 and St Andrews 2-1. Our last game was a 0-4 defeat to top of the table St James. These results saw us move up the table, from 4th to 3rd.

Sunday June 5th we only had 2 League games due to St Andrews being unable to field a team. We lost our 1st game 1-2 to Arbroath but won our second, beating Carnoustie Panmure 1-0. We played Raith Rovers in a friendly, winning 3-2. We dropped a place in the League, down to 4th.

There was a break in July, so our next fixtures were on August 7th. It was a case of a 'session of two halves"!! In our 1st game v Crieff, we were beaten 0-6, our worst ever result, but the scoreline did not reflect some awful refereeing decisions. We lost, but you move on.

Next up were Dundee United SC and we got back on track, winning 3-0. This was followed by a meeting with top of the table and undefeated St James. We went 0-1 down early on but two superb goals saw us fight back to win 2-1. Previously we had not even scored against them! The League later confirmed that it was their first defeat in 3 seasons, so what a way to finish after such a dismal start to the afternoon.

Our next league programme is Sunday September 4th when we take on Fife Wanderers, Montrose and Fairfield.



The Rapid Change in Scottish Football

For many years there was very little change in the Senior Football set-up in Scottish Football. Changes in membership were few and far between. For years the teams which finished bottom of the bottom division just carried on the following season, with no threat to their status. All change now, of course, with clubs who often finished in that lowly position now having sunk into obscurity. Cowdenbeath are the latest, following Brechin City, Berwick Rangers and East Stirlingshire at the expense of new blood in the form of the likes of Kelty Hearts, Bonnyrigg Rose and Cove Rangers.

There was never such a risk in the Highland League, the likes of Strathspey Thistle and Fort William had no risk of disappearing into the likes of the North Caledonian League. All that changed however with the advent of the pyramid and last season Banks of Dee, the North Region Junior Champions, replaced Fort William who had finished bottom of the Highland League. Other Highland League clubs began to realise that squeaky bum time was upon them...Here's what the Nairn County manager had to say last week

NAIRN County manager Ronnie Sharp says players need to realise the Highland League has gone with promotion and relegation now in place. He says the Highland League has now become the fifth division of Scottish football and players have to be aware a sixth division awaits any team that finishes bottom.

His views come after Nairn County suffered a 5–0 hammering to Forres Mechanics at home on Saturday.

Nairn are still looking for their first win of the campaign, but only suffered their first loss on Saturday after respectable draws against Banks O'Dee and Rothes.

But Sharp says with new teams in the division and the opportunity of playing at a higher level, the Highland League they knew previously no longer exists.

"The Highland League is gone, it is fifth tier football now with promotion and relegation," said Sharp.

"We are playing against players now who can play at a higher level.

"You have the likes of Banks O'Dee bringing in better players, you have Brechin City bringing in better players.

"We are giving a lot of chances to the boys, but they have to produce the goods".

Nairn County are in 13th place and head to Pitmedden on Saturday to face Formartine United.*

Sharp is confident his team can improve this season, but says repeat performance like against Forres Mechanics could land them in trouble.

"Formartine are a strong team that play a certain away and we have to handle it.

"We have too many defenders out but we have to find a way.

"If we can do it against Banks O'Dee and Rothes we can do it again. But if we keep making mistakes, we won't compete at all.

"We get another one or two of these results then we have a real problem."



Arran Shows the Same Spirit as his Grandad Eddie



A recent leading article in *The Courier* highlighted 14 year old Arran Leiper's spirit as he recovered from cancer.

Arran is the grandson of Tayport FC's late chairman Eddie Stewart.

Arran's mum Gill and his Aunt Nicola, who formerly ran the TFC matchday pie shop and is now the head teacher at the new Camperdown Primary School in Dundee, and grandmother Yvonne, were all a big part of Tayport FC for many years.

Arran, a Dundee United Academy footballer, received the award in recognition for his positive spirit in attending training

throughout chemotherapy for a rare form of cancer (LCH), the tumour being located in Arran's cranial cavity.

Arran's dad Mal thanked the Academy coaches for allowing Arran to continue attending as normal during his treatment. His coach was quoted as saying "Arran would come into training with a smile on his face and never moaned, showing great commitment and attitude". The same characteristics as his grandad Eddie displayed in his 40 years at the helm of Tayport FC.

We reproduce this article from a 2018 Tayport FC programme which details Arran Leiper's recovery from cancer. At the time Arran was in Dundee United's Football Academy but subsequently moved into Dundee FC's youth system.

This season Arran, grandson of Tayport FC's late long serving chairman Eddie Stewart, made his debut in the Midlands Junior League after signing for Carnoustie Panmure. Arran notched his first goal for Carnoustie on Saturday past, grabbing their second in their 2-0 win over Letham.

50 Years ago in August 1972, Tayport had made a less than auspicious start

to their **Midlands Amateur** season, losing their opening three fixtures. All came good in their fourth game that month, however, with a 2-1 win away to Morgan FP, one of only three Dundee clubs now left in the MAFA. Tayport's team that afternoon was Phil Callander; Eddie Stewart, Jim Mathers, Ian Howe, Raymond White, Dave Mitten, Nobby Shipley, Eddie Gilmour, Andy Johnstone, Ian White, Tony Gillespie and substitute Stewart Ritchie. Andy Johnstone had both goals. Mitten and Shipley were RAF lads from Leuchars. Andy Johnstone is the uncle of Dave Aitken, TFC's present commercial manager.

The **Alliance XI** fixtures didn't get underway until the first week in **September 1972**. They beat Harris FP 6-1 in their opening game on the East Common .

Line-up was Gordon Brankin; C.Hogg, R. Buckley; John Porter, Warren Farrer, Alan Davie, Alex Ritchie, Doug Henderson, Jimmy Lindsay, Murray Anderson, Walter Kemp. Sub was Tammy Laing. Scorers were Ritchie (2), Kemp, Porter, Henderson and Lindsay

Tayport's disappointing early season results can probably partly be put down to the fairly seismic changes which were taking place during preseason. Manager **Eddie Wolecki** left, prior to which several out of contract and loan players moved on. On loan goalkeeper **Craig Hepburn** returned to his parent club, St Johnstone and has subsequently been loaned out to Luncarty. Similarly, **Luke Emmett** has returned to Keith FC, while **Louis Joyce** and **Dan Dorovic** signed for Carnoustie Panmure. **Kris Rollo**, after 218 games for 'Port, moved to North End. **Aiden Cobb** moved to Kelty Hearts U 20s, **and Ewan White**, still attached to Dundee FC, has been loaned to St Andrews Utd.

The vacant managerial hot seat was quickly filled by **Daryl McKenzie**. Daryl, assistant to former Tayport FC striker Darren Scott at Broughty Athletic, had previous experience as player/manager at Forfar West End. It was during his tenure at West End that Daryl was first approached for the Tayport job back in 2015 but at that time agreement couldn't be reached.

Daryl inherited a somewhat threadbare Tayport squad and found himself on the back foot when it came to recruitment. Including Daryl who has taken the role of player/manager, into the club have come keeper Charlie Kennedy (Craigie AFC), defenders Caleb Addo (Newport Ams), Ross McDonald (Downfield) Callum Walls (Blairgowrie), forward players Niklas Edwards (Dundee FC), Kyle McMulkin (Dundee United SC) and Dominic Haglik (Brechin City). Welcomed back to his home town club after a couple of seasons at Arbroath Vics is Luke O'Brien.

Dominic (18) is on loan from Brechin City for whom he signed after his release from Dundee United. Back in 2019, Dominic was invited to join the Poland Under 15 squad for a training camp.

Historic Occasion Next Saturday

Next Saturday, for the first time in 144 years, a Tayport team will be playing a match in the Scottish Cup when we travel to Cardenden to meet **Dundonald Bluebell** in a First Preliminary Round tie.

The Cup journey begins on Saturday and ends next May at Hampden Park. Neither club of course will be playing in the Hampden final but we can all dream!

Tayport's entry to the competition is by virtue of ticking all the boxes that allows the club to be licensed by the Scottish FA. The other licensed Midlands club in the competition is **Lochee United**. There is an entry exception for Junior clubs who win their Regional League, hence **Carnoustie Panmure's** participation.

Of the three, Tayport clearly have the toughest task, as Dundonald are challenging near the top of the East of Scotland (EoS) Premier Division (Tier 6 of the Pyramid). Only two seasons ago in round 1, Dundonald were level 1-1 with Queens Park after 90 minutes and it took an extra time goal from former Tayport striker Simon Murray (seen here v Partick Thistle last week) to set Queens on their way to the next round.



Lochee won't have it easy either, at **Dalkeith Thistle**. Although Thistle are in EoS Division 2 (Tier 8), they are top of the table with a 100% record. Carnoustie have an easy looking tie, though, at home to **Hawick Royal Albert**. Hawick are also in Division 2 at Tier 8 but are rooted to the foot of the table with not a point to their name.

The tie at Dundonald will be Tayport's fourth visit to Moorfield Park. The first visit was 1996, two weeks after we had lifted the Scottish Junior Cup for the first time. On a run of 55 successive away games unbeaten and a Scottish Cup on the sideboard, we were odds on to progress in the Fife/Tayside (Redwood Leisure) Cup but, football's a funny game! We lost 2-3. Ten year later we returned to Cardenden on in the same competition and won 5-0. Most recent visit was in August 2014 when we went down 2-3 in a league game.

We did better in our three home games v Bluebell, winning 7-0, 4-0 and 1-0 on the last occasion we met in March 2015.
