TAYPORT v ARDEER THISTLE

A warm welcome to The Canniepairt to Ardeer Thistle for this Scottish Junior Cup tie.

Ardeer, from Stevenston in Ayrshire, don't play in Junior league football, they are members of the West of Scotland Football League (WOSFL). However, like some other WOSFL clubs, they retain membership of the Scottish Junior FA which allows them to play in this competition.

Until recently Ardeer hadn't been setting the

heather on fire and life had been a struggle. In June 2021, however, new manager Sean Kenney took up the challenge of improving the club's fortunes and this he did in his first season, finishing mid table in the

Conference division which was rewarded with a place in the restructured WOSFL's second division.

Kenney had brought in a host of new players from his former Kilbride Thistle amateur side, several of whom had previous Junior experience. The team has made a steady start to this season's campaign with two wins and three defeats in their five league games played.

Best result to date, however, was the Scottish Cup 1st round win over first division Johnstone Burgh, 26 places above them in the WOSFL. Burgh went ahead in the 1st minute but Jack Loudon (pictured) levelled from the spot 5 minutes later. No change after 90

minutes and an exciting afternoon at the Ardeer Stadium came to a conclusion when Thistle won the penalty shoot-out 5-4.

Ardeer have suffered two of their league defeats on the bounce and according to manager Sean Kenney, it was a poor performance in losing 1-3 at Greenock last Saturday when they ended



with 9 men. Talking

about today's tie, the Ardeer boss said "this is a massive game and one which we have been looking forward to for a long time".

Tayport have been cooling their heels since the draw at Arbroath three weeks ago, a game in which their inability to convert their chances, combined with defensive errors, cost them two points in a league which is developing into a tight title race.

Manager Daryl McKenzie, who gave his players a workout in a friendly earlier this week, is not a fan of chopping and changing so look for his selection to be on the usual lines. A reminder that it's penalties after 90 minutes if required.

Winners of this afternoon's tie are favoured with a home tie against either Greenock - victors v Ardeer last weekend - or Ruther-glen Glencairn who also play this afternoon.

1907 - FROM THE ARCHIVES - 1907

The first and only ever Scottish Junior Cup meeting between a **Tayport** team and **Ardeer Thistle** was a 4th round tie **115** years ago, in **December 1907**.

In round 1 Tayport chartered a boat from Tayport harbour for their tie against **Montrose Roselea** at Links Park, winning 2-1. In **round 2**, it was a 5-0 home win over **Arbroath Parkhead** and a 3-2 win over **Glenavon** in Dundee in **round 3** which set them up for the 4th round tie on 28th December.

Ardeer's path to the 4th round was 4-0 v **Girvan Athletic** in round 1, 2-0 v **Dunaskin Lads** in round 2 then after two drawn games v **Vale of Garnock Strollers in** round 3, a penalty in the third game gave Ardeer a 1-0 win and their place in round 4.

By this stage, the competition which had an entry of 231 clubs, was all-in and the draw for the last 32, which included a few familiar names still going strong well over a century later, had favoured Tayport with a home tie.

The rules of the competition decreed that if clubs were more than 100 miles apart, the home club had to either guarantee the visiting club's fares or otherwise, stage the game at a neutral midway venue — an almost certain loss of money whichever way they decided.

Tayport took the neutral venue option but then agreed to Ardeer's suggestion that, for a monetary consideration, the neutral venue be in Ayrshire!

Tayport had wanted £15 [worth around £2,005 in 2022] but eventually a deal was struck and they settled for Ardeer's top offer of £10. The temptation to accept the financial inducement may well have been regretted, as the match report records...

"There was a large attendance at Stevenston to witness the encounter between these Fifeshire and Ayrshire teams in the 4th Round of the Scottish Cup. Prompt to time the game started, and in a twinkling Harvie had the ball in the net for Ardeer. The Fifers strove hard to get an equaliser but the Ardeer players were too strong for them and they were repulsed. Another smart piece of play brought a second goal for Ardeer, and

It was noted that... "The Committee of the Ardeer FC have been reluctantly compelled to raise the price of admission to Saturday's match to 4d. Members on this occasion are also kindly asked to pay at gate, so as to assist the management in meeting the large expenditure which this important match will entail"

at half-time they led by 2-0. On resuming, it was expected that Tayport, with the strong wind in their favour, would make a better show, but this hope was not realised. Ardeer completely outplayed them, scoring four more goals and winning the tie by 6-0"

Tayport's line-up was Heggie; Crawford & Lonie; Balfour, Oswald & Guthrie; Morris, Rae, Mills, Campbell & Greig.

Ardeer fielded - Stevenson; Ewing & Leckie; McCulloch, Reid & Auld; Hamilton, Speirs, Harvey, Duff, and Allardyce.

The local press also noted...

The visit of the Fifers to the town of explosives was looked forward to with much interest and anxiety by the supporters of Ardeer Thistle. The visitors arrived in Stevenston on Saturday forenoon at 11.30am, leaving Tayport in the morning at 6.12 am. They left Stevenston with the 4.57 pm train for Glasgow where they were to get a connection for home at 8 o'clock. On being asked why they were going away so early from Stevenston, their reply was that "they wanted a wee while in Glesca". They also remarked that "it was awfu' cauld doon this way"; and they considered "Ardeer grand players"

Ardeer Thistle almost went to the wall back in the early

1950s but thanks mainly to the efforts of Jimmy Clements, chairman at the time, the club was resuscitated and re-admitted to the Ayrshire JFA in time for season 1951/52. 70 years later and a similar threat was once again hanging over the club when the club was reported to be thinking about taking a year out. However in June 2021 an agreement was made with crack amateur side Kilbride Thistle based

about seven miles up the road in West Kilbride whereby the management, players and backroom staff of Kilbride Thistle switched lock, stock and barrel, to Ardeer.

Manager Sean Kenney (pictured) said at the time he had been building a squad at Kilbride with a view to joining the West of

Scotland League

and this was a ready made opportunity.

Previously having spent a few seasons in the doldrums, Ardeer, in their new guise, quickly got their act together and finished comfortably in mid table in Conference B thus qualifying for a place in this season's West of Scotland Football League's 2nd Division, the third of the WOSFL's 5 divisions, tier 8 of the Scottish Football Pyramid, (current standings right).

Youth football returns to Tayport

Back in June, myself, Dave Baikie and Dave Aitken representing Tayport FC, met with Paul Dempsey. Paul lives in Tayport and is currently studying coaching at University in Aberdeen. Paul had been approached by a number of parents about the lack of youth football in Tayport. The club had received similar feedback from the local community about no youth football teams or sessions available for kids in the town. This led to us putting out on social media an ask to see if anyone would be willing to start up youth teams in Tayport, in partnership with the football club. Paul came forward and said he would be willing to be involved in such a venture.



This has led to the creation of **Tayport Community Football Club** (TCFC) which will be led by Paul and other individuals in partnership with Tayport FC. TCFC will shortly be beginning inclusive sessions which will take place on the East Common. There will be sessions running for kids from three years old up to 14 years old.

We are aware that most kids over 14 are currently already with teams, either in St Andrews or Dundee. So, by starting off with inclusive sessions for younger ages, there will be an opportunity for kids to start off with these sessions before potentially being part of a competitive team within TCFC, if the uptake is there. The hope is that in years to come there will be many teams under the banner of TCFC competing in local youth leagues.

As the community club will run in partnership with Tayport FC, we are hoping the community club can provide a pathway to the first team We want kids playing for the community club to have the dream that one day they will play for Tayport FC.

Four Youths Fined

Street football has become very prevalent in Tayport lately, despite the warnings issued by the police, and four youths were up before the Police Court on this charge. Provost G. B. Black was on the bench.

Adam Cook (19), apprentice painter, 17
Albert Street; Thos. Adamson (17), foundry
worker, 46 Ogilvy Street; Gregor Kemp
(17), apprentice butcher, Cowgate Cottage;
and Robert Irvine (16), apprentice joiner,
Riverview, Cowgate, all pleaded guilty to
having played football in Queen Street,
Tayport, and were each fined 5s, or five
days' imprisonment. The fines were paid.

Tough times being a youth in Tayport back in 1930. Just imagine...the possibility of 5 days in jail on bread and water for playing football in Queen Street.

No TVs, no computer games, too young to go to the boozer and looking for a wee bit recreation after work, only to end up before the Police Judge!

Queen Street in 1930 was hardly the M90 but the boys had been warned and somebody must have made another complaint. [5s (25p) would have the value of £20 in today's money]

THE TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALLERS UPDATE

Well done, Fergus! Ardeer Thistle - Scottish Junior Cup Semi Finalists in their first season!

Ardeer Thistle was a crack Juvenile side which was formed around the start of the 20th century. After reaching the semi-final of the Scottish Juvenile Cup in 1901/02, losing to Airdriehill Shamrock, Thistle turned Junior the following season.



What a mark they made as first season Juniors! Stevenston was buzzing as Thistle reached the Scottish Junior Cup semi finals.

It was a memorable season and packed with incident. In November, in an Ayrshire Cup-tie at home on Warner Park v Cronberry Eglinton, the sides were level at 0-0 with 25 minutes to go when Eglinton were awarded a penalty which had to be re-taken. This roused the wrath of the Ardeer support who made for the ref and assaulted him as he fled to the sanctuary of the pavilion. The game was not re-started. A quickly convened meeting of the Ayrshire JFA decided that 'the town of Stevenston be closed against Junior Football for the next two months owing to the gross misconduct of the spectators when the referee was assaulted and the crowd invaded the field of play'.

As a consequence, the 3rd round tie v Drongan was played at Blacklands Field, Kilwinning and the 4th round v Cup holders and hot favourites Rutherglen Glencairn, took place in front of a record crowd at Winton Park, Ardrossan. In round 5, a special train was laid on to take 300 Ardeer fans to Darvel.

Warner Park had been re-opened in time for the quarter final tie v Cambuslang. 'The crowd at Warner Park was a huge one and very orderly. The game was billed as Ayrshire's Hope v Glasgow's Cracks and enthusiasts from all parts of the country poured into Stevenston to see the encounter'. Cambuslang, clutching at straws, appealed on the grounds that Ardeer had fielded an ineligible player but the appeal was thrown out.

In the semi final Ardeer led Larkhall by 2-1 at half-time, but two goals conceded in the last five minutes, cost them a place in the final. And that's a dream which has eluded the club for the past 120 years



57 years later Ardeer would go one step further to realise their dream of a place in the Junior Cup Final when they drew 3-3 with Greenock in the 1959/60 semi final only to lose the replay 2-0. Greenock's opponents in the Final? St.Andrews United, who would bring the Cup to north Fife for the first time.

A Mixed Bag of Results

It's been a mixed bag of results since our last home game. In our final midweek game, in the league at Coupar Angus, despite us dominating proceedings, the scoresheet was still blank as we moved into the last 15 minutes. However, late goals from youngsters Niklas Edwards (penalty) and Dominic Naglik ensured the points would come back across the bridge to Fife.

We stayed in Fife later that week, travelling to Cardenden for our first ever 'big' Scottish Cup tie against a Dundonald Bluebell side well placed near the top of the East of Scotland League's Premier Division and mounting a serious challenge for promotion to the Lowland League. A very trim looking Moorfield Park had attracted a healthy attendance which saw Tayport's plans up in the air inside 2 minutes of kick off when Bluebell took the lead. Player manager Daryl levelled with a neat header midway through the half as Tayport settled into the game but a scrambled goal in added time at the end of the half gave Bluebell a crucial lead. A third goal inside 5 minutes of the restart sealed Tayport's fate with the home side content to sit back and hold on to their two goal winning margin.

In the next round Dundonald went down 4-2 at Benburb. Lochee United eliminated Dalkeith Thistle in the 1st preliminary round but didn't travel as well on the near 500 mile round trip to Wick in the next round. Despite breaking the journey with an overnight stay, United went down 5-1. This was pretty much an exception, as no fewer that nine Highland League clubs went out at this stage, their first hurdle in the competition. Included was a defeat for Rothes at Carnoustie Panmure. The Gowfers had reached that stage despite a fright in the 1st preliminary round when they were held at home by a Hawick Royal Albert side, firmly entrenched at the bottom of the East of Scotland League second division. No problems for Carnoustie in the replay, however, winning 3-0 down at Hawick to set up a round 2 match at home to former Juniors, Formartine United, now of the Highland League.

Back on league business the following week in a rearranged league game at Arbroath Vics, Tayport's profligacy in front of goal almost cost them full points after Vics had cashed in on two errors inside the first 20 minutes to lead 2-0 at the break. Jamie Hume pulled back a goal just after half time and Kieran Sturrock salvaged a point with the equaliser in added time.

When did you last see any tables - including our own - in the local press?
