TAYPORT v FORFAR UNITED



A warm welcome to The Canniepairt to Forfar United for this league fixture.

Forfar Albion was an amalgamation in the 1970s of Forfar Celtic and Forfar East End. In August 2020, Forfar Albion amalgamated with successful Midlands Amateur FA club Lowson United, who had just celebrated 50 years as an amateur club, to form Forfar United.

Current United manager Ryan Todd moved to Guthrie Park, at this time, bringing with him a host of Lowson players.



Last season was something of a disappointment for Forfar, finishing third from the bottom of the league. This season, however, things have been looking much more promising.

This season Forfar have done the league double over neighbours Forfar West End, with a

7-1 aggregate score, beaten Lochlee United, and returned with a point from title challengers Kirrie Thistle.

Without doubt the visitors biggest goal threat comes in the shape of striker Con-

nor Birse (pictured left). Connor has been rattling them in all season including a pearler in their 1-2 cup defeat at Carnoustie last week. Facing the Tayport attack will be former 'keeper Jack Shaw (right) who will be determined to put on a show against his former club.



Hugely disappointing performances have seen Tayport throw away 7 points from their most recent three games, games in which they have dominated play. Against North End, for example, debutant keeper Thomas Welsh, on loan from Dundee FC, made his first save on the hour mark. It's been a case of cheaply conceded goals at one end and failing to test the opposition's No.1 at the other. Furthermore, all opposition goals in the last four game have been scored in the first half of the game. Greg McColm, an ever-present this season, took a serious knock at North End last week and will be missing from the line-up for some weeks.

Tayport will have noted that United haven't won a game outside Forfar this season, their only away win coming at West End's Strathmore Park. Hopefully that situation will continue to prevail at around 4.30 this afternoon!

What's been happening in the top half of the Midlands League?

With the majority of teams in the Midlands League having played 12 or more league games, let's take a look at how the top half of the league is shaping up. The team that has been making the headlines so far this season is **Kirriemuir Thistle**. They are currently the only unbeaten team in the league, sitting with 28 points after 12 games. Although currently third they have played fewer matches than **North End** who are one point ahead of them and **East Craigie** who are three points ahead at the top. Kirrie were pleased with a seventh place finish last season but will be confident that they can better it this season. Their striker Craig Batchelor is currently the top goal scorer in the league with 14 goals in 12 matches. Another team that deserves credit for their start to the season is East Craigie. Although they finished second last season, I think many people thought they would be much further down the table this term having lost a number of key players at the end of last season. This doesn't appear to have affected them too much and Craigie are once again in the title race. Champions **Carnoustie** are currently sitting 8th in the league but have only played nine league games due to their involvement in the senior Scottish Cup. If they win their games in hand they will return to the top of the league and feel confident that they can win back to back titles. North End also look to be in the title race and despite their manager Ross Lunan leaving North End Park, they will feel they have a good enough side to challenge for the league. **Broughty Athletic** and **Lochee United**, currently 4th and 5th, have both had some big results but have also dropped points against teams that they were expected to beat. Despite being a number of points off the top, if they can put a run of victories together, they will be back in the title challenge. Big spending **Downfield** had a good start to the season and despite a bit of a dip but in recent games, their form picked up and they will feel they can overtake a number of teams ahead of them. A special mention has also got to go to today's opponents **Forfar United** who are currently sitting in 9th place and look a completely different team from last season. It was a difficult campaign for United last season finishing 17th with 21 points, whereas this season they already have 20 points after only 14 matches. I think this shows that today will be a difficult match for us against a side who will be full of confidence and belief. From a Tayport perspective, we are currently sitting seventh and know that we need to be more clinical in front of goal if we are to climb up the table. Of the top nine teams in the league, we have scored the least number of goals, scoring only 20 in 12 league games—*Peter McEleneay* - Tayport FC's Communication Officer

THE MANAGER'S THOUGHTS



Today's programme notes have been the most difficult to write so far, we have been on a disappointing run of late and all the playing and coaching staff are feeling it. Since our defeat at Dundonald in the Scottish Cup we have only won 1 of our last 5 games. Frustrating draws with Arbroath Vics and Violet coupled with a disappointing defeat at rivals North End last week have seen us fall behind in this very competitive league season.

I thought last week vs North End was arguably our poorest performance for a while, we didn't pass the ball well at all

and although we defended well as a team our attacking threat was basically non-existent which isn't like us. We have been a team that have created chances galore this season but on Saturday we just didn't get going from an attacking sense. More bad news is that Greg McColm picked up an ankle injury on Saturday that is likely to se him out for a period of 4-6 weeks.

Today's visitors Forfar United have a had a very promising start to the season, with basically a brand-new team they have picked up some notable results and sit comfortably in mid table. I know their coaching staff and the majority of their squad from my time at Forfar West End and they have coupled good quality with promising youth well this season. Today's game will be a tough encounter but one we hope to secure all 3 points from.

We are still active in the transfer market and ideally, we would ideally like to bring in another 2 or 3 players to help us improve our squad. We have managed to sign young local Tayport GK Tom Welsh from Dundee FC on an initial loan period. Tom will add good squad depth to our team, and he will compete with Darren Brown for the number 1 slot. Charlie Kennedy has moved on loan to Dundee Violet for a short spell.

I look forward to seeing the supporters at today's game and hope they enjoy the match and can help cheer us to 3 points as we look to climb the table.

HOW ARE OUR OLD PALS GETTING ON ? (2)

Continuing the brief look at our neighbouring clubs, clubs which we used to play against regularly but who now play their football in the East of Scotland League . 










Teams from Tayport have played against St Andrews and Newburgh based clubs frequently during the past 140 years at amateur, Juvenile and Junior level. For the last couple of years both Newburgh and St Andrews, having left the Juniors, play at Senior level in the East of Scotland League. Whilst Tayport play at level 6 in the Pyramid, because the East of Scotland League has four divisions, both Saint and Newburgh are at level 8.

With only another two Fife based clubs in an 18 team second division, travel is a significant factor for both Saints and 'Burgh. This season the clubs will make nine trips to Edinburgh and the Lothians plus visits to the Borders to meet Hawick and Peebles and one venture into England.

Newburgh haven't been setting the heather on fire in recent seasons but the future looks much brighter as recent form of only one league defeat in their last six games would confirm.

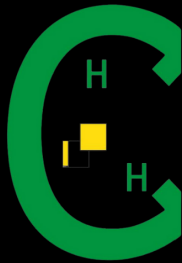
St Andrews inflicted that defeat and with significant financial backing manager Robbie Raeside, whom some might remember wore a Tayport jersey briefly in 2011, has his side targeting a promotion place. This was emphasised last week at Dalkeith where United inflicted a first league defeat of the season on the table toppers. Today we take on Forfar United. This will be the first time playing Forfar this season and it will be interesting to see what they bring to The Can-niepairt.
