TAYPORT v RUTHERGLEN GLENCAIRN



A warm welcome to The Canniepairt to Rutherglen Glencairn for their first ever visit to Tayport for this Scottish Junior Cup tie.

Rutherglen are no longer members of a Junior League, having moved a couple of seasons ago, along with all the other west based Junior clubs, to play their football in the West of Scotland Football League . The new 5 League structure has taken time to settle and Rutherglen Glencairn are currently in the first division i.e. the second tier.

Just as Tayport's aim is to reach a level to consistently challenge for the Midlands title, Glencairn have a challenge to get to the Premier Division and get on equal footing with the likes of Pollok, Auchinleck and Darvel.

Both teams are off the back of disappointing away league defeats. Last Saturday's 1-2 league defeat at Shotts ended a run of four away league and cup wins on the trot. A comparison with only one win in all home games this season suggests that our visitors enjoy their travels. Allied to the fact that they have conceded an average of only a goal a game on these travels, means that Tayport will have to be sharper in front of goal than of late.

Rutherglen's main goal threat comes from the twin spearhead of Jack McIlveen (pictured) and Ryan McManus who have eight goals apiece, more than half the team's total for the season.



Tayport missed top scorer Kieran Sturrock last week (Kieran & Caitlin became proud parents of Millie) and keeper Thomas Welsh who was injured in training with parent club Dundee FC. Both should be back this week but long term casualties Greg McColm and Jamie Gill are probably a bit away from a return to action.

Rikki Gillespie, recent signing from Broughty Athletic, is cup tied. Adam Fraser and youngsters Ryan McMulkin, Dominic Naglik and Niklas Edwards will be in competition for a starting berth.

PAUL BERG WITH THE TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALLERS UPDATE

The club's Walking Football squad is now entering "Where will we train?" season!

This is the time of year when on a Monday morning I start looking at Friday's weather forecast and try to guess if it will be suitable for outdoor training. Apart from not wanting to play at the Canniepairt if it's raining, we obviously don't want to cause any damage to the pitch for Saturday's games.

Leave it too late, and indoor facilities will be fully booked, book too early, and you can guarantee good weather come Friday! And even if I decide to go indoors, where do we go ?

Waterstone Crook is the closest, but the wooden slightly spongy flooring isn't to everyone's liking. We do get longer playing time there and it is more private but I need to book by Wednesday.

Soccerworld is over in Dundee, near Caird Park, further to travel for Fifies but closer for those living over the bridge! They have 4 indoor Astro turf pitches, about the same size as Waterstone Crook, but we only get about 1 hour playing time and it's more expensive. Like Waterstone, they have shower facilities.

Talk is that next year there will be 2 divisions, Premiership and Championship. We are guaranteed a Premiership place and are looking at the possibility of entering a second team in the Championship. LAST 16 PLACE IS THE PRIZE FOR TODAY'S WINNERS

24 Non-Junior League clubs dominate this afternoon's 3rd round Scottish Junior Cup card, 22 from the West of Scotland Football League (WOSFL) and 2 from the East of Scotland League (EOSFL). The remaining 8 places are shared equally by the Midlands Junior League and the North Region Juniors.

Ten clubs from the West of Scotland's Premier Division - the top tier of five tiers - are represented in the draw. Two of the ten, **Auchinleck Talbot** and **Darvel** still retain an interest in the 'big' Scottish Cup but one will go out of the Junior Cup this afternoon as they meet each other at Auchinleck in what is clearly the match of the day.

One North club is sure to be in the last 16 with **Aberdeen East End** favourites to beat **Newmachar** from a division below but **Stonehaven** could well get the better of **St Roch's**. Of the four Midlands clubs still with an interest, **Arbroath Vics** look like being cannon fodder for WOSFL Premier Division league leaders **Hurlford United** but **East Craigie** should account for **Ellon**, although the North Region club are having a good season, currently sitting 4th top of the Premier Division. **Carnoustie** are in Glasgow to face Premier Division **Petershill** and shouldn't have many problems against a side yet to win a league game and earlier this month lost 11 goals to **Arthurlie**. The progress of the two remaining EOSFL sides, **Livingston** and **Stoneyburn**, both in that Association's 4th tier, will almost certainly be halted at **Gartcairn** and **Glenafton** respectively. The losers will at least get a decent cut from the 'gate' at New Cumnock but Livi won't be so fortunate at Gartcairn.

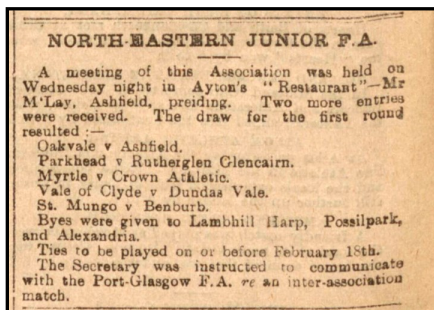

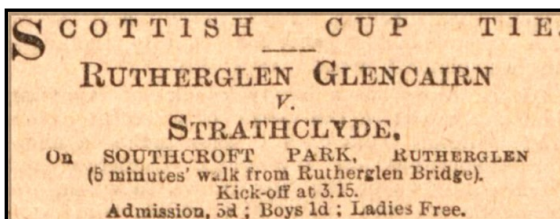
RUTHERGLEN GLENCAIRN



Our opponents today are one of the longest established clubs in the country with a history stretching back 125 years. 1896 was the year Rutherglen Glencairn were accepted as members of the Glasgow Junior Association, at the Association's 11th annual general meeting, held on Wednesday 12th August 1896, in the Buchanan Street Station Hotel, Cowcaddens. The cutting left however, shows there was a Rutherglen Glencairn playing in Glasgow's North Eastern Junior FA in the 1892-93 season.



Rutherglen Glencairn's first ever Scottish Junior Cup-tie in a cup history which, like Tayport's, can boast six Cup Final appearances, was a 1st round tie in 1896, away to Park Thistle in Govan. For whatever reason and despite the players' protests, the tie was ended by the referee 10 minutes from close of play. Rutherglen were winning 5-3 at the time and must have got the nod as we see from the advert (right) for round 2. Rutherglen were eliminated at that stage but it was no disgrace as Strathclyde went on to win the competition.



Since then Rutherglen have gone on to win the cup on four occasions, 1902, 1919, 1927 and 1939. The 1919 final v St Anthony's, a 1-0 replay win after a 1-1 draw, attracted an aggregate attendance of 75,000 to Hampden Park. More recent times saw a further two Scottish Cup Final appearances but they were both defeats, 3-1 by Kilsyth Rangers in 1967 and 1-0 by Glenrothes in 1975.

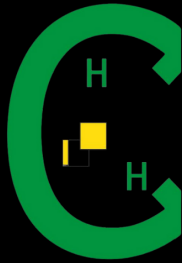
Best performance in recent years was 2012-13 when Glencairn reached the two leg semi-final before losing 2-1 on aggregate to eventual winners Auchinleck Talbot.
