TODAY'S GAME MIDLANDS LEAGUE TAYPORT V FORFAR WEST END



West End, like ourselves, haven't been having a great season, a far cry from 30 years ago when the two sides ruled the roost in the Tayside Junior FA, finishing first and second in the Tayside League.

Our visitors arrive here this afternoon trying to arrest a slump which has seen them lose their last eight games, five on the road and three at home, scoring only five goals in the process. Most recent of



these defeats was a 0-7 humbling at Lochee Harp. However, in the five week break since, manager Kevin Longmuir has

had the opportunity to address these issues as he plans for a more successful second half of the season.

The two sides met in the corresponding league game at Strathmore Park back in early August when Tayport won 3-0 with goals from Luke O'Brien, Jamie Hume and Ryan Paterson.

In contrast to their line-up that evening, West End will have a number of new faces in their squad today including recent signing Ross Flight (left) from Brechin Vics.

One player, Ethan Samson (below), who wore the West End colours when we met back in August will be in a Tayport jersey

today, having moved from Strathmore Park to Canniepairt at the end of that month.



Tayport's disappointing form can partly be put down to injuries, unavailabilities and

suspensions but it is an undeniable fact that only eight points have been collected in the last four months, a situation which has seen the team's league position slump locally to an all time low.

Although Tayport did get some action during the holiday break, going down 5-2 to St Andrews United in a 'closed door' friendly in St Andrews, the recess will have allowed the injury situation to improve and another plus is the return from six months exile in Japan of experienced striker Paul Sludden.

Harry, who now plays for Stoke City, was a stand out for the Aussies as they made it to the last 16 and was, without exception, rightly well-praised by the pundits.

Few here at The Canniepairt are likely to recall big Harry's appearance for Dundee United U20s in a pre-season friendly on Tuesday 12 August 2014. Harry, a few weeks short of his 16th birthday, the youngest player in a United XI which lost 2-1.

The United players that evening are scattered around the world these days. Keeper Zwick plays in Germany, Ballantyne (Airdrieonians), McLaughlin (East Kilbride), McNaughton (Broughty Ath), Tumilty (Hartlepool), Allardyce (Inverness CT), Adeyemo (Peterhead last season), Duke (Portadown), Lochhead (Australia), Harwood (N.Ireland), Robson (Forest Green Rovers)

Of the Tayport players listed that evening, none are playing here now but eight are still playing with other Midlands Junior clubs.

Craigie into Scottish Cup quarter-finals

East Craigie are one of the few Junior clubs still around, 136 years after the first

ever Scottish Junior Cup was contested. Not that they, or indeed many clubs from this area, entered the inaugural tournament. East Craigie, unlike many of those clubs who have lifted the Cup since 1887, are still very much a part of the Junior scene. Despite Craigie's longevity in the game there aren't many honours on the board at Craigie Park and few of their followers over the years would have dreamed of reading such a headline as we saw the other week

East Craigie are unique in this season's last 8 in that they are the only club left in the competition playing Junior football. The other 7, almost all former big guns in the Juniors, are now members of the West of Scotland Football League . Not that Craigie should feel in any way overawed having already disposed of Cambuslang Rangers, Broughty Athletic, Ellon United and St Roch's.

The Shipbuilders won a penalty shootout to account for St Roch's and incredibly four of the other seven ties were settled in the same fashion. Larkhall 7-6 v Aberdeen East End; Cumnock 4-3 v holders Auchinleck Talbot; Bellshill Athletic 2-1 v Kilbirnie Ladeside; Shotts Bon Accord 5-4 v Arthurlie.

Elsewhere, Tayport's conquerors Rutherglen Glencairn won 2-1 at Gartcairn, Hurlford United scraped through by the only goal at home to Troon and the biggest winning margin of the day, 3-1, saw Glenafton Athletic return victorious from Carnoustie Panmure.

With the absence in the competition of virtually all the East of Scotland League's former Junior clubs and a host of west based former Junior clubs, we were down to the last eight by the beginning of December with the quarter finals scheduled for 11th February. Of the eight, only Craigie and Bellshill don't already have their name engraved on the grand old trophy.

The draw is

Bellshill v Glenafton Athletic East Craigie v Shotts Bon Accord Hurlford United v Cumnock Larkhall Thistle v Rutherglen Glencairn

If Craigie can repeat the impressive form they displayed in ending Broughty Athletic's 12 game unbeaten run last Şaturday, then they can go all the way.

THE MANAGER'S THOUGHTS



Today's game is our first fixture in 2023 with the end of the year bringing to an end a hectic first 6 months as Manager of this brilliant football club. When I accepted the job in July, I had a vision of what I wanted to create here at Tayport and I knew it would take time. Nothing that I have witnessed since my first day in the job has changed my optimism or enthusiasm to deliver that vision. I deem success for this club as winning trophies and competing with the best teams in this region and although we may seem a long

way away from that just now, I am certain we have made progress both on and off the park.

For my first friendly vs Syngenta in July we only had 9 signed players, umpteen trialists playing and a 15-year-old keeper. We had no real shape or playing style and the team was pieced together after 2 training sessions, mainly based on my perception of our players from playing against them. That day ended in a 4-1 defeat but being honest, it could have been more. Since then, we have worked tirelessly as a group to develop a playing style that suits our players and I must praise the players for their attitudes during this period. The way they have come together after a difficult summer is testament to their resilience and commitment. Our league and cup form has been inconsistent at best. We have had some pleasing results and performances but also some very disappointing ones. Our inability to field a consistent starting team each week has really cost us. We simply haven't scored enough goals and we have relied too heavily on our young players which has been unfair at times.

The positive news is that we have been able to bring some new exciting players to the club and we are working hard to add more. I am aware of our current position and am determined to improve on that in the 2nd half of the season starting with full points today.

Can I take this opportunity to thank all the committee and supporters for their great support this season to me personally and to the players. Best wishes for the New Year.

A flooded Canniepairt caused the postponement of our league fixture against Brechin Vics on 19 November then, before the enforced holiday break, we lost successive games to Broughty Athletic, going down 0-3 in the league at home then going out of the Quest Engineering Regional Cup by 4-2 at Whitton Park the following Saturday.

Nothing much for home fans to cheer, with that league game the third successive Canniepairt defeat in which we had failed to find the net.

Broughty's cup win extended their long unbeaten run but it was a much improved performance from Tayport. Despite losing a soft goal early on,

Tayport settled and had created several opportunities before Ryan Paterson set up Kieran Sturrock for a deserved equaliser before half time.

Tayport were well in the game following the break but Callum Walls conceded a penalty which put the home side back in front on 63 minutes. Undaunted, we grabbed a leveller with twelve minutes left, Paterson again the provider, this time for Ethan Samson.
