

TODAY'S GAME MIDLANDS LEAGUE TAYPORT V EAST CRAIGIE



For much of last season East Craigie looked to be heading for the Midlands title only to be pipped at the post by Carnoustie.

This season they had an indifferent start to their campaign but then strung together eleven league wins which refreshed their title challenge. Alas, only one win in their four most recent league outings has seen Craigie slip back in the title betting. That win, however, was an impressive 2-1 success at League leaders Broughty in the first game of the year.

The resurgence of East Craigie in recent seasons is down in no small way



to the management of Craig Brown (left) and 'Port legend Sean Wilkie. Sean was at the Canniepairt from 1990 to 2000 during which time he led

the team in a success packed decade.

For much of the season Craigie have generally relied on a tried and trusted starting eleven with only the odd adjustment here and there.

Two experienced members of East Craigie's squad who have previously

worn Tayport colours are the uncompromising Andy McDonald, who played here under John McGlashan

in the 2011/2012 season, and striker Stewart 'Tweedy'
McConnachie who had the latter part of the 2017/2018 season here under Charlie King.



Tayport will be aware that they have a task on their hands this afternoon if they are to collect the points, or even a point, as Craigie have a 100% record against teams beneath them in the league table.

Tayport created chances last week against Letham but will have to be less profligate in front of goal. Youngster Aiden MacDougall made his debut as a trialist when he came on in central defence last week but could possibly be on from the start today. Kyle McMulkin, out through injury since last year, is back to fitness and could get a place on the bench.

Bradie Heggie won't feature. He is on the transfer list. Neither will Craig Sturrock who is off to Broughty Athletic on loan.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

In my previous two columns, I have written about sticking with the club over this transitional period. In both columns I mentioned if we want to be successful, we need to be patient and allow the manager to rebuild the squad and implement his ideas.

The first half of this season has really been a survival job for us, just getting a team on the pitch has been an achievement at times. It's not been an easy time for the club but I believe we are very slowly starting to turn a corner, and I saw this last Saturday against Letham in two ways. Firstly, we had a full bench for the first time this season, Secondly, for the first time this season the majority of players in the starting line-up eight - were players that Daryl has signed. This is extremely significant as I think we are now starting to see it becoming Daryl's team.

What many have probably noticed is that many of our recent signings are young players, who have joined us on loan or who have joined us after being released from other clubs. The average age of our squad is currently 23 years and comprises eight teenagers. Now, there will be many people who may be saying we are signing too many young players, but I don't think this is a bad thing. In the 1995-96 season, Sir Alex Ferguson showed that having a young team could still win trophies. This made Alan Hansen eat his words after he had previously said, "You can't win anything with kids." The manager is building for the future and with these young players he can implement his ideas, coach them, and develop them. Of course you need some experience in there but we do have some experienced players in the squad.

You can be successful with a young team and I believe today's opponents East Craigie are a prime example of this. There are teams in the league who have spent lots of money but then you have a team like Craigie who have invested in young players and have built a really strong side.

Last season they came extremely close to the League Championship, just falling at the final hurdle as Carnoustie took the crown, but they deservingly won the Quest Cup where they comfortably defeated us in the final. Despite losing star players Grady McGrath and Fraser MacLeod to Brechin City they have once again shown that they have quality in their squad to be competing at the top of the league.

I think East Craigie is a very good example of how a club can develop young players and be successful. We need to be patient with the young players but let's remember we can have a young squad and still be successful

PAUL BERG (pictured) MATCHDAY GATEMAN AT THE CANNIEPAIRT, TELLS US HIS STORY AND THE STORY BEHIND EMERGENCE OF THE SUCCESSFUL TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB

I was born in London in 1950, and my wife and our two daughters lived in Barnet, north of London.

My elder daughter met a "Dundonian" whilst visiting a friend at Dundee University, and in 2006 they married and set up home in Ardler, Dundee. In 2009 our first grandchild was born, and we decided to close our business, sell our home and move up to Monifieth to be nearer our daughter and now our two grandchildren.

Not wanting to retire, I got a seasonal Ranger job at Crombie Country Park for a few summers, and then switched to B&Q stores, firstly in Dundee and then Arbroath. Whilst there, a colleague mentioned that he played Walking Football on a Wednesday afternoon at the Douglas Sports Centre in Dundee. I went along with him and thoroughly enjoyed it and continued going each week. It got me fitter, healthier and I even lost a few pounds! It also became a social event.

In 2017 we moved over "The Bridge" to live in Wormit. I continued going each Wednesday to Douglas, but one day I visited the Waterstone Crook Sports Centre in Newport, and was shown their indoor football court. I thought it would be perfect for Walking Football, so I contacted Fife Leisure, who run it. They were very supportive of me running a club there, but only Friday mornings were available so we agreed on a time and set a date to start.

I wanted the club to have a name, as there were Walking Football teams at Dundee Utd., Arbroath and Raith Rovers. I knew of Tayport FC, so I got the contact details for chairman Davie Baikie and emailed him my ideas. Within minutes he rang me, totally enthusiastic about the idea and that was the start of Tayport over 50s Walking Football Club. I got posters and leaflets printed and I distributed them around the catchment area, and gave out the leaflets on a Saturday morning!

On Friday August 2nd, 2019, we held our first session. 9 people attended including old Tayport players Fergus Mann and Frank Feechan, who still attend regularly. By the end of the month we had 18, including Tayport FC vice-chairman John Anderson, Abby Oswald and a one off visit from the club chairman, Davie Baikie, who unfortunately pulled a hamstring and is apparently still waiting for it to heal!!

I registered the club with the governing body, Walking Football Scotland, and, wanting the club to be self-funded, I went looking for sponsors and grants. After sending out over 12 sponsorship requests and getting no response, I saw on the news that Tunnock's were sponsoring a private lifeboat, so wasting no time, I

pinged off an email to them and within a week they responded, offering to purchase our full kit, and allowing us to have their logo on the shirts, the only football team Tunnock's have ever sponsored! A local garden designer, Iain Hogg, sponsored our waterproof jackets. I also applied and got a sports grant from ScotMid stores to purchase footballs and proper walking football sized goals, which enabled us to play outside at Canniepairt.

In 2021, after 9 months of inactivity due to Covid, we restarted and entered a team in the Walking Football Scotland East Division League. We finished an amazing 4th, and the following year the league expanded to 13 teams and we again finished 4th, coming above teams from Dundee United, Montrose, Raith Rovers and Carnoustie.

This season (2023), the league has expanded further, creating

2 divisions, a Premiership and a Championship. Tayport FC will be the only club having a team in each division, a great effort considering we have only 36 active members. Of those only 2 are under 60, the rest are aged up to 74, and that's one of our goalkeepers!

My next step is to create an evening fortnightly session, as I know there are people who want to attend but obviously work during the day. Hopefully I can get this started when the evenings get lighter, and warmer.

Tayport Walking Football Club isn't just about playing football. The club has developed and at a Friday session we meet, train and afterwards sit in the clubhouse at Tayport and have coffees and teas, and nobody rushes off. We all sit chat, and show what the true meaning of "A Club" is all about, and we have to thank Davie Baikie for all his enthusiasm towards us, and Abby Oswald who promotes the club so well whenever the club programme is published.

EAST CRAIGIE'S BIGGEST DAY A WEEK AWAY



Craigie Park will likely host its biggest crowd in recent memory next Saturday when East Craigie play Shotts Bon Accord in the Quarter Final of the Scottish Junior Cup, which is sponsored by *Clydebuilt Home Improvements*. With an entry of only 108 clubs, the majority of which no longer play in Junior leagues, the 136 years old competition may not have the profile of 100 years ago when around 400 clubs entered, but it's still the holy grail of Junior football.

East Craigie are flying the flag for the Juniors as the other 7 quarter finalist play in the West of Scotland Football League (WOSFL) Apart from Craigie and **Bellshill Athletic**, the quarter finalists have all previously won the competition at least once. **Rutherglen Glencairn** who eliminated Tayport from this season's competition have won it on four occasions.

The Shipbuilders, with a history lengthier than the competition itself, despite this longevity, have never previously reached the semi finals. They'll never have a better chance than next Saturday when **Shotts Bon Accord** are their quarter final visitors.

Shotts, Cup winners in 2012, play in Division 1, the second tier of the WOSFL

which is tier 7 of the Scottish Football Pyramid. A good run of league results towards the end of the year has been halted by successive defeats since the turn of the year.

Rutherglen also play in WOSFL Div 2 while **Larkhall Thistle** and Bellshill Athletic play in WOSL Div 3. The Cup favourites all play in the WOSFL Premier Division, like Craigie,



they're in tier 6 of the Scottish Pyramid. Next Saturday's match of the day will undoubtedly be the Ayrshire derby between **Hurlford United** and **Cumnock**. Rutherglen are at Larkhall and **Glenafton** are at Bellshill.

If East Craigie do the business next week - and we'll all be rooting for them they will join the band of local clubs to have reached the semi finals. **Violet** (1929); **Harp** (1931, 1934, 1954, & 1968); **Carnoustie** (1952, 1978, 2001 & 2004); **St Josephs** (1961); **Lochee United** (1980,1995,2005, 2010 & 2019); **Downfield** (1985); **Tayport** (1993, 1996, 1997, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 & 2006)
