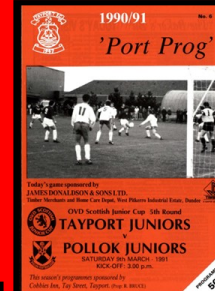

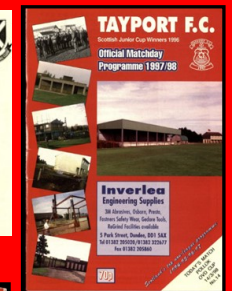

MAGNIFICENT 'PORT RUN ENDED

TAYPORT JUNIORS 1
POLLOK 4

Tayport's dreams of glory in the Scottish Junior Cup came to an end at the hands of Glasgow side Pollok in this fifth round tie at Canniepairt last Saturday.

In front of a record-breaking crowd Tayport were sadly lacking the fighting qualities which had seen them win through to the last 16, and by the end of the first 45 minutes found them-

selves three down to a Pollok side packed with Junior International and ex-senior players.

Before full-back Marshall had volleyed the visitors ahead after seven minutes, with a strike reminiscent of his opener in Pollok's Scottish Cup win at Hampden in 1986, home defender Frankie Dolan had been called upon to make a couple of telling tackles to keep out the lively Pollok attack.

Visiting keeper Cassidy was not called into action too often as his well drilled defence dealt competently with the efforts of the Tayport forwards.

With the score still 1-0 though, Tayport were still in with a shout and a fine save by Cassidy denied Dave Reilly after a mazy run through the Pollok defence. The killer blows came in the 30th and 39th minutes when O'Brien headed Pollok into a three goal lead, his second counter striking the

base of keeper Christie's right-hand post and entering the net at the far side after running along the goal line.

A minute before half-time any lingering hopes of a home revival were slightly enhanced by the dismissal of McCall following comments and a gesture directed towards the Tayport dugout.

To be fair to Tayport, they came more into things in the second half and it was soon after the restart that Reilly was unlucky to see his looping header elude Cassidy, only for the ball to skim the top of the bar and land behind for a goal kick. Another fine chance to narrow the gap fell to Grant Cushnie but the ball he received from Irons head flick was thumped past the

post from eight yards. Gary Lamont, earlier substituting for Spalding and playing his first match in five weeks, brought out a tremendous save from Cassidy. Lamonts wide play on the left heralded the home side's best period of the match and in the 75th minute Thoms headed home from an Irons cross. Cassidy was booked for attempting to delay proceedings by preventing the retrieval of the

ball from the net, as Tayport anxiously strove to keep the momentum going. However, the dream of cup glory was finally ended when, with the home side

wholly committed to pushing forward, striker Crie found himself with plenty of time to put the ball between Christie and ensure Pollok place in the quarter final. Tomorrow Tayport travel to Thomson Park, Loch take on United in Zamoyski Cup second round. The game has a 2.30 kick off and will be played to a full

Manager Stewart Maxwell would not have been too happy at the fashion in which the goals were conceded so today's line-up could see a change or two.

Tayport will be without the suspended Sam Simpson but leading marksmen Scott McComiskie and Ethan Samson, could be in from the start. Both returned after injury last week and got some game time, both scoring after coming on as substitutes v St James.

If it's all-square after 90 minutes today, then there will be 30 minutes extra time and then a penalty shoot out if the sides are still level. No replays these days.

To the surprise of the villagers, who were out in great force, the home lot were defeated by 3 to 1. At both places visited the Glasgow lads created a good impression by their clever and gentlemanly play, and the treatment accorded them was extremely hospitable.

130 years ago, the first Glaswegian football team to visit Tayport, albeit to play a friendly on Boxing Day 1894, was Alexandra FC who played out of Provanmill, from the north east outskirts of the city. The same result today against Tayport's 2024 visitors would be fine! For the record, here's the Tayport line-up that day.

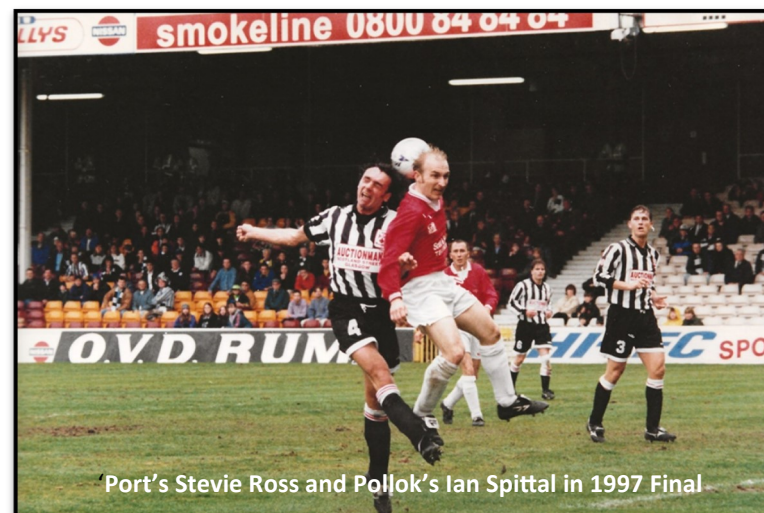

When Tayport joined the Scottish Junior FA back in 1990, the Tayport committee, dipping their toe in the semi-professional game and aware this would be a different ball game, travelled through to Glasgow prior to the start of the season to meet their Pollok counterparts. Pollok FC of the Juniors' Central League was a giant of the Junior game and their officials were only too happy to share their experience with their Tayport counterparts. It was a sound grounding for Tayport's two decades of success which followed.

Pollok are now in the West of Scotland Football League's Premier Division which is tier 6 in the pyramid, the same as the Midlands League. Based in Newlandsfield in Glasgow's south side, Pollok are one of the best supported non-league clubs in the country, their home attendances, averaging something like 600 this season, putting several SPFL clubs in the shade.

Pollok have invested a load of money recently to get their ground up to standard. This was in order to tick all the boxes required to gain an SFA Licence and thus enter the 'big' Scottish Cup annually and eventually, perhaps, winning play-offs to get into SPFL League Two, should they want to go down that road.

✦ In our last programme we commented on North End's 25-0 win at Whitehills FC in the last round of the Scottish Cup. A one-off in the Cup we thought, and that's probably true. But a correspondent has unearthed another 25-0 scoreline. A while ago, mind you. The correspondent has found an identical result. It was a game played under the auspices of the Broughty Ferry & District Junior F.A. on **Christmas Eve 1892**. The press commented: "Tayport Union FC v. Ardenlea Reserves (Broughty Ferry). Played on the Common at Tayport. The game was a mere farce. The Union, taking matters easy, had all their own way, and ran out winners by 25 goals to 0".

✦ **Back** at the end of May earlier this year, following a phone call from Eddie Wolecki, the former Tayport boss offering his services, the Lossiemouth FC chairman appointed Eddie to the manager's role at the Highland League side. Announcing Eddie's appointment on a 3 year contract, the chairman said he had studied Eddie's CV and he ticked all the boxes. In August, fearing that his club could be slipping into relegation trouble, the chairman announced that Eddie, who had taken up residency in Lossiemouth by this time, was leaving by mutual consent.

✦ **Dave** Reilly, who scored two of the Tayport goals in our 3-3 quarter final draw v Pollok in 1998, has the unique distinction of being the Scottish Junior Cup's all time top goalscorer with 45 goals between 1990 and 2000.
