Tayport's relative absence from the last 32 of the Scottish Junior Cup in the past ten years has seen Lochee Utd take top billing for Midlands clubs' appearances in the competition during the 21st Century.

Lochee have reached the 4th round on 14 occasions, followed by Tayport with 12. Carnoustie Panmure come next with 11, then Dundee Violet with 7, North End 6, Broughty Athletic 5. Amongst the dozen or so others, maybe somewhat surprisingly, come Downfield with 3, two of which have been this season and last season.

Panmure are hard on the heels of the Bluebells over the last decade with 6 appearances to Lochee's 7.

1899 FROM THE ARCHIVES 1899

From time to time over the years, players from many nations have turned out for Tayport clubs on The Canniepairt or on the East Common but surely the first such occasion was exactly 125 years ago this week. On 1st November 1899 the Liverpool Mercury newspaper (and others) reported that Kidlaw [phonetic spelling], a 16 year old Esquimaux lad from Dexterity Harbour on Greenland's Davis Strait arrived in Tayport as a guest of the ship's Tayport based captain Harry McKay

Captain who commands the Esquimaux, and his wife, kindly solicitude, have taken the stranger under their care, and both are loud in their praises of his intelligence, his docility, and his manners and deportment. Already Kidlaw has been initiated into the mysteries of football, to which game he devoted himself with zest, and to the admiration of Captain M'Kay's boys and his other youthful companions, who prophesy for him a place in one of the junior elevens practising on Tayport Common.

Also happening in Tayport that first week in November 1899

- *The SS Glenisla arrived at Tayport harbour from Aguilas in Spain to discharge its cargo of esparto grass
- *Mr William Henderson retired from Donaldson's Sawmills after 40 years service
- * Jute Workers were wanted and Tayport Spinning Works advertised for 'Families with Spinners, Piercers and Shifters. Steady employment. Cheap dwelling houses'
- *Tayport Liiterary Society had a large audience listening to a lively debate on "Country Life v Town Life". After a prolonged discussion, Country Life won by a majority
- * Tayport Rangers FC were playing Ardenlea (Lochee) 'and will put a strong team on to pull off the two points. Team - Coss: Cook, Berrie: Wood, Hay, Simpson; Campbell, Hill, D.Coss, Cowie and Kinnear'

Tayport Crescent FC were playing East End, (Newport) in a league game on Garpit Park, which had been kindly granted by the Rangers.



TODAY'S GAME

TAYPORT v CARNOUSTIE PANMURE **MIDLANDS LEAGUE**



This afternoon's game will be a major test for us. We've played - and won each of our six league games at home this season, gathering 18 points which has taken us to 4th place in the table.

What we've got to take cognisance of is that all six games have been against clubs occupying the bottom eight places in the league table, hence labelling this game today as something of a test.

Confidence comes with wins, however, and with six wins from our last seven games, we won't be lacking.

Carnoustie arrive here today defending an unbeaten run of eight games against Tayport, four of which were here at Canniepairt, our last success being a 4-1 win here in 2019.

Although Carnoustie aren't quite the side which won back to back Midlands titles in 2021-2023, they have tasted league defeat on only three occasions to date, one of which was at in-form

Downfield last week. It was their biggest defeat of the season and one which ended a run of four successive victories.

Carnoustie's main threat comes from their strike force of Dale Reid and Jay

Canniepairt between from 2016-18 when he had the impressive record of scoring 47 goals in 79 appearances during his spell at Tayport. Since moving to Carnoustie, his goals certainly have-

n't dried up and he's consistently proved to be a thorn in our side. He's again the Gowfers' leading marksman this season.



Six in a row?

Catching the eye in recent games has been Dale's fellow striker Jay Yule. Jay is looking to find the net today for a sixth successive game. So, Tayport defenders, you have been warned!

Another player facing his former club today is **Sam Simpson** who will be back after missing two games and looking to add to his six goals already this season. Stefan Elvin will also return to the squad

There will be three new faces in Tayport's squad this afternoon, defender James Simpson and midfielder Jamie Timmons, both from Violet and striker Nick Mann (30).

Nick was previously at Canniepairt in 2013/14 when his first goal for the club was against Carnoustie in a Super Yule. Dale, was at The League match in 2013.

PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB REPORTS...

Our final session of league games finished with mixed emotions. Our **Red** team in the Premiership, despite having a good day, were relegated to the Championship. The **Red's** performances were unfortunately matched on the day by the teams immediately above us and we missed out by 1 point!

Best result was drawing and nearly beating, champions Dundee East. Raith Rovers looked odds on to be champions, just needing to avoid defeat against Linlithgow Rose, whom we had beaten earlier in the day, but they lost 4-0 and thus missed out on the title by goal difference

Our **White** team in the Championship finished in the bottom half of the table but, considering they are a new squad, did well on the day, beating Dundee FC and today's Canniepairt visitors, Carnoustie Panmure, who again just missed out on promotion.

We are entering 2 teams again next year. We have over 30 players and are confident we can put out 2 equally balanced teams and get back into the Premiership.

Tom Malone, who is now in charge of team selection and performance, has spoken with all the players he wants to be involved. To Tom's credit, over the last two league sessions since he took over, the **Red** squad were 5th out of 12, showing we are definitely progressing.

Some people have asked why we don't just have one Super team next year. The answer is, we have so much interest from our players, it would be unfair just to select a squad of 8 and leave out another 12 potentially equally good players. Obviously we want to win every game we play, but our main focus is involving as many of our players as possible, rather than to win at all costs, as some clubs' mentality seems to be. Last year's Premiership champions, Arbroath also entered 2 teams for the first time this year and escaped relegation by a single point. But they were happy that, like us, they had involved more players.

On Sunday December 1st we are entering a team in the Raith Rovers Christmas Cup, being played at Starks Park. Hopefully the weather will be kind to us as we hope to do even better than we have done in the past. Last year we made the quarter finals before losing on penalties so, fingers crossed, hopefully we can improve this year.

Although we have managed to train outside at the Canniepairt for the last few weeks, we will soon be training inside at the Regional Performance Centre in Dundee, so if anyone wants to come along and join us on a Friday morning training session, just contact me on 07831-535555, or email: tfcwalkingfootball@gmail.com. or message via our Facebook page.



Good to see a familiar face at the Scone Thistle game when the legend that is Scott Peters looked into The Canniepairt to see his 16 year old son Finlay enjoy some action, coming on as a trialist for the visitors as a second half substitute.

When Tayport and Lochee United met in the final of the 2005 Scottish Junior Cup at Tannadice, the gate receipts were £35,666 (£66,741 in today's money). Dundee United's share was £10,419 (£19,500)

Mackenzie Williamson, scorer of 7 goals and recipient of 14 cards at Canniepairt last season, was featured on the cover of the Newburgh match programme last week. To date Mac has hit 4 goals and has collected 8 cards in his 12 games for Newburgh this season.

St Andrews United and manager Garry Wright have this week parted company. Garry was promoted at the start of this season from his coaching role to the top job but has resigned with his team currently in bottom spot in EOSFL Premier Division.
