HEADLINES FROM HISTORY DECEMBER 1990 AND JANUARY 1991

Hectic finish

TAYPORT JUNIORS.....2
KIRRIE THISTLE.....3

In dreadful conditions of a snow-covered surface and an icy Arctic gale blowing the length of the Canniepairt, Tayport Juniors went down to fellow championship aspirants Kirrie Thistle for the second time this season in a Tayside Juniors Division Two match.

Tayport failed to get to grips with Kirrie's recent midfield signings, Simpson from Coupar Angus and Billy Gallacher from East Fife. It was ironic that Gallacher should play such an influence, having turned out for Tayport in all their pre-season friendlies before being unable to settle on terms with the club.

Part of the match report of the game on **December 8th 1990**. As things transpired, come May 1991, Tayport would pip Kirrie for the title by a single point. Incredibly, 24 hours later (Sunday!) Tayport played St Josephs in a league game, also on Canniepairt and won 9-0. Aye, they were tough in those days!

A Local Press headline from **January 18th 1991**.

The signings made headlines and well they might, both players playing five trophy laden seasons at Tayport.

Andy, of course, later becoming a very successful manager here.

Tayport's major signings

Tayport made two major signings when they secured the double transfer of Downfield players, Andy Sommerville and Jimmy Hunter.

Tayport had been on the trail of both players for some time but the Tayside champions only recently made the players available for transfer.

During the last four seasons both players picked up every honour in the Tayside Juniors, including three championship medals, but following an internal dispute with the club, haven't played at all this season. Clearly the new signings will need games to get match fitness.

Sommerville was the target of several clubs but the big defender chose to join up with his ex-teammate at Downfield, Tayport co-manager Dave Baikie.

TAYPORT v KIRRIE THISTLE

JOHN REILLY MEMORIAL TROPHY

(contested by North of Scotland Football League / Midlands Football League Clubs)



We welcome Kirrie thistle to The Canniepairt this afternoon for the first of three cup ties to be played over successive weeks.

This is the local qualifying round prior to the North of Scotland clubs joining with the Midlands clubs in the 3rd round. Kirrie were unlucky to go out at the 2nd qualifying round last season, beaten 4-3 on penalties after a 1-1 draw at Forfar West End. For Tayport, it was an exit at the first hurdle, beaten 3-1 by North End in the 1st qualifying round.

Since the beginning of the century Kirrie have yet to reach the final of this competition and although Tayport have featured in seven finals during this era, winning five times, their most recent Final appearances have resulted in inglorious 5-1 defeats in 2017 (Broughty) and 2022 (East Craigie).

Kirrie had a distinctly average start to this season with only one win in their first ten games. Recent results, however, suggest their form is improving, having won two of their last four games whilst conceding only five goals. These two recent defeats were 1-2 at Broughty Athletic and 1-2 in a Scottish Communities Cup tie at Dyce, a club only a point off second top of the North of Scotland Premier League.

Although the 0-4 home defeat by Lochee United last week was their first loss in 11 games, Tayport will require to give themselves a shake following that disappointing performance. Kirrie never make it easy and today under former 'Port coach Garry Balfour and the veteran veteran (!) Bryan Duell, it will be no different.

Teenager Finlay Peters, son of Tayport legend Scott, came on as substitute for Thistle when the sides met here back in August and recently netted his first goal. He'll have an eye on another on the ground on which his father starred so often.

PAUL BERG of TAYPORT FC WALKING FOOTBALL CLUB WRITES...

Tomorrow we play the final set of league games for this season.

In the **Over 50s Championship**, we have 4 games to play, and still have an outside chance of getting promoted.







Dumbarton FC will always have a place in Tayport FC history



Dumbarton FC's Marbill Coaches Stadium situated in the lee of Dumbarton Rock

This will be the first time we have played a competitive game against an SPFL club, indeed a club which has actually won the Scottish Cup, albeit 142 years ago. They have also been beaten finalists on five occasions.

Sadly, Dumbarton FC went into administration last year and as a result were deducted 15 points and were subsequently relegated. Earlier this year they exited administration and, like Rangers, they are a new club, now run by The Dumbarton Football Club 1972 Limited, a new company owned by Canadian businessman Mario Lapointe.

Included in the Dumbarton squad is a player with a tenuous connection with Tayport. Striker Leighton McIntosh was born in Dundee and when a teenager, played for the Dens Park club under Barry Smith, the current Tayport coach. Barry, of course, led the Dark Blues to a club record unbeaten league run of 23 games in 2011, guiding them to safety from relegation, despite the team having received a 25-point deduction for entering administration. Leighton also played with Arbroath and Montrose amongst others as well as in Wales, England, Iceland and Jordan.

Tayport's visit to Dumbarton at the end of this month will be our first for 37 years. Not to play the Senior side, of course, it was a 6th round Scottish Amateur Cup tie in season 1988-89 when we lost 2-1 to Dumbarton Academy FPs.
